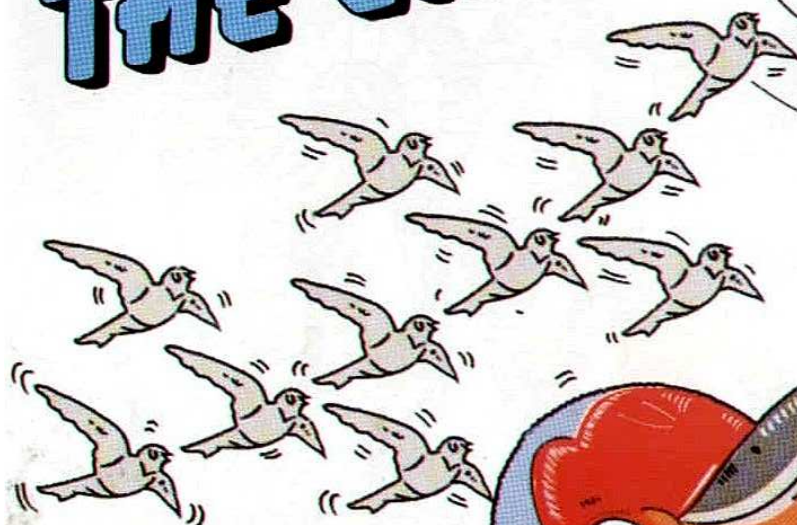

**Christmas is fast approaching and so is the half-way stage in our League programme. Personally I am pleased with the progress we have made on our return to the Second Division.**

Those that had dreams of striding through to the First Division may have received a rude awakening in the last few weeks. Mind you, I must admit that we have not helped our own cause with the amount of suspensions and injuries we have encountered. Injury cannot be avoided but sometimes disciplinary points can be avoided, if not they can cost the Club heavily in terms of lost points in the League table.

I stated earlier in the season that I did not think that, overall, we were strong enough to compete with the big Clubs of the division for further honour. We cannot compete financially in the transfer market with the big Clubs, Leeds United spent £350,000 on Bobby Davison, Aston Villa bought Andy Gray from Crystal Palace and Stuart Gray from Barnsley for a combined total fee of somewhere in the region of £300,000, money we simply do not have to spend here at the County Ground. Instead we have to budget sensibly and spend wisely. That entails knowing the transfer market for the bargains that may be available and stretching the net further.

Last week I travelled to Scotland in my search for new players, for we need an infusion or two in team strengthening.

I hope to bring in a few new

players as the season progresses because it can often lead to a situation, when the summer arrives, where Managers bring in four or five new players. If they are all introduced into the first team on the opening day of the season it will take a period of ten to fifteen matches for them to get into a cohesive unit. If the introduction takes place during a season, which in theory should be applicable to any mid-table side in any division, then that team could well be set for a bright beginning for the following season.

I now know, after half the season has passed, which positions need

strengthening. It is now a matter of checking, re-checking and travelling to find the right players. Certain players are already in my thoughts and we shall have to wait and see what materialises.

Our recent visit to Leeds emphasised that we cannot compete with most teams for commitment. If we can add guile and experience we can then look to more than hold our own. The lads did well to pull back from three goals, but we simply cannot afford to give teams such a start and hope to catch them.

I missed the win against A.F.C. Bournemouth on Saturday. Both Andy Rowland and myself went to Scotland to check on players. My absence revitalised the team to win! Maybe I'll be North of the border tonight, it seems a lucky charm at present.

Enjoy tonight's match.

### Wednesday November 18th

It was with regret that Swindon Town Football Club were informed of the death of Plymouth Argyle supporter Mark Smith who lost his life in the streets of Swindon.

Lou is still pondering on what his best combination of players will be. Meanwhile, tomorrow's opponents, Leeds United, splash out £350,000 for Derby County striker Bob Davison. To allow him to play in tomorrow's match they have signed the free-scoring striker on loan until Monday next.

The recent run of dismal results in the League continued when the Town were defeated 4-2 at Elland Road by Leeds United. Almost inevitably, Bobby Davison had to be among the Yorkshire Club's goalscorers. The Town were, at one stage, trailing by three clear goals. Two goals by Bobby Barnes reduced the arrears, but a late goal by United's Peter Haddock added to the misery. Bobby Barnes' two strikes took his personal tally to five goals in four matches since he joined the Town. While the Town strikers seem more than capable of hitting the target with regularity, the defence is punctured with alarming ease. Fourteen conceded goals in five League matches have told the story of the Town's current problem.

Meanwhile the Town's Youth team got back on to the winning trail in their League matches with a 3-0 away win against Reading. Goalscorers for the Town's South East Counties League team were Fitzroy Simpson, Gavin Sandrey and trialist Mark Johnson from Gloucester.

## MONDAY

### Monday November 23rd

Lou contemplates making a move for two Second Division players, one a midfield player of International fame, the other a defender. Meanwhile he also has to field two teams this week. The Town have a Combination match at Fulham tomorrow

while a visit to Melksham on Wednesday sees the Town back in the Wiltshire Premier Shield after an absence of several seasons.

Twelve people were accused of murdering Mark Smith of Plymouth in the Magistrates Court at Swindon today. Along with six other people, they were also accused of violent disorder.

Former Town player 'Chic' Bates loses his job as Manager of Shrewsbury Town. 'Chic' is the second former Town employee to lose his position as Manager of a Football League Club in the last ten days for former Assistant Town Manager Harry Gregg was similarly dismissed from Carlisle United.

The Swindon Town Supporters aptly named 'Robins Out of Town' announce that they are to hold a presentation dinner at the Hanney Royal British Legion on Friday 18th December 1987. They appealed to all Town supporters who live in Oxford, Witney, Bampton, Faringdon, Didcot, Wantage and Abingdon areas to contact Roger Bunce on Longworth 820499 if they wish to attend this or any future events. Tickets for the dinner are priced at £8.50 each.

Lou decides to travel North of the border in his search for new players. The Town boss jets out of Heathrow after covering the Combination fixture between Charlton Athletic and Chelsea. Lou's search for new players takes him to Aberdeen who are due to meet Hibernian in a Scottish Premier League fixture.

More problems for the Town as Leigh Barnard is sent off in the Combination team's 3-1 win at Craven Cottage against Fulham. Leigh becomes the Town's fifth player to face

suspension this season. Taking into account Chris Kamara's second suspension, it is the sixth of the season to date!

On the mark in the Town's fourth away win of the season in Combination matches were Steve Foley, on his return from suspension, Leigh Barnard and Phil King.

Former Town player Colin Bailie is listed by Reading as being available for transfer and is among several of the Elm Park Club's players made available.

## WEDNESDAY

### Wednesday November 25th

Lou returns from his trip to Scotland where his spying mission on two midfield players ends in frustration. Neither player is available. The Town defeat Melksham Town 5-0 in the preliminary round of the Wiltshire Premier Shield. Goalscorers for the Town were Bryan Wade (2), Kieran O'Regan, Steve White and Dave Bamber. Melksham 'keeper Andy King was sent off in the last minute of the match for twice handling the ball outside the penalty area. He had been booked earlier in the game for a similar offence.

Town boss Lou Macari is set to bid for a Second Division defender in time for Saturday's match with A.F.C. Bournemouth. Meanwhile new Carlisle boss Clive Middlemass, formerly Assistant to Terry Cooper at Bristol City, enquires about the availability of Town players while Brighton are also taking an interest in one of the Town's playing staff.

**Thrust into the limelight of first team football is an opportunity to be grasped but it can also be an ordeal. That surely was the situation for the Town's young 'keeper Nicky Hammond last month.**

The thumb injury sustained by Fraser Digby pushed the former Arsenal youngster into the Town's Littlewoods Cup saga with First Division Watford and subsequent League fixtures with Manchester City and Leicester City. How did he feel at the time?

"It was a big opportunity. I was nervous and I had little previous experience", said Nick. Unknown to most people the Hornchurch born player had been a virtual outcast at Highbury last season.

"I was loaned to Bristol Rovers for three months and I would have been prepared to stay there on a similar agreement, but did not want to join them permanently", said Nick. "When I returned to Arsenal I only played in six more matches."

The Town 'keeper actually attended the same school as Tottenham Hotspur free-scoring striker Clive Allen. For Nick, school did not end at Hornchurch, for he later attended the Bob Wilson goalkeeping class along with other Arsenal keepers Pat Jennings, John Lukie and Rhys Wilmott. "Two mornings a week we were subject to a lot of basic goalkeeping exercises and to cover what Bob termed as 'game situations' it would take a fortnight to go through the whole exercise."

Nick had enjoyed his breakthrough to first team football at the County Ground, as he explained. "I don't think I did too bad, the team were going through a bad patch but the lads tried to help me and I really did enjoy the Manchester City

match here. The crowd were noisy and it was a good game to be involved in, the play was end to end."

After being with a big Club such as Arsenal, was Nick disillusioned to be released by the First Division giants?

"I would have been, if it happened the previous season. I started a two-year apprenticeship with them and they made me a professional after the first season. I was on the transfer list from last

February, so I virtually knew I would be leaving at the end of the season. I was unhappy with the lack of games."

Nick went on to explain. "I believe Arsenal are a fantastic Club and I enjoyed my time there." Nick had a lot of admiration for the Gunners Manager George Graham. "He is very, very strict and the players there have to show complete respect for him. That means from the most junior player to the most experienced International."

The Essex born player found the Town a different type of Club. "The emphasis here is on fitness and a different style of play. Here I am part of the first team squad, where at Highbury I was really a bit out of things and treated like a young lad."

What of his prospects? Nick had no doubt on that score. "The Gaffer has promised me he would give me time to develop and personally I hope to improve enough to do well and press for regular first team recognition."

It's difficult being a 'keeper, one mistake is crucial, where others may make several. A quiet, introverted lad is beginning to mature, he will need time like all young players. Nick just has to hope that Lou Macari and Swindon Town can afford him that period of time.

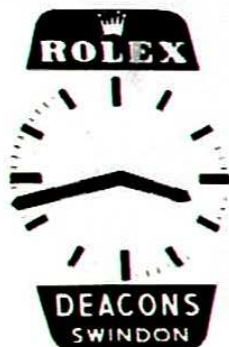

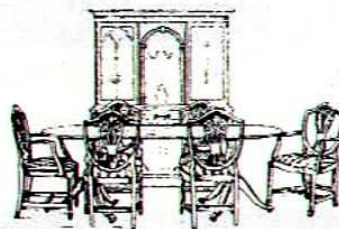

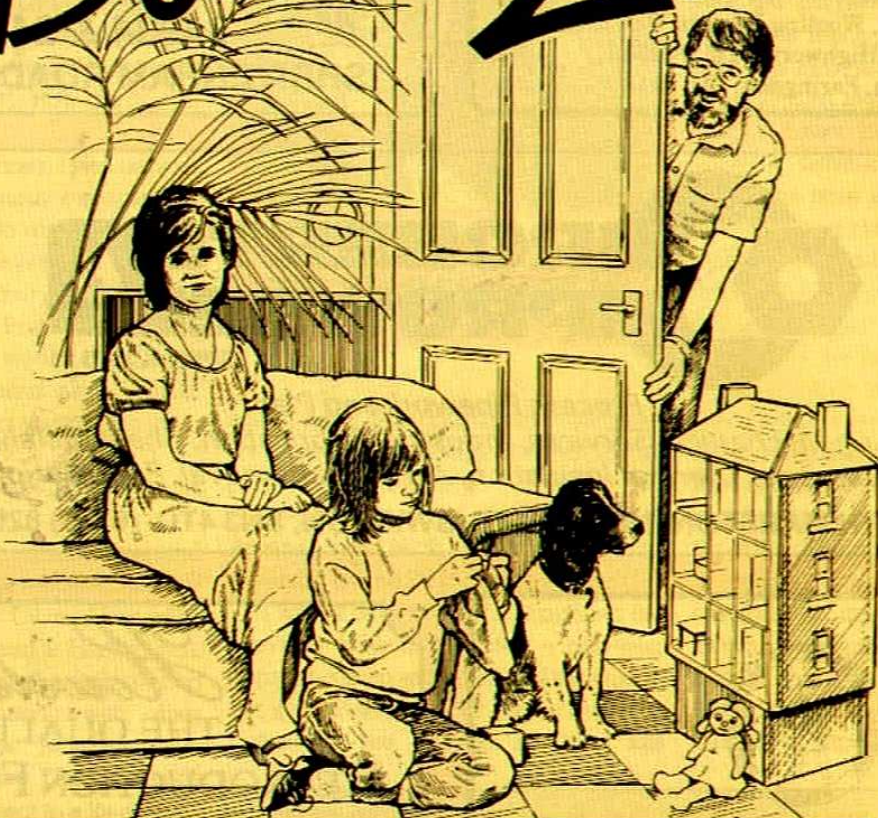

## HUDDERSFIELD TOWN

### MEET THE PLAYERS AND MANAGER

Huddersfield Town were formed in 1908 and elected two years later into Division 2.

From 1910 until 1972 the Club featured in the top two divisions of the Football League - 37 of the 72 years being spent in the First Division.

Relegation from the First in 1972 heralded a rapid decline in the Clubs fortunes and within three years they had plunged down into the Fourth.

Five years later - season 1979/80 - Huddersfield as Fourth Division Champions began the climb back.

After finishing third in Division 3, behind Portsmouth and Cardiff, in 82/83 they had regained a place back in the Second.

However, last season and this one so far have seen very hard times for the Yorkshire Club.

Three victories in the last three games of the 1986/87 season prevented Huddersfield from relegation - the nine points lifted them from 21st to a final place of 17th in the Division 2 table.

This campaign has seen a change in management with Malcolm Macdonald being appointed recently to try and turn the Clubs fortunes around.

It has not been an easy start for him. Huddersfield currently lie bottom of the table (at the time these notes were penned) and crashed to their heaviest away League defeat 10-1 at Manchester City on November 7, but a first away win of the season at Bournemouth a week ago could be the change in luck that the Huddersfield supporters are looking for.

Undoubtedly the most successful period in Huddersfield's history was in the 1920's and 1930's.

They became the first team to win the First Division Title in three consecutive seasons - 1923/24, 1924/25 and 1925/26, and were runners-up in the following two seasons, as well as in 1933/34.

They won the F.A. Cup in 1922 and finished as losing finalists in 1920, 1928, 1930 and 1938.

Huddersfield have also won the Second Division crown once - 1969/70 - and been runners-up in 1919/20 and 1952/53.

Those glory days seem an eternity ago. For the present Manager his task now is to try and keep Second Division football at Leeds Road and try and build for the future.

**Malcolm Macdonald (Manager).** Recently appointed Manager at Leeds Road. Previously a former Chief Marketing Executive at Fulham before taking over the Managers role. Had been out of the game for a couple of seasons before taking over at Huddersfield. As a player affectionately known as 'Supermac'. A prolific scorer at all his Clubs - Trowbridge, Fulham, Luton, Newcastle and Arsenal. Capped 14 times by England and scored all five goals in England's 5-0 win over Cyprus at Wembley in April 1975.

**David Burke (Defender).** Liverpool born, he joined Town from Bolton, for whom he played in both the 1st and 2nd Divisions. A very experienced player. Unfortunately broke a leg during the 1984/85 season, but now fully recovered. Had made 179 League appearances for Huddersfield prior to start of this season.

**David Cowling (Midfielder).** Huddersfield's longest service player. The 29 year old had made 334 League appearances (43 goals) prior to start of this season. Began his career as an apprentice at Mansfield.

**Simon Webster (Defender).** Joined Huddersfield Town from Tottenham Hotspur. He is 21 years old and played his first match for Town in March 1985. Has been a regular member of the first team since then.

**Duncan Shearer (Forward).** Signed for Town towards the end of 1985/86 season and quickly established himself as a goal scorer. Last season in his first full season at Huddersfield he was leading goal-scorer with 24 goals. Previously with Chelsea and a native of Fort William.

**David Cork (Forward).** Signed from Arsenal in 1985. A native of Doncaster, the 23 year old had scored 17 goals in 74 League appearances for Huddersfield prior to the start of this season.

**Ian Bray (Defender).** Signed from Hereford United. He was born in Neath and spent six years at Hereford (two years as an apprentice).

**Julian Winter (Defender).** A Huddersfield lad, he was an associated schoolboy with the Club. He became an apprentice in 1982 and has progressed to a regular first team place.

**Brian Cox (Goalkeeper).** Originally came on loan from Sheffield Wednesday. He signed for Town at the end of the loan period and has been established first team keeper over the last five years. Had made 193 League appearances for Huddersfield up to end of 1986/87 season.

**Malcolm Brown (Defender).** A very popular player at Leeds Road. He was transferred to Newcastle United but returned to Town in 1985. Has made over 350 appearances for the Club in his two spells. Other Club Bury, where he began his career.

**Graham Cooper (Midfielder).** A product of local football. He has made over 50 League appearances. Now fully recovered after sustaining a broken leg.

**Ian Banks (Midfielder).** Signed from Leicester City for £40,000. Began his career at Barnsley (164 appearances) before moving to Leicester (93 appearances). He has recently taken over the captaincy of the Huddersfield side.

**Willie McStay (Midfielder).** Signed in March from Celtic. A very experienced player, he was a regular member of Celtic first team. Born in Hamilton.

**Peter Ward (Forward).** Signed last season from Chester-le-Street and made 7 first team appearances. Scored his first League goal at Plymouth on August 22.

**Mark Barham (Forward).** Signed from Norwich City for whom he made 177 League appearances. Capped twice by England in 1983 against Australia.

**Andrew May (Midfielder).** A close season signing from Manchester City for whom he made 150 League appearances - most of them in the First Division. Began as an apprentice at Maine Road.

**Gordon Tucker (Defender).** A young defensive player who was signed from Derby County. He is a native of Manchester.

**Graham Mitchell (Defender).** 19 years old, has come through from the apprentice ranks. Had made 17 League appearances before the start of this season.

**Simon Trevitt (Defender).** Another former apprentice with the Club, born at Liversedge near Huddersfield. Scored his first League goal on the opening day of the season against Crystal Palace.

**Lee Martin (Goalkeeper).** The 19 year old, a former apprentice, only made his League debut on 24 October at West Bromwich. He was drafted in to replace the injured Brian Cox. And what a debut - one football magazine gave him 10 out of 10 for his performance.

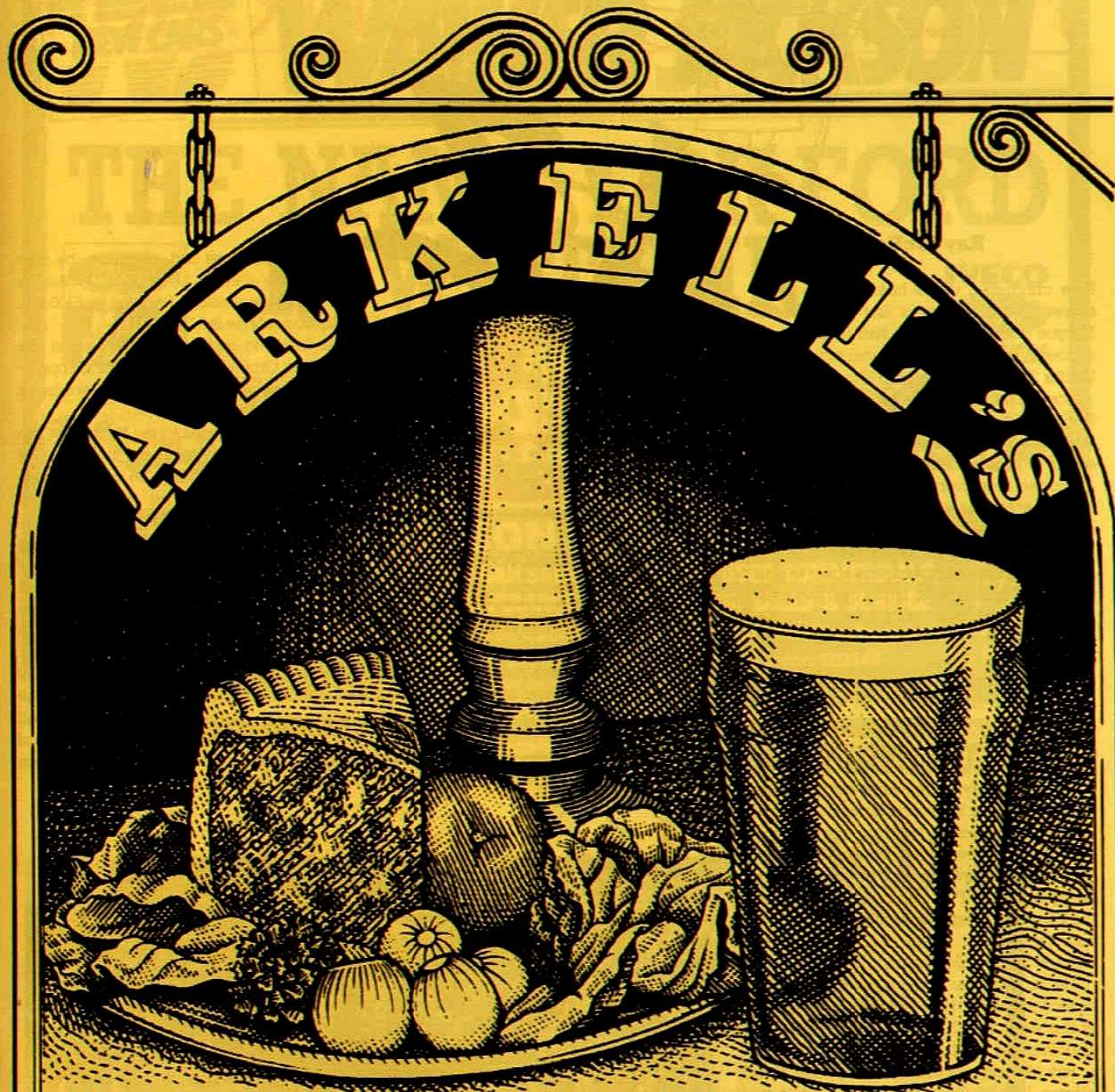

# A to Z

## OF SWINDON TOWN

### Ray McHale

Now chronicled in the history books as the scorer of Scarborough's first ever Football League goal, Ray McHale had an immensely successful spell at Swindon after signing from Halifax Town in September 1976.

Costing only £8,000, Ray soon became Club Captain and crowd favourite, his thoughtful but tenacious midfield play impressing locals eager to regain their Second Division place. An added responsibility of penalty taker was another area where both the crowd, and Ray, seemed to have confidence in his ability. His pinpoint passing was the product of a now diminishing footballing skill, the ability to stop, think, look up and pass, rather than engage in the 'headless chicken' routine which seems to govern the midfield play of many sides nowadays.

His debut came at Lincoln City in his familiar number four shirt, though he was soon to switch to the number 10 jersey. His first season with the Club saw him appear alongside some classic 'Town' players. At Lincoln, forcing the 0-0 draw that day, were names such as Trevor Anderson, Dave Syrett and Howard Goddard.

McHale scored the first of his nine goals that season in the 'Town's' first game of 1977 at Port Vale in a 2-2 draw. He had, however, scored two goals in the F.A. Cup before this, starting the 7-0 goal glut against Bromley in Round One and putting the 'Town' 3-1 up at Craven Cottage in the Third Round.

He scored nine times again the following season including three penalties in two games at the start of 1978 against Tranmere Rovers and Sheffield Wednesday.

Ray McHale was, of course, a member of the classic 1979/80 Swindon Town squad and a very important one at that, leading by fine example.

It was Rays penalty at White Hart Lane in the F.A. Cup that season that placed Swindon on the verge of another giantkilling, only the least successful substitution ever made was able to rob Swindon that night.

The superb League Cup run by the 'Town' in 1979/80 also saw Ray net an ultimately fruitless spot kick, at Molineux against Wolves in the semi-final Second Leg with Wolves still going

His performances had, of course, by now attracted the attention of the First Division. In May 1980 he was sold to Brighton for £100,000, a £92,000 profit for the 'Town'!

He failed to make an impression at the Goldstone Ground, making only nine appearances before moving north to join Barnsley in March the following year.

After 52 appearances for the Yorkshire Club Ray moved back to his home town Club of Sheffield United, making 96 appearances, broken by a loan period to Bury before heading south again, this time to Swansea.

Already vastly experienced before joining Swindon, after 200 plus appearances for Chesterfield and Halifax, Ray McHale played the best football of his career at the County Ground and added a vital ingredient, heart, to the Swindon Town midfield.

It was heartening to hear the name of Ray McHale again on the opening day of the season as he 'started again' in the Football League, bringing back, as it did, memories of his part in some of the most exciting modern moments in the history of Swindon Town.

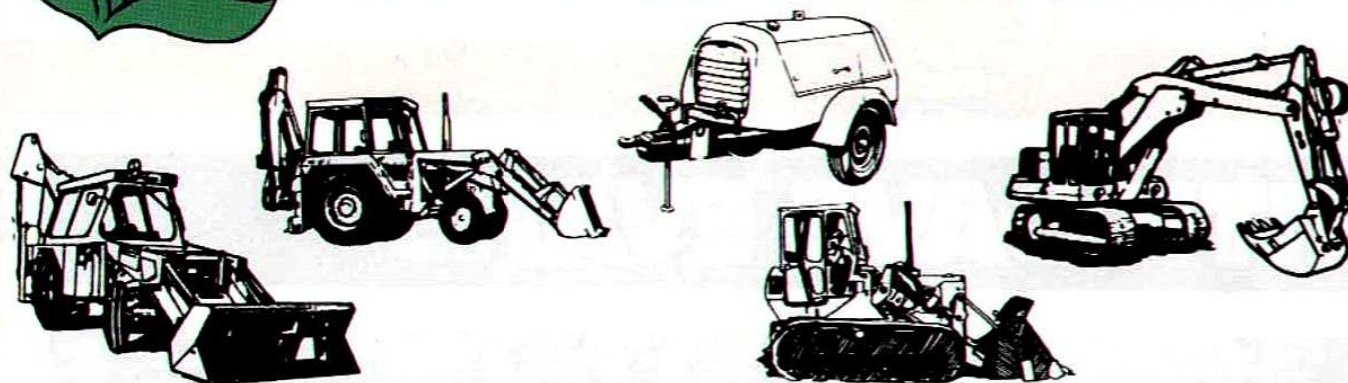

Our recent 4-2 defeat at Leeds, where our depleted forces were up against new United signing £350,000 Bobby Davison, brought the Town to within distance causing the Yorkshire Club a fight according to John Hill of 'The People'. The free scoring Bobby Barnes just cannot get himself onto a winning line-up at present! John paid tribute to Bob's current form in his report of the Elland Road high scoring match.

Little Bobby Barnes came within an ace of ruining Leeds' big day at Elland Road.

The former Aldershot winger hit two goals that stunned the home side after Swindon had looked dead and buried at 3-0 down.

Both - in the 40th and 77th minutes - were simple tap-ins. But Barnes put them away without a hint of a problem.

The only problem was that Lou Macari's side had allowed Leeds a field day for 35 minutes and then stood still six minutes from time as Haddock wrapped up the match.

Swindon have faltered of late and Leeds were parading £350,000 former Derby striker, Bobby Davison and 19-year-old David Batty, for the first time.

They opened their account in the 25th minute when Davison hammered home after Rennie got on the end of the flag kick.

And a super Snodin cross in the 35th minute left Swindon standing again, Taylor meeting it on the volley to ram the ball home.

The fight-back began when Bamber crossed to unmarked Barnes.

The winger then had another goal clearly off-side ruled out by the referee - but made no mistake when following up in the 77th minute.

Yet Leeds got their reward for an impressive display when defender Haddock beat two men before shooting past Flowers with six minutes to go.

Tony Hardisty of the 'Sunday Express' was quick to point out that he felt we were finding life difficult in the Second Division and that we had defensive deficiencies which Leeds punished adequately. A quick look at the League table would have shown Tony that Leeds are faring no better or reversing the line of thought no worse!

Swindon are finding life in the Second Division uncomfortable. Leeds ruthlessly exposed their defensive deficiencies three times in the first 35 minutes.

Bobby Barnes managed to cut the deficit five minutes before half-time and again in the 77th minute, but Leeds wrapped it up with the goal of the game seven minutes from the end.

Tony paid tribute to our commitment but felt we were indecisive.

Swindon were indecisive in most departments and paid the predictable penalty. There was never anything wrong with their commitment, but with the Leeds squad short on confidence the one thing Macari did not want was to go a goal down very early.

Imagine his disappointment when David Rennie helped in Bob Taylor's shot in the second minute.

### CHANCE

Leeds sensed from that moment that this was to be their day. And after 25 minutes Davison got their second by beating Tim Flowers from close range after Rennie's shot had been blocked. Ten minutes later Glyn Snodin's lovely deep cross was headed in by Taylor.

Three goals in arrears but Tony again had to pay a compliment to the Town's never-say-die spirit as they hauled themselves into contention.

To their credit Swindon kept on running and chasing and they deserved the Barnes goal just before half-time.

But after the break Swindon's luck ran out. Bamber missed a decent chance from a Barnes cross, and Mervyn Day foiled Jimmy Quinn. Then on 72 minutes Day saved from Peter Coyne when really he should have been given no chance.

With 13 minutes left Barnes got Swindon's second goal. But just when they sensed there might still be a point for the taking, Leeds hit them with a super goal.

Peter Haddock, Leeds' best player on the day, had Swindon back-peddalling with a fine run. And when he got the ball back from John Stiles he kept his composure splendidly to beat Flowers.
