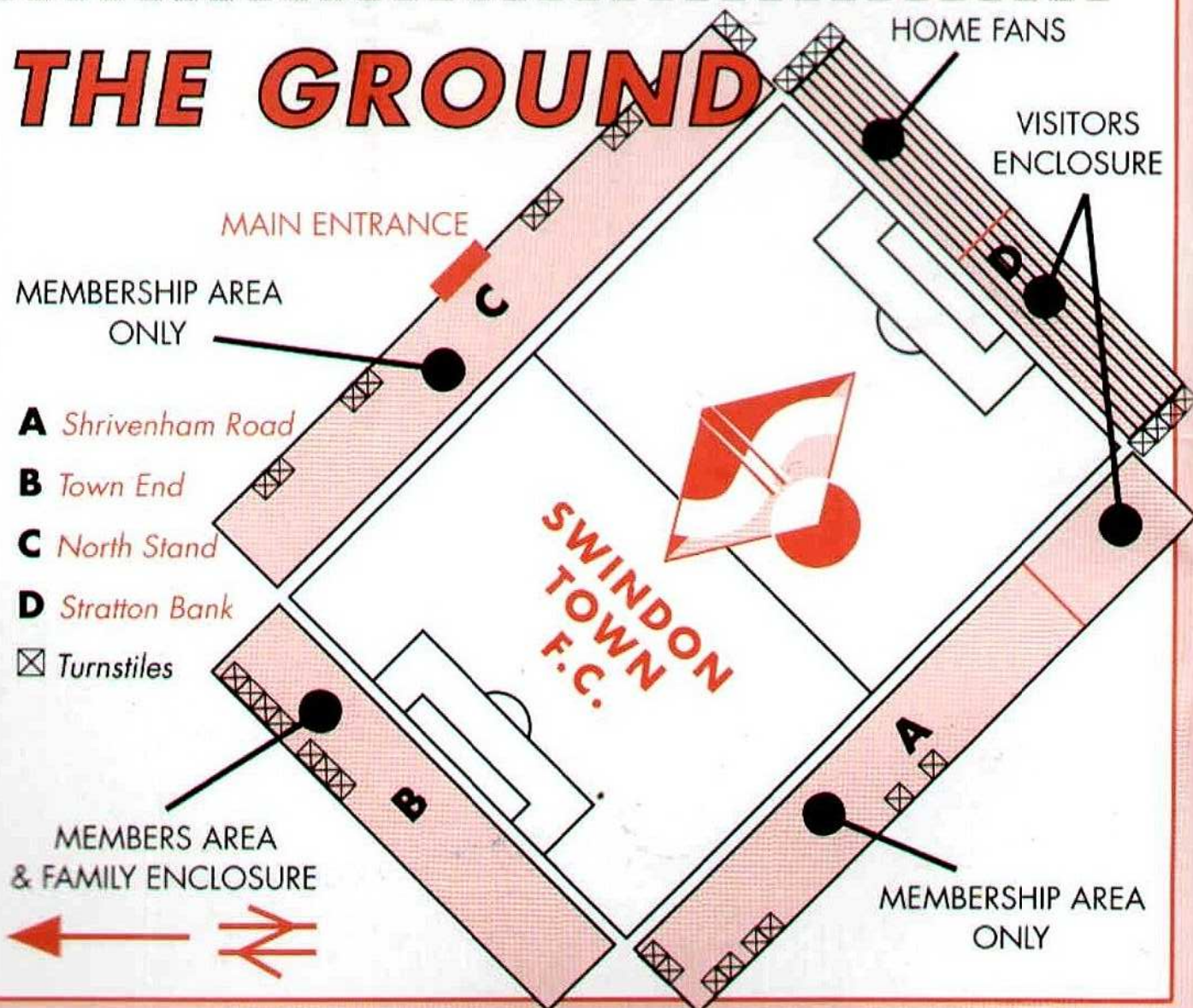

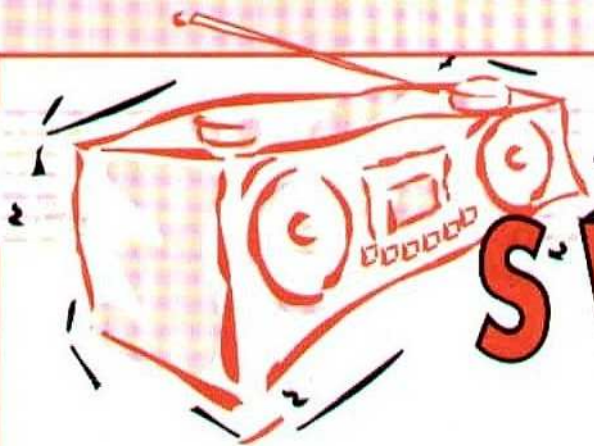

## **COMBINATION**

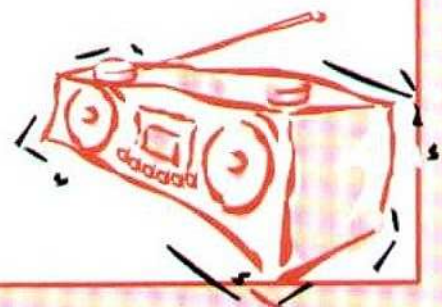

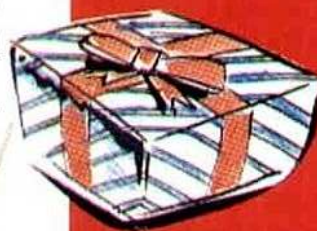

I saw the England and Germany game at Wembley last week and was impressed by the technical way the Germans played using

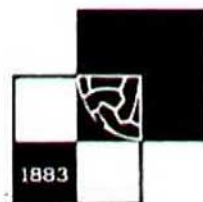
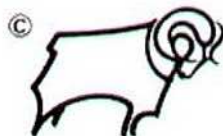
the sweeper system the way we try to play.

# NEWS

Charlton Athletic are experiencing problems with their planned return to the Valley which has now been put back to the New Year. The problem appears to be the insistence of Greenwich Council who require that each item of work receives individual planning consent thus requiring Charlton to submit numerous planning applications, all of which is very time consuming. When finished the new look Valley will seat 12,000 spectators and provide covered accommodation on three sides of the ground which once held 75,031 spectators in 1938. Meanwhile, on the pitch, Charlton continued their steady start to the season which has seen them lose only one of their opening five games. New signing Gary Nelson scored his first goal for Athletic in their 2-0 victory at Plymouth and manager Alan Curbishley remains optimistic about his sides chances "I feel the Second Division this season is much more even than in previous years and although it is early days there do not seem to be any out and out favourites for promotion or any obvious candidates for relegation. As the season progresses I think there will be a few surprises in store, and hopefully Charlton can continue as we have started and provide a few ourselves."

Watford boss Steve Perryman has not seen his side make the best of starts losing all three of their home games to date to Wolves, Middlesbrough and Cambridge and he will be looking for an improvement if his ambitions for the club are to become reality. Following a recent game at Newcastle, Perryman revealed "That game put us in front of a crowd of 22,000 people, with all the pre match hustle and bustle that you normally associate with a First Division match. It took me back to those days of my own career and increased my determination to work towards bringing those days back to Watford."

Peter Shilton, 42 this month has experienced both sides of the coin from the Derby fans in recent weeks. Blamed for his side's 2-1 home defeat to Southend, Shilton was not impressed when fans barracked him during Derby's next home game against Blackburn Rovers threatening to quit the club "If they feel they don't want me at Derby that's fine by me. I don't need Derby County and I'll go somewhere else. I have set my stall out to help Derby get back into the First Division and that still remains an ambition." A week later following a rapturous response from the Baseball

Ground fans, Shilton performed without fault in the 1-1 draw with Barnsley and replied by saying "The fans showed how big they are. They gave me a great reception and I will remember that for a long time."

Only three clubs remain without a victory in the Second Division . . . Oxford, Barnsley and Bristol Rovers. Barnsley manager Mel Machin has signed Oldham Athletic winger Neil Redfearn on a months loan with a view to a more permanent move. Much travelled Redfearn missed only five games last season in Oldham's successful promotion campaign scoring fourteen goals and will be disappointed at losing the opportunity of playing in the First Division. Bristol Rovers meanwhile, under new boss Martin Dobson look set for a difficult season following the departure in the summer of influential midfielder Ian Holloway who has teamed up with former Rovers boss Gerry Francis at Q.P.R.. The club however are keen to return to Bristol after spending the last three seasons at Twerton Park in Bath and chairman Denis Dunford has made his plans for the club clear "We have transformed the Twerton Park stadium but we can do no more here. A much larger all seated stadium in Bristol is essential for the continued expansion and growth of the club. That is our next objective and I am confident that it will happen. The plans we have are not minuscule, but worthy of a great club at home in a great city."

Two of the divisions goalkeepers will be out of action following injuries received last week. Brighton's Perry Digweed tore a calf muscle whilst warming up for the game at Millwall and will be out for at least a month. Plymouth and Welsh squad member Rhys Wilmott was injured during the Pilgrims 2-2 draw at Newcastle and will also be unable to play for a month. His place will be taken by reserve Dave Walter who combines professional football with Argyle with sheep farming at his father's farm in Devon.

## PERRYMAN THE MASTER RETURNS



STEVE PERRYMAN was almost an institution at White Hart Lane where he notched up a Tottenham Hotspur record 864 appearance between 1969 and 1986. Glenn Hoddle was one of the eager disciples who developed in the masters wake during those glorious years in North London.

Now the two clash as rival managers in what promises to be a real footballing feast. For Perryman, who was a great success as a manager at Brentford, is now trying to steer troubled Watford back to better times.

Like Glenn, Steve's principles rebound off quality football. Last season it took him all his time to stave off relegation. This season he hopes to be involved in a battle at the other end of the Second Division chart.

So far the Hornets have only stung away from home. On their own Vicarage Road patch they have lost to Wolves, Cambridge United and

Middlesbrough in the league. But on their travels they have drawn 2-2 at Newcastle United and won 3-0 at Barnsley.

They lost their top hit-man, Paul Wilkinson, to Middlesbrough during the summer but former Vicarage Road favourite Luther Bissett has returned from Bournemouth with a vengeance firing four goals in the opening seven games of the season.

The former England striker, who had a season with Milan, will be hoping to add to his phenomenal tally-no one has scored more goals for Watford-at the County Ground on Saturday, September 28th.

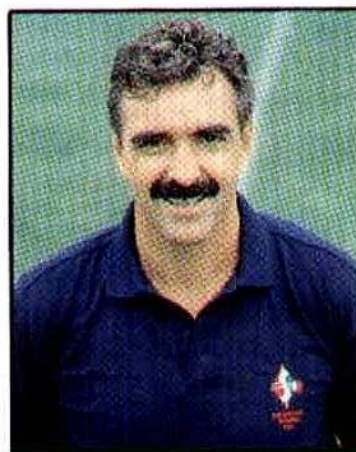
# Offbeat<sup>WITH</sup> JOHN GORMAN

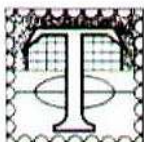

# MARTIN LING

You can almost hear the adrenalin bubbling in the slight frame of Martin Ling, such is the enthusiasm that is filling him with excitement and ambition as he fights for a place in the first team.

At 25, Martin knows that if he is going to make his mark then now is the time he must do it and though the headlines and plaudits which praised his substitute appearances are good for the ego there could be no greater testament to his ability than a regular place in the first team.

"Without wishing to seem big-headed my name was always one of the first pencilled in on the team sheet at Exeter," says Martin. "But I left St James' Park because I felt they lacked ambition. They were standing still in the Fourth Division."

Where did he go? Why to the County Ground of course. It was Lou Macari who persuaded the young Londoner that his future was with Swindon Town. That the Robins were flying higher and that he could spread his wings with them.

"It back-fired," admits Martin who stayed just 93 days. "Macari signed me on a two-year contract but we just didn't see eye to eye on football. I want to put the record straight because there has been a lot of rubbish written about it in the press. We didn't have blazing rows about discos and drinking. It was nothing like that. I just couldn't play the way he wanted me to. Humping the ball up field as far as possible. There has got to be more to football than that."

"So he moved me on to Southend United. I think I played just four games for Swindon. But if I hadn't got a move a think I would have walked out of the game rather than play it his way."

Having been born and raised in the East End of London, where he was an avid West Ham United fan, it is perhaps not surprising that the long-ball doctrine goes against the Ling grain.

Says Martin: "I watched the Hammers as a kid. Trevor Brooking was my kind of player. He didn't break sweat."

His move to Roots Hall meant a return to home roots. Martin was able to live with his family which he had left at 15 to join the junior ranks at Exeter City.

"I had a lot of misgivings at the time," he recalls. "It was a big wrench to travel so far away from the family

at that age. But I wanted to be a professional footballer more than anything else in the world so I took a chance."

Gerry Francis eventually gave Martin a three-year contract and he made his League debut in the centre of midfield at Sheffield United. He was still only 16. During his four years with Southend Martin helped 'The Shrimpers' gain promotion to Division Three, finishing that season as the second top scorer from midfield. But he began to get stale and needed a new challenge.

A loan trial at Mansfield convinced the club he was the man for them but Martin was not so enamoured about moving north. He says: "Ossie came in for me the day before the transfer deadline. It sounded good so I signed."

"I remember I came down for training on the Friday and was very happy with what was being done. I went home picked up the paper on Sunday morning to read the headline: 'Bye Bye Ossie! I thought oh no. What if they get another Macari."

"Thankfully it was Glenn who came and his system is pure football. I'm really enjoying my role on the pinnacle of the midfield diamond - just behind the front two because it gives me the opportunity to run at opponents."

"My ambition though is to be in the starting line. There would be no point in being here if I did not want that. But everyone else in the 15-man squad has the same ambition."

"From what I have seen I don't think there is a side in the Second Division that can touch us on football. Do we play too much football? I don't think so. I bet we finish the season higher than Cambridge United." Martin claims he needs no motivation to play in the reserves because he knows without consistent performances there he will not be considered for the senior squad. But with Micky Hazard occupying his role he has considerable opposition to overcome if he is to achieve his objective.

Always one of the first to look at the team sheet when it is pinned to the wall he smiles confidently: "My chance will come. At first you try to get into the first fifteen, then the thirteen then the eleven. . . I'm not here to play in the reserves."





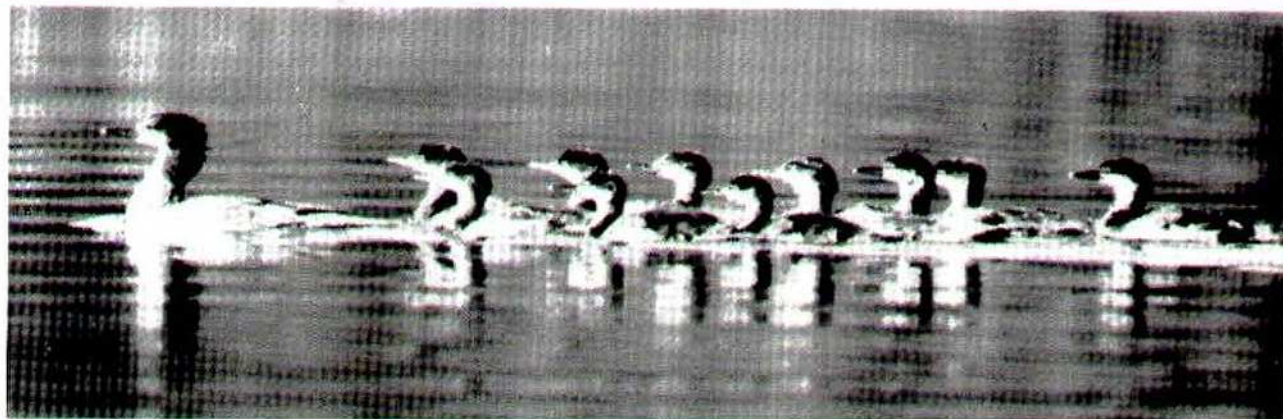

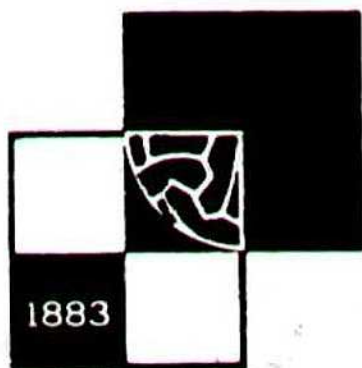

Bristol Rovers travelled to Southend at the weekend still looking for their first win of the season.

It has been a disappointing opening to a season that started so dramatically on the opening day when Rovers overcame a three goal deficit to draw 3-3 with Ipswich Town.

A further point was earned at Tranmere Rovers but then they lost at home to Newcastle United and suffered subsequent defeats at the hands of Bristol City and Grimsby Town.

So these are difficult times for new manager Martin Dobson as he tries to formulate a winning blend. The squad is basically the same as that which served the Rovers last season when Carl Saunders was the leading scorer with 16 Second Division goals and exciting Devon White added 11.

White netted twice in the 3-3 draw with Ipswich on the opening day and added a third goal in the home game with Grimsby Town so he will certainly be one to look for this evening.



### **THE MAN IN CHARGE**

Martin Dobson came into League football as a young player with Burnley in 1968 after a brief spell as an amateur with Bolton Wanderers. A powerful athlete he was a creative midfielder who captained Burnley in the First Division by the time he was 21.

Capped five times by England in 1974 he was transferred to Everton for a British record 300,000 in August 1974. Five years later he returned to Turf Moor for 100,000.

In 1984 he took on the challenge of player-manager at Bury and in his first full season led the Shakers into Division Three.

Martin left Bury in March 1989 and was out of the game for two years before taking on the task with Bristol Rovers.

# BENNO'S REPORT

By COLIN BENSON.

**The burning question on everyone's lips at the moment is not England's disappointing defeat by Germany at Wembley but exactly what is to become of the Football League.**

**As you know all the current First Division clubs have resigned to join the Football Association sponsored Premier League.**

Not surprisingly the remainder of the 93 clubs are upset because not only will we all lose stature but considerable finance as well.

It is obvious that TV and media coverage will be polarised, as always on the Liverpool's and Arsenal's leaving the rest to fend for themselves in a decreasing market place.

Now the League tried to enforce a rule which stipulates that member clubs must give three years notice of resignation. The FA contested this in court despite FIFA drawing their attention to article 57 of their statutes which states that national associations should not refer disputes of this nature to court but should submit them to an arbitration tribunal.

The FA won the legal argument which meant that as the First Division clubs had resigned, and the League control is in the hands of just the top two divisions - the Third and Fourth Divisions have but six votes - constitutionally the League did not exist any more as there is nobody to run it. With no Management Committee to handle affairs administrators have been appointed so things can roll on.

It seemed the FA were winning every round until last week's meeting when they were

put on the spot by the sudden startling decision of the 22 First Division clubs to change sides in the debate on promotion and relegation.

They sided with the rest of us and after some tentative exchanges appear to have agreed to three up three down between the two competitions although there is some argument over compensation.

Jon Pollard, one of Town's representatives at the meeting says: "We are fully confident an agreement can be struck. The difference in the financial dispute is not a million miles away. We want 6 million a year compensation they are talking about 5 million.

"But the League are asking for legal guarantees and I would be surprised if we get them from the FA. What we can be sure of though is that there will be a Premier League."

Personally, I don't see why they don't just change the title of the First Division to "Premier" and make the Second Division the First and so on and stop all this suicidal wrangling.

***DID YOU*** see that Southend United's first-day cover issue to commemorate their first match in the Second Division is now a real collector's item... The Shrimpers got their Bristols mixed up and printed "Rovers" when it should have been "City."

The Town had made what was to prove to be their last visit to Eastville in October 1981, recording a fine 4-1 win. So this was a chance to complete a League double. And how well they took that chance! For when full-back Charlie Henry drove goal number five past Phil Kite with a minute to go, it was the first time Swindon had recorded five against the Rovers since Boxing Day 1913! Town hit the woodwork in the 15th minute, when Howard Pritchard drove in a cross from the right and the ball came off the knee of Gary Williams to hit the crossbar. But Rovers were the first to find the net. After half an hour Tim Parkin, who would later come to Swindon, headed home a cross from the late Mike Barrett. But the Town were level within a minute when Tim got his boot in the way of a Pritchard cross to send it past his own goal keeper.

Swindon took the lead ten minutes into the second half. From a left-wing run by Roy Carter, Paul Rideout sent a bullet header past Kite. And six minutes later, they were 3-1 up. Kevin Baddeley went on a storming run into the area, where he was pushed from behind by former Town winger Brian Williams. Carter obliged from the spot. But just two minutes later, Rovers were put back in with a chance. Rideout robbed Gary Mabbutt, but his back-pass to Jimmy Allan stuck in the mud, brought by heavy rain prior to the game and Archie Stephens nipped in to score. Then the former England school-boy striker made amends when he sent a header into Kite's top left-hand corner from a Brian Hughes cross, to make it

4-2. Rovers were left a man short with five minutes to go when Brian Williams - made captain for the day against his old club - was dismissed by referee Colin Downey for kicking Hughes. And the Town duly wrapped it all up with young Henry's late strike.

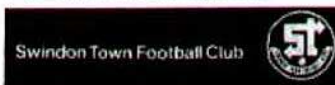
