Andy Roberts – A leader by example

When the voting slips are handed out in a couple of month's time for Lions fans to nominate their Player of the Year, it's a fair bet that Andy Roberts will feature amongst the front runners.

Ever present so far this season, Andy has been the model of consistency and has reaped the rewards for his efforts, winning two *Captain Morgan/South London Press* Player of the Month awards and being selected by Luton boss David Pleat to captain the Endleigh League side in Italy last month. Roberts' leadership qualities were first recognised by Mick McCarthy, who had no hesitation in handing him the captain's armband as a teenager in the absence of Keith Stevens. Still only 20, 'Pikey' as he is more familiarly known, must surely be on the verge of forcing his way into the England Under 21 side on a regular basis.

"People have remarked to me how much Andy has improved this season," observed the Lions boss, "but I believe he has been playing well for us for some time now. At one stage last season he was getting a bit of stick from some of our fans, but he was able to rise above that and by the quality of his performances week in week out has won over his critics."

One statistic Andy was certainly glad to see the back of recently was the fact that until the Grimsby game, Millwall had never won a League match under his captaincy. If Rhino still hasn't shaken off his thigh strain by tonight, his able deputy will be doing everything in his power to lead The Lions to another victory, over The Robins.

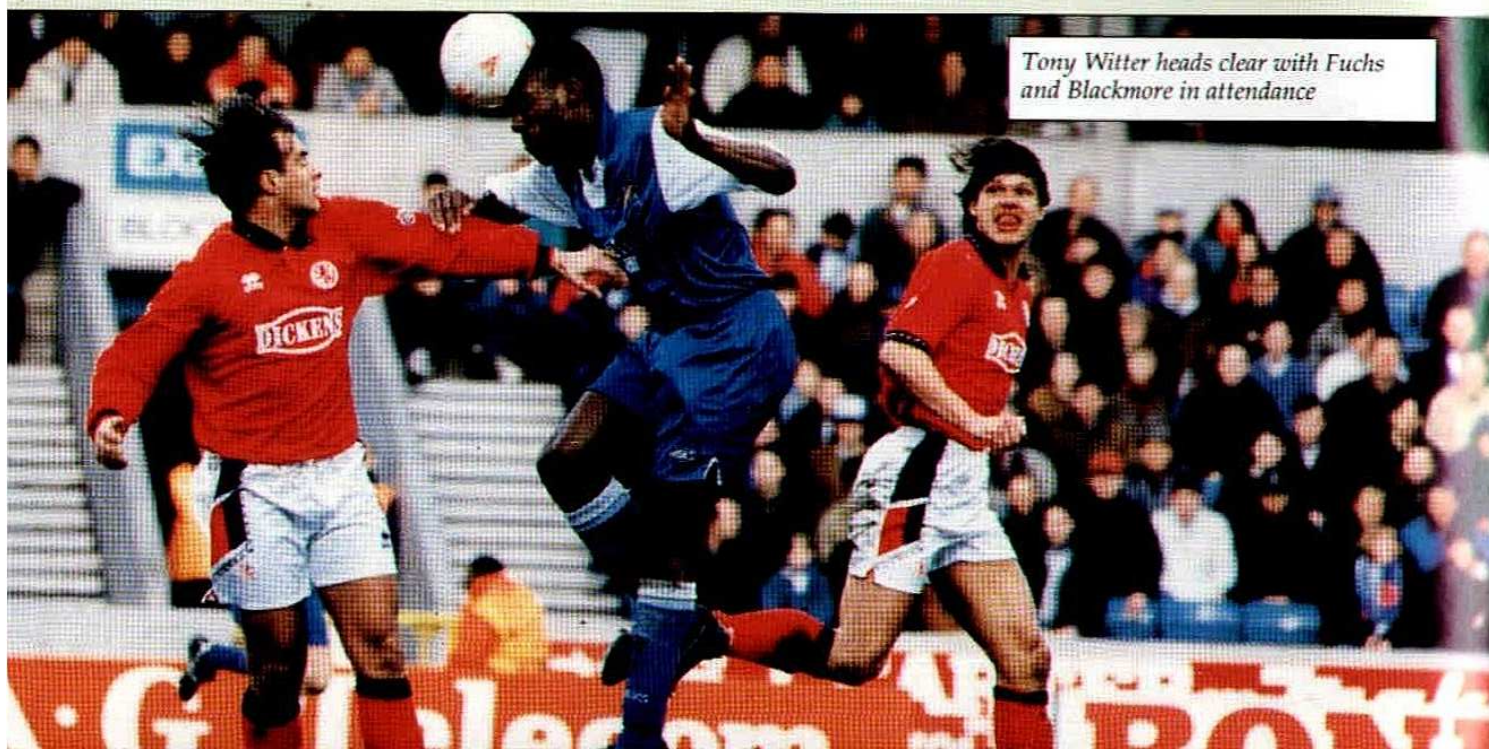

The boss says

No score to settle, just a game in hand to be won

There's no hiding the fact that last Sunday's was an awful game. I think Middlesbrough got what they came for, they were quite happy to sit back and wait for something to happen from a free-kick or a corner, or to catch us on the break. We're not making excuses for our own performance, we didn't play well, but we have to remember that we've had an excellent couple of months and now we're suffering a little bit with injuries and suspensions.

Clearly, the biggest problem we've got is up front at the moment. Dave Mitchell is suspended, but hopefully he'll be back fit and rested after his shin problem at the weekend. Richard Cadette hasn't had a Reserve game yet since his operation, Mark Kennedy's groin injury will take a little while to heal properly so we're having to make do and mend. We've not really had that one central figure up front throughout the season knocking goals in consistently and the fact that on Sunday, we fielded the eleventh different strike partnership tells its own story. But it's no good whingeing about things which are beyond our control. We've just got to get on with it and do the best we can. It's just that sometimes our best falls below my expectations and those of the supporters.

David Oldfield came into the side on Sunday and played up front after training with us for just one day and it wasn't easy for him. When he joined Manchester City from Luton it was as a front player and his last game for Leicester was as a striker so he can play there although he's perhaps better known as a midfield player. With a suspension coming up for Andy Roberts my thinking was that perhaps he can slot into that role when Dave Mitchell comes back.

I'm still having a look at the possibility of bringing someone else in as cover. Warren Neill was due to play in the Reserves on Monday night. With Dawsey having just had another operation and a suspension coming up for Mark Beard it could be that I'll need a right back.

Looking forward to tonight's game, I'm not going to hark back to that Coca Cola Cup defeat, other than to say that if we play as well as we did that night I think we'll beat Swindon this time. We just have to get the Barnsley and Middlesbrough performances out of our system and get back to creating chances as we've been doing consistently for most of the season.

We've got a lot of games to play in the next couple of months, and there's a lot to do if we're going to claim one of those Play-Off places. Postponements and Cup matches have left us with games in hand, but they don't count for anything unless you win them, and we'll be doing everything in our power to start this evening.

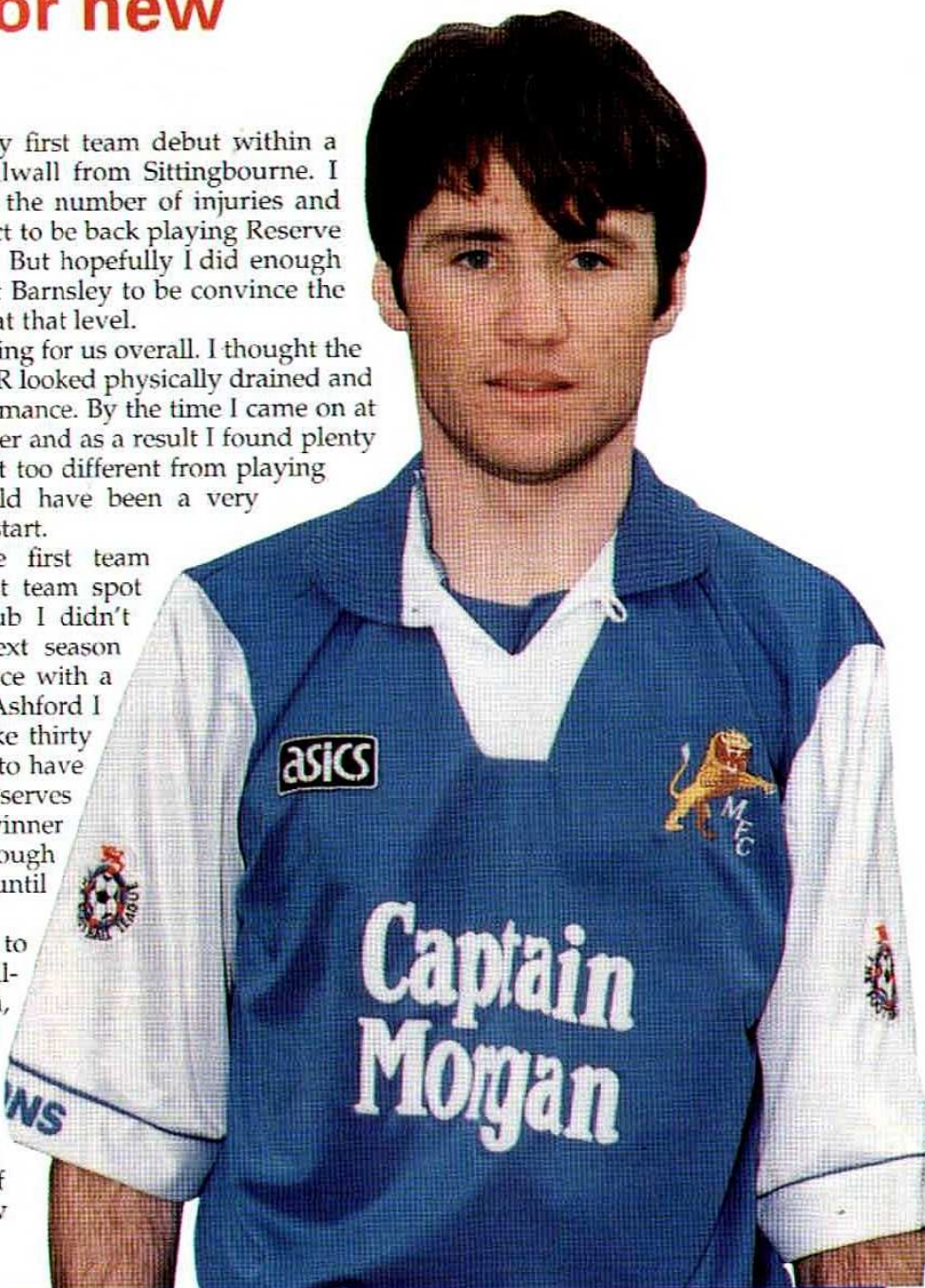
Early debut for new boy Lee

When I eventually got my chance to join Millwall I expected to find the full-time training very hard to start with, but so far it's not been too bad. I'll have to build up my physical strength a bit and I'm sure the manager will be quick to point out the areas I need to work on. So far though, I've really enjoyed myself and I'm looking forward to my new career at The Den.

SCORES TWICE A WEEK

"We can still make play-offs" says Alex

LIONS' midfielder Alex Rae is still optimistic that Millwall can reach the First Division promotion play-offs for the second year running.

The Lions 4-1 defeat at Barnsley and Saturday's 0-0 draw with Middlesbrough mean Millwall have got a lot of work to do if they are going to make up ground on the promotion chasing clubs.

But Rae, back in the side after suspension stressed, "Before the defeat at Barnsley we had gone 13 League games unbeaten, so I don't think it's beyond us to finish in the top five.

"Everyone was upset after what happened at QPR in the FA Cup and when something like that happens it makes it doubly difficult to go to places like Barnsley and get a result.

"Considering the number of first team players we had out against Middlesbrough I don't think we did too badly and as soon as we start getting people back I don't see why we can't emulate them and move up the table."

Lion's manager Mick McCarthy certainly didn't pull any punches after Sunday's televised draw with Middlesbrough who fancy their chances of grabbing the First Division's only automatic promotion spot.

"It was an awful game," he admitted. "In the end we had to take what we could from it.

"We've got six first team players out and given the depth of my squad I think the players have been exceptional, but you are not going to get it week in week out.

"Just compare it to them. They had Neil Cox and Paul Wilkinson on the bench and either of them would have been in my team."

AN UP AND DOWN SEASON FOR ROBINS

SWINDON step into the Lions Den with one eye firmly on Wembley and the other on the First Division relegation battle. There is still a buzz of expectation at the County Ground as the Robins go into next month's rearranged Coca Cola Cup semi-final replay with Bolton just one game from the twin towers and a chance to emulate the famous League Cup triumph of 1969.

The Wiltshire side reached the last four of the competition thanks to a 3-1 win over us, a gloomy January night Lions fans will want to forget in a hurry. The arrival of Steve McMahon and those cup successes appeared to have helped turn Swindon's otherwise rocky season recently, but defeats at home to Bristol City and away at Luton have plunged them back into the drop zone.

STEVE McMAHON

SWINDON player/manager Steve McMahon is no stranger to football's school of hard knocks.

The tough tackling midfielder was appointed to the County Ground hotseat following the departure of John Gorman at the end of November, and marked his debut for his new charges by getting his marching orders in the 2-0 defeat at Southend.

To make matters worse he then broke his arm 16 minutes into his comeback game against Oldham on New Years Eve.

But while things might not have been going like clockwork on the field, McMahon has shown the sort of tenacity and determination off it that earned him 17 England caps and a distinguished career with Liverpool, Everton, Aston Villa and Manchester City.

Under his stewardship Swindon have enjoyed mixed fortunes, the side's inability to string enough League wins together to escape the danger zone taking some of the shine off their Coca Cola Cup exploits.

"It's hard being away from the action on the field," he admitted, "and it's going to be even harder when I'm fit, to put myself back in the team, the way we've been playing."

"It's difficult having to do everything that goes with the manager's job as well as playing. You have to be able to switch concentration quickly, but it certainly sharpens the mind."



LOOKING FOR MORE COCA COLA FIZZ

SWINDON will be hoping they can repeat the sort of performance which put paid to the Lions Coca Cola Cup ambitions at the New Den this afternoon. Mick McCarthy's men were in optimistic mood when they travelled to the County Ground in January, having already taken maximum League points from November's League visit, goals from Jon Goodman and Mark Kennedy securing a 2-1 win.

This will be Swindon's first taste of the New Den. They spent last season in the Premiership after winning the dramatic 1992/93 play-off final against Leicester, a Paul Bodin goal securing a 4-3 win.

Millwall had looked a good bet to join them in the play-offs that year before they tailed off right at the end of the campaign.

The honours that season finished even between the two sides, the Lions claiming a 2-1 victory at the old Den thanks to goals from John McGinlay and Jon Goodman, Swindon winning the return fixture 3-0.

The previous season, today's visitors had the upper hand, claiming a 3-1 win at the County Ground, while the Lions had a late John Kerr equaliser to thank for a point at The Den.

TOWN

THORNE IN LIONS SIDE

SWINDON new boy Peter Thorne is aiming to build himself a reputation as big as his former mentor Alan Shearer.

The 21-year-old striker was plucked from Blackburn reserves for £200,000 by Steve McMahon in January after finding it impossible to command a first team place ahead of the England marksman and £5 million man Chris Sutton.

And Thorne has taken an instant liking to first team football firing four goals in his first four starts, including both goals in the 2-1 Coca Cola Cup win over Bolton.

Thorne's arrival was a blow to the aims of former Wolves man Andy Mutch who was hoping to establish himself as a partner to Norwegian international Jan Aage Fjortoft up front.

Supplying the ammunition for Fjortoft from the flanks is the job of Joey Beauchamp.

The former Oxford man seems to have put his disastrous one month spell at West Ham behind him and is now a regular for the Wiltshire club.

Martin Ling has become a stalwart in the middle of the park since former boss Glenn Hoddle signed him for a mere £15,000 from Southend in 1991.

Kevin Horlock, a Northern Ireland international, can play in a variety of roles, and grabbed the winner against Middlesbrough recently.

Dutchman Luc Nijholt is another defender who can also play in midfield.

Nijholt joined Swindon from Motherwell for £175,000 in June 1993 having spent three years in Scotland after moving from Swiss outfit Old Boys Basle.

At the back Steve McMahon recently completed the signing of Ian Culverhouse from Norwich for £150,000.

Culverhouse is a cultured defender, capable of playing the sweeper's role as he proved during the Canaries adventures in the UEFA Cup last season.

He is likely to be partnered at the centre of defence by the reliable Shaun Taylor.

Taylor was ever present during the past two seasons, and is back in the side after breaking his arm against Middlesbrough earlier in the season.

The Robins are not short of experience at full-back either. Welsh international Paul Bodin is now in his second spell at the County Ground after an unsuccessful period at Crystal Palace and is also the club's penalty taker, with six goals to his credit this season.

Opposite him is record signing Mark Robinson who cost £600,000 from Newcastle during the close season having been unable to hold down a regular spot at St James' after moving from Barnsley the previous season.

The goalkeeper's spot is a straight fight between the experienced Fraser Digby, with over 350 first team appearances to his name, and former Arsenal apprentice Nicky Hammond.

Digby has been the preferred choice for much of the season but has recently lost his place to Hammond, who is keen to establish himself as number one between the posts.

AWAY DAY BLUES

SWINDON's dismal form on the road this season has been a major factor in their current lowly standing. A 2-1 win at fellow strugglers Burnley at the end of January was their first away since a 1-0 victory over bottom club Notts County way back in September. But Steve McMahon seems to have made his side slightly better travellers with that win against Barnsley and three draws to his credit away from home since taking over the County Ground hotseat.

Star VISITOR

FJORTOFT OUT TO CAUSE LIONS MORE MISERY

MILLWALL fans who made the trip to Swindon for our Coca Cola Cup quarter-final clash in January will need no reminding of the goalscoring prowess of Jan Aage Fjortoft.

Fjortoft was the difference between the two sides that night, setting up both Andy Mutch's goals and adding a rather special one of his own.

Lions boss Mick McCarthy was so stunned by the strike he offered to bare his backside in Burton's shop window if it was a deliberate effort on goal, but the video evidence suggests that it was in fact another gem from the Norwegian international's impressive repertoire. One of the hallmarks of a natural goalscorer is his ability to find the net regardless of his side's position, and in this respect the 28-year-old striker's record speaks for itself.

While Swindon have struggled at the wrong end of the table this season Fjortoft has not lost his touch in front of goal.

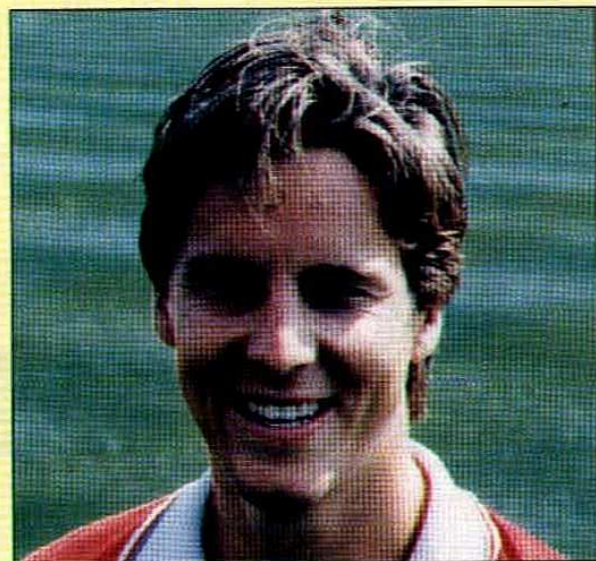
With 23 already this season - eight in the Coca Cola Cup - he is three goals ahead of John Aldridge at the head of the First Division scoring charts.

Add to that the 13 goals he hit for the Wiltshiremen as they fought against the Premiership drop last season, and Fjortoft boasts an average of over a goal every two games.

It is little wonder that his name has recently cropped up as speculation mounts over Kevin Keegan's likely replacement for Andy Cole, but all the signs are Fjortoft is happy at the County Ground, and he has recently signed a contract that will keep him there until 1999.

English fans got an early taste of the Norwegian's ability when he scored one of his country's goals in the win that condemned England to miss the 1994 World Cup finals.

John Gorman got a bargain when he snapped up the prolific goalscorer, who has more than 50 caps for his country, for just £500,000 in July 1993.

SAFETY SPENDING

With more clubs being relegated to the obscurity of the Second Division than promoted to the glamour of the Premiership, it is hardly surprising that those involved in the dog-fight at the bottom are starting to spend to try to preserve their Division One status. Before last weekend's fixtures, Burnley had lost seven games on the trot, and had slipped into the danger zone. The response of the Clarets was to go into the transfer market. Manager Jimmy Mullen smashed the club record by signing Leicester midfielder Steve Thompson and striker Kurt Nogan. The £500,000 spend did not, however, yield immediate results. Burnley went to Tranmere and were thrashed 4-1, their goal even coming from a Rovers defender in the last minute.

As a result, the Clarets dropped to 24th place, and Notts County move off the bottom for the first time in months. Howard Kendall was also in a buying mood last week, and he paid Bournemouth £60,000 for experienced striker Kevin Russell. He was happy enough on Saturday evening. The Magpies dented Reading's promotion hopes by winning 1-0 at Meadow Lane. All the action was in the last ten minutes, for Agana got the winner and then Reading's skipper Williams was sent-off for the use of an elbow.

Sunderland have been drawing too many games for comfort, 15 in all, but they collected six priceless points, all away from home, in four days last week. Firstly, in midweek they became the first side to score against Watford in 1995, through Russell, and then beat Southend by the same scoreline. The winner at Roots Hall came from Agnew, his first goal since his move to Roker from Leicester.

This defeat made it nine games without a win for the Shrimpers. Days earlier, they had gone down 0-2 at Reading, which prompted chairman Vic Jobson to suggest that manager Peter Taylor take a month's paid leave. It was

reported in one Sunday paper that Billy Bonds had turned down the chance to take over at Southend, but for the moment, Steve Thompson has temporary control.

DOWN AND UP FOR WOLVES

Although progress in the Cup has been exciting for the Molineux faithful, most would probably trade a place at Wembley in May for one in the Premiership in 1995-6. This must have seemed rather remote when they lost to fellow contenders Middlesbrough before a huge 27,611 crowd at Molineux. Boro won this vital clash with two second-half goals to complete a League double over Graham Taylor's team. Wolves, however, showed their resilience by winning a thriller at Port Vale on Saturday. Dutch defender de Wolf was the hero with a hat-trick in a 4-2 win.

NEW LEADERS

The inconsistency amongst the leaders has let Tranmere through to the top. They took over for the first time this season after their third away win of the season. Only West Brom had won fewer away games in Division One than Rovers before Nevin won the points at Charlton with his second goal of the season. They followed this with a more comfortable victory at Prenton, their 14th home win in 17 starts. Nevin was again on the mark but, more ominously for the rest of the division, the name of Aldridge appeared amongst the scorers for the first time in 1995.

Bolton's brief spell at the top was ended by Coca Cola Cup commitments (still to be settled) and then a defeat at the Baseball Ground. McAteer gave them a first minute lead they were unable to hold, and second-half goals by Yates and Mills lifted the Rams into the top half of the table and kept the Trotters behind Tranmere and Boro.

Now starting to show amongst the challengers are Sheffield United, who, with Wolves, are the joint top scorers in the division. They were easy winners at home to Burnley in midweek, but had to work hard for a point at Oldham on Saturday, a fixture which last season was a Premiership encounter. In a see-saw match, the Blades needed a goal by Flo in the last ten minutes to level at 3-3. Also amongst the goals at Boundary Park was Nathan Blake, who is now finding the net regularly for United.

IN FORM POMPEY

The in-form team is Portsmouth, unbeaten since Terry Fenwick succeeded Jim Smith as manager. They have a habit of leaving it late, however. At home to Luton, a Creaney penalty in the last ten minutes gave Pompey a 3-2 victory, and then Symons scored the winner in the last minute last Saturday at home to Grimsby. Despite these results, they have probably left it too late to make the play-offs.

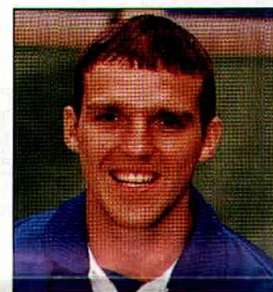

LAWRIE GRANT LESLIE

5' 11", 13st 2lbs

Born: Edinburgh 17.3.1935.

LESLIE started his football career with Scottish junior side Newtongrange Star, from there he moved to Hibernian for his first taste of League football. His next club was Airdrieonians.

Whilst with Airdrie he was to gain four full Scottish international caps during 1961, against Eire, Czechoslovakia, Wales and Ireland.

LESLIE decided to move south into English football joining West Ham United in June 1961. He was to make fifty seven League appearances for the Hammers.

In October 1963 he was transferred to Stoke City where he made seventy eight appearances.

MILLWALL brought LESLIE to The Den in July 1966, following the departure of ALEX STEPNEY to Chelsea.

LESLIE proved to be a fine acquisition to the squad and gave some excellent displays between the posts for the Lions during his two seasons at The Den.

LAWRIE made his Lions debut in the opening game of the 1966-67 season, against Rotherham United (away) on August 20th in Division Two. He remained in goal throughout the season.

The following season (1967-68) he featured in twenty eight League and cup matches, but

was transferred to Southend United in June 1968.

He returned to The Den in 1971 for a short spell in a coaching capacity. He later became manager of Leytonstone.
