

New Year is a time for wishes and mine is very simple. Promotion from the Third. I am desparate to achieve it. The players too are determined to give it everything they have got. With the old year now past things are as tight as ever in the promotion race and there are still a lot of teams involved in the bid for Division Two football.



Another side who are showing good form are Walsall. They beat us 2-0 earlier in the season and before Christmas spent £300,000 on new players. When you spend that sort of money on players in the Third Division to join the good players you've already got you've got to be in with a chance.

That sort of money just is not available here, yes, it would be nice to be able to buy players at this stage of the season to consolidate and aid our bid for promotion. Sometimes its a game or two a day but you've got to keep an eye on who's doing what and who may be available for transfer.

We have created a good youth scheme but you never know whether it is going to produce even one player. The kids are doing quite well but I must be honest and say that none are ready yet. They have got a long way to go.

Boardroom





## Around Third SWINDON HERE TODAY

When ever you think of Swindon Town Football Club you can't help but cast your mind back to that famous League Cup final win against Arsenal. That's if you can remember that far. They are a club who surprised everyone then with that victory thanks to someone called Don Rogers. A lot of water has gone under the bridge since then and Swindon are rebuilding after ending up in the fourth then soaring from the bottom division up to third. Now of course they are on their way toward the top of the league and the Cherries must view them as a big threat to them. A win against Swindon today would be just the start AFC would want going into the New Year.

The pace will soon start to really hot up and what happens in the next few weeks will give a firm guide to what the final placings will be like at the top at least come the end of the season.

Programme collector Peter Jackson has among his collection the Swindon versus Cherries programme for the match of August 12 1980.

In football terms six years isn't that long but just one name on the Cherries teamsheet is still with us today and that is Tom Heffernan.

There are a few interesting names in both teams and the AFC pen pictures tell a few stories of the past too.

### AFC Bournemouth Pen-Pictures

KENNY ALLEN (Goalkeeper) Kenny opened his League career with Hartlepool in 1968/69, then left for Tow Law Town, In 1970 he went to South Africa but he returned two years later to play for WB.A. and Workington. After a spell with Bath City, he joined Bournemouth in 1978.

IAN CUNNINGHAM (Defender) Ian is a former Scottish youth international who served his apprenticeship at Dean Court. He made his first appearance in their League eleven in 1975 and has been a fixture in the back four for the past five years.

JON MOORE (Defender) Jon spent his Bristol Rovers' days as a reserve player but he soon got a League chance with Millwall after his transfer in 1974. He made well over 100 league appearances for the Lions before moving to Bournemouth in the 1979 close-season.

NEIL TOWNSEND (Defender) Northampton introduced Neil to League soccer in 1968/69 and he was transferred to Southend in 1973. Five years later he went into the Southern League with Weymouth but Bournemouth signed him for a League come-back last season.

JOHN IMPEY (Defender) John made his senior bow for Cardiff City in 1972/73 and made around 20 League appearances for the Bluebirds before being transferred to Bournemouth in 1975. He has been a fixture in the Cherries' rearguard for the past four seasons.

PHIL FERNS (Defender) Phil developed with neighbouring Poole Town's Southern League side and he joined Bournemouth two seasons ago. He got an early opportunity in the first-team and now he is a fixture in the left-back position.

BRIAN CHAMBERS (Midfield) Brian opened his career with Sunderland and was signed by Arsenal for £25,000 in 1973. He moved to Luton a year later and to Millwall in 1977. Bournemouth signed him during the 1979 summer break.

PHIL HOLDER (Midfield) Phil grew up with Spurs and made about a dozen First Division appearances for them. He moved to Crystal Palace in 1975 and held his place there for three years. Bournemouth signed him two seasons ago.

JOHN EVANSON (Midfield) John now has well over 300 League appearances behind him since his debut for Oxford in 1966/67. He went to Blackpool for £40,000 in 1974, remaining for two years until signing for Fulham. Bournemouth signed him in 1979.

MARTIN McGRATH (Midfield) Martin is a former England schoolboy international who served his apprenticeship with Southampton. He made one First Division appearance last season and signed for Bournemouth this summer.

EDDIE PRUDHAM (Forward) Eddie, who joined Bournemouth from Stockport this summer, made his early League appearances with Sheffield Wednesday and moved to Carlisle for £20,000 in 1975. After loan periods with Hartlepool and Workington, he joined Stockport in 1977.

TOM HEFFERNAN (Forward) Tom waited in vain for a chance in Tottenham's League team. He jumped at the chance to join Bournemouth last summer and he got his eagerly-awaited opportunity to play in the League last season.

STEVE MASSEY (Forward) It was in 1974/75 that Steve stepped into League soccer with Stockport County. He became a regular first—teamer for three years and then moved on to Bournemouth during the close—season of 1978.

NEIL PROSSER (Forward) Neil was a scoring sensation with non-League Harlow last season, his goals earning replays with Southend and Leicester. Anxious to see if he can make it in League soccer, he 'phoned Bournemouth for a trial and is on a 2 - year contract.

DAVID WEBB (Midfield) David joined Bournemouth, from Derby, as player-coach this summer. A one-time West Ham reserve, he made his League bow with Orient and later played for Southampton, Chelsea, Q.P.R. and Leicester before joining Derby in 1978.

### FORMATION OF COMPANY.

In 1913-14, Boscombe competed in the F.A. Cup for the first time and in 1914, the Club was formed into a liability company with a capital of £1,000 and professionalism was adopted.

The South-Eastern League was entered but competition proved to be far stronger than in the county leagues in which Boscombe had been so successful and they finished at the bottom of the table.

This was Boscombe's first and only season in the South-Eastern League as it became defunct during the 1914-18 World War and was never revived.

The war also caused Boscombe to suspend activities but these were resumed in 1919, and, in order to reorganise the playing strength of the Club it was considered advisable to spend another season in county competitions.

In the following season, 1920-21, Boscombe competed in the Southern League and for three seasons they met with moderate success in this competition.

### THE BIGGEST PLUNGE.

The biggest plunge of all was made in 1923 when an application was submitted to the Football League for admission to the Third Division (Southern Section).

When the company was first formed, the late Mr. W. Hayward became the Chairman of Directors with the late Mr. V. J. Kitcher, who had jointly carried out the duties of secretary with Mr. Hayward since 1911, was appointed secretary. He had joined the Club as a player in 1906.

Thanks to a great deal of work "behind the scenes" by Mr. Hayward to secure the necessary backing of First and Second Division clubs, the Club's application to the League was successful and another public meeting was then called to increase the share capital.

### CHANGE OF TITLE'

It was also at that meeting that it was decided to change the title to Bournemouth and Boscombe Athletic F.C. to make the Club more representative of the whole Borough of Bournemouth.

It was one thing to gain admission to the League and another to justify this bold step. In their first two seasons in the Southern Section, Boscombe had an uphill struggle. The end of the 1923-24 campaign found them in the 21st position, so that an application had to be made for re-election.

Of the 42 matches, only 11 were won, 11 drawn and 20 lost with a goal average of 40 for, 65 against, and 33 points. Two players, "Billy" Lamb (left back) and Len Butt (wing halfback) were ever present and other players who took part in 12 or more matches that season were: – Miller (38), Smith, C.F. (37), Davey (34), Leitch (33), Robinson (31), Armstrong (29),

Glenn Hoddle will be out for the rest of the season after losing a false eyelash in a brutal match v Norwich. Reading go bankrupt after receiving their bill for footballs lost out of the ground (Juggernauts have been revving up outside Elm Park waiting to fill up with them). Ron Atkinson purchases rest of Liverpool team.

MAY: England Burslem beat Amalgamated Gasworks F.C. 1-0 in friendly. Gasworks manager resigns in disgust. Liverpool do double with victory at Wembley over Manchester United F.A. Cup Final. Wolves offer £5 to each spectator to entice fans to Molyneux. Wolves get lowest gate since the war in friendly v Arsenal. AFCB win third division!!!! Colin Clarke top scorer with 43, but they won't be playing pompey season - their relegated McMenemy resigns to take over as chairman of ICI. Sunderland bankrupt. Arsenal score second goal of Wolves) the season (v but disappointment as it's ruled offside - Robert Maxwell buys Ron Atkinson, Q.P.R. sack Doris Entwhistle.



Swindon Town won their first Football League title last season as they swept to the Fourth Division Championship under the astute guidance of their Team Manager – Lou Macari, the former Scotland, Glasgow Cetlic and Manchester United star.

In compiling a Football League Record of 102 points, Swindon Town passed several previously existing Club records with consummate ease.

Naturally the exploits of last Season attracted several of the leading Clubs to take a definate interest in the immediate future of the diminutive Scot, who had become one of the brightest and most promising young Managers in the Football league.

The Summer months were spent dissuading Coventry City, Leicester City and Glasgow Celtic from adding Lou Macari to their staff. While overtures were received from all three Clubs along with more than a little interest from Spain, it was eventually a compromise that decided the immediate destiny of the popular Scot.

After being offered the position of Assistant Manager with Glasgow Celtic, Lou Macari finally settled for remaining as Manager of Swindon Town.

DAVE HOCKADAY Born 9.11.57 The versatile former Blackpool player who moved to the County Ground from the Bloomfield Road Club in the close season of 1983, proved a revelation in the Full Back hole he fulfilled in the second half of last Season. Dave made 34 appearances and three substitute appearances in the Towns championship winning line-up of last Season.

CHRIS RAMSEY Born 28.4.62 The former Bristol City and Brighton Full Back joined the County Ground staff on loan initially. Lou Macari secured his permanent transfer in December 1984. Chris who suffered an unfortunate injury while appearing in the 1983 Brighton v Manchester United F.A. Cup Final at Wembley, made up for the disappointment of collecting a losers medal by collecting a Fourth Division Championship medal with Swindon Town last Season.

Chris missed only three League matches last Season as Swindon collected their first League title.

COLIN CALDERWOOD Born 20.1.65 Without doubt Colin proved to be Lou Macari's outstanding signing as he built his championship winning team in the Summer of 1985.

The former Mansfield Town Defender attracted a lot of attention from First Division Clubs last Season with his brilliant displays. Stranraer born, Colin, was the only Swindon Town player to make the 46 maximum League appearances as Swindon collected their first ever League Championship title. Colin rightfully won the 'Player of the Year' award in his first Season with the Club.

CHRIS KAMARA Born 25.12.57 Chris rejoined the Club for a second spell in August 1985 from Brentford for a £12,500 transfer fee. Absent through injury in the first half of last season the former Portsmouth apprentice made 19 League appearances and one as substitute, scoring one League goal. Chris is one of the few players in the Football League to have played for two League Clubs in different spells – Portsmouth and Swindon.

Chris made 183 First Team appearances in his first spell with the Club.

LEIGH BARNARD Born 29.10.58 Leigh recaptured the form that he displayed in his first Season with the Club after signing from Portsmouth in July 1982 in the Town's championship Season.

The previous Season, Leigh had the unusual distinction of playing for Exeter City on loan against Swindon, while the situation was reversed when the two Clubs met in the return fixture, Leigh then appearing for Swindon. Signed on a free transfer from the Fratton Park Club, his enthusiastic approach has been a refreshing attitude in previous Seasons of struggle. Leigh made 37 League appearances last Season with one as substitute three goals.

Leigh spent a brief period on loan with Peterborough United while with Portsmouth.

DAVE BAMBER Born 1.2.59 Joined the Club from Portsmouth for a fee of £15,000 in March 1986 after an initial period on loan. Previously with Blackpool, Walsall and Coventry City, he brought a dimension to the team in the final matches leading to the Fourth Division Championship that had perhaps been lacking following Peter Coyne's early Season injury. The fact that he scored nine goals in the latter part of last Season contributed greatly to the Clubs championship title.

JIMMY GILLINGAN Born 18.2.56 Jimmy was the first of Lou Macaris Summer signings as he bid to strengthen his line-up in preparation for Third Division soccer.

Jimmy moved to the County Ground in June for a £31,500 transfer fee from Grimsby Town. Jimmy had only been with the Blundell Park Club for one Season following his £100,000 transfer in the previous Summer of 1985 from First Division Watford.

Jimmy who found his opportunities limited at Vicerage Road due to the form of the much vaunted Luther Blissett and John Barnes, will hopefully replace the goal scoring prowess of the departed Colin Gordon, who moved to Wimbledon, in the Town attack this Season.

BRYAN WADE Born 25.6.63 Bryan made a successful entry into League soccer last Season from Southern League Trowbridge Town. To have finished with a championship medal in his first Season of full-time soccer was beyond the former Bath City and Trowbridge Town's Strikers wildest dreams.

Bryan's ten League goals from his 31 League appearances, and three as substitute had a significant part in the Town's first ever championship title win.

KENNY ALLEN Born 12.1.54 Joined Swindon Town from Torquay United in September 1985. The former Hartlepool United, West Bromwich Albion and Bournemouth player collected a Fourth Division Championship medal in his first Season with the club as he made 40 appearances. Ken certainly settled a problem position for Lou Macari.

TIM PARKIN Born 31.12.57 Joined the County Ground staff from Bristol Rovers in July for a Football League Tribunal fee of £27,500. The tall commanding Central Defender had made 219 League appearances for Rovers. Tim moved to the Bristol Club from Malmo (Sweden) in August 1987.

Rated at £50,000 by Bristol Rovers prior to his move to Swindon, Tim had been 'Player of the Year' in successive Seasons with the former Eastville Club. He originally made his Football League debut with Blackburn Rovers for whom he made 13 League appearances.

ANDY ROWLAND Born 8.9.54 Andy is now Swindon Town's longest serving professional, having joined Swindon from Bury in September 1978 for an £80,000 fee.

Andy who has now taken a backroom role with the County Ground Club was restricted to 12 League appearances last Season and six as substitute.

Tantalisingly placed on ninety-nine League goals, the champagne remains on ice for the former Bury Striker who has made a career total of 542 first team appearances during which he has scored 169 goals.

MARK GARDINER Born 25.12.66 Progressed through the Clubs junior ranks to make his League debut against Mansfield Town on April 28th 1984. Despite the fact that Mark has been a prolific goalscorer at Junior and Reserve team level he has found his opportunities restricted to five League matches since his debut.

Mark has been the Clubs leading goalscorer for the past two seasons in the Football Combination.





### Looking Back on AFC 1899 to 1949.

Continued from Cherries Chatterline.

Lister (28), Voisey (26), Saxton (26), Heron (24), Wingham (18), Lock (13), Simpson (12), and Tait (12). In the aggregate the 21 matches at Dean Court were witnessed by 98,642 spectators, the highest attendance being on Easter Monday for the visit of Portsmouth, when there were 8,926, a record crowd for the ground up to that time. The average attendance per match worked out at 4,697.

Boscombe only just managed to avoid having to apply for re-election again at the end of the 1924-25 season, when they finished in the 20th place with 34 points from 13 wins and eight draws and a goal average of 40-58.

### WHEN RON EYRE CAME.

Strenuous efforts were made during that season to improve the strength of the team and one of the best captures Boscombe have ever made was centre-forward Ron Eyre, who joined the Club from Sheffield Wednesday and made his first appearance at Luton on 3rd January, 1925. Boscombe won that match by two goals to nil and it was due to improved playing results in the second half of that season, when they secured 23 or their 34 points that they escaped one of the last two places.

Other notable acquisitions during the 1924-25 season were Leslie Roberts and Pat Clifford from Merthyr Town, while other players whose names will readily occur to the minds of supporters of those days were Wilson (goalkeeper), Bob McCulloch, "Dossie" Miles, formerly of Bournemouth Trams F.C., Buchanan and Readman.

In their first season in the League, Boscombe did not compete in the F.A. Cup but they re-entered in 1924 and had the disastrous experience of being knocked out in the 4th qualifying round at Yeovil, the "giant-killers" of last season, by three goals to two.

There was a slight improvement in gate figures for the Club's second season in the League, the aggregate being

104,446 and the average 4,973.

Mr. Harry Kinghorn was Trainer-Manager of the Club during its first two seasons in the League but in 1925, the positions were separated. Mr. Kinghorn became trainer and Mr. Leslie Knighton, former manager of the Arsenal, was appointed in that position at Dean Court.

### THE TURNING POINT.

That season proved to be the turning point in the Club's fortunes. Boscombe finished in the eighth place with the following record: -

Eyre led the list of goal scorers with 27 and missed only one match; including Cup-ties, his total was 32. Other wellknown players who became Boscombe team-mates were George Colin (left-back) from Arsenal, Stringfellow, from Portsmouth, Bliss from Spurs, while Jack Hayward had made the right back position practically his own.



### DID YOU KNOW?

### **SWINDON TOWN**

Swindon returned to Division 3 this season after relegation in the 1981-82 season. The Wiltshire club were formed in 1881, and play at the County Ground were they have been since 1911, 9 years later they joined the league.

Towns highest attendance is 32,000 for an F.A. Cup 3rd tie in 1972 against Arsenal, who won this particular match, but in 1969 they surprisingly lost the League Cup Final 3-1 to Swindon at Wembley.

Swindons highest score was back in 1925, an F.A. Cup 1st rd tie winning 10-1, against Fareham United Brewery, whose players had probably been on the bottle before kick-off!

### NEWPORT COUNTY

Formed in 1912 by workers of a local iron and steelworks, County's home is Somerton Park where they have been since formation.

Newports highest attendance of 24,268 was for a 'Derby' against Cardiff City, a Division 3 South match in October 1937. In the same division they achieved their highest score of 10-0, Welsh side Merthyr Town the victims in April 1930. County were relegated to the Fourth Division in the 1961-62 season, they had to wait until the 1979-80 season to win promotion.


