I got home about 2.45 am and had to be up bright and early to prepare for the club's annual meeting on Thursday morning. That


went very well indeed-it was quite amusing, in fact, to see the chairman getting a vote of confidence"

It can be busy, it can be frustrating and it can have its disappointments. But successful weeks like the last one make it all worthwhile from a personal point of view and from the club's standpoint.


I hope there are many more in the same vein.

Naccumulated vast experience of football at the highest level. Born in an exclusive area of the Thames Valley, Webb is a six foot striker who played 72 games for Reading then 123 for Portsmouth.

He moved to Nottingham Forest in 1985 for a fee of £250,000. He had a spell with Manchester United before moving back to Forest in November 1992 for £800,000. Whilst in the North he got only 8 goals in 75 games. This is surprisingly few by his standards because during his career he had scored well over 100 goals. He joined Swindon on loan this season from Forest. Webb has played 26 times for England, 4 times for England B, 3 times for England U21 and 10 times for England youth.



The last decade has been the most eventful ever in the history of Swindon Town Football Club. Under Lou Macari the club rose from division four to the first division within the space of four seasons. But they had to wait another three seasons before they actually played in the top flight. They were relegated for administrative reasons over the summer of 1990. Three years later they were back at the top but again they had a bad summer when manager Glenn Hoddle left for

Chelsea and the club never really found its feet in the Premiership.

Over the summer the club received £1.5 million from Manchester City for Nicholas Summerbee. They spent a third of it on Mark Robinson who spent fifteen up and down months at Newcastle

following a £400,000 move from Barnsley. The club were also in the news when they signed Joey Beauchamp from West Ham. Beauchamp did not play a single match for West Ham after moving from Oxford.

This season Swindon are near the top of the first division thanks partly to their Norwegian international striker Janaage Fjortoft. He scored against Port Vale in the opening match. Manager John Gorman said, "we

had to wait until Christmas before Fjortoft scored last year. At least we have not had to wait again." Fjortoft got two more in the match against Tranmere but Swindon lost 3-2. Gorman said, "we lost because of individual errors. We made them and got punished for them. Two goals should be enough to win away from home. We threw it away."

Most results have gone Swindon's way and they occupy the highest position of the three relegated clubs. Since their promotion in 1963, they have seen more ups and downs than the local stationmaster. In that period they have established themselves as a major force in domestic football, but after joining the league in 1920 they spent over 40 consecutive years in division three.

AWAY FROM HOME

Goalkeeper Fraser Digby has played for England at Youth, U19 and U21 levels. He has now played 300 times for Swindon. Reserve goalkeeper Nicky Hammond is a former Arsenal apprentice who has now played over 60 games for Swindon.

Star defender Paul Bodin is a Welsh international who is his second spell with Swindon. In 1981 Crystal Palace signed him for £550,000 but he returned to Swindon after just nine appearances for the London club.

Other defenders include Luc Nijholt. He is a Dutchman who spent three years in Scotland. Swindon signed him from Motherwell in June 1993 for £175,000. Shaun Taylor was signed from Exeter

City for £200,000 in July 1991. He played in every Premiership game last season. Kevin Horlock came from West Ham on a free transfer in 1992 and played regularly in the Premiership. Andrew Thomson made his debut against Leeds in the final match of last season. Wayne O'Sullivan is now 20 and hopes to make the breakthrough this season. Terence Fenwick has spent most of his career with London clubs. He played 70 games for Crystal Palace, 256 for Queens Park Rangers and 93 for Tottenham Hotspur. He is 35 next month and came to Swindon on a free transfer. Brian Kilcline played 158 games for Notts County and was the driving force behind their promotion to the First Division in 1984. After relegation he moved on to Coventry and was captain when they won the FA Cup in 1987. He played 8 matches for Oldham and 32 for Newcastle before joining Swindon last January. Six months later he was followed by Mark Robinson for a Swindon record fee of £600,000. Before playing for Newcastle Robinson was at Barnsley.

In midfield Martin Ling is now 28 and came from Exeter for £23,800 in July 1986 but he quickly moved to Southend and played 138 games for them. When he came back to Swindon in the summer of 1991 he cost £17,600. Joey Beauchamp hit the headlines when he moved from West Ham without playing a game. He had previously played 151 games for Oxford and scored 27 goals.

Up front Janaage Fjortoft, who joined Swindon from Austrian club Rapid Wien for £500,000 in July 1993, scored for Norway when they ended Englands hopes of reaching the World Cup finals. He also scored 13 goals in 27 Premiership games last season. Andrew Mutch joined Swindon from



Wolverhampton in August 1993. He scored 97 goals in 289 games at Wolverhampton. Keith Scott signed from Wycombe Wanderers in November 1993 for £300,000. He was previously with Lincoln but moved to Wycombe during their non league days.

Manager John Gorman is now 45. He moved to Carlisle from Celtic as a 21 year old. He played for Carlisle together with Test umpire Chris Balderstone in their first division season. In 1976 he moved to Spurs for £60,000 and then spent five years with Tampa Bay Rowdies. In 1985 he was appointed youth team coach at Gillingham. He was then youth and reserve team coach at Leyton Orient and became assistant manager to Glenn Hoddle at Swindon in 1991.



His league debut came in March 1978 during a 1-0 win at Mansfield as Bolton were on their way to the second division championship. He appeared as substitute for the injured Tony Dunne.

It was his only appearance during 1977/78 but the following term he made his full debut at right back in a 2-1 second round league cup tie wn over Chelsea at Burnden. On the same evening David Burke, another Bolton youth product, made his debut at left back.

Strangely, his final league appearance for the club came in the same game as Burke's in his first Bolton spell. That was in a

2-0 home second division reverse by Shrewsbury Town in March 1981.

In July 1981 he joined Swindon Town making his debut in a 4-1 home win over Wimbledon, also scoring his first league goal in the process.

That was to be his only league goal for Swindon but he went on to make 141 appearances for them before moving to Mansfield Town in July 1985.

At Field Mill he made 133 league appearances and was a member of their Wembley side that won the Freight Rover Trophy against Bristol City in 1987.

He ended his league career with Carlisle United, joining them in September 1988 making 138 appearances before spending some time with non league Barrow.

The Whites will be looking for a good home win, but County's position is a false one, and they will be looking to hit form soon, it has the makings of being a very entertaining game.



ASSOCIATE MEMBERS CUP

This League competition has come under sponsorship guises as the Freight Rover Trophy, Sherpa Van Trophy and Autoglass Trophy.

The Wanderers played their first game in what was then known as The Associate Members Cup in February 1984, losing 2-1 at Burnley in a straight knockout competition.

The following term it became the Freight Rover Trophy and Bolton reached the Northern Area semi-final before going down 2-1 at home to Mansfield.

In 1986 a crowd of 12,120 were at Burnden to see the Wanderers reach Wembley after defeating Wigan Athletic 3-1 on aggregate in the Northern final. Bristol City took the trophy but it gave many supporters the first opportunity to watch the club perform under the twin towers.

Chester won at Burnden in 1987 in a Northern Quarter final and the following year Bury won a first round tie at Gigg Lane, the competition then being known as the Sherpa Van Trophy.

Extra time was needed in three games during 1988-89 as the club went on to win the trophy after defeating Torquay United 4-1 at Wembley. The Gulls took the lead before Bolton came storming back with goals by Darby, an own goal from Morrison, Crombie and Morgan.

The 1990 competition became the Leyland DAF Cup and once again Bolton put up a good showing before losing 2-1 at Tranmere in the Northern semi final.

In 1991 the club failed to qualify from the qualifying round whilst in 1992 Crewe ended interest in what had then become the Autoglass Trophy.

The clubs final game in the competition came in February 1993 when Huddersfield Town won a second round tie at Leeds Road.

Our overall record in the competition is as follows:-

In the early days of organised football the Wanderers met Astley Bridge on a number of occasions. Although the majority of these were nothing more than friendly games, the Wanderers remained unbeaten in all encounters, registering such scores as 8-1 in October 1881 and 7-0 in August 1886.

The clubs met in the Bolton Charity Cup final in 1882 and 1888 with the Wanderers taking the trophy on both occasions.
