

WELCOME BACK

For the fifth time of asking we will be out this evening to try and complete this F.A. Cup Third Round tie against our welcome visitors from Leyton Orient Football Club.

The original tie at Brisbane Road went to a replay after Geoff Pike cancelled out Duncan Shearer's early goal. Gale force winds took care of the initial replay set for Tuesday 8 January 1991. Monday 14 January at 5.00 p.m. match referee Mike Bailey inspected the County Ground pitch and was totally satisfied that it was playable. A check was made with the Bristol Weather Centre and they confirmed that the temperature would only be at freezing point or at the worst -1° which should cause no problems. At 7.30 p.m. Mr. Bailey had a further precautionary look at the pitch as it was noticeable the temperature was dropping rapidly. The Cambridge based official said that the pitch was playable and the game commenced. It was evident that as the game went on the temperature was still dropping and at half time was down to -4°, well below the forecast. After consultation with the Managers they were told that should the conditions worsen the referee would obviously have to call the game to a halt. Paul Bodin put the Town in front after 50 minutes with a quick Leyton Orient equaliser coming from Kevin Dickenson just one minute later. In conditions which would have made Torvill and Dean feel at home Mike Bailey was left with no option but to abandon the tie after 54 minutes for not only the players safety on the pitch but also for the spectators as the terracing was freezing and becoming dangerous.

The safety of spectators and players is always of paramount importance, so here we

are tonight.

Last Tuesday evening it was clear that the weather was not going to improve in time for the re-arranged kick-off on Wednesday with the frost deep in the ground on the Shrivenham Road Stand side. At 8.00 p.m. the referee was left with the only choice of another postponement.

EXTRA TIME

Should the scores be level tonight after ninety minutes, extra time of fifteen minutes each way will be played. If they are still level it's back here at the County Ground this Wednesday evening with a 7.45 p.m. kick off!

As if the abandonment of the game on Monday evening wasn't enough, we suffered a power failure in our Computer Room overnight which prevented the new set of replay tickets from being printed in time to go straight back on sale. Thus the reason for the Town End seats being unreserved for tonight only with cash payment at the turnstiles.

The date for our next round is this Saturday 26 January 1991 with a 3.00 p.m. kick-off at Carrow Road. Norwich City's opponents? . . . well only time will tell!
