

Hopes are always high at the start of a new season and no set of supporters are more optimistic than Bradford City fans. A splendid end to last season and a final placing of tenth in Division Two left supporters eagerly awaiting the new campaign.

Well, here we are for the first match of the new season against a Swindon side, which has been promoted in each of the last two seasons under Manager Lou Macari, the former Manchester United and Scottish international.

They won the Fourth Division Championship two seasons ago and promotion last season after two tough play-off matches. They beat Wigan on aggregate 3-2 after trailing 2-0 at one stage and then beat Gillingham after a replay at Crystal Palace's Selhurst Park ground.

So, they have achieved Second Division football the hard way and Lou Macari has signed six new players to make sure the club don't slip back into Division Three.

They include Jon Gittens, a central defender from Southampton for £40,000 and two mid-field players, Steve Foley from Sheffield United for £35,000 and John Kelly from Chester for £20,000.

It's 13 years since Swindon were last in the Second Division so they are bound to have a big following to see their first match back in Division Two. To them, and to our own supporters, we say 'Welcome' to Valley Parade.



Every football fan is naturally optimistic at the start of a new season and nowhere is that optimism more in evidence than at Bradford City.

A sparkling end to the season when City won seven of their last ten matches put everyone in good heart for the new campaign.

Supporters have shown their confidence in the club's prospects by their enthusiasm to buy season tickets. Some 2,500 season tickets have been sold netting a record £200,000 for the club.

And, City have demonstrated their ambitions by paying a record £130,000 for defender Lee Sinnott to go with the £47,000 they spent on goalkeeper Paul Tomlinson during the summer.

Just as important, they have persuaded John Hendrie and Stuart McCall to sign new contracts much to the delight of the fans and the disappointment of some top First Division clubs, who were desperate to sign this talented pair.

Having established themselves as a Second Division club in the last two seasons, City now seem ready to challenge for a promotion or playoff place.

Many people forget that Bradford is one of the largest cities in the country and there is no reason why it should not support a First Division club.

Towns of similar or lesser size and potential like Coventry, Luton and Watford have shown it is possible to run First Division clubs, so why not Bradford?

Crowds at re-built Valley Parade last season were the envy of most Second Division clubs and there is scope for a greater increase providing there is success on the field.

Yorkshire derby matches are once again a feature of next season's Second Division programme with visits from Leeds United, Huddersfield Town, Hull City, Sheffield United and Barnsley certain to attract five figure crowds.

The three relegated clubs Aston Villa, Manchester City and Leicester will enhance the Second Division and Villa and Manchester City, who have big away followings, will boost the gate of every club they visit.

Villa will be most people's favourites for promotion. New manager Graham Taylor from Watford has been given the task of guiding this famous club back to Division One at the first attempt and no one can dispute that that is where they belong.

Manchester City, who have added Mel Machin to their management team, is another club who will not be satisfied with Second Division status, but the third relegated club, Leicester City, may struggle to go straight back.

Apart from the top three clubs Derby, Portsmouth and Oldham – who were beaten in the play-offs by Leeds United – there was a noticeable lack of consistency in the Second Division and the promotion race is wide open to anyone who can produce this elusive commodity.

If City can re-produce their form of the last two months of last season it could be their season.



TODAY'S VISITORS Swindon Town

Like many English football clubs Swindon Town owe their origins to the church, being formed as an amateur club in 1881 by the Rev. W. Pitt, but they quickly developed into a highly professional and successful organisation becoming founder members of the Southern League in 1894.

During the early years of the century Swindon were amongst the leading clubs in the Southern League which was universally recognised as the premier competition outside the two divisions of the Football League.

Spurs showed the strength of the Southern League winning the FA Cup in 1901 and Swindon twice came close to emulating that feat, reaching the semi-finals in both 1910 and 1912 before losing to the eventual winners — Newscastle and Barnsley respectively.

During those years immediately before the First World War they were at their peak and twice won the Southern League championship. Although the break in domestic football halted their progress, in 1921 League football came to the County Ground for the first time when the Southern League was adopted by the Football League as a 3rd Division (South).

There was little else to note until the 1960's when they were promoted to Division Two for the first time in 1963. Though relegated soon after, they bounced back with a sensational 3 - 1 win over Arsenal in the League Cup Final at Wembley in 1969, gained promotion for a second time the following year, then shot to the top of the Second Division in the opening weeks of the following season.

Unfortunately by the mid-70's they were on the slide once more and in 1982 they found themselves in the 4th Division for the first time.

However, Lou Macari arrived on the scene from Manchester United as player manager in 1984 and the club has never looked back. After winning the Fourth Division championship with a record-breaking 102 points in 1986, they forced their way into last season's dramatic play-off final with a thirteen match unbeaten run and though losing their first leg at Gillingham 1 - 0 and going 1 - 0 down in the second leg, Swindon hit back to force a replay and clinch promotion for the second successive season with a 2 - 0 win.

Manager Macari now goes into this new season relying to some extent on his promotion winning side to mount their challenge for a First Division place for the first time in their history, but he has every confidence in their ability.

Sheffield born goalkeeper Fraser Digby only joined the club last December, having failed to make the

first team at Manchester United, but he quickly made his mark and went on to win England U.21 honours before the season's end.

In defence there is the 29 year old ex Blackpool man Dave Hockaday, now in his third season at the club, and Tim Parkin, also 29, who joined the club 12 months ago from Bristol Rovers, having earlier played for Blackburn Rovers, while Phil King and skipper Colin Calderwood made up the regular back four. Incredibly King, though still only 19 years old, is actually with his *third* club. He started with Exeter City and then moved on to Torquay last summer before signing for Swindon in March.

Calderwood, a 22 year old Scot, played 100 games for Mansfield Town before joining Swindon two years ago and becoming a permanent fixture in their side. Charlie Henry (25), now in his eighth season at the County Ground, is another defender in contention for a place. Although missing most of last season's run in, he came back to play a vital role in the three matches against Gillingham.

During the exciting run up to the play-offs, Mark Jones (25), a signing from Oxford United last September, and 29 year old Chris Kamara were the regular midfield men although Kamara, who has clocked up over 400 League appearances in a 13 year career with Portsmouth, Brentford and two spells with Swindon, was something of a utility man at times.

Leigh Barnard (28), another ex-Portsmouth player, also appeared in midfield while 24 year old Steve Berry, a signing from Newport in March, came into the side for the last League game of the season and then played in every one of the play-off games.

Up front there were five men challenging for the striking roles. Bryan Wade (24) was the man most often in the No.12 shirt, Northern Ireland international Jimmy Quinn (27), another in his second spell with the club, missed a few games through injury, but much travelled Dave Bamber (28), formerly with Blackpool, Coventry City, Walsall and Portsmouth, didn't miss a game in the last three months.

The others in contention were the inconsistent Peter Coyne (25), a man rescued from non-league soccer after Manchester United and then Crewe had let him go, and Steve White. The 28 year old White once cost Luton Town £200,000 when they signed him from Bristol Rovers but he arrived at Swindon at the start of last season via Charlton, Lincoln City (on loan) and Bristol Rovers again. Although playing only one full game in the last eight in the League and missing the first three in the play-offs, White came back for the last two games against Gillingham and emerged the hero of the season after scoring both goals in that decisive 2 - 0 win at Selhurst Park.

Recent additions to last season's squad are 23 year old central defender Jon Gittens, a £40,000 signing from Southampton, midfield men Steve Foley (24), formerly with Grimsby Town and Sheffield United, and John Kelly (24) from Chester City who was previously with Tranmere Rovers and Preston, with two ex Coventry City teenagers, Terry Merriman and Gary Marshall, completing the list of newcomers.

Meet the Manager - Lou Macari

Lou Macari should need no introduction to football fans for, unlike some of his fellow TV pundits, he also does his talking out on the field in the harsh day to day cut and thrust of professional soccer. Or to be more precise, his Swindon team do the talking for him now that he has made the transition from a highly successful player to successful manager.

Born in Aberdeen of Italian parents, 38 year old Macari began with Celtic, playing a part in four successive Scottish League championship wins and Scottish FA Cup and League Cup successes, before joining Manchester United in January 1973 where he collected a 2nd Division championship medal (1975), an FA Cup winners medal (1977) and two runners-up medals (1976 & 1979).

The only real hitch in his career came at Easter 1985 when he was sacked by Swindon, the club he had joined as player manager in 1984, after a much publicised row with his No.2, Harry Gregg. Fortunately for Swindon and Macari, the board reversed their decision and both have gone on from strength to strength.





BACK CHAT

Leading writer for Football Monthly

During the next few months in this column I'll be chatting to some of the men who have played their part in making the turbulent, yet sometimes highly successful, history of Bradford City Football Club and who better to kick off the series than Peter Downsborough.

Although Peter made his Football League debut in goal for his home town club Halifax Town, and also played a few games on loan with Brighton, it was with City and today's visitors to Valley Parade, Swindon Town, that he enjoyed his most tangible success.

"I had a good time at Bradford," he recalls. "It was a friendly club with a relaxed atmosphere and we had some success on the field.

"My best moment with the club was, without doubt, playing in the FA Cup Quarter Final against the eventual winners Southampton in 1976 but I was also in the 4th Division promotion side the following year."

He might have added that he also passed two personal milestones in his career at Valley Parade between November 1973 and April 1979, recording both his 500th and 600th League appearances.

However, none of that quite matched a spring day in 1969 when, at times, he alone seemed to stand against the might of First Division Arsenal as Third Division Swindon battled to win the League Cup Final at Wembley.

"That has to be the greatest moment of my career," says Peter who, despite playing around 700 League and Cup games in a 20 year career, has very little to do with the game today. That may sound surprising but as he explained. "I did spend the season before last coaching the Halifax Irish club but working shifts and weekends at Elland Power Station made it difficult to make a regular commitment.

"My only sporting involvement now is swimming for an hour every day and playing golf at the Bradley Moor club. I still watch football on T.V. but the crowd trouble has spoilt it for me as a spectator sport." Peter's work commitments, together with problems from an old knee injury, have prevented him from playing even in charity games since his last appearance for an ex-Halifax Town team against Pennine Radio two years ago. However, that day he still showed flashes of his old brilliance and saved a penalty. He made quite a habit of that in fact during his career and it was only after hanging up his boots that he revealed his secret.

"I used to leave just a little more space on one side of the goal for the kicker to aim at so I knew which way to dive," was his simple but highly effective ploy.

Coming back to the present Peter's work at the power station dictates his movements to a large extent but today's match is one that he really hopes to get to in order to renew an old acquaintance.

"One of the best friends I made in the game was my old team-mate at Swindon, John Trollope, who is still on their coaching staff, and it would be great to see him again," he explained.

Peter's career record shows that in his six seasons at Valley Parade he made 225 League appearances, just failing to beat Geoff Smith's postwar goalkeeping record for the club, and he was awarded a well deserved Testimonial in 1979 on his retirement.
