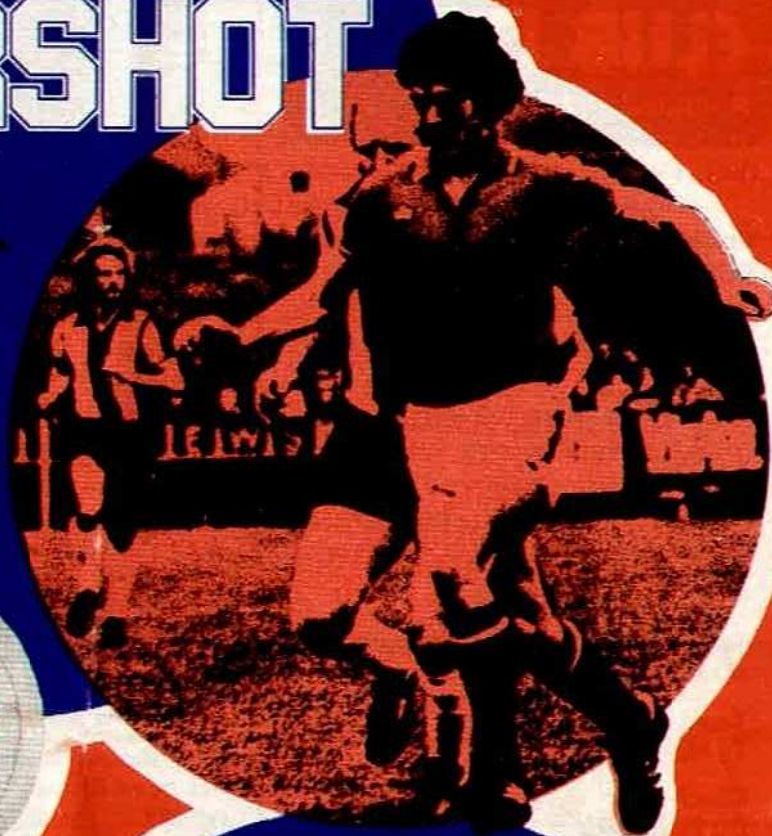

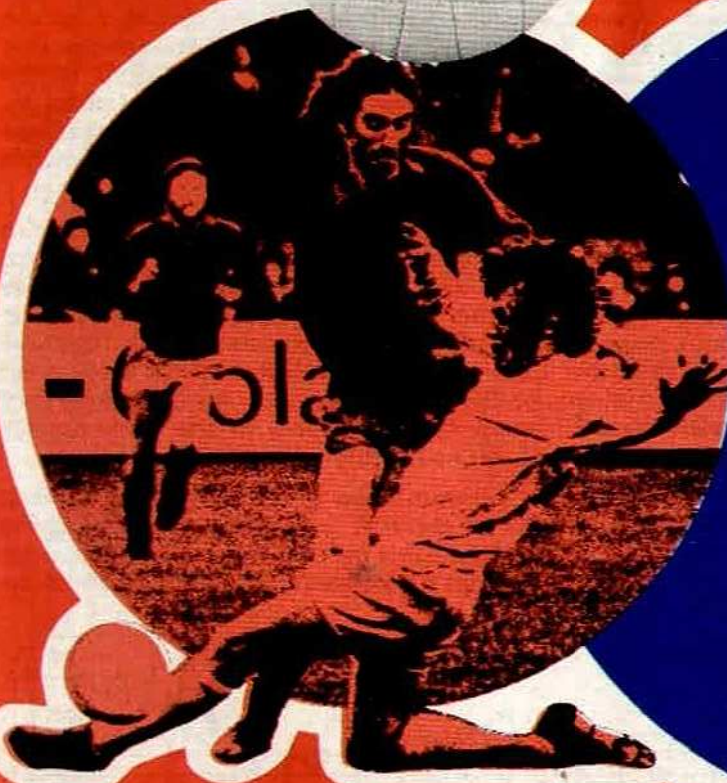

Mac's Chat

Good afternoon and welcome to the Recreation Ground. When you sit down and think about the condition of the pitches, due to the weather, it does try the patience of the people connected with the football game. I have heard many people criticise postponements when they don't know anything about why a game was postponed. The

decision to put the game off is not taken lightly, and we at Aldershot (like most clubs) think about all supporters and the visiting team. When a game has been called off there is so much work to be done behind the scenes by the administration side of the club. One of the first of many calls by the Club is to the media, T.V. and radio, national and local (this is worth noting for the future) papers (if the match is put off a day before). Just think how much money the club loses through programmes which have to be scrapped (unless the match is re-arranged during the next week), police and gate-men, refreshments which have been ordered and sometimes delivered. These calls I have mentioned are just a few of the numerous things that have to be done. Most teams leave the phone number of hotels where they could be contacted.

Who should be responsible for the on-off decision? This topic has been brought up recently in the press, with many famous people in the game giving their ideas. It struck me that they all had different ideas or opinions. For the record, I believe things should stand as they are and that is between the two managers and referee. If the referee can't make it to the ground, the football league get a local referee to stand in. This happened to the Aldershot vs. Reading game when Dave Letts from Basingstoke was called in and declared the match off.

Boots to suit the conditions is another point brought up in the last few weeks. I have checked around many league clubs enquiring on this point and at the end of my enquiries I was no wiser, other than that there was not the perfect boot. It all boils down to what the player fancies on the day. This was proved the other Saturday night on 'Match of the Day' when Laurie Cunningham, the West Bromwich Albion player said he tried three different types of boots in the game against Norwich and he still was not happy with his footwear.

Today we welcome Swindon Town to the Recreation Ground for the 4th round tie of the F.A. cup. My hope is the game will be played in the right spirit on and off the field. So come on you Aldershot fans let's hear you cheer your team on to the next round.

On Saturday 20th we travelled to Chertsey Town for a Suburban League game and came away easy winners by 6-1.



We increased our lead ten minutes later when a Barry Andrews cross was dropped by the home keeper for Paul Findley to drive in and number three was added by the same player after good work by Lucas and Wynn Hooper. Our fourth came early in the second period when a long cross from Nigel Edwards was headed home by of all people Barry Andrews. This made it three goals with his head against Chertsey this term by the wee man, and he is now trying to get round me to play him at Central Defender for his aerial power!!

After 65 minutes we added goal five when a Hooper cross was controlled and hammered home on the turn by Lucas and soon after a great run and cross by Edwards was turned in by Paul Hampshire. Introducing...

It has been mentioned before in this column that matches involving Aldershot and Swindon Town have been of more than passing significance. And this Fourth Round F.A. Cup tie is no exception. Victory would put Aldershot into the Fifth Round to equal their previous best in the 1932-33 season.

There have been other milestones. The last of them ending tragically for Aldershot during the latter stages of the 1975-76 season when Swindon won 1-0 here for what was a fifth successive League defeat and virtually cost us our Third Division place.

Before that and with even more import in view of today's game was 15 years ago in the same stage of the competition when Swindon won 2-1 at the Recreation Ground.

In January 1947 it was a more pleasant outcome. Aldershot had ended the Old Year by losing 9-0 at Bristol City. But they managed to start the New Year right by defeating Swindon Town.

But probably the match which inadvertently had sensational consequences was the day after we drew 2-2 at Swindon in September 1939 when World War Two was declared!

Swindon's own cup record dates back with renown to their days in the Southern League. Twice they reached the F.A. Cup semi-final before gaining admission to the Football League.

They entered the League in 1920 via Division Three and they have had two spells in Division Two, the last of them ending in 1974. And this season the club are serious promotion contenders again.

Under new manager Bobby Smith previously chief at Port Vale and Bury where he ended his playing career which also embraced Manchester United, Scunthorpe United, Grimsby Town, Brighton, Chester and Hartlepool and began with England schools and youth honours. His assistant is a former Swindon boss Danny Williams.

An experienced staff is headed by a recent acquisition in the shape of Bryan Hamilton who captained the Northern Ireland team in last season's home international tournament.

Belfast born, Hamilton who plays usually in midfield or defence was signed from Millwall in November. He has also played for Linfield, Everton and Ipswich.

Right-back John McLaughlin started with Colchester United and is a former youth international who has been with Swindon for five years and has completed 200 League games.

One of the longest serving, however, is midfield player Ken Stroud with some nine years as a professional and more than 150 League games.

The club has recruited from this southern area as well with ex-Southampton striker Paul Gilchrist signed from Portsmouth this season and earlier with Charlton and Doncaster, midfielder Chris Kamara who was with Portsmouth and full-back Andy Ford signed from Southend but earlier with Bournemouth.

Newcomers this term include goalkeeper Chris Ogden from Oldham Athletic, striker Andy Rowland from Bury and previously at Derby County, winger Ian Miller from Doncaster and earlier with Nottingham Forest and Bury.

Players who made their names originally outside the League also figure among the Swindon staff. Goalkeeper Jimmy Allan was signed from Brora Rangers in the Highland League in October 1970, striker Chic Bates had seven years as a Southern League player before moving to Shrewsbury, defender Russell Lewis was in the Welsh League and goalkeeper Kevin Roberts played for Welton Rovers.

One player who has renewed acquaintance with his former boss is midfield player Brian Williams who was with Bury before Swindon boss Bobby Smith sold him from there to Q.P.R. He returned to Smith's care in June 1978.

Completing the staff are centre-half Steve Aizlewood, midfielder Roy Carter, striker Gus Gilligan and midfielder Ray McHale.

Aizlewood began with Newport County and is a former Under-23 cap for Wales, Carter started with Falmouth in the Western League before going to Hereford United, Gilligan made his debut last season and McHale is an experienced campaigner with service at Chesterfield and Halifax in a career which has covered more than 300 League matches.

Swindon's record win does nothing to improve our local tradition. It was a 10-1 win in November 1925 against Farnham United Breweries...

Should the game end with the scores being level after 90 minutes play then the replay will take place at the County Ground, Swindon, on Tuesday next the 30th January, kick-off 7.30 p.m. Stand tickets for the replay would be on sale from the Football Club offices tomorrow (Sunday) from 10.00 a.m. to 12 noon, Monday from 9.30 a.m. - 4.30 p.m., and Tuesday from 9.30 a.m. - 2.00 p.m.

The Supporters Club would be running coaches to the replay, and intending travellers are again reminded that they must be members of the Aldershot Football Supporters Club Travel Section and 48 hours notice of application for membership of the Travel Club should be given. Details of the Travel Club may be obtained this afternoon from Radio Shots or from the Football offices tomorrow morning. Bookings by existing members of the Travel Section can be made at the Football Club offices during the afore-mentioned hours.

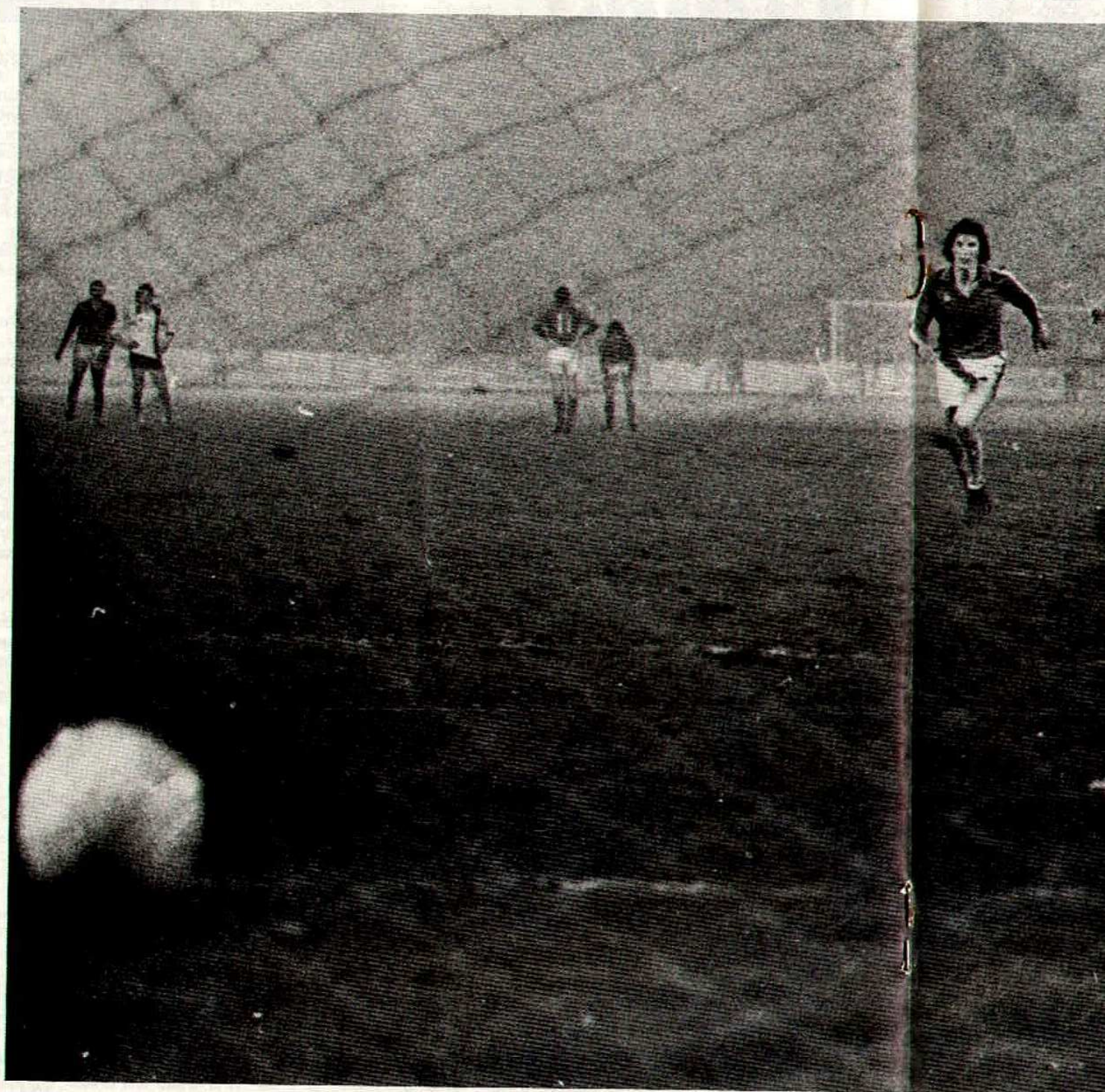

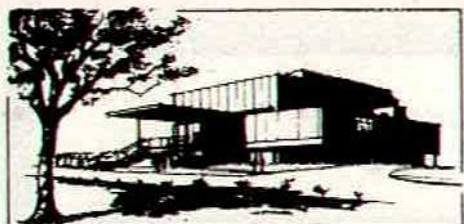


John Dungworth scores from the penalty spot during the Third Round Round
