We would like to welcome our newest apprentice Rolston Ricketts to the Manor. Rolston, who is sixteen, lives in Headington and went to King Alfred's school in Wantage. He has appeared for the Youth team in the South East Counties Junior League on several occasions this season, and we wish him a long and successful career in professional football.

Did you know that our average home and away gates are almost exactly the same? At home we have been watched by an average crowd of 5,040, whilst away from home the average is 5,037. The largest League gate of the season so far was at our home match with Reading, 9,254, and the lowest when we played away at Chester, 2,008.

Swindon, who were formed in 1881, joined the Football League in 1920 as original members of the Third Division. The Robins, though, had tasted glory as a non-League outfit reaching the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup in 1910 and again in 1912.

They remained in the Third Division until they were promoted at the end of the 1962-63 season but were relegated again two seasons later. However, it was not long before they returned to the Second Division following the most successful season in the club's history, 1968-69. That season saw them finish runners-up in the Third Division and win the League Cup, beating Arsenal by three goals to one after extra time, thus becoming only the second Third Division club to win a Cup Final at Wembley.

The following year saw the Robins win the Anglo-Italian Cup and challenge strongly for promotion from the Second Division finally finishing fifth. The next few years though saw Swindon slip down the table until 1973-74 when they were relegated back to the Third.

Recent seasons have seen Swindon regularly in the top half of the Third Division, but last year five successive defeats at the start of the season saw them firmly anchored in the relegation zone. It was only due to a good run in their last ten matches that they managed to climb to safety, finally finishing 17th but only one point above the relegated clubs.

This season saw Swindon make a good start to the season and three wins and a draw in their first four games saw them top the table, and after twelve games they were still in the top six. However, their form since October has seen them slip down the table and Saturday's disastrous 5-1 home defeat against Huddersfield has pushed them into the bottom four.

Hopes of a repeat of their past glories ended in the League Cup First Round with defeat by Wrexham and in the F.A. Cup Third Round when, following two victories over non-league opposition, they went down by two goals to one at Luton. Swindon will obviously be looking to today's match to halt the slide in their results and their record in these 'derby' games is formidable, as United have not beaten them in the twelve meetings since season 1972-73. United's complete record against Swindon in twenty-six League meetings and one League Cup tie is as follows:—

#### PEN PICTURES

Steve ABBLEY (Forward)

Signed from local football in season 1978/79. A winger whose opportunities had been limited in the first team prior to this season.

Jim ALLAN (Goalkeeper)

Experienced goalkeeper who has been with Swindon since signing from Scottish Junior Football in 1970. He made his debut in September 1971 and has been the regular first team keeper for several seasons, making almost 300 League appearances.

Kevin BADDELEY (Defender)

Young defender who served his apprenticeship and made his League debut for Bristol City. He was unable to claim a regular first team place and moved to Swindon in the 1981 close season.

Roy CARTER (Midfield)

Played Western League football with Falmouth before joining Hereford United in the summer of 1975. He signed for Swindon in December 1977 making his debut that month. A genuine utility player he can play on either side in midfield and in all back four positions.

Gary EMMANUEL (Midfield)

Began his career with Birmingham City, making his League debut in January 1975, and moved to Bristol Rovers in December 1978. Joined Swindon during the close season.

Mike GRAHAM (Defender)

Began his career with Bolton Wanderers and played his first full League game in September 1978. His chances were limited at Bolton and he moved to Swindon in July 1981.

Roy GREENWOOD (Forward)

First club was Hull City where he broke into the first team in 1971. He moved to Sunderland in January 1976 in time to help that club win the Second Division. He moved to Derby County in February 1979 before moving to Swindon in March 1980. Although originally an orthodox winger he now plays as a central forward.

Charlie HENRY (Defender)

Joined the club from school as an apprentice signing full professional forms in February 1980. Although his first team debut was at centre forward he is normally a defender and quickly settled into the right back position.

Brian HUGHES (Midfield)

Served his apprenticeship with Swindon and made his first team debut in August 1980 only a few months after signing professional.

Howard PRITCHARD (Forward)

Began with Bristol City, working his way through the junior sides to make his League debut in August 1978. He made around 40 League appearances for City before signing for Swindon in August 1981.

Paul RIDEOUT (Forward)

Paul only signed pro forms in August but appeared in the first team last season as an apprentice. He scored on his debut against Hull City in November 1980, and he is a former England Schoolboy International.

Andy ROWLAND (Forward)

Andy was an apprentice with his home town but his League debut came after a transfer to Bury in the summer of 1974. He joined Swindon in September 1979, making his debut that month and has since been a consistent goalscorer for the Robins.

Ken STROUD (Defender)

Served his apprenticeship with Swindon, professional forms in 1970 and is now the longest serving player with the club. Much of his early career was spent in midfield but he is now established as a central defender.

Gary WILLIAMS (Defender)

Joined from Blackpool at the start of this season, having started his career at Tranmere Rovers.

Mike CARTER (Forward)

With Swindon on loan from Bolton Wanderers, also spent a period on loan at Mansfield Town.





#### PEPSI GOLDEN GOALS COMPETITION

There have been a lot of ideas put forward in the last few months on how to make football more entertaining, many have involved a change in the way points are awarded for results. The Football League itself, of course, introduced the three points for a win system at the start of this season. The Pepsi Golden Goals competition is based on awarding points for goals scored only and not for results. One point is earned for each goal scored at home, two points for each goal scored away from home, and three bonus points are given when a team scores three or more goals in any match. However, the league tables produced using such a system are of more than academic interest as Pepsi have sponsored the competition in an attempt to produce more goals.

Every month a league table is compiled for each division and the top team in each division receives an award of £1,000.




