








TEAM TALK







DAVE HOCKADAY (Defender). Born 9.11.57. The versatile former Blackpool player who moved to the County Ground from the Bloomfiend Road Club in the close Season of 1983, proved a revelation in the Full Back hole he fulfilled in the second half of last Season.

CHRIS RAMSEY (Defender). Born 28.4.62. The former Bristol City and Brighton Full Back joined the County Ground staff on loan initially. Lou Macari secured his permanent transfer in December 1984.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (Central Defender). Born 21.1.65. Without doubt Colin proved to be Lou Macari's outstanding signing as he built his championship winning team in the Summer of 1985. The former Mansfield Town Defender attracted a lot of attention from First Division Clubs last Season with his brilliant displays.

CHRIS KAMARA (Midfield). Born 25.12.57. Chris rejoined the Club for a second spell in August 1985 from Brentford for a £12,500 transfer fee. Absent through injury in the first half of last Season the former Portsmouth apprentice made 19 League appearances and one as substitute, scoring one League goal.

LEIGH BARNARD (Midfield). Born 29.10.58. Leigh recaptued the form that he displayed in his first Season with the Club after signing from Portsmouth in July 1982 in the Town's championship Season. The previous Season, Leigh had the unusual distinction of playing for Exeter City on loan against Swindon, while the situation was reversed when the two Clubs met in the return fixture, Leigh then appearing for Swindon.

MARK HUGHES (Striker). Born 17.7.67. Swindon born, Mark missed the majority of last Season with a pelvic injury. The local born Striker who formed a prolific goalscoring partnership with Mark Gardiner in the South East Counties. League in the 1982/83 Season, made his one and only League appearance to date on March 6th 1984, against Northampton in a goal-less match at Swindon's County Ground.

CHARLIE HENRY (Midfield). Born 13.2.62. The Acton born former Club apprentice was a revelation in his Midfield role of last Season. Converted from his customary Full Back position, Charlie astounded everyone by becoming the Clubs leading goalscorer with 18 League goals. Charlie who joined Swindon as a professional in February 1980 made 38 League appearances last Season and one substitute appearance in the Town's championship winning campaign.

DAVE BAMBER (Striker). Born 1.2.59. Joined the Club from Portsmouth for a fee of £15,000 in March 1986 after an initial period on loan. Previously with Blackpool, Walsall and Coventry City, he brought a dimension to the team in the final matches leading to the Fourth Division Championship that had perhaps been lacking following Peter Coyne's early Season injury.

PETER COYNE (Midfield/ Striker). Born 13.11.58. The former Manchester United, Crewe Alexandra and Hyde United Striker was in brilliant form in the first half of last Season, as he quickly swept into the lead as the Clubs leading goalscorer at the end of the October.

JIMMY GILLIGAN (Striker). Born 18.2.56. Jimmy was the first of Lou Macaris Summer signings as he bid to strengthen his line-up in preparation for Third Division soccer. Jimmy moved to the County Ground in June for a £31,500 transfer fee from Grimsby Town.



MEMORY LANE

A LOOK BACK AT THE PLAYERS & EVENTS OF THE LAST 108 YEARS BY TOM BEARDSLEY

THE PLUNGE

When the Rovers fell into the newly formed Third Division, after their relegation from Division Two in 1958, they were destined to meet many clubs from the south who they never encounted before in League competition. The 1958/59 Third Division consisted of seven such clubs, Norwich, Colchester, Reading, Southend, Bournemouth, Newport and today's visitors, the 'Robins' of Swindon.

Swindon Town were formed in 1881 by the Rev. W. Pitt. They soon turned professional and joined the Southern League and were members until 1920 when they became one of the original members of the new Third Division—which was actually the old Southerm League transformed into a League Division—which was actually the old Southern League transformed into a League Division. Northern clubs were admitted the next season and the old Third (North) and Third (South) format was set up, which, barring the War, lasted till 1958.

Things started well for the Rovers in the Third Division, and it looked as if the pre-season optimism would be fulfilled when they won 4 of thier opening 6 games - then inexplicably the rot set in and the club embarked on the worst run in its history. Of the next 16 League games, 14 were lost, 1 was drawn with 1 solltary victory, 12 goals scored and 40 conceded. On Sept 9, 1958, 10,725 witnessed a 2 - 0 win over QPR. By Dec 20, 1958 only 5,050 came to the home win over Tranmere which saw a mini revival to the end of the season with the Rovers averaging a point a game. This however did not stop the Rovers plunging from Division Two to Division Four in successive seasons. It was during the 'plunge' that the Rovers met Swindon for the first ever time.


On March 21, 1959 only 3,907 attended the Rovers home game with Newport. The distressed club officials declared that this was the worst ever Saturday afternoon gate at Belle Vue since the War. A mixture of Rovers shocking from and the fact that fewer fains were now following their teams over the long distances to


away games to help bolster some attendances. It came home to the Rovers officials that the Doncaster public would support a successful team when, on the day before Swindom's first visit to Belle Vue on March 28, a gate of 11,110 came to see the English School's shield.

The Swindon game took place on Good Friday afternoon and a better than average crowd of 6,435 came to witness the Wittshire club's first visit to Belle Vue. The Robins were having a relegation struggle and a win over the struggling Rovers would greatly improve their position. The Rovers were 2nd from the bottom with 26 pts from 38 games and Swindon lay 4 places higher with 32 pts from 35 games. The Rovers had to win. Albert Minton returned to the side after injury, replacing Tony Reeson. The line up was Nimmo, White, Gavin, Kilkenny, Mordue, Cavanagh, Sharp, Fernie, Fletcher, Minton, Walker. Swindon made 2 changes. 18 year old Bob Woodruff was recalled to inside left in place of Andy Micklewright and Peter Chamberlain took. George Hudson's place at centre half for his 2nd full League game. They lined up thus; Chandler, Neal, Bingley, Fountain, Chamberlain, Owen, Skull, Richards, Marshall, Woodruff, Darcy.

The first ever clash turned out to be a poor game, with either side playing much constructive soccer. The Rovers' 'Keeper, Willie Nimmo, hardly had a shot to save, but at the other end the Rovers were squandering what few chances came their way. The only difference between the two sides was the Rovers' North-Eastern centre forward, Jim Fletcher, who hit a couple of opportunist goals to give the Rovers a surprise 2 - 0 victory there was still hope!

They had now won 3 successive games, were the Rovers to pull off an 'Houdini' type escape from the clutches of Division Four?. That question was emphatically answered the following day at the Shay, Halifax. It was the club's first visit to halifax for 9 years. Reeson replaced Minton and the Rovers got off to a cracking start when Jim Fletcher hit his 5th goal in 5 games after 5

minutes to put the Rovers 1 - 0 up. The 4,687 Shay crowd watched as relegation threatened Rovers outfought their mid table Yorkshire rivals - until McCall equalised for Halifax on the stroke of half time. The Rovers totally collapsed in the second half and conceded 4 more goals to lose 5 - 1. Could they bounce back on Easter Monday down in the West Country for their first ever visit to Swindon's County Ground?

Manager Bestall brought in Makepeace for White at full back and Francis Callan took Sharp's place on the right wing. Ronnie Walker moved to inside left and Meredith came in on the left wing. Swindon made 2 changes from their 2 - 0 defeat at Belle Vue. Tilley for Owen and Edwards for Micklewright. The Rovers

pulled off a great result in front of the 9,504 Swindon crowd and held the Robins to a 0 · 0 draw in an entertaining game. But this point would not be enough to save the Rovers from the 'plunge' into soccer's basement. It was one of the very rare away successes the club had that season. Their away was shocking and read 1 win, 3 draws, 19 defeats with 10 goals scored and 58 conceded. Swindon fared a little better, escaping relegation, finishing in a mid table position with 45 pts from their 46 games. They went on to gain promotion to Division Two for the first time in 1963 - but for the Rovers the plunge continued and in 1962 they had to seek re-election to Division Four.

GILLY'S GAS..... A PERSONAL VIEW OF THE SPORTING SCENE

Christmas printing deadlines dictate that I have to write these notes well in advance of todays match, but I dare offer a small wager that by the time todays match is played, weather conditions could play a large part in the result. We are about to enter the mid-winter madness of snow, frost and ice, where I truly believe there are occasions where clubs make little or no effort to ensure their matches are in with a fair chance of being played. Every season, we are guaranteed a number of weeks whereby if there is little snow, there will be freezing temperatures, and it seems to me that this appears to come as a hell of a surprise to some of our clubs, for they seem to make no contingency plan to combat such problems. If my memory serves me correctly from previous research, the Rovers achieved one of their finest ever wins on a carpet of snow, this was the 9 - 2 demolition of Carlisle in 1947. Next time, the subject will be artificial pitches, are they a possible soccer salvation or just a pain in the grass.
