Our results have lacked consistency in the past three weeks but I suppose that it is understandable as we have played teams from the First, Second, Third and Fourth Divisions in the space of 15 days.

After our defeat at Highbury we bounced back in great style when we visited Cardiff City but then gave a disappointing display at Port Vale.

I think we let ourselves down badly at Vale Park but on Wednesday we regained some of our pride when we drew 1-1 with Third Division Bristol City in the first leg of the Freight Rover Trophy.

We created the better scoring chances and though our finishing did not match our approach work it was a good result against a team that had won on every previous visit to Edgar Street.

I thought, however, that the attendance of 2,690 fell below: expectations in view of the calibre of the game but so far the Freight Rover competition has not yet caught the public imagination like the Milk Cup and the F.A. cup.

Mind you it took some time before soccer fans accepted the Milk Cup so lets hope that the Freight Rover Trophy will also eventually get the support it deserves for a competition that takes the finalists to the hallowed corridors of Wembley.

We are grateful to Freight Rover for their sponsorship but there are times when we must consider what is best for the game and money isn't always everything. It helps, however, to keep us on an even keel and we certainly appreciate the extra cash that was produced by our successful run in the F.A. cup.

Nevertheless the league is our bread and butter and after our reverse at Port Vale last week it is important that we get a good result this afternoon.

SWINDON TOWN have failed to make their mark since slipping into the Fourth Division for the first time the season before last.

They finished eighth at their first attempt to regain a place in the Third Division and last season they slipped to 14th place.

They are currently in the top half of the table but have failed to play with any degree of consistency as demonstrated when they beat promotion contenders Chesterfield 4-0 on New Year's day and then lost by the same margin when they visited bottom-of-thetable Wrexham four days later.

They also beat Blackpool 4-1 and then went down by four goals to Northampton, one of the current re-election candidates.

The Robins were formed over 100 years ago in 1881 and have had two spells in the Second Division but have spent most of their life in the Third - a total of 56 seasons out of 64.

The club's glory year was in 1969 when they reached the final of the Football League Cup as a Third Division club and toppled mighty Arsenal at Wembley, winning 3-1 in extra time. At the end of the season they also gained promotion to the Second Division.

The Robins have enjoyed more cup glory than most clubs in the lower bracket of the league and during their early years when in the Southern League they twice reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup.

Only four years ago they also reached the semi-finals of the league cup after beating Arsenal again in a replay. But they were then eliminated themselves by Wolves, the eventual winners, in a replay.

This season, however, they were eliminated by Bristol Rovers in the two leg first round and also made an early exit in the F.A. Cup when non-league Dagenham beat them 2-1 after a goalless draw.

SCOTT ENDERSBY. Goalkeeper. He appeared in an F.A. cup-tie for Kettering Town at the age of 15 but served his apprenticeship with Ipswich Town at Portman Road where he won an England youth cap. Made his league debut for Tranmere Rovers against Hereford United in September 1981 and played 91 league and cup games for the Birkenhead club before joining Swindon in July 1983. He was voted the supporters' player of the season last term when he missed only a handful of first team games.

COLIN BAILIE. Defender. A former club apprentice he made his league debut at Oxford three years ago and since then has made in the region of 100 league and cup appearances for Swindon.

NIGEL GRAY. Defender. He made 262 league and cup appearances with Orient and had a spell on loan with Charlton Athletic before Swindon signed him last term. He was slow to settle and went on loan to Brentford for a short while.

CHARLIE HENRY. Defender. Supported Swindon as a boy and joined the club as an apprentice before signing full-time forms in February 1980. Made his debut five years ago at Lincoln and has now totted up over 150 first team games.

CHRIS RAMSEY. Defender. Started his career with Brighton after playing for Bristol City as an amateur. He made 30 league appearances for Brighton and joined Swindon on loan in August. He was officially transferred in December.

MARK DEMSEY. Midfield. Joined Swindon on loan from Manchester United recently. He is a former Old Trafford apprentice.

LEIGH BARNARD. Midfield. Served his apprentice with Portsmouth and made 89 appearances for the club in addition to four on loan with Peterborough before moving to Swindon in July 1982. He has since totted up 100 games with the club.

DAVE HOCKADAY. Midfield. Before joining Swindon in the summer of 1983 he spent eight seasons at Bloomfield Road and made 178 appearances for Blackpool. He missed only a handful of games last season.

LOU MACARI. Midfield. Appointed player-manager last July after a distinguished career with Celtic and Manchester United. He made 390 appearances for United and won 24 Scottish caps. Recently scored his 100th league and cup goal.

PAUL BATTY. Midfield. A former club apprentice he made his league debut against Crewe Alexandra in September 1982 and since then has topped the 100 mark in club colours.


ANDY ROWLAND. Forward. Started his career at Derby but made his league debut with Bury with whom

he played 203 first team games before moving to Swindon in 1978. He is now nearing 300 appearances with Swindon and his career goal total is now 166.

GARY NELSON. Forward. Made his league debut for Southend against Colchester United in October 1979. He made 140 appearances for the seasiders and joined Swindon last term playing 43 first team games.

PETER COYNE. Forward. Started his career with Manchester United 10 years ago making one First Division appearance for the First Division club. Before joining Swindon this season he had spells with Crewe, Ashton United and Hyde United. In September 1980 he scored four goals against United when Crewe caned Hereford 5-0.

IAN MUIR. Forward. Served his apprenticeship with Queens Park Rangers with whom he made his league debut. He had a spell on loan with Burnley and then moved on to Birmingham before joining Brighton last season. He is currently on loan with Swindon.







UNITED will be aiming to register their first double of the season this afternoon having beaten SWINDON by three clear goals when the teams met at the County Ground in September.

After a goalless first half STEWART PHILLIPS (2) and PAUL MADDY snapped up the goals that gave United an impressive victory.

The last time they achieved a league double over the Robins was during the 1975-76 season when they went on to win the Third Division championship.

But honours are so far even in the previous 11 league games between the clubs, both teams having gained five wins apiece and scored 13 goals each.

OLLIE KEARNS and Phillips scored the goals when United beat Swindon 2-1 at Edgar Street last season.

United have re-arranged their three outstanding league matches which were postponed due to the bad weather last month and also the club's successful F.A. cup run.

They have arranged to visit Stockport County on Monday, 11th March and will entertain Rochdale on Wednesday, 3rd April and Crewe Alexandra on Wednesday, 24th April.

They will be playing twice a week for the remainder of the season and April looks like being a particularly busy month with a total of five home games.

United have been drawn to visit SWANSEA CITY in the quarter-finals of the Welsh Cup

following their runaway 4-0 win over CARDIFF CITY at Ninian Park last week. Swans have never been beaten by United in six matches between the clubs and have chalked up four successive wins at Vetch Field and drawn twice at Edgar Street. In the other quarter-final matches NEWPORT COUNTY have a home tie with WREXHAM, the holders SHREWSBURY visit RHYL and BANGOR CITY entertain TOWYN.

All-round sportsman STEVE EMERY has been elected captain of Ledbury Cricket Club for the coming season.

Steve, who celebrated his 29th birthday on Thursday, has played for the town club since he left school and his aim is to take them back into the top division of the Hereford and District League.

Former United goalkeeper KEVIN CHARLTON has played a prominent role in helping Telford United to become only the fourth non-league club since the war to reach the fifth round of the F.A. cup.

During four years with Telford he has only been on the losing side twice in 15 cup matches against Canon League opposition - a record unrivalled in non-league soccer. Next Saturday when he plays against EVERTON at Goodison Park the First Division club will include one of Kevin's former United colleagues KEVIN SHEEDY in their line-up.

BRIAN HILL, of KETTERING

commenced refereeing in 1965 and progressed by way of the United Counties and Southern Leagues to the Football League. He refereed the 1983 F.A. Challenge Trophy final at Wembley and also an F.A. County Youth Cup final in addition to schoolboy internationals. Married with two children he is a wages-cost accountant in the building trade and he enjoys watching all sports and listening to music.


