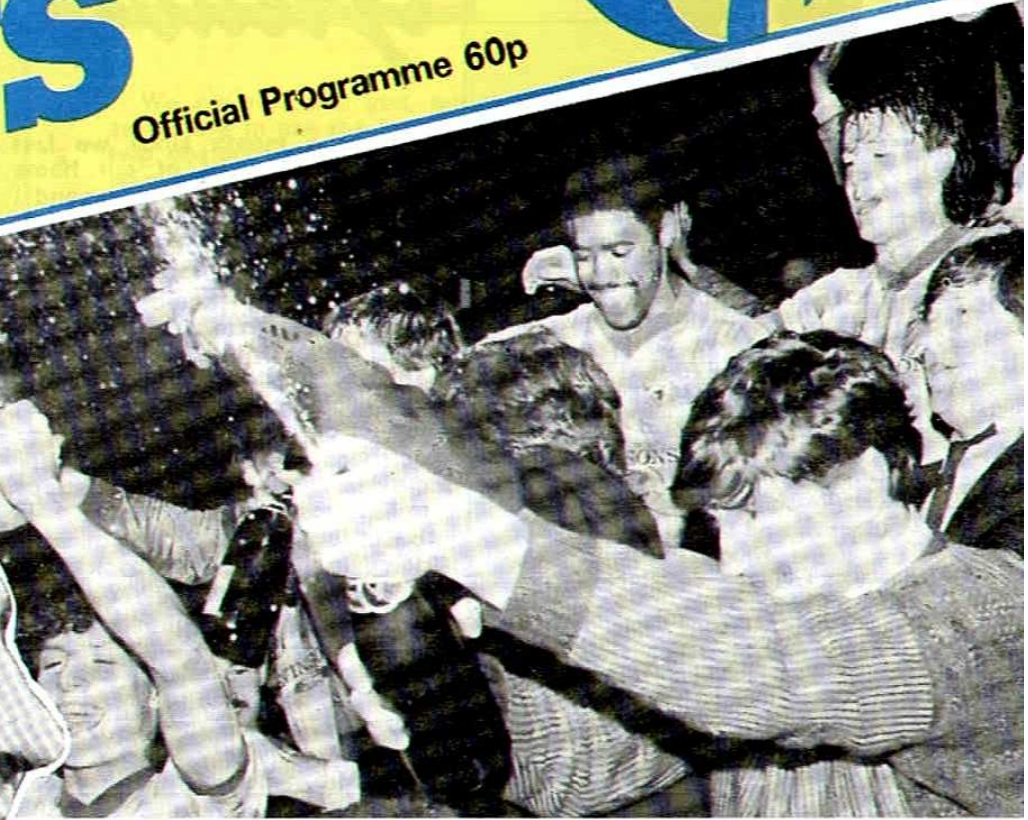

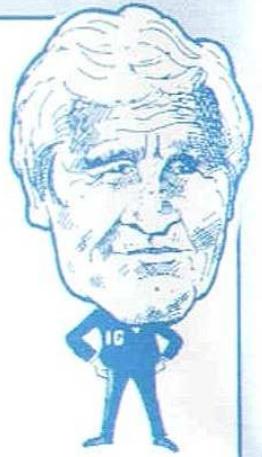

It is a month since we last appeared in front of our home fans, here at Field Mill — and I think that everything is set just right for an excellent game.

Today's visitors Swindon Town, like ourselves, promoted at the end of last season, have made a good start to life back in Division Three, and find like ourselves in a challenging position to climb even further up the division.

It would have been so easy for the fortnight's gap in our fixtures to have lost our momentum.

But fortunately the lads buckled down to bring points back from the two most recent away games at Rotherham and Bristol City.

The two postponements have also created an imbalance between our home and away fixtures.

We have completed eight away games — but only five so far at Field Mill, so it is important that we take full advantage of the outstanding home matches if we are to maintain our position at the top end of the table.

Naturally we were most disappointed that we allowed a two-goal advantage to slip away at Millmoor last Saturday.

But I must say that the entire team showed tremendous character on Tuesday evening, particularly in the second half when we really had to battle and fight to keep a very well earned point.

I can tell you I was very proud of my team, and for once I am going to depart from my usual practice, and comment on the performance of one player... Kevin Hitchcock.

Kevin turned in one of the best goalkeeping displays I have seen

this season — although this deserved praise must not go to his head.

After all he is paid to do the job and he certainly did that at Bristol.

One of the most worrying aspects at the moment is our growing injury list.

For the Bristol match I had only 13 players available — and we picked up more injuries during the 90 minutes, although hopefully most of the sufferers will have recovered in time for today's affair.

Our long-term injuries are slowly on the mend, and I am hopeful that both Neil Whatmore and Roddie Collins will be in action with the reserve side against Notts County this morning.

Gary Pollard had an operation on his knee earlier in the week, but only a minor one, and should be back in action within a couple of weeks.

Paul Garner's long-standing problem however is still causing problems and he has been sent for specialist treatment in an effort to regain his fitness.

What I can say is that when these players with injury problems do get back to fitness, they will have every opportunity to show their paces the moment they are available again.

But we can only wish them well — and a quick recovery.

Finally, can I say how much I am enjoying my work with the current squad of players.

Club Scene

We are sure that you, our supporters are just as pleased as we are to see the team back in action at Field Mill after two postponements inside a week saw us without a home league fixture for a month.

Attractive opposition however to mark our return to home waters, in Swindon Town, managed by the former Scotland and Manchester United star Lou Macari.

Not forgetting either that their team captain is Colin Calderwood who, of course, learned his trade with us here at Mansfield.

Swindon clinched the Division 4 championship when they visited Field Mill at the back end of last season and fought out a 1-1 draw.

Naturally we will be hoping to go one better on this occasion to keep us in the challenging position at the top end of the table.

While we were picking up a valuable point at Ashton Gate at the expense of Bristol City last Tuesday evening, Swindon were going down 2-1 to visitors Bristol Rovers.

So Swindon will be hoping to regain winning ways this afternoon at our expense.

We too will be looking for three points so an epic battle is in prospect.

A new date for your diaries is Tuesday, 25th November, when our postponed game with Newport County will be played.

As yet we have not been able to arrange a new date for the outstanding match with Blackpool.

It seems that we are in for a very busy November this season with three home and four away games scheduled.

We have already travelled to Rotherham and Bristol with visits to Darlington and Walsall still to come.

Swindon today, Newport and Bolton Wanderers provide our home games in this period with Bolton on the 22nd and of course Newport on the 25th as we have already mentioned.

Can we take this opportunity to offer belated congratulations to Neil Whatmore whose wife Gillian presented him with a son some three weeks ago — a brother for Natalie.

A task which we undertook in our Newport programme which, of course, was not published.

We suppose that everyone's thoughts are beginning to turn at this time of the year to Christmas — and Christmas presents.

Always a problem are these stocking fillers — so can we suggest a visit to our club shop where there is an excellent selection of possible gifts to delight, not only the youngsters, but the mums and dads as well.

And don't forget, every little on the financial side, helps the club in what is a very difficult financial period.

STAGS RESERVES

The current injury problems surrounding our club does not only affect our senior side — it is an ongoing thing which stretches not only to our reserve side, but to the youth section as well.

Sending out a full side has been extremely difficult of late, and we have found it necessary on more than one occasion to use trailists to fill in the ranks.

It is important, of course, that we utilise the reserve fixtures in the Midland Intermediate League to give match practice to the senior players who are not currently — or only occasionally — in the senior team, such as Craig McKernon and Les Robinson.

Then there is the need for the likes of Neil Whatmore and Roddie Collins to be in the line-ups on their way to regaining full fitness after a prolonged spell on the sidelines.

Nicky Anderson, who made history with a 10 seconds appearance as substitute for

the first team at Chester, has also joined the ranks of the injured.

He is on crutches at the moment suffering from a very bad ankle ligament problem.

Of our other youngsters Mark Place and Gareth Price, who has a broken bone in a foot, are also among our non-available players.

The constant chopping and changing of our reserve side has not helped our recent results.

We went down 3-0 at Aston Villa, drew with Walsall, and had a couple of reverses in the League Cup losing 2-1 at Peterborough and 5-2 at Nottingham Forest.

In our Midland Youth Cup game against Forest at the City Ground we again lost out this time by a 4-0 margin.

This morning we were away at Notts County after a rearranged midweek meeting with Chesterfield.

YOUTH TEAM

Our search for young players with the potential of a successful professional football career is being stepped up.

Already we are getting an increasing flow of youngsters seeking trials with Mansfield Town.

And we have been entertaining teams on our Tuesday and Thursday evening training sessions from areas in Nottinghamshire and from the South Yorkshire area with the search for new talent very much in mind.

So far we have very successfully concentrated on the local area but are now planning to spread our net even further.

For it becomes increasingly important that we discover our own talent as the financial stresses increase.

Now we are in Division 3 the next aim must be the Second Division and if this is to be achieved, then we must find youngsters capable of reaching that grade.

So far we have several successes in the youth policy to our credit.

Craig McKernon, Les Robinson, Simon Coleman, Nicky Anderson are all rated as possible first-team regulars in the future.

We must ensure that the conveyor belt of young talent does not dry up.

The involvement of Football League Clubs with the local community is to be stepped up after a conference at Lilleshall recently.

The Schools of Excellence are to be extended and schools are to be encouraged to arrange coaching courses in conjunction with the local League club.

At Field Mill we have now been staging coaching courses for youngsters for some time.

The most recent, sponsored by the CHAD was in the October mid-term school holidays, and like all the others, had a waiting list of would-be participants.

Our next will be held during the Christmas holidays and early application to take part is advised when it is advertised.

Our two most recent Notts Combination results were a mixed bag. We lost 1-0 at home to Sachiell Sports and defeated Kimberley Welfare 1-0 at Kimberley.

One scheduled match was postponed late on, but we are hoping to meet Bilsthorpe Welfare away this afternoon.

Don't forget that our home matches are played on the practice pitch here at Field Mill, spectators would be very welcome.

★ Mark Jones of Newcastle United has gone to SWINDON TOWN for £25,000.

★ CARLISLE'S much travelled striker Alan Mayes has joined BLACKPOOL.

★ Southend United have paid £20,000 for SWINDON'S Martin Ling.

★ Coventry City have signed ROTHERHAM'S UNITED'S midfielder Dean Emerson, 23 in a swap deal involving City pair Andy Williams and Gareth Evans.

★ Sheffield United's Tony Philliskirk has joined ROTHERHAM UNITED on a month's loan.

★ BLACKPOOL'S midfielder Ian Britton has left the club to join neighbours Burnley on a free transfer.

★ Trevor Christie has joined WALSALL from Manchester City for £30,000 after just two months at Maine Road.

City pocketed £100,00 and Christie in the pre-season deal which took Mark Lillis to Derby, but the former Notts County man made only ten appearances.

★ Watford have signed for the second time former England Under-21 defender Steve Sims for £50,000 from NOTTS COUNTY.

★ WIGAN ATHLETIC paid £40,000 for CHESTER'S Welsh international defender, Andy Holden.

★ FULHAM have turned down a transfer request by England Under-21 striker Dean Coney.

★ Barnsley have rejected YORK'S bid for striker Stuart Gray.

SWINDON

DAVE HOCKADAY (Defender). Born 9/11/57. The versatile former Blackpool player who moved to the County Ground from the Bloomfield Road Club in the close season of 1983, proved a revelation in the Full Back role he fulfilled in the second half of last season. Dave made 34 appearances and three substitute appearances in the Towns championship winning line-up of last season.

CHRIS RAMSEY (Defender). Born 28/4/62. The former Bristol City and Brighton Full Back joined the County Ground staff on loan initially. Lou Macari secured his permanent transfer in December 1984. Chris who suffered an unfortunate injury while appearing in the 1983 Brighton v. Manchester United F.A. Cup Final at Wembley, made up for the disappointment of collecting a losers medal by collecting a Fourth Division Championship medal with Swindon Town last season. Chris missed only three League matches last season as Swindon collected their first League title.

TIM PARKIN (Defender). Born 31/12/57. Joined the County Ground staff from Bristol Rovers in July for a Football League Tribunal fee of £27,500. The tall commanding Central Defender had made 219 League appearances for Rovers. Tim moved to the Bristol Club from Malmo (Sweden). Rated at £50,000 by Bristol Rovers prior to his move to Swindon, Tim had been 'Player of the Year' in successive seasons with the former Eastville Club. He originally made his Football League debut with Blackburn Rovers for whom he made 13 League appearances.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (Central Defender). Born 20/1/65. Without doubt Colin proved to be Lou Macari's outstanding signing as he built his championship winning team in the summer of 1985. The former Mansfield Town Defender attracted a lot of attention from First Division clubs last season with his brilliant displays. Stranraer born, Colin, was the only Swindon Town player to make the 46 maximum League appearances as Swindon collected their first ever League Championship title. Colin rightfully won the 'Player of the Year' award in his first season with the club.

CHRIS KAMARA (Midfield). Born 25/12/57. Chris rejoined the club for a second spell in Aug. 1985 from Brentford for a £12,500 transfer fee. Absent through injury in the first half of last season the former Portsmouth apprentice made 19 League appearances and one as substitute, scoring one League goal. Chris is one of the few players in the Football League to have played for

two League clubs in different spells—Portsmouth and Swindon. Chris made 183 First Team appearances in his first spell with the club.

STEVE WHITE (Striker). Born 2/1/59. Steve was surprisingly given a free transfer at the end of last season by Bristol Rovers. After scoring sixteen goals for the former Eastville club last season, Lou Macari fought off opposition from several Third Division clubs to obtain his signature in July. Steve was in his second spell with Rovers having been transferred to Luton Town for a fee of £200,000 in 1979. He later played for Charlton Athletic before his return to Bristol Rovers.

LEIGH BARNARD (Midfield). Born 29/10/58. Leigh recaptured the form that he displayed in his first season with the club after signing from Portsmouth in July 1982 in the Town's championship season. The previous season, Leigh had the unusual distinction of playing for Exeter City on loan against Swindon, while the situation was reversed when the two clubs met in the return fixture, Leigh then appearing for Swindon. Signed on a free transfer from the Fratton Park club, his enthusiastic approach has been a refreshing attitude in previous seasons of struggle. Leigh made 37 League appearances last season with one as substitute scoring three goals. Leigh spent a brief period on loan with Peterborough United while with Portsmouth.

DAVE BAMBER (Striker). Born 1/2/59. Joined the club from Portsmouth for a fee of £15,000 in March 1986 after an initial period on loan. Previously with Blackpool, Walsall and Coventry City, he brought a dimension to the team in the final matches leading to the Fourth Division Championship that had perhaps been lacking following Peter Coyne's early season injury. The fact that he scored nine goals in the latter part of last season contributed greatly to the clubs championship title.

JIMMY GILLIGAN (Striker). Born 18/2/56. Jimmy was the first of Lou Macari's summer signings in his bid to strengthen his line-up in preparation for Third Division soccer. Jimmy moved to the County Ground in June for a £31,500 transfer fee from Grimsby Town. Jimmy had only been with the Blundell Park club for one season following his £100,000 transfer in the previous summer of 1985 from First Division Watford. Jimmy who found his opportunities limited at Vicarage Road due to the form of the much vaunted Luther Blissett and John Barnes, will, hopefully replace the goal scoring prowess of the departed Colin Gordon, who moved to Wimbledon, in the Town attack this season.

What the papers say . . .



RARELY do clubs from the lower reaches make the national headlines — apart from where there is a financial crisis.

But little Fourth Division Wrexham did just that with their superb 0-0 draw in Spain in the European Cup winners Cup.

Dixie McNeil's men stunned Europe with their sterling work at Real Zaragoza and rightly earned the praise of Fleet Street and co.

The 'News of the World', for instance, focused on how Zaragoza helped Wrexham keeper Chris Pearce regain fitness for the cup tie by treating him for a trapped neck nerve.

Mike Langley in the 'Sunday People' was also full of praise for the little Welsh club, but pointed out many quirks surrounding the tie.

He stated that Wrexham had an English manager, English players, an English-speaking crowd and play in the English League.

Apparently Ardiles' successful time in the British game convinced Maradona that he too could make the transition.



Former Nottingham Forest star Tony Woodcock is having a tough time in his second spell at West German club Cologne.

Four months ago he rejoined Cologne for a cut price £140,000, but the manager was sacked after the club were left languishing at the bottom of the league.

Now the new boss has decided to play with just two strikers — and the former England marksman comes third best to the Allofs brothers, Klaus and Thomas.

The 'Sunday People' claimed that West Germany "buzzed with talk that he's for sale" . . . but Woodcock was quoted as saying "as far as I am concerned there's no problem."



Liverpool supremo Kenny Dalglish came under fire from the usually quiet Chris Lawler — once the Reds popular full back and a major part of the backroom staff at Anfield during last season's double winning triumph.

Lawler is bitter about his sacking in the summer and the fact that he did not even learn about the upheaval from manager Dalglish.

He told the 'News of the World': "I've been kicked out for no apparent reason other than my face doesn't fit in the dynasty Kenny Dalglish is creating.

"You learn to be hard in football and I know Liverpool can be ruthless, but I've never felt so bitter."
