

BLACKBURN'S RECORD **RUN IS OVER**

Blackburn Rovers' long unbeaten run finally came to an end at Stoke last Saturday. They had smashed all club records by playing 23 League games without defeat but Stoke's second-highest League gate (14,100) of the season began celebrating as Nicky Morgan gave the Potters an early lead.

Though Chris Price equalised for Rovers soon after the interval, Graham Shaw scored Stoke's winner a quarter-of-anhour from the end. Stoke have themselves built up an impressive unbeaten run. The Potters have won five and drawn two of their last seven Second Division matches.

Aston Villa strolled to a comfortable 2-1 victory at Bournemouth to open out a three-point lead over Blackburn at the top of the table. Goals from Tony Daley and David Platt put Villa into a two-goal lead with seven minutes to go. Andy Gray then conceded an own-goal to make the final score 2-1 to Villa.

Platt, signed from Crewe a few weeks ago, has scored in each of his last three games for Villa.

The game attracted Bournemouth's best League attendance (10,057) of the season.

What a dramatic change of fortunes there has been at Reading! By mid-Decem-ber they were bottom of the Second Division without any hope, it seemed, of avoiding relegation. Since then, the Royals have won five out of nine League games and knocked First Divison sides Q.P.R., Oxford, Nottingham Forest and Coventry out of the Simod Cup.

Their victory over Coventry - by 4-3 on penalties - takes them to Wembley for the first time in their history, where they now play Luton Town in the final on Sunday

27th March.

Last Saturday Reading won 2-0 at Huddersfield and they now have a very good chance of pulling clear of relegation danger. Both goals came from Billy Whitehurst - his first since his £120,000 transfer from Oxford last month.

The Midas touch of new manager David Pleat is beginning to work at Leicester. They made it four wins in a row last Saturday with a goal from Nicky Cross in a 1-0 home win over Sheffield United.

Striker Ian Baird celebrated his return to Leeds by scoring the winning goal at home to Plymouth last weekend. Ian, Leeds' top scorer with 19 goals last season, was sold to Portsmouth for £285,000 last summer but he managed to score only twice this season for Pompey. They relieved their financial problems by agreeing to sell him back to Leeds for only £185,000.





Robert and Chris are both resident at the F.A. School of Excellence at Lilleshall.



RECORD FEE RECEIVED FOR LINIGHAN

Athletic picked up £350,000 from the sale of defender Andy Linighan to First Division Norwich City last week, a record for the club.



The move appeared to come out of the blue after a possible deal with Crystal Palace fell through three

weeks earlier, but in fact negotiations had been taking place between the two chairmen for four days.

Athletic's Chairman Ian Stott said: "The Norwich Chairman contacted me on the Sunday following our friendly at Norwich. They were obviously impressed with Andy's performance in that match and had watched him in a few previous games. It wasn't until Tuesday that the fee was agreed, and the player travelled to Norwich on Wednesday to talk personal terms, and undergo a medical examination."

It was 8 p.m. on the Wednesday evening before Andy eventually signed on the dotted line. Everything had been kept a closely guarded secret at the request of Norwich.

Joe Royle signed Andy from Leeds United on January 13th. 1986 for £55,000 and during his 26 months at Boundary Park Andy made 102 appearances and scored eight goals.

Joe does not intend to be

rushed into a signing but knowing how he operates don't be surprised if he has made a signing before today's game.







SWINDON'S ATTACKING STYLE PAYS OFF

by Tony Pullein

Swindon manager Lou Macari decided to continue with his attacking policy after winning last season's promotion play-offs to move up into Second Division football this season. It has kept the Robins in a safe position in mid-table.

They were also hoping it would take them to Wembley! Swindon were due to meet Luton in the semi-final of the Simod Cup, aiming for a game against neighbours

Reading in the final.

Swindon had already scored five victories over First Division sides in other cup-ties this season. Norwich were ousted from both the F.A. Cup and Simod Cup to add to wins over Portsmouth, Derby and Chelsea.

The Robins possess four consistent goalscorers in Jimmy Quinn (24 goals), Dave Bamber (12), Bobby Barnes (who scored seven times for Aldershot and, since his transfer, has bagged eight more for Swindon) and Steve White (12).

Quinn is level top scorer in the Second Division and his shooting form has earned him a recall to the N. Ireland team. He scored their winning goal against Turkey and picked up his 16th cap against Greece. Swindon initially signed Jimmy from Oswestry Town and he made his League debut during 1981/82. Blackburn signed him in 1984 and it was with them that he became an international. He rejoined Swindon last season.

Bamber has been a consistent scorer since joining the club from Portsmouth in 1985. Last season he netted 20 times and he has bagged 12 goals so far this term. He started his career with Blackpool and it was after leading their scorers for two successive seasons that Coventry signed him in 1983. He didn't stay for long at Highfield Road before signing for Walsall. Portsmouth signed him three season ago.

Barnes started his career with West Ham, making his League debut during the 1980/81 campaign. He made more than 40 League appearances for the Hammers before going to Scunthorpe on loan in 1985. He then made the full transfer to Aldershot. Swindon

signed him in October.

Steve White is likely to play in attack with Quinn and Bamber. Steve was top scorer with 21 goals last season, including the two

which finally beat Gillingham in the replay of the play-off finals which clinched promotion. He was originally a Bristol Rovers player, moving off to Luton in a £175,000 deal in 1979. Charlton signed him in 1982 but a year later he returned to Bristol Rovers. Swindon signed him during the 1986 close-season.

Barnes usually plays in midfield alongside Keiran O'Regan and Steve Foley but Chris Kamara and Charlie Henry are also in

contention here.

O'Regan was spotted in Irish football by Brighton who offered him a professional contract. He made his League debut for the Seagulls in 1983 and, whilst with them, he won four Republic of Ireland caps. Swindon

signed him last summer.

Foley, who joined Swindon from Sheffield United last summer, began as a Liverpool apprentice. He didn't make the League team at Anfield but he got his chance when loaned to Fulham during 1983/84. At the end of that season he was transferred to Grimsby and he moved on to Sheffield United just over a year later.

Kamara is now in his second spell with Swindon. After taking his League bow with Portsmouth in 1975, he moved on to Swindon two years later. In 1981 he went back to Portsmouth — but only for a few weeks. Brentford signed him and he remained at Griffin Park until re-joining Swindon in 1985.

Henry is a versatile player who was a defender when he made his League debut for Swindon in 1980. Two seasons ago he switched back to attack and finished top scorer with 18 goals. Now he usually plays in midfield.

Tim Parkin and Jon Gittens have recently been playing in the middle of the defence, though Colin Calderwood had been a fixture

in the centre until early February.

Parkin joined Swindon from Bristol Rovers in 1986. Earlier his career had taken some surprise twists. After turning professional with Blackburn, he got 13 outings in their League eleven and then decided to try his luck in Sweden in 1980. He played for Malmo and then Almondsbury but he returned to England in 1981 to join Bristol Rovers.

Southampton were impressed by Gittens' performance with Paget Rangers and they invited him along to The Dell. He was blooded in their First Division side towards the end of the 1985/86 season. Swindon

signed him last summer.

Calderwood got his League chance with Mansfield in 1982 and quickly earned himself a place in their senior squad. Swindon signed him for £27,500 in 1985 and he hadn't missed a game until last month.

Dave Hockaday and Phil King are the full

Hockaday was a forward in his early days with Blackpool but is now well established at right-back. He made his League debut for Blackpool in 1977 and made well over 100 League appearances for them before transferring to Swindon in 1983.

King was introduced to League soccer by Exeter City in 1984 and was a fairly regular member of their side for two seasons. He moved on to Torquay during the summer of 1986 but it wasn't long before a further

transfer took him to Swindon.

Goalkeeper Fraser Digby has just returned after injury. Signed from Manchester United, Fraser made his League debut last season but he has already won four England under-21 caps.
