The Clubs A team also proved themselves a capable side with a 0-0 draw against Manchester City A team away from home last weekend. This was also a good achievement particularly with our side consisting of youngsters still playing at schoolboy level together with three apprentices. Well done lads.

Everyone was deeply shocked earlier this week to learn of the sudden death of Bill Shankly the former Liverpool manager. Shanks, as he was affectionately known was greatly admired and respected by all who knew him. Football has indeed lost one of its greatest ambassadors. On behalf of everyone here at Turf Moor I extend our deepest sympathy to Mrs. Shankly and her family at the great loss they have suffered.

WELCOMETO

Many Burnley supporters will recall the surprising if not shock defeats the Clarets suffered against our opponents today in past Football League and F.A. Cupties.

The first of these surprising results, was way back in 1947/48, when Burnley were beaten 2-0 in the F.A. Cup at Turf Moor before a crowd of 34,000. It was a shock result which stunned the clubs supporters, for in those days there were not many teams capable of coming to Turf Moor and winning let alone by a two nil margin.

The second occasion in which Burnley were humiliated when playing against Swindon Town was in the first leg in the semi-final of the Football League Cup at Turf Moor, when our visitors today won 2-1. In the second leg at Swindon, it was the Clarets turn to win 2-1 in extra time. The replay which followed was played at the Hawthorns, West Bromwich, and Swindon won the match 3-2 and then went on to win the F.L. Cup at Wembley beating Arsenal 3-1. But like we have said many times, cup matches are a one off situation and the results of these games depend upon which team is on form on the day!

This afternoon we meet the 'Robins' in a league fixture, which is a totaly different situation, for whilst it is important to be on form for each match, it is essential that a team must be playing consistently well if it is to prove worthy of honours at the end of the season.

Today it is our sincere pleasure to welcome to Turf Moor everyone associated with Swindon Town Football Club, and we hope that both teams will provide the fans with an exciting game of football.

Here is the squad from whom their manager, Mr. John Trollope, will select his team for today's match.

ABBLEY, STEVE (FORWARD). Born Liverpool. Signed from local football in season 1978/79 a winger whose opportunities have been limited in the first team. He made his debut at Exeter City in April 1980 and had made 4 full league appearances at the end of last season.

ALLAN, JIM (GOALKEEPER). Born Inverness. Experienced goalkeeper who has been with Swindon since signing from Scottish junior football in 1970. He made his debut against Q.P.R. in September 1971 and has been the regular first team keeper for several seasons. Had made 272 league appearances at the end of last season.

BADDELEY, KEVIN (DEFENDER). Born Swindon. Young defender who served his apprenticeship with Bristol City and made his league debut for that club last season. He was unable to claim a regular first team place and moved to Swindon in the 1981 close season.

BEAMISH, KEN (FORWARD). Born Birkenhead. Joined Swindon in July 1981 as player/coach. He began his career with Tranmere Rovers making 175 league appearances before moving on to Brighton (86 games), Blackburn Rovers (86 games), Port Vale (84 games), Bury (49 games) and finally back to Tranmere Rovers. A consistent goal scorer wherever he has played.

CARTER, ROY (MIDFIELD). Born Torpoint. Played Western league football with Falmouth before joining Hereford United in the summer of 1975. He made 64 league appearances there and was a member of the Third Division Championship side in 1976. He signed for Swindon in December 1977 making his debut against Carlisle that month. He had made 147 league appearances for Swindon at the end of last season and when not required elsewhere plays in midfield. A genuine utility player he can play on either side in midfield and in all back four positions. He has also made the occasional appearance at centre forward.

EMMANUEL, GARY (MIDFIELD). Born Swansea. Began his career with Birmingham City making his league debut in January 1975 and playing in 61 First Division matches before his transfer to Bristol Rovers in December 1978. He made a similar number of league appearances for Rovers and joined Swindon in July 1981.

GRAHAM, MIKE (DEFENDER). Born Lancaster. Began his career with Bolton Wanderers and played his first full league game in September 1978. His chances were limited at Bolton but he made about 30 league appearances mostly at full back before moving to Swindon in July 1981.

GREENWOOD, ROY (FORWARD). Born Leeds. First club was Hull City where he broke into the first team in 1971. He made 118 league appearances for Hull and moved to Sunderland in January 1976 in time to help that club win the Second Division. After 45 league games there he moved to Derby County in February 1979 and made a further 20 league appearances before moving to Swindon in March 1980. He made his debut against Carlisle the following month and had played 27 league games to the end of last season. Although originally an orthodox winger he now plays as a central forward.

HENRY, CHARLIE (DEFENDER). Born London. Joined the club from school as an apprentice signing full professional forms in February 1980. Although his first team debut was at centre forward in a league cup game at Lincoln City in September 1980 he is normally a defender and quickly settled into the right back position where his determined play made him popular with the supporters. He made 31 league appearances last season.

HUGHES, BRIAN (MIDFIELD). Born Ludgershall. Served his apprenticeship with Swindon and made his first team debut at Lincoln City in a league cup tie in August 1980 only a few months after signing professional. He usually takes up the central position in midfield and made 18 league appearances last season.

LEWIS, RUSSELL (DEFENDER). Born Blaengwynfi. After being spotted playing part time football in the Welsh league, he signed for Swindon in September 1976 making his league debut against York City in April 1977. He had to spend several seasons as reserve centre-half but in August 1979 had the opportunity to play at full back which resulted in him holding down the right back position for the rest of that season. Last season he reverted to centre-half and was voted Player of the Year by the supporters for his tireless efforts in defence. He had made 89 league appearances at the end of last season.

MOORES, CRAIG (FORWARD). Born Macclesfield. Young winger or central forward who served his apprenticeship with Bolton Wanderers and made his league debut for them last season. He signed for Swindon in July 1981.

PEACH, DAVID (DEFENDER). Born Bedford. The most experienced player in the present squad he began his career with Gillingham making his league debut in September 1969. After 186 league appearances he moved to Southampton for whom he made 220 more such appearances. Whilst there he won an F.A. Cup winners medal, scored in a League Cup Final, won representative honours for the Football League and as an over-age player in the England under 21 side. Although he usually plays at left full-back he has also played in midfield. He signed for Swindon in March 1980 making his debut that month at Millwall and had made 42 league appearances for the club at the end of last season.

PRITCHARD, HOWARD (FORWARD). Born Cardiff. Began with Bristol City working his way through the junior sides to make his league debut in August 1978. He made only one appearance that season but began to appear fairly regularly over the next two seasons mainly as an orthodox winger. He made around 40 league appearances for City and signed for Swindon in August 1981.

RIDEOUT, PAUL (FORWARD). Paul signed pro forms on 14 August last but appeared in the first time last season as an apprentice. He scored on his debut against Hull City in November 1980 and made 12 full league appearances last season. A former England Schoolboy International he scored a hat trick against Scotland Schoolboys in May 1980.

ROWLAND, ANDY (FORWARD). Born Derby. And was an apprentice with his home town club but his league debut came after a transfer to Bury in the summer of 1974. He was three times leading scorer and made 169 league appearances before his move to Swindon in September 1978. He made his debut for the club against, Blackpool that month and has been a consistent goal scorer throughout the 114 league games that

he had played for the club up to the end of last season.

STEVENS, MARK (GOALKEEPER). Young goalkeeper who served his apprenticeship with Bristol Rovers and signed for Swindon in the 1981 close season.

STROUD, KEN (DEFENDER). Born London. Served his apprenticeship with Swindon, signing professional forms in 1970 and is now the longest serving player with the club. He made his debut against Q.P.R. in September 1971 and had made 272 league appearances at the end of last season. Much of his early career was spent in midfield but he is now established as a central defender.


THE MANAGER

JOHN TROLLOPE Born at Wroughton near Swindon, he joined the club as an apprentice and made his debut in 1960 against Halifax Town. He played in the promotion winning teams of 1963 and 1969 and at one stage played in 368 consecutive first team games. The height of his playing career came when he played in the side that beat Arsenal in the 1969 League Cup Final. In March 1978 he made his 832nd first team appearance (727 in the league) and retired to become the club's youth manager. He was however, recalled to first team duty later that season and in the following season. It seemed that a game at Blackpool in May 1979 would be his last but another recall in September 1980 saw him make a new appearance record for a single club of 770 league games. If cup games are included he has played 878 matches for the club nearly all of them at full back.

The Manager's job became vacant in October 1980 and after considerable thought John decided to accept the position in November even though there was a real threat of relegation. He was awarded the MBE in 1978.





The kids queuing up for autographs outside Bury's ground a couple of weeks ago were too young to remember DENIS LAW the footballer.

He was recognised as Granada T.V.'s new soccer pundit; someone whose views and constructive criticism have quickly become a popular feature on KICK OFF and MATCH TIME.

To older viewers, however, Denis is immediately thought of as one of the greatest players the world has ever seen.

He retired from the game in 1974. In fact, his last competitive match was for Scotland in the

World Cup Finals. Shortly afterwards he began working for BBC Radio as a member of their commentary team, and over the last five years his voice has been heard 'live' from all the world's major soccer occasions. But Denis has always been interested in working for television. And when that opportunity arose during the summer, he readily accepted the chance to join us at Granada, and what a valuable acquisition he's proving to be.

As he was during his playing days, Denis is alert to everything which happens on the pitch, and more often than not he's brimming over with ideas which could be illustrated on MATCH TIME, or KICK OFF the following week. He's a willing learner too, having quickly recognised the difference in technique between radio and television work.

A whole new generation is beginning to appreciate Denis Law's football brain, although to most of us his ability as a player will always provide the fondest memories. During one conversation I had recently a part time football fan referred to Denis as 'a good player'. A good player! It was like calling Liberace a pianist.

Another never to be forgotten player, Bobby Charlton, has been telling me about the success of his summer soccer school.

"The school has become so popular, and successful", said Bobby, "I have been invited all over the world with offers to start similar ventures".

But the most pleasing thing according to the one time Manchester United and England star is that many of the youngsters who have taken part in the scheme are now on the books of professional clubs.

"I believe if these young players are taught the basic principles of the game as early as possible, disasters like England's defeat in Norway would not happen", Bobby told me. "The mistakes the England players made that night were all elementary ones; the sort of mistakes schoolboys would be disgusted with themselves for making. At the Soccer School we believe in teaching the basics — thankfully it seems to be paying off."
