





FRANKLY SPEAKING

We welcome everyone to Leyton Stadium for today's Third Round F.A. Cup tie against Swindon Town.

Ossie Ardiles, their Manager, has turned them into one of the best footballing sides in the country after inheriting a successful, but very direct team, from Lou Macari. We shall need to prevent them showing too much of that ability here today.

Some of our play in the first half of our last home match against Crewe was surely as good, if not better, than anything we have produced in a long, long time. We could have scored six or seven goals before half time, it was just as well we managed to score three, as our defending was poor, especially early in the game. Anyone coming in late would have missed the most explosive opening ten minutes to a game I have ever seen. Although the second half was goalless, and therefore a bit of an anti-climax, we controlled the

game very well and in fact, Crewe only got the ball into our penalty area four times in forty-five minutes.

Our worst fears were realised regarding the ridiculous Boxing Day fixture away to Bury because of the adverse weather conditions. The players had Christmas Day ruined, having to travel up on Christmas night and then spent a very frustrating day having prepared for the game to no avail. The supporters who travelled up to Bury also had a completely wasted day, although I believe some of them ended up at Old Trafford watching our 'superiors'. There was no blame attached to anyone on the day as the pitch was playable right up until the torrential rainstorm between one o'clock and one thirty left large puddles all over the ground and the referee with no alternative but to postpone the match.

Having expressed our misgivings about the fixture at the start of the season, it was interesting to see the publicity generated by Liverpool being unhappy about their fixture at Queens Park Rangers. Accepting the fact that the Police will not allow any Derby matches on Bank Holidays, it should surely be possible to arrange fixtures involving less travel, especially for supporters on those dates.

Our game at Bournemouth last Saturday eventually turned out to be an exciting, competitive hard-fought, contest difficult, heavy conditions, although it was disappointing to lose a two goal lead, I feel that a draw was probably a fair result. Having weathered the storm in the firsthalf, we scored two-excellent goals quickly after half-time, but then allowed Bournemouth to get back into the game, not without some controversy it must be said! Our goalkeeper was adamant that the ball never crossed the line for their second goal, but the referee's opinion is the only one that counts and he obviously disagreed.

I hope that you see an exciting Cup-tie today. Get behind the players and help us ensure a place in the hat for the draw, whenever it is.

A fine new stand - one of the many initiatives supported by Trust funds.


The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's final report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods. Vernons and Zetters. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

PROFILE

JOHN GORMAN



The success of Leyton Orient's youth team this season has delighted Coach John Gorman.

The Young O's are currently second in the South East Counties League, despite the strong opposition of the bigger clubs, and on Monday play Birmingham City here at Brisbane Road in the third round of the FA Youth Cup.

"I am delighted with how well the youngsters have done this season." said John.

"Their all round standard has been particularly impressive and the bonus is in the fact that most of them can play for the colts again next season."

One member of the youth squad, 16-yearold Chris Bart-Williams has already appeared as substitute for the first team.

John Gorman also looks after Orient's reserve team so he is able to give many of the young players a chance in the Wendy Fair Capital League.

A Scotsman from Edinburgh, John joined Orient two years ago after being coach and assistant manager at Gillingham.

He left the Kent club when Keith Burkinshaw, who had taken over from Keith Peacock as manager, asked him to be Chief Scout.

"It wasn't my scene at all," said John, "I am a coach and that's what I wanted to do".

John started his career at Celtic playing in one of the strongest reserve sides which included Kenny Dalglish, Lou Macari, David Hay and Danny McGrain.

After a limited number of first team appearances for Celtic John moved to Carlisle in 1970–71 season, playing in the First and Second Division with them, mainly at full back.

Keith Burkinshaw, then boss of Tottenham paid £80,000 for John who joined a team and played with Hoddle, Vilas, and Ossie Ardiles, manager of today's visitors Swindon.

A serious knee injury disrupted John's career at White Hart Lane and he went to America in 1979 to play for Tampa Bay Rowdies and in the Indoor League with Phoenix, playing in the final of the Soccer Bowl.

John lives at Lower Halstow in Kent with wife Myra and children-Amanda (17) and Nick (14) and in his spare time is a very good artist painting portraits and caricatures. He is very happy working at Leyton Orient: "They are a great club and everybody is hoping we can achieve promotion this season."

Meanwhile John is looking to the future. "It is my job to produce players for O's first teams of the future", he said. "One player who has already graduated through the youth system is Adrian Whitbread, now a regular in the side. I hope there are many more to follow him". Fire Protection



(A look at the FA Cup Third Round and the chances of the Third Division leaders.)

The Third Division is reasonably well represented in today's third round FA Cup action with our game here at Brisbane Road between Leyton Orient and Second Division Swindon Town one to look forward to in anticipation. The O's have a splendid home record this season as they set their sights on promotion and today's match will give the team a great opportunity to show their potential against Ossie Ardiles' team who occupy a midtable position in the Second Division but who play good attacking football. It's a match that should provide some high quality action. Cambridge United, beaten only once away this season will certainly be put to the test away to Second Division Wolverhampton Wanderers and the scourge of defences, Steve Bull.

Shrewsbury Town haven't exactly been setting the Third Division alight this season and they will do well to get a result against fast improving Second Division Watford who recently hoisted themselves off the bottom of the table after a six match unbeaten run under new manager Steve Perryman. 



MEET OUR VISITORS

Today's visitors Swindon Town occupy a midtable position in the Second Division and had taken 27 points from 23 League games going into last Saturday's match.

Away from home they had been beaten only three times in 11 games,

winning two and drawing six.

Swindon's Manager Ossie Ardiles, the former Argentinian international and Tottenham Hotspur player was at Brisbane Road to watch O's beat Colchester United in their second round FA Cup replay.

PAUL BODIN (Defender). First choice at left-back since Phil King's departure to Sheffield a year ago. Now a Welsh international, having gained his first cap against Costa Rica in May. Signed for a bargain £25,000 from Newport County in March 1988 and previously with Bath City, where he was top scorer with 16 goals in 1986/87.

FRASER DIGBY (Goalkeeper). The former England Under-21 keeper missed just one game in 1989/90, the first time he had been absent in over two years. The former Manchester United apprentice, who also spent a loan period with Oldham Athletic, made his League debut for Swindon in September 1986.

STEVE FOLEY (Midfield). Missed the first three months of last season through injury, but was soon buzzing again as the Town fielded an unchanged line-up in 22 successive League and Cup games. A knee injury forced him out again in the spring. Spent four years at Anfield, without making a senior appearance. Signed from Sheffield United for £35,000 in 1987.

JON GITTENS (Defender). Now enjoying his most consistent spell since arriving from Southampton three years ago, having not been absent from the Town line-up in the past twelve months. The Saints spotted him playing for Midland Combination club Paget Rangers in 1985.

NICKY HAMMOND (Goalkeeper). Made his first senior appearance for Swindon in two and a half years against Darlington in the Rumbelows League Cup, having suffered two broken leg injuries during that

DAVID KERSLAKE (Midfield/Defender). Signed for £110,000 from Queens Park Rangers last November. David stepped in at right-back and became a firm favourite with the fans with his forceful sorties upfield. Represented England at schoolboy, youth and Under-21 levels. David joined the Loftus Road club as an apprentice and made his first team debut in a UEFA Cup tie in 1984.

NESTOR LORENZO (Defender). The Argentinian, who played in the World Cup Final, has been signed on loan from Italian club Bari for the remainder of the season. He has appeared 25 times for his country. Has now signed on a permanent basis.

ROSS MacLAREN (Midfield/Defender). The other 'ever-present' in the Swindon side last season, along with Colin Calderwood, Ross has assumed the role of skipper in the absence of his fellow Scot. Signed two years ago from Derby, where he won a Second Division championship medal, and previously with Shrewsbury Town and Glasgow Rangers.

DUNCAN SHEARER (Striker). Joint top scorer with 27 goals last season, Duncan has topped his club's scoring list for a fourth successive season (twice with Huddersfield Town) and leads the way again this term. Signed from the Yorkshire club for £230,000, he was previously released by Chelsea on a 'free' transfer.

STEVE WHITE (Striker). Probably the best 'free' transfer signing ever made by Swindon Town, Steve was the other half of the club's 54-goal partnership last season. Previously with Bristol Rovers (twice), Luton Town and Charlton Athletic.

Neil Kaufman looks back at the careers of two more former Orient players, Idris Miles and William Corkindale.

Idris Miles

Only one player ever to play for Orient was smaller than this Cardiff born player and that was Fred LeMay. Miles stood at 5ft 31/2in and he weighed 9st 6lb. With his considerable speed he was nicknamed by the O's fans 'The flying flea'. Miles joined Orient from Leicester City in May 1934 as part of the Tommy Mills deal. He made 7 League appearances for City in 32-33. hitting one goal. He played at outsideright but was kept out of the side by the good form of 'Ginger' Mayson, but came into his own in 35-36-it was that season that he starred in the impressive win over high flying Charlton Athletic in the FA Cup. He was not quite so impressive in 36-37 when Jim McCombe often played. Miles was transferred to Exeter City in 1937 making 10 appearances, 1 goal before his transfer to Worcester City in 1938.

On his day he was a very fast raiding and dangerous wingman.

William Joseph Corkindale


'Corky' as he was known at Orient was born in West Bromwich on May 9 1901. Signed by Swansea from Wellington Town on November 21, 1923 for £250 and played 19 games for the Welshmen scoring twice before joining the O's on a free transfer in 1926.

This bandy legged winger who stood 5ft 10in and weighed 10st 5lb, became a firm favourite with the Millfields' crowd. Played in the two memorable FA Cup ties with Aston Villa in January 1929. His performances assisted in the successful retaining of Division 2 status in the third season but not even his efforts could stop the O's being relegated for the first time in its League history.

He showed an attacking style which often saw him move in from the wing to shoot for goal and he was quite a good goal scorer for a wingman.

He did not stay with the Club for its Third Division (South) encounters but moved onto Millwall where he played 40 matches scoring 5 goals. He joined Q.P.R. in 1931 and later became involved in the restaurant business. He died August 3 1972, aged 71.




