

We welcome Bruce Rioch and his team and congratulate them on their fine display at Wembley in the Coca-Cola Cup Final on Sunday. I'm sure they all enjoyed their day out even if in the end they could not get the better of Liverpool.

Whether we get them on a high or a low nobody knows but they have a lot to play for in the First Division so we might be getting them on the rebound.

They are a good side but to be fair in our

previous encounters this season there has not been much in it. We know the standard we need to achieve to upset them. They are a strong team, well organised and well drilled.

It is silly to say this is a very important game for us. They are all important at the moment. The next game is vital, the one after that is vital, and so on. They are all vital in our quest for First Division salvation. So you can't stress how important every match is to us.

At Reading last Saturday again we had the better of the play. People might say it is the same old story but it's a fact. If we were playing badly I could accept, to a certain extent, our situation in the League table and admit we are not good enough. But we are not playing badly. At Reading we suffered a crazy five-minute spell before half-time and that basically sealed the game.

We had all the possession, created some great chances, but didn't take them and in the end we paid the penalty. But from what I have seen in the First Division this season we are as good a team as most. We have got to keep our heads up and battle on.

I know we have been criticised for selling Jan Aage Fjortoft to Middlesbrough but I can only repeat what I have said in the papers. We did not want him to go. At the end of the day Jan made the decision. It wasn't a case of us pushing him out of the door.

Jan insisted we advise him of any enquiries. So when 'Boro came in I told him and he took the decision. Lou Macari and those other managers who have come out spouting that Fjortoft was worth much more than £1.3 million are wrong. If that was so, if it was a snip, why weren't clubs queuing up for him? I didn't have one call from a Premier League club.

In fact Middlesbrough were the only interested party and they didn't come in until deadline day. I didn't expect to lose Jan or any other player so when it all happened on the Thursday I was left in a cleft stick. It was too late for me to get a replacement. There was no question of me running out and picking up someone for the sake of it.

There is life after Fjortoft and we will prove it. We need to take heart, keep plugging away, and hope that at the end of the day we get a few breaks going our way.

BOLTON WANDERERS

Bolton Wanderers showed signs of battle fatigue leading up to Sunday's Wembley Final as their impressive double campaign faltered at the most inappropriate moment.

The Coca-Cola Cup finalists missed an opportunity to return to the summit of the First Division when they were held at home by Sheffield United and then in their last League fixture they dropped two vital points in another I-I draw at Portsmouth.

Since we last met here at the County Ground in the first-leg of the Coca-Cola Cup semi-final Bolton have beaten Barnsley (h) 2-1, with goals from Thompson and Sneekes; Southend United (h) 3-0 - Thompson. Lee and McAteer the scorers; Millwall (a) - a real cracker from McGinlay; and of course us 3-1 at Burnden Park in that eventful second leg semi final tie when John McGinlay's first goal since January 21 clinched Bolton their Wembley dream. McAteer and Paatelainen their other scorers.


The only other side, besides Swindon, to beat the Trotters this year have been Derby County who won a hard battle at the Baseball Ground by 2-1. Controversy surrounded an 11th minute incident in which Bolton centre half Simon Coleman broke his left leg.

Two Derby goals in the last five minutes cost Bolton valuable points in the First Division Championship race but it was the double fracture to Coleman which cast the biggest cloud over the Bolton camp.

Mark Seagraves has been deputising for Coleman and the only other change to the side we met before has been the inclusion of defender Neil McDonald, a former England Under-21 International.

Bolton were without the services of striker John McGinlay against Portsmouth as he was with the Scotland squad preparing for last week's European Championship qualifying match in Russia. Moscow, Wembley, Swindon all in one week. Such is the life of an International striker.

Bolton, under Bruce Rioch, have gained a reputation for playing flowing effective football. On Sunday they had the opportunity to put on the style against Liverpool at Wembley. Tonight they are up against the Reds again in what promises to be a more robust battle for points.


BOLTON WANDERERS





GUNDI BERGSSON - Defender. A full International fullback he first played in his native Iceland for Valur. Had a trial with Aston Villa in 1985 yet did not impress, came back three years later to sign for Tottenham Hotspur. Enjoyed only limited exposure with Spurs and returned to Iceland. Returned to train with Spurs this year and signed for Bolton just before the transfer deadline. Born: Iceland 21-7-65.

KEITH BRANAGAN - Goalkeeper. Has been with the Wanderers since July 1992 when he left Millwall. Began his career with Cambridge United, making 110 League appearances before a £110,000 transfer to Millwall in 1988. Served under manager Bruce Rioch at the Den, and followed him to Burnden Park. Was an ever-present for Bolton in 1992-93 but missed most of last season through injury. Born: 10-1-66.



AIDEN DAVISON - Goalkeeper. Like Branagan, made the trip to Burnden Park from Millwall (£25,000) in 1993. Learned his trade with Spennymoor United and Billingham Synthonia before signing for Notts County. Has had loan spells with Leyton Orient, Chester, Blackpool and Derby. Bury signed him but it was with Millwall that he enjoyed his best spell. Born: Sedgefield 11-5-68.

FABIAN DE FREITAS - Striker. Dutch Under-21 International he cost Bolton a club record £400,000 to sign from Dutch First Division side Volendam in August 1994. Stands 6'1" and made his Football League debut at Middlesbrough on August 27, 1994. His first goal in English football was netted against Swindon Town on November 1, 1994. Born: Paramaribo 28-7-72.

RICHARD SNEEKES

SCOTT GREEN = Midfield. Former Blackburn Schools star, served his apprenticeship with Bury, making the first of his 208 League appearances for them at Chesterfield in August 1985. Six years later Southampton acquired his services and he made his debut in the top League against Leeds United in August 1991. Transferred to Bolton in December 1992 for £275,000. Born: Whitefield 5-11-67.

JASON LYDIATE - Central Defender. Arrived at Burnden Park from Manchester United towards the close of the 1991-92 season, making his League debut in the last game of the season - a 3-1 home win over Stoke City. Played five League games in 1993-94. Born: Manchester 29-10-71.

JOHN McGINLAY - Striker. The First Division's leading scorer with 33 goals in all competitions last season he heads the Wanderers score chart again this season. Went from Elgin City to Shrewsbury Town then Bury, who received £65,000 for his sale to Millwall in 1991. Bolton Wanderers paid £215,000 for him in October 1992. Established himself as Scotland's front-line striker this season. Born: Inverness 8-4-64.

MIXU PAATELAINEN - Striker, Finnish International, Bolton signed him from Aberdeen for £350,000 in the summer of 1994. Began his career with Valkeakosken Haka and arrived in Britain in 1987 to play for Dundee United, Was five seasons at Tanadice Park, scoring 33 goals in 133 Scottish League games. Joined in March 1992. Born: Helsinki 3-2-67.

MARK PATTERSON - Midfield, An apprentice at Ewood Park, made his debut for Blackburn in the Second Division. In June 1988 he moved to Preston and in Februry 1990 was transferred to Bury for £80,000. In January 1991 Bolton paid £65,000 for his services and he has now made over 150 appearances for the Trotters. Born: Darwen 24-5-65.

JAMES PHILLIPS - Defender, Former Middlesbrough fullback, Jimmy joined them in March 1990 from Rangers for £250,000. Started his career at Burnden Park, making 108 appearances before switching to Rangers in 1986. Played just 25 Scottish League games before Oxford gained his services for £110,000 in 1988. Returned to Bolton in July 1993 for £300,000. Born: Bolton 8-2-66.

RICHARD SNEEKES - Midfield. A bargain buy at £175,000 last summer from Dutch Second Division club Fortuna Sittard. Begun his career with Ajax where he made his debut at 16. Was five years with them before signing with FC Vollendam, A year on and he was with Fortuna. They loaned him to the Swiss Second Division club Locarno for the 1993-94 season. Has won representative honours with Holland, Born: Amsterdam 30-10-68.

PETER SHILTON - Goalkeeper. At 45 recruited by Bruce Rioch last month to strengthen their Coca-Cola Cup campaign. Capped 125 times by England he has served Leicester City, Stoke City, Nottingham Forest, Southampton, Derby County and Plymouth Argyle where he was player/manager . Born: Leicester 18-9-49.

ALAN STUBBS - Central Defender. Turned pro with Bolton in 1990 and has developed into an England "B" International - making his debut as a sub against Northern Ireland at Hillsbrough in May 1994, Made his League debut against Bradford in September 1990 and has now over 150 games to his credit. Born: Kirkby 6-10-71.

ALAN THOMPSON - Midfield. Was 17 when Newcastle United introduced him to League football in November 1991. A leftsided player he cost Bolton £250,000 in the summer of 1993 and scored 6 goals in 27 League games in 1993-94. Scored Bolton's goal at Wembley on Sunday in the Coca-Cola Cup Final. Born: Newcastle 22-12-73.

THE MAN IN CHARGE



Manager Bruce Rioch

The son of a regimental seargant major, Bruce has always been a strong disciplinarian and his teams are consequently well organised and drilled on set-piece routines.

Born in Aldershot, in September 1947, he emerged as a very competitive and talented player and served his apprenticeship with Luton Town. Developed into an outstanding wing-half who could win the ball, pass it, dribble with it and shoot. Indeed, Bruce scored 47 goals in 149 League games for the Hatters and he was in their Fourth Division Championship side of 1968.

In July 1969 Aston Villa snapped him up and Bruce did not let them down scoring 34 goals in 154 League games in the claret and blue. Collected a Runners-Up trophy in the League Cup in 1971 (against Spurs).

Derby County was the next port of call and another 34 goals in 106 League games - as he helped the Rams win the League title - was followed by 3 in 30 for Everton (1976-77); 4 in 41 for Derby again (1977-79); and 6 in 71 League outings with Torquay United (1980-83).

Bruce also played on loan for Birmingham City and Sheffield United as well as in the USA with Seattle Sounders. He won 24 caps for Scotland being in their 1978 World Cup Finals squad.

Began his managerial career with Torquay, where he took over as player/manager in 1980, and in February 1985 was installed as manager of Middlesbrough. Led them from Division Three to Division One with successive promotions in 1987 and 1988.

Took charge of Millwall in May 1990 after being axed by 'Boro just two weeks before the Ayresome Park club were to appear in their first ever Wembley Final in the Zenith Data Systems Cup. Was sacked by Millwall and took over at Bolton in May 1992.

In his first season at Burnden Park Mr Rioch led the Wanderers to promotion from Division Two and in 1994 took them to the sixth round of the FA Cup - the club's best performance in that competition since 1959. And this season of course they were Runners-Up in the Final of the Coca-Cola Cup.

UNDER THE SPOTLICHT

Midfielder Jason McAteer

Dubbed "The Wonder boy" Jason McAteer's rise to fame in just over a year has been quite remarkable.


Jason went to Chicago on a soccer scholarship but after three months had to return his visa. Whilst here he played in the Reserve team at Marine where he was spotted by Bolton.

Phil Neal was the manager at Burnden Park at the time and he offered the youngster a trainee post. Jason played regularly in the Reserves until February 1993, having made his Football League debut in November 1993.

Such was his rapid development and impressive performances as a powerful running midfielder that Jason was invited to represent England at "B" level just over a year ago. But within hours of his inclusion in the squad Jack Charlton was on his doorstep to persuade him to throw his lot in with the Irish.

Jason made his International debut for Eire against Russia at Lansdowne Road in March 1994. Two months later he was en route to the USA to participate in the World Cup Finals. A year on Jason was at Wembley in the Final of the Coca-Cola Cup.

It certainly has been a magical year for this 23 year-old who matches his industry with courage, his tackling with good distribution, his running with power and shooting with deadly accuracy - in short, Jason McAteer has everything a top-class midfield player needs.





Bolton Wanderers had their hour of glory in the Coca-Cola Cup Final on Sunday. Win, lose or draw the experience of participating in their first Wembley Final since 1958 is bound to have been a stimulating experience.

Tonight of course it is back to reality and the bread and butter fare of the First Division, a competition they have designs on winning. And indeed, to do this they badly need to make up ground this evening.

Our hopes will be that rather than coming here stimulated by Sunday evening's events they will be caught in that abyss of anticlimax that often follows in the wake of great occasions.

Bolton's success in the Coca-Cola Cup cost them the ground in the League Championship chase with Middlesbrough last weekend after they took only a point from their last First Division game at Portsmouth. So Bruce Rioch will be looking for a minimum three points tonight.

Nothing short of maximum points will do Swindon either, though our priorities are of a different nature. Consequently we have a match on tonight which is in every way as crucial as those two fine Coca-Cola Cup semi-final ties we played out last month, and this surely is a good omen for the fans.

The importance of this game to Swindon cannot be stressed too emphatically either for Town's very existence in the First Division hangs in the balance of not our performances, but our results, over the next few weeks.

After losing to Derby County, then at home to Charlton Athletic, the reality of a possible second relegation became all too possible. Going into Saturday's difficult assignment at Reading we were some ten, maybe even twelve, points adrift of what most feel will be the safety margin for continuation in Division One next season.

There were some important fixtures last night which will have affected both our's and Bolton's situations.

Burnley, home to Charlton and Stoke City home to Watford have a bearing on the scrap against relegation while Wolverhampton Wanderer's trip to Luton was a big game for injury struck Molineux eleven.


Tonight, the Millwall vs Port Vale fixture will be of most significance to us. The Lions overcame Tranmere Rovers in their last home game, when new signing former England striker - Kerry Dixon, opened the scoring with a debut goal. More of the same from the old Chelsea star will be to our advantage for we will be hoping Millwall can achieve another victory to leave the Potteries side within our reach.


Middlesbrough meanwhile will be looking to turn the screw on Bolton by overcoming Oldham Athletic at Boundary Park. Jan Aage Fjortoft should be spearheading Bryan Robson's assault which regained momentum with Boro's 3-0 defeat of Port Vale.

Oldham's 1-0 victory over Derby County ended the Rams impressive run and also stemmed the Latics slide towards the bottom. But following Saturday's trip to Watford and tonight's meeting with Middlesbrough on the highest ground in the country Oldham could well be falling to lower level....And don't forget they are our visitors here this coming Saturday in what will be another on the edge of your seats six pointer.

Yes. It is very tough for all concerned from here on in with 24 clubs in the First Division still very much involved in either Championships, Play-Off, or relegation issues. There are no safe havens in this competition and certainly no easy games. From Ayresome Park to Meadow Lane there is only one requisite right now - to win.

This is the time when draws can be virtual defeats, in vital struggle for those elusive points.



This evening Colin Benson talks to Fraser Digby

Q. Well Fraser, life at Swindon Town has been sweet and sour in recent weeks?

A. Yes, just a little. We went into the game at Derby County with two good results behind us having beaten

Sunderland at home and West Bromwich Albion away, which gave us fresh hope to keep plugging away. But obviously after losing that game and the next home match with Charlton we are more than a little disappointed.

Q. The Derby game was particularly frustrating for until a silly free-kick was given away in the D we looked the more likely winners. Did you see it that wayt

A. Yes. Especially in the first twenty minutes or so into the second half we played very well, had a lot of the ball, and looked the more dangerous side on the attack. So to then concede that free-kick and suffer the subsequent consequences was a bitter blow.

Pembridge's shot touched Peter Thorne and sent me the wrong way. Another stroke of luck that didn't go our way. It all added up really to a very disappointing time.

Q. Derby were the in-form team of the moment yet a measure of how well we contained them overall can be seen by the fact that you had very little to do in your goal on the night.

A. That is right. It has been like that in the last few games really. We have conceded a few goals but at the end of the day I have not had an awful lot to do.

At Derby I had one shot from Gabbiadini and one from their centre-back and that was about it really, apart from the penalty, which seemed a tough break against us, the free-kick and their final goal at the end when we were pushing forward and got caught on the break.

Q. This is the story of the season isn't it. You look back on games at Watford, Bolton, Derby etc. All matches that on the overall play we deserved to win but have not. It must be worrying?

A. Too true. We are letting far too many points slip away. After having seventy per cent or more of the ball we are still losing which is very disconcerting. We have obviously got to get it tightened up.

Q. What do you think can be done about it?

A. I don't know, it is hard to say. Like the gaffer said we have worked hard closing down, we have worked hard in training, and that came out in the game at West Brom by the way we actually finally over-ran them. When you stop doing that sometimes you slightly lose your shape and this is when, unfortunately, things are breaking against us.



Q. Despite all this you must be delighted to be back on site again anyway!

A. True. As a professional that is what you want to do. You want to be in the team, you want to be playing. And I want to be playing. I have been here along time now and this is the position I want to be in.

Q. Were you surprised by your recall?

A. I was, Nick and I are good friends. We room together and have known each other for what, eight years now. We must be the longest serving pair of goalkeepers in the League. So yeah, it was a bit of a surprise to be selected as Nick was doing all right in the team.

But at the end of the day I have a job to do and hopefully I can continue to do it to the best of my ability.

Q. The gaffer has experimented with different formations. Has this effected you as the last line of defence?

A. Not really. So long as I know the players in front of me I am aware of what they can do and which balls will attack and so on. As long as we basically hold our box and don't drop too deep there is not really a lot of difference.

Q. Adrian Viveash has come back looking a new player don't you think?

A. Yes, "Aide's" done superbly well. It did him the world of good going on loan to Reading. It got him playing regularly and got him his confidence and he has come back into the team and shown everybody what he can do. Which is great for the lad, he has been brilliant.

Q. Pity he gave away the penalty at Derby though?

A. Yeah. To be honest I thought that was a bit harsh. We had the one lad in front, "Aide" behind and they all jumped together. The referee gave his decision but I think it was a penalty myself.

Q. Had you faced a penalty from Simpson before?

A. No. We had said which way I was due to go on it but as he was about to take the kick Luc said no he's changed his mind because one of his colleagues had spoken to him. So I decided to go the other way and unfortunately it wasn't the right way. I should have stuck with the original plan.

Q. It's a matter of committee beforehand is it?

A. Yes sometimes. The point is if somebody is a good penalty taker with the pace of the ball from twelve-yards a lot of times you don't think the player will go for. If you go the right way you always have some chance. Having opted for one side it is just a matter of diving early and hoping for the best really.

Q. Still in the bottom four but still a lot of confidence about. Can we pull clear?

A. Of course. We showed what we are capable of at West Brom and felt we were desperately unlucky at Burnden Park in the semi-final. We have beaten Bolton here once this season and we will go into this game with heads held high. Hopefully we will put one over on them his time around.

I see former Swindon Town boss Lou Macari who, like us, is embroiled in the fight to stave off relegation, is frustrated by the great divide that is becoming ever more evident in English football. The divide between those who have and those who do not have.

He is talking about money of course but could just as easily be referring to talent. Such is the shortage of quality players these days.

Macari, as shrewd as they come when dabbling in transfer dealings, tells us his Stoke City club haven't any money. Claims Lou: "There are players you think you can get for £100,000 and then you find out it will cost £600.000.

"I was looking at Gordon Watson at Sheffield Wednesday. I thought he would be a £300,000 player. He went to Southampton for £1.2 million.

It is a frustration most of us at this level of the game have had to live with and the current environment, in which ordinary players start in the sale at £1 million, is not all of soccer's own making.

The media must shoulder much responsibility for inflating not only the egos of many mundane bread and butter players but the transfer market itself.

There was a time, when players had to earn super-class billing. Such is the current desperation to unearth a class act that many a young hopeful has been elevated to £1 million status in the media

on the strength of an eye catching 45-minutes.

Darren Eadie of Norwich City has been dubbed a new George Best on the back of a couple of thrilling performances this season. The young Canary is a promising prospect I'll grant you - but George Best? His style is nothing like the same, his talents definitely no where near the mark. His consistency? Exactly!

Even Ryan Giggs has not proved his case yet. The young Welshman has far too many indifferent performances to warrant a place in the hall of fame alongside the Best's, Charlton's and Law's just yet.

Then there is Stan Collymore. I mean I ask you. £6 million? It's a joke. When he has scored as regularly as Nat Lofthouse over a few seasons and proved himself at the highest International level then you can talk about him in that sort of company.

No wonder it is so hard for men like Macari, McMahon and McCarthy to patch together a prospective promotion winning side...

Congratulations though to one player who has had to wait a long

time for recognition. Our former skipper Colin Calderwood who won his first Scottish cap in a European Championship qualifying tie in Russia last week.

At 31 International recognition has finally come his way and on his form for Tottenham Hotspur this season it is fully justified, particularly after the stick he got from Spurs fans when, under Ossie Ardiles, things were not going well at White Hart Lane.

Colin's sense of humour never deserted him though: and he remained honest to himself and his club. Now the rewards are beginning to materialise. Russia last week, maybe a Wembley FA Cup Final next month.

WILLIE MILLAR

Former Town winger Willie Millar, a popular figure at the County Ground in the early 1950's, has died at the age of seventy. Born in Irvine, in Ayrshire, he started his professional career with Partick Thistle during the War and had spells with Aberdeen and Stirling Albion prior to signing for Swindon in August 1950.

Willie wrote himself into Swindon's history books by scoring both Town goals in the first-ever floodlit game at the County Ground in 1951. In three seasons and 75 League appearances he notched 18 goals for the club - five of which came in his last eight games.

In July 1953, a player exchange deal took Willie to Gillingham, with Ken Lambert joining the Town. He was at Priestfield for a further three years, before moving to Accrington Stanley and apart from a brief period with Kettering Town, remained in Lancashire in various coaching and scouting capacities until the 1970's.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW? CHRIS PORTER BYPAUL PLOWMAN

There was little comfort for Swindon at Burnden Park a month ago, following their Coca-Cola Cup exit. But there have been happier days there - and on one of them, almost 25 years ago, Town recorded an emphatic 3-0 victory.

Wearing the number seven shirt for Swindon on that otherwise grey December day was Chris Porter, who had been signed by Fred Ford from Bridgewater Town for the princely sum of £1,500!

Chris arrived from the Western League club in November 1969, but spent almost a year in the Combination side before being given his Second Division baptism. That came in an uneventful 1-0 defeat at Norwich. He had to wait a further month for his home debut, when Don Rogers bagged two of the goals in a 3-0 win.

Seven days later, a repeat performance from Don produced a repeat scoreline, but young Chris grabbed the other goal - his first at senior level. "Rifled in with that trusty left foot?", I enquired, not being able to recall that particular strike. "No", he quickly replied, "I beat their keeper Boswell to a loose ball and it was a toe-poke with the right!" Nonetheless, it consigned Bolton to their fifth home defeat in a season which saw them eventually finish bottom.

Chris added his name to the scoresheet again the following Saturday when he earned the Town a point against visitors Orient. It might have been two had Don not had a rare penalty miss. A further two goals came at the end of February, one in yet another 3-0 win, when Oxford were the victims. Swindon suffered themselves a week later when Chris's goal was cancelled out by two from Birmingham's Trevor Francis, who was then only 16. As Chris said, "He was a bit special."

Fred Ford gave way to Dave MacKay at the end of 1970/71 after which Chris saw less first team action. And when Les Allen succeeded the Scot there was little change. "To be honest, I was only a fringe player", said Chris. "Les tried me in a few different positions and I even played at the back in a couple of games", he added.

But just after Christmas in 1973, Chris Porter's brief career at League level came to an end when he suffered a pelvic injury at West Bromwich Albion. He was sent to a specialist in Bristol and a complex operation followed. He still carries the scars and a stainless steel plate.

Following a short spell with Yeovil Town, Chris returned to

Bridgewater - then another £1,000 richer following his League appearances for Swindon! There he combined duties of player/manager with a job at a cellophane manufacturer. Other Somerset clubs - Chard, Taunton and Frome - have also benefited from his services.

Chris, 46 later this month, now runs his own sports shop in Bridgewater and is a popular figure on the local sports scene. Chairman of the town's Cricket Club, he is also a keen golfer and closely follows the career of one of his sons, Scott, who is a professional in East Anglia.

We let Southampton back into the game with a bad goal when Andrew Thomson let his man come off him to score at the back post with a header.


However we managed to take control of the game again and in the end it was a great result for the boys with three most welcome points.

With the wind at our backs we dominated the second half, Luton rarely getting anywhere near our goal. Although we wasted some good openings we managed another two goals.



It is great to be here but it all happened so unexpectedly. It was on transfer deadline day that I had a call at about quarter to nine in the morning telling me to get myself down to Swindon.

I came, had talks and a medical, and signed before the five o'clock cut-off. It was a hectic day but you can't throw away opportunities like this.

For six months at Newcastle I had played in the Reserves and couldn't break through to the first team. I had been on the subs bench six or seven times and I just wanted the chance to play first-team football.

Swindon are a good club, play good football, and when I knew they were interested I saw it as a great chance to get my first team career going again...obviously things have not gone quite to plan for after just one game I find myself out on the sidelines again with a very bad haematoma.

So now I have to keep my fingers crossed that it is going to be as short a delay as possible, and get back playing as soon as I can. At the time of writing these notes there is no indication of how long it will take to break down but I am hoping to make the game with Oldham on Saturday.

It is a matter of getting rid of the swelling and getting mobile again. You have to wait for the bruising to come out. It is still very sore at the moment.

I was born in Bristol of a football family - my Dad played leftback for Lincoln, Hartlepool, Reading, Oxford and Bristol City - so I am no stranger to this area though I went to the GMFA National School at Lilleshall when I was 14. From there it was Watford where I was a first-team regular for five years. I wanted to play in the Premier League and joined Newcastle United but it didn't work out so I have to start reestablishing myself now with Swindon Town.

The first priority is to get out of relegation trouble then we can look forward to next season. I can play in midfield or on the wing but leftback is my favourite position. Obviously there is a lot of competition for that shirt here with Paul, Kevin and Eddie Murray, who I hear has done a good job. So like Newcastle there is a lot of competition but that is part and parcel of football.




