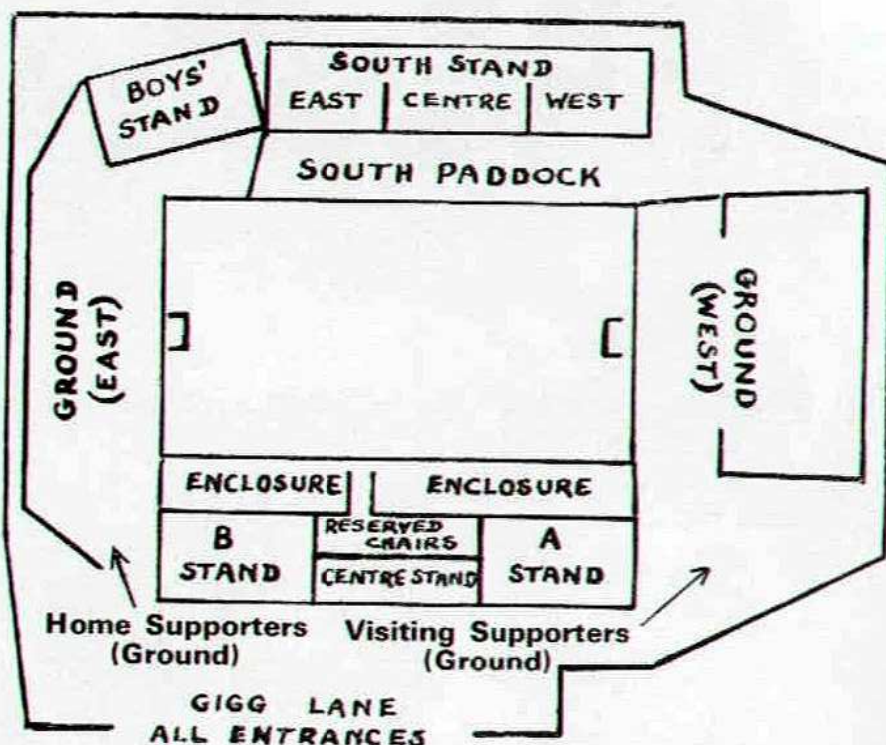

Stewart Imlach Summing Up

Yesterday Manager Dave Hatton and Secretary, John Heap were in Scotland completing the transfer of goalkeeper Dave Latchford from Motherwell.

Coach Stewart Imlach spoke of the draw at Southend as "a good point."

He further revealed that a different pattern of play was employed for the game and it worked well. He said, "Following the goals conceded against Blackpool and Hull we had to stabilise at the back and the system did what we intended. I was a little surprised at Southend's performance. They just could'nt break us down and I thought that they became a little frustrated."

Stewart had words of praise for John Forrest who had an outstanding match and John Ritson.

Mr. Imlach continued, "We now have two home games on the trot and they will be hard. There is a bit of spice added tonight by the return of former Bury players in the Swindon line up. But the ball is in our court and I was pleased that we looked more like the old team last Saturday."

David Constantine who has slotted well into the side goes full time shortly.

Stewart Imlach continued, "I have been impressed by Constantine. He has some good attributes required by a player and when he comes full time I think we shall see the best of him then."

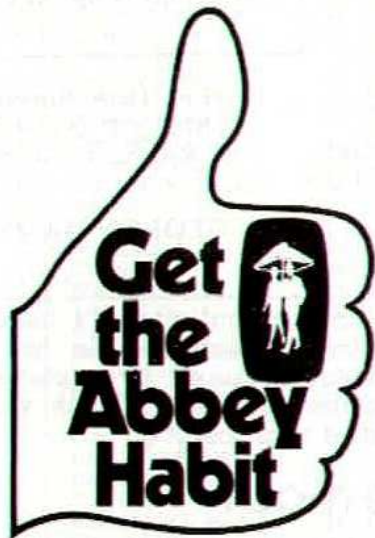

Five of our players accompanied P.F.A. Chairman, Gordon Taylor to the Hilton Hotel, London for the Footballers Annual Dinner and Presentation recently. Among the 950 guests were Keith Kennedy, Bill Tucker, Danny Wilson, Brian Stanton and Alan Woolfall who gave their team mate full support. It was Gordon Taylor's first dinner in the chair, and on arrival back at Gigg Lane the following day for training, Gordon was delighted that everything had gone well.

He said, "This function is the biggest in the World of Footballers and it is a tremendous gathering of players, past and present. I was very nervous before my speech. I have of course done speeches before but not in front of this size of audience and the television cameras. A lot of players came up to me beforehand and wished me well." Kevin Keegan, who flew over from Germany, specially for the occasion told Gordon Taylor that he was nervous at just presenting the Young Player of the Year Award to West Brom's Cyrille Regis.

Tickets are apparently pretty difficult to come by and 300 were unsuccessful this year. The atmosphere must be somewhat unique and most important, as Gordon added, "You can really feel the comradeship amongst players coming through."

STEVE AIZLEWOOD. Steve signed with home-town Newport County in 1969 and made 191 appearances for them before joining Swindon in March 1976. He made 71 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season and is a former Welsh Under 23 International.

JIMMY ALLAN. Born in Inverness he was signed from Brora Rangers in October 1970 as an apprentice and on full forms nine months later. Although he made his debut in September 1971, it was not until 1976/1977 that he became established in the side. Had made 158 League appearances at the end of last season.

ROY CARTER. Roy who comes from Torpoint, Cornwall played part time Western League Football with Falmouth before joining Hereford in the summer of 1975. He quickly established himself in the side there and played in the team that won promotion to the second division in 1975/1976. Signed for Swindon in December 1977 having made 64 League appearances for Hereford and had made 18 more for Swindon by the seasons end.

ANDY FORD. Andy comes from Minehead and started his career with Bournemouth although he did not reach their League team. A move to Southend in 1972 led to a place in that clubs League side and he made 135 such appearances before moving to Swindon at the start of last season. He made 33 appearances last season mostly at left back where he has taken over from the long serving John Trollope, but he has also played in midfield at odd times and as a central defender.

BRYAN HAMILTON. Born in Belfast and transferred from Millwall on 13th November, 1978. A former Irish Youth International, he gained his first International Cap at the age of 19. Transferred to Linfield and then to Ipswich in 1969

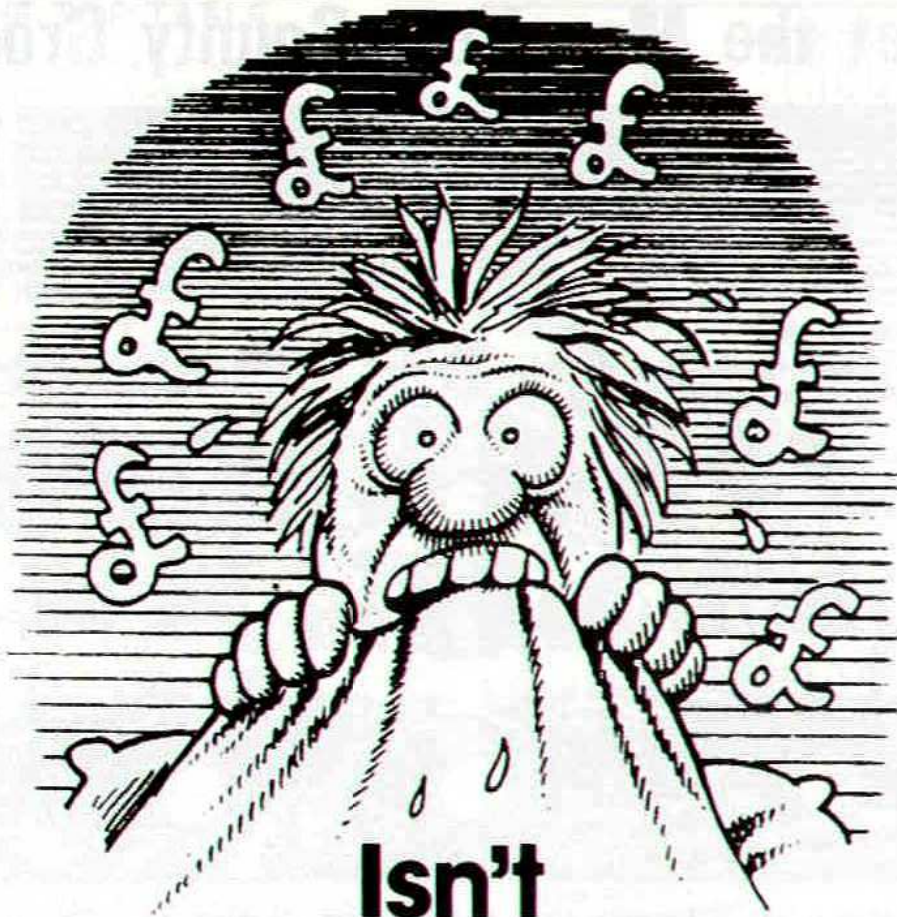
where he was a member of their successful UEFA Cup team. From Ipswich he moved to Everton and signed for Millwall in July, 1977. Bryan a current International and who has played in three World Cup Series for Northern Ireland, has recently captained Northern Ireland in the last Home International Championships. Bryan was signed not only for his playing skills, but also to complete the Club's coaching staff.

IAN MILLER. Ian comes from Perth but he first played League football for Bury making 9 full appearances and a number as substitute. He moved to Nottingham Forest but did not make the first team until a further move to Doncaster Rovers in August, 1975. He became a regular first team player there before his transfer to Swindon who had been interested in signing him for a number of months in the 1978 close season.

RAY McHALE. Ray comes from Sheffield and made his League debut for Chesterfield in Season 1971/72. After 123 League games he signed for Halifax Town where he was top scorer in one season although a midfield player. He did not miss a single match before signing for Swindon to the end of last season and usually plays as the link man in midfield although he likes to get forward and has a hard shot that made him the regular penalty taker last term.

ANDY ROWLAND. Andy was signed from Bury in September, 1978, where he had been the top scorer for the past two seasons. Prior to signing for Bury in 1974, Andy was on the playing staff of Derby County.

BRIAN WILLIAMS. Brian is from Manchester and played 148 games for Bury until present Swindon Manager Bobby Smith sold him to Q.P.R. during the 1977 close season. He made 22 First Division appearances for Q.P.R. last season before signing for Swindon in June, 1978.

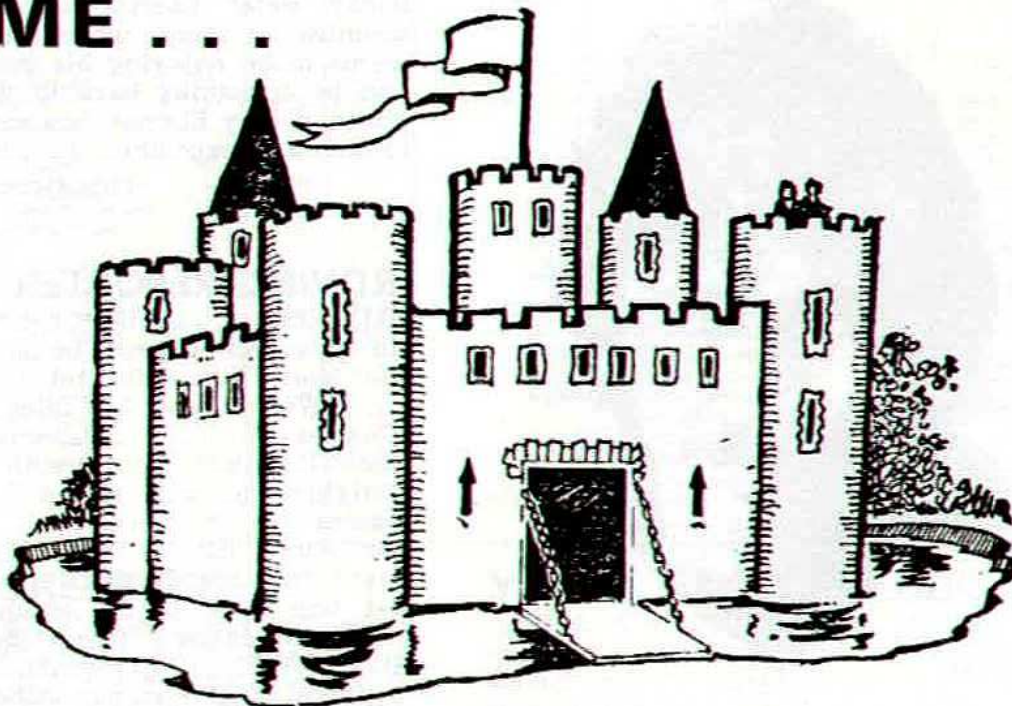

THIS WEEK'S GUEST SPOT

— Gerry Keenan (Port Vale)



Gerry Keenan needs no introduction to Bury fans, for he was our regular full back up to his transfer to Port Vale in October last.

He joined the Gigg Lane staff from non-league soccer and under the watchful eye of Dennis Butler, who was Reserve Team Coach at the time, progressed satisfactorily to win a first team place.

Gerry once said that Dennis Butler was the most influential person in his career and it was probably little surprise, on reflection, that Dennis should return for the full back. Gerry Keenan still lives in Bury and travels daily to Vale Park along with two other ex-Shakers in Peter Farrell and Brian Sinclair.

Talking about life in the Fourth Division with Port Vale, Gerry said, "Dropping to a lower division didn't worry me at first but the standard in the fourth isn't so high as I had thought. Play is more physical and you probably only experience about twelve decent games throughout the season. On reflection I am disappointed at the standard."

The full back hastily added however, "But Port Vale is above fourth division set up and if we don't succeed in our promotion hunt this term we certainly will succeed next. Dennis Butler is rebuilding the side and he has in fact signed eight players since becoming Manager. Once we get a settled side, then consistency will follow."

Assisting Dennis Butler at Vale Park is the remarkable ex-England goalkeeper, Gordon Banks, and he is apparently doing a great job on the coaching side.

Gerry Keenan had a word to say about tricky Peter Farrell who showed good promise at Bury when he said, "Peter seems to be enjoying his game again now and he is coming back to the Farrell we know." Gerry Keenan has scored two goals to date and captained the side recently.

TONIGHT'S REFEREE

RON BRIDGES (Deeside), Started refereeing in 1958. Promoted to Cheshire County in 1972 and then to the Football League in 1974. He was linesman in the European Cup — Bayern Munich v. Real Madrid in 1976 and Northern Ireland v. England in 1975. In 1977/78 refereed England v. Finland Under 21, and Wales v. Scotland Under 21.
