TRANSFER GLUT

Northern Ireland international Trevor Anderson has been put on the transfer list by Peterborough, who are facing Division Four soccer next season. Their Manager Peter Morris has put eight players on the list - three on free transfers, including skipper lan Ross, the former Liverpool and Aston Villa defender.

Bill Green, who cost Peterborough a record £60,000 from West Ham 10 months ago, is listed, along with ex-Luton striker Barry Butlin, Harry Holman and Archie Styles. The other free transfers are Peter Hindley and teenager Rodney Leadbeater.

Newcastle have caused a stir by giving a free transfer to their 30 year old scottish international sweeper John Blackley. This shock news came a year after Blackley was voted Newcastle's player of the year and named in

Scotland's original 40 for the World Cup finals.

Blackley joined from Hibernian for £100,000 and has been with Newcastle for two years.

Four other players have been released South Africans striker Andy Parkinson, who has played in the first team, and youngsters Stephen Burn, Colin Mullen, and Kevin Patterson.

NEW BOSS FOR COBBLERS

Northampton have appointed Clive Walker team manager. He has been acting-boss since Mike Keen was sacked in March, has been Northampton's trainer for two years, and was a defender with Leicester, Mansfield and Northampton.

The club also have a new chairman -Neville Ronson, who returns in place of Bob Brett. Ronson rejoined the Board only recently after a two-year break, but was chairman for three years when Bill Dodgin was manager.



THE SEASIDE SCENE

As tonight is our last home game of the season and the next to last fixture, it is appropriate to reflect on a disappointing year.

Those who felt the side could bounce straight back to Division II at the first attempt have been proved wildly optimistic as the team has struggled to maintain a point a game. There have been moments of rich pleasure, like the away romps at Bury and Chesterfield, the glory of beating Ipswich in the league cup and so nearly repeating it against Manchester City, and the 5-0 drubbing of championship chasing Shrewsbury at Bloomfield Road.

As the season has ground through a miserable winter we have seen what a tough division the Third is and that above all else skill is not such an important factor in getting out of it as aggression and discipline.

Within passing weeks, attendances have fallen off and interest sagged to an all-time low. But there IS interest if it can be tapped by successful team strengthening this summer.

Quality players like Bob Hatton, Paul Hart and Mickey Walsh cannot be replaced over-night, certainly from the standpoint of a Third Division club on 3,500 gates.

Time and patience are the qualities which bigger clubs than Blackpool have had to summon in reserve. Bolton, Aston Villa and other have encountered the difficulties Blackpool face now.

Sheffield United spent nearly £1 million on an impressive array of talent and will be joining us in Division III next season: Blackburn's late surge has been too dilatory to stave off Third Division football next August.

Blackpool's first task is to win the rat race of signing players this summer when freedom of contract inevitably throws up a glut of disgruntled professionals looking for big wage packets. More than ever the club now needs a plan and a pattern, fitting stronger players into the jigsaw piece by piece.

The side cannot make as bad a start with injuries and contract disputes as they did this term. Surely the injuries to Tynan, Davidson, Gardner, Kerr, Pashley, that have occured this season can be put down as a rare blow by the footballing fates.

The fans are hungry for success.

Manager Bob Stokoe is just as hungry.

Optimism is always high between seasons at any club. Blackpool have to back it up with action and determined

moves will be made to ensure that the team building is undertaken with wisdom and foresight. To all those faithfuls who have stood by the club in this turbulent phase in the clubs history, thanks, and surely better times await us all around the corner.

Today's visitors — SWINDON TOWN

JIMMY ALLAN. (Goalkeeper). Born in Inverness he was signed from Brora Rangers in October, 1970 as an apprentice and on full forms nine months later. Although he made his debut in September 1971, it was not until 1976/1977 that he became established in the side. Had made 158 League appearances at the end of last season.

PHIL BATES (Forward). Known as Chic he comes from West Bromwich but spent seven years as a part-time Southern League player before signing for Shrewsbury in 1974. Made 160 League appearances for Shrewsbury being top scorer for two seasons before signing for Swindon in January, 1978. Made a further eleven appearances for Swindon last season.

ROY CARTER (Midfield). Roy who comes from Torpoint, Cornwall played part-time Western League Football with Falmouth before joining Hereford in the summer of 1975. He quickly established himself in the side there and played in the team that won promotion to the second division in 1975/1976. Signed for Swindon in December 1977 having made 64 League appearances for Hereford and had made 18 more for Swindon by the seasons end.

DAVID CUNNINGHAM (Forward). Dave, from Kircaldy, played 44 games for Brechin City in the Scottish League and

moved to Southend in 1973. After 56 League appearances and a period on loan to Hartlepool he moved to Swindon in the 1977 close season and made 16 League appearances last season. Although short in stature he does not lack determination and can play in midfield or on the wing.

ANDY FORD (Defender). Andy comes from Minehead and started his career with Bournemouth although he did not reach their League team. A move to Southend in 1972 led to a place in that clubs league side and he made 135 such appearances before moving to Swindon at the start of last season. He made 33 appearances last season mostly at left back.

RAY McHALE (Midfield). Ray comes from Sheffield and made his League debut for Chesterfield in Season 1971/1972. After 123 League games he signed for Halifax Town where he was top scorer in one season although a midfield player. He did not miss a single match before signing for Swindon in September 1976 after 86 games. Ray made 81 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season and usually plays as the link man in midfield.

KENNY STROUD (Midfield). Ken is a Londoner but has been with the Club since he was an apprentice and is now one of the longest serving players at the Club. Although signed as a professional in 1970

and made his League debut in 1971/1972 it was not until 1974/1975 that he gained a regular place in the team. Ken had made 154 League appearances to the end of last season, mostly in midfield but he enjoys playing as a central defender.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Defender). John Trollope is locally born and has been with the Club since he was an apprentice making 737 League appearances to the end of last season nearly all at left back.

Last season he passed the old record for one club domestic appearances in this Country, retired from the first team to take up the job of Youth Manager, was voted player of the year by the readers of the local newspaper and was awarded the M.B.E.! He remains in training as cover and could still beat Jimmy Dickenson's League appearance record for a single club player.

IAN MILLER (Forward). Ian comes from Perth but he first played League football for Bury making 9 full appearances and a number as substitute. He moved to Nottingham Forest but did not make the first team until a further move to Doncaster Rovers in August 1975. He became a regular first team player there before his transfer to Swindon who had been interested in signing him for a number of months in the 1978 close season.




PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

SUPPORTER'S CLUB NOTES

For the last home match of the 1978-79 season Swindon Town are the visitors tonight. It is quite possible that Swindon will be coming to Bloomfield Road looking for 2 points to clinch promotion. They have been in the thick of the exciting promotion battle for most of the season and should bring a good following of supporters with them. With 25 victories to their credit they have won more matches than any other team in the division. Their 8 away wins were at Brentford, Bury, Exeter, Lincoln, Mansfield, Oxford, Rotherham and Swansea. The fixture at the County Ground last September resulted in probably Blackpool's best result of the season. Tommy Sermanni scored the only goal of the game in the 88th minute after lain Hesford had saved a penalty.

Blackpool have won all games played between the two clubs at Bloomfield Road. The last meeting was in 1973 when Blackpool won 2-0 with a Terry Alcock goal and an own goal. The complete record between the clubs is as follows:

Most Blackpool supporters will want to forget this season which has been the worst one ever. Bob Stokoe hasn't managed to keep a settled team all season and he is still no nearer knowing his best team now than he was a year ago when he joined the club. Signings are to be made during the summer so let's hope that next season gives the now small band of faithful supporters something to cheer about.

The Reserve team succeeded in avoiding having to apply for re-election to the Central League. The vital points were gained in the


