## The Boss's Brief

I'M hoping that we can find our shooting boots against Swindon this afternoon.

We certainly left them behind last Saturday, when, after dominating our top of the table clash at Rochdale, we saw all our impressive approach play ruined in front of goal.

I've spent the week impressing on the players the need to be far more professional in their attitude in front of goal.

It's no use producing performances if you are not capable of providing the coup de grace and that was one of our major weaknesses last season.

I don't want a repetition of that situation when we created probably more chances than any other team in the Division.

But while we were disappointed with the outcome at Spotland in relation to the nature of our performance, it underlined how unpredictable and cruel football can be.

Whereas we should have been three goals in front before Rochdale scored last Saturday, I felt we were fortunate to escape with a 1-0 victory over Scunthorpe the previous weekend — so I suppose one match has balanced out the other.

Swindon may not have set the Division alight in the opening weeks of the season, but they probably feel that



their campaign is now taking off after last Friday's 3-2 victory over Northampton.

Lou Macari has spent quite a bit of money in the summer, and, as I've stated before, any team that is able to spend money in the Fourth Division ought to be sure of promotion.

I'm fully expecting them to be one of the teams involved in the promotion race and they'll provide us with a strong test this afternoon.

Our Milk Cup exit at Northampton was very disappointing, especially in the light of the second round draw which provided several Fourth Division clubs with moneyspinning ties.

But on the night we could have few complaints about the merits of Northampton's victory even though we felt the penalty award early in the second half altered the course of the game.

There was no way in the world that it was a penalty, but Northampton took advantage of their good fortune.

With all our strikers now fit, I couldn't afford to retain the services of former England man Trevor Whymark on a match to match basis.

He helped us out of a big hole last month when we were beset by injuries to our front personnel and he did all that could have been asked of him considering his lack of preseason preparation.

If our situation changed and we needed his services again, then I hope he would be available, although by that time he might well have been signed by another club.



MY biggest thrill was Chesterfield's 4-1 aggregate victory over Glasgow Rangers in an Anglo-Scottish Cup Semi-Final, and I saved a Colin McAdam penalty in the second leg at Saltergate which we won 3-0.

MY biggest disappointment is not having played in the First Division. There were rumours that big clubs were interested before my £120,000 move from Torquay to Chesterfield, but I've never been beyond the Second Division.

ONE of the saves which stands out in my mind was the one against Darlington last season when I flicked a point blank Carl Airey header over the bar only for them to score from the resultant corner.

IVE been the victim of several brilliant goals, but probably a 30-yarder from Charlton's Derek Hales was the best when I was at Chesterfield. I had no real chance with the goal, but what made it worse was it was shown on 'Match of the Day'. Every time I replay the incident — it proved to be the winner — I seem to be getting a bit nearer each time!

SUNDERLAND were my boyhood team, with Jim Montgomery and Charlie Hurley my heroes. I watched them whenever I could with the 1973 FA Cup Final victory over Leeds being the greatest moment. I was at Wembley, although I was playing with Derby at the time.

I'M a do-it-yourself fan around the house, the influence coming from my father, while my musical tastes are varied. My favourites include Frank Sinatra, George Benson and Steeleye Dan.

ROY SENIOR: Barnsleyborn winger who made his Posh debut at Shrewsbury in September 1961. Signed from Doncaster, he scored 11 goals in 38 appearances for the club before moving on after three seasons to Millwall (15 games) and finally Barnsley (20).

PAT SHARKEY: Northern Ireland international midfield player signed from Colchester in 1978 after playing previously with Ipswich (17 League games), Millwall (7), and Mansfield (5). He made just 15 appearances in two seasons at London Road, making his debut at Carlisle on March 20, 1979.

JIMMY SHEAVILLS: Tiny winger who made his debut for Posh in their final season of Midland League football in 1959-60. He made just 19 League appearances, including only one in the 1960-61 Fourth Division Championship side before joining Barnsley in 1963 where he played 65 games in two years.

CHESTER'S Stuart Rimmer may have been an Evertonlad, but he wasn't welcomed back to Merseyside with open arms by Tranmere's fans.

He halted the Frank Worthington roadshow with a hattrick at Prenton Park in
Chester's Milk Cup victory,
and then returned there four
days later to score what
proved to be the winner in a
3-2 Fourth Division victory.

Then, as a further blow to Rovers followers, big Frank sold John Clayton, last season's top marksman in the Fourth Division, to Plymouth for a tribunal fixed £24,000.

Poor old Torquay, the League's 92nd club last season, are occupying the undistinguished position again with four defeats in five games, but they did break their duck at home to Colchester to give new manager John Sims a small ray of sunshine.

It took a Phil Cavener penalty at Northampton for Mansfield to concede their first League goal in four games, and then third placed Wrexham breached their defences at Field Mill to earn a 1-1 draw with a Steve Charles goal.

Relegated Cambridge are finding life equally as hard in the Fourth. Aldershot inflicted their fourth successive League defeat with a 2-0 win

at the Abbey Stadium, Massey and Johnson getting the goals.

"I just hit it first time and fortunately it went into the net."

The Bedford-based player, who scored both goals when Posh were beaten at Southend last season, has fitted in well to the scheme of things at London Road and is optimistic about the team's chances this term.

'The manager has built a good side on limited resources and, barring injury, I think we will do well." fore-



casts Lil, who could come face to face today with two of his former Luton team-mates, David Moss and Jake Findlay.

'The fact that I was able to train with the side in preseason helped me to settle down more quickly rather than being thrown in at the deep end after the season had started.

"I like the homely nature of the club and the people behind the scenes and I'm hoping that we can maintain our encouraging start to the season."



TWO years ago today Posh produced the kind of cup fighting quality that has been the hallmark of the club's proud image throughout the decades.

Three goals down from the first leg at Crystal Palace, Posh's task seemed of Everest proportions when they lined up for the London Road return.

But Posh showed they had 'gotta lotta bottle' by cancelling out the Second Division club's lead, and then winning a third round ticket in a dramatic penalty shoot-out.

Ray Hankin, Trevor Quow and Colin Clarke scored in normal time, and then Phil Chard, Martin Pike, Kenny Beech and substitute lan Benjamin grabbed the penalties for a 4-2 'sudden death' win.

There was drama of a different kind when Posh won their first Third Division game of the season — 2-1 at home to Brentford.





IT'S little wonder that Swindon Town are rated as one of the main candidates for Fourth Division success this season.

There were signs towards the end of last season that player-manager Lou Macari was beginning to point the club in the right direction — they finished eighth after some fluctuating fortunes early on.

From that foundation, the wily Scot has added several experienced additions to his pool to build Swindon one of the strongest looking squads in the Division.

Two of the most notable arrivals are goalkeeper Jake Findlay and winger David Moss from First Division Luton.

For Moss, it's a return to the club which gave him his big break in League football before a six-figure move to Kenilworth Road.

And he was on target early on with a goal in Swindon's

But, apart from achieving a 4-3 Milk Cup aggregate victory over their Fourth Division rivals to earn atilt at Lawrie McMenemy's Sunderland in the next round, Macari must be a little disappointed with his side's rather inauspicious start to their League programme.

They lost their opening two games—0-1 at home to Wrexham and 1-4 at Hereford—before defeating Torquay for the second time in a matter of days and then earning a goalless draw at Southend.

It's not promotion stuff in any sense of the word, but with several new faces in the side, it may take a little time for the blend to mix.

The other newcomers include former Mansfield defender Colin Calderwood, Torquay midfield player Derek Hall and ex-Wolves striker Tony Evans.

Swindon are hoping that Evans can rediscover the form which brought him a healthy goal return with Cardiff, Birmingham and Crystal Palace.

So there's plenty of potential and experience in the Swindon squad who will be looking today to repeat last season's success at London Road when a Peter Coyne goal earned them the spoils.

## . . . SWINDON TOWN

SWINDON will be looking to the goalscoring partnership of Peter Coyne and Colin Gordon to fire them towards promotion this season.

The goal aces, plucked from the obscurity of non-League football by Swindon, hit 32 League goals between

them last season.

The goalscoring impact of young Gordon was particularly impressive. Signed from Midlands club Oldbury United last November, he scored on his debut at Rochdale and finished with 17 goals in 33 games, including a hat-trick at Hereford.

Coyne arrived a few months earlier from Hyde United, linking up with his former Manchester United colleague Lou Macari.

He made two First Division appearances for United, joined Crewe after drifting out of football and then had his League career resurrected by Macari after languishing in non-League football.

He scored 15 League goals last season, and hit a hat-trick against Northampton last Friday.

Swindon certainly have no shortage of firepower in their squad with playermanager Macari having

strengthened matters in the summer with Luton winger **David Moss** and Wolves striker **Tony Evans**.

For Moss, it's like the return of the Prodigal Son, having started his League career at Swindon 13 years ago before a£110,000 move to Luton where he made more than 200 League appearances.

Evans was a prolific scorer with Cardiff and Birmingham, but had a lean time in the struggling Wolves side.

Former Manchester United and Scotland star Lou Macari is using his experience when necessary to hinge together the midfield, but in the close season he boosted that

department with the signing of former Coventry player **Derek Hall** from Fourth Division rivals Torquay.

Also operating in that area this season have been utility player Charlie Henry, who has graduated through the junior ranks, former Portsmouth man Leigh Barnard who was once on loan to Posh and David Hockaday, signed from Blackpool two years ago.

Andy Rowland, who once formed a deadly attack with Alan Mayes, is now stopping goals as a centre-half with a new partner in Colin Calderwood, a Scot recruited in the summer from Mansfield.

Jake Findlay, who has linked up with former Luton team-mate David Moss at the County Ground, has taken over in goal from Scott Endersby.

Chris Ramsey, who injured an ankle in Brighton's first FA Cup Final meeting with Manchester United in 1983, has started his second season with Swindon at right-back, with David Cole, signed from Swansea last February, also operating in defence.

This follows the move by city nightclub Rinaldos to sponsor goalkeeper John Turner's gloves.


Now Posh are hoping to expand the scheme by obtaining sponsorship for individual players shirts, shorts, socks, boots, tracksuits and training kit.




