




indeed lift our players, who are working flat out to repay you.

COLIN BAILIE (Full Back) – A former apprentice he made his league debut at Oxford United in April 1982, but began to claim a regular place in the side the following season. He became an established member of the team last season at the end of which he had made 71 appearances.

LEIGH BARNARD (Midfield) – Served his apprenticeship with Portsmouth making his league debut at Exeter City in September 1977. He made 89 appearances for Pompey plus 4 on loan to Peterborough United before signing for Swindon in July 1982. Made 92 appearances for Swindon to the end of last season.

PAUL BATTY (Midfield) – A former Swindon apprentice who made his league debut against Crewe Alexandra in September 1982. He quickly became a regular in the centre of midfield and has made 91 appearances to the end of last season.

SCOTT ENDERSBY (Goalkeeper) – He appeared in an F.A. Cup tie for Kettering Town aged 15 but served his apprenticeship at Ipswich Town where he won an England Youth Cap. He moved to Tranmere Rovers in 1981 and made his league debut against Hereford United. He made 91 appearances for the Birkenhead club and joined Swindon in 1983. He made 40 appearances last season and won the Supporters Player of the Season award. MARK GARDINER (Forward) – Promising young forward who made two appearances last season whilst still an

apprentice, his debut being against Mansfield Town on April 29th 1984.

MIKE GRAHAM (Defender) – A former Bolton Wanderers player he made his debut at Mansfield in March 1978

and went on to appear 51 times for that club. He joined Swindon in July 1981 and had made 125 appearances at the end of last season when he was given a free transfer under the Freedom of Contract rules but re-signed in August 1984.

DAVE HOCKADAY (Midfield) – Before joining Swindon in the summer of 1983, he had spent eight seasons and made 178 appearances for Blackpool. Made 39 appearances last season.

LOU MACARI (Midfield) – Swindon's Player/Manager appointed in July 1984 after a distinguished career with Celtic, Manchester United and Scotland. He joined the Old Trafford club in 1973 after over 50 appearances for Celtic and went on to make around 390 appearances for United. He also gained 24 Scottish caps.

ALAN MAYES (Forward) – Alan is in his second spell with the club having resigned in July 1983 after 76 appearances for Chelsea. He began with QPR but only made his league debut (against Port Vale) after a move to Watford. He made 155 appearances there (plus 10 on loan to Northampton) before coming to Swindon in February 1979. He made 112 appearances before moving to Chelsea in December 1980.

GARRY NELSON (Forward) – Garry's only previous club was Southend United for whom he made his league debut against Colchester United in October 1979. He went on to make 140 appearances for Southend and joined Swindon in July 1983. He made 43 appearances last season.

ANDY ROWLAND (Forward) – Although Andy began with Derby County it was not until he moved to Bury that he played first team football. Made his league debut at Swindon in August 1974 and a total of 203 appearances for Bury before moving to Swindon in September 1978. With 264 appearances for Swindon to the end of last season he is the club's senior professional and before this season began his career goals scored totalled 161.

PETER COYNE (Striker) – Joined Manchester United in 1975 where he played for two years including one-full game in the first team. He then joined non-league Ashton United before signing for Crewe in 1978 for whom he played around 120 first team games. In 1981 he joined Northern Premier League club Hyde United, playing 103 games for them before joining Swindon Town.





EUROPEAN SUPER LEAGUE SCENE

"Today's visitors Reykjavik, are finding life tough at the top. Currently bottom, they can't be fancying their chances today against unbeaten Quakers.' It looks like we'll figure in the championship play offs for the third consective season to be joined, probably, by any three from Benfica, Juventus, Liverpool, Dynamo Kiev or Bayern Munich. Incidentally if Reykjavik finish last and are eliminated, a Northern European club will be balloted in, there being no other suitable Icelandic team. The champion clubs of Britain, Russia, West Germany, Poland and Benelux will qualify for the ballot. Well done Kev Smith on achieving your 250th League game for Darlington this afternoon. Kev made his debut for the club v Torquay, away, 29th September 1979. Here's to the next 250!

FEETHAMS SUNDAYS

This is the fifth season that Football League games have been able to be played on Sundays under normal conditions, although there were a number of Sunday games during 1974 owing to the power crisis. The Quakers of course set the ball rolling almost five years ago when we were the very first club to take advantage of the new legislation and stage a Sunday game. Mansfield Town were the visitors that day on 15th February 1981 when amid national press and television coverage (highlights were on the news) we attracted a crowd of 5,932 - treble our previous home gate! At the end of an exciting game the scores were level at 2-2, with Ian Hamilton (penalty) and Alan Walsh doing their Sunday best. We staged two more Sunday games that season beating Hereford United in March and Torquay United in April.

The following season we again staged a trio of games in the spring of 1982 beating York City and Crewe Alexandra, but losing to Hereford by a single goal. Since then two seasons have gone by without us having a league game at home on a Sunday. However we have staged three most attractive Sunday games during this time with the visitors being Southampton, Nottingham Forest and Newcastle United (if only they had been league games!).

Southampton came to us on Sunday 18th April, Kevin Keegan and all, for a match to raise money for our Centenary Appeal. A crowd of 9,415 saw a tremendous game with Dave Speedie hitting a superb hat trick. The following season Brian Clough's Nottingham Forest side paid us a visit on 24th April 1983 for a challenge match to mark the club's centenary. Then last May, Newcastle United (Kevin Keegan again) came to play in a Testimonial game for David Barton, only the day after the Magpies clinched promotion to Division One. So recently we have enjoyed some pretty good Sunday action.

Looking backtenyears to the power crisis of 1974, we find that the Quakers played four matches at home between the end of January and mid-March, when floodlights were unable to be used. A goal-less draw with Torquay was followed by wins over Scunthorpe and Bradford City, before our worst Sunday defeat by Lincoln City, 0-3. So our Sunday league record at Feethams is:

F.A. CUP DRAW

After three non-league opponents last season in the F.A. Cup in Mossley, Altrincham and Maidstone we have again drawn a team from outside the Football League. This time it is Frickley Athletic of the Gola League, who disposed of Stalybridge Celtic in round one to reach the second round for the first time ever. Formerly known as Frickley Colliery they changed their name to Athletic in 1974 and later joined the Northern Premier League, before entering the Alliance Premier (now Gola) League in 1982. Their ground, Westfield Lane, is situated in South Elmsall, near Pontefract.







ENCOUNTERS

The two great railway towns of Swindon and Darlington meet for only the fourth time in league competition here at Feethams this afternoon. Yet it was over seventy years ago in the times of the Great Western and North Eastern Railways that the sides first met in the F.A. Cup, before either were members of the Football League. This was in 1910/11 when Darlington made history by playing eleven games in eight rounds from the first qualifying round to the last sixteen. Both minnows had had their moments in earlier rounds as the Quakers had knocked out First Division Sheffield United, while Swindon had accounted for Woolwich Arsenal, as the First Division side were then Eastern League North So Darlington met Southern League Swindon on 26th February 1911 for a place in the quarter finals. Nine thousand packed Feethams that day and the majority went away disappointed as Darlington slumped to a 0-3 defeat.

Another fifty two years passed before we met again; this time in the Football League Cup second round in September 1962 at the County Ground, Swindon. Again Darlington were on the receiving end going down heavily 0-4. Only three years later we were paired again at the same stage of the competition, but this time at Feethams. Goals from Bryan Conlon and Jim Lawton (transferred to Swindon after the game in part exchange with Alan Sproates) saw the Quaker's through, and gave us our first win

over Swindon at the third attempt. The first league game between the clubs came in the 1966/7 season when we were promoted to the Third Division. Our first away game was down in Wiltshire in August 1966 when again we suffered a 0-4 defeat. The return game at Feethams on New Year's Eve of that year gave us some revenge when we triumphed by two goals to one. Swindon Town remained in Division Three at the end of that season and we did not meet again until they finally fell into the Fourth for the first time in 1982. We recorded the double over them in 1982/3 winning at Feethams by a single Alan Walsh goal, and then recording our first ever win at the County-

Ground in March 1983, when an own goal by keeper Jim Allan and a tremendous 25 yarder from Dave McLean gave us a fine 2-1 win. Last season we repeated our 1-0 home win in September 1983 with Alan Walsh again being on target, this time from the penalty spot. However our trip to Swindon in April saw us go down to a single Leigh Barnard goal.

Now the overall record stands at five wins to Darlington and four to Swindon in league and cup, without a draw ever being played.
