

From th With Manager Steve McMahon

You would not believe how disappointed I was when we came away from the Racecourse Ground last Saturday after the 4-3 defeat at the hands of Wrexham.

Time and time again I have said to the players that you cannot be complacent in this game and I hope that those words are still echoing around their ears today.

We have played so well this season. Up until last weekend we had only conceded just four goals and then we go and let in as many again in one game.

Wayne Allison gave us the ideal start with an early two goal lead. Unfortunately Wrexham came back with two goals themselves, one just before half-time and one straight after.

To be fair this could have killed us there and then but Peter Thorne. back from injury regained our lead and I thought that we should then sit back and not let Wrexham make up the deficit again. However we did just the opposite-we sat back alright but they took away everything, our lead and the points.

On Wednesday we left behind the pressures of the League as we resumed our Coca-Cola Cup tie with Blackburn Rovers at Ewood Park.

We went to Lancashire 3-2 down knowing that we had to score at least twice without reply to have any chance of going into the third round draw.

In my mind there is only one reason why Blackburn progressed at our expense and that reason is Alan Shearer.

He is without doubt the best striker in England. In a team that has been struggling in the Premiership and in Europe, he is still scoring goals and that is the sign of a quality striker.

After the Wrexham defeat I am pleased that our lads were not overawed by the occasion and if Wayne Allison's early effort had gone in it would have been a totally different game. Today we return to the Endsleigh League as we welcome Bristol City to The County Ground. Like ourselves they have lost interest in the Coca-Cola Cup and will now concentrate their efforts on regaining ground in the League but I am intent on making sure that it is not at our expense.

Many congratulations to young Wayne O'Sullivan on his call up to the Eire U21 squad. He travels straight after this afternoon's game to fly to Dublin where he will meet with the rest of the party for their game with Latvia in Galway.

Finally as you will have read both Joey Beauchamp and Adrian Viveash have left the club. Joey has returned to Oxford United, the club he was with just sixteen months ago. I think in his heart of hearts he always regretted the day he left when he joined West Ham United, Adrian Viveash was on a weekly contract which has now been terminated. We wish them both well in the future.



A glance at the Second Division table is all you need to see that this has been a desperate season so far for Joe Jordan and his City team who come here looking for a first away win of the season

Held at home 1-1 by Blackpool on the opening day, a single goal victory over Stockport County, at Ashton Gate, last August is the only success to reflect upon in nine Second Division outings, for a Bristol side that has found goals in short supply.

David Seal, the Australian striker, has been the main ray of hope in this respect. It was his goal that dumped Stockport County on their backs and he has now taken his tally for this season to seven.

Indeed, it has been very much a tale of a Seal of approval for City fans who can thank the man brought in to take on the role Wayne Allison played last term, for point winning goals in the 1-1 draw with Blackpool and at Peterborough United (again 1-1) and Notts County, where his strike in the 84th minute made it 2-2!

The points at London Road and Meadow Lane are Bristol's only reward from their travels so far. Even when Seal gave them a third minute lead at Colchester in the first-leg of their First Round Coca-Cola Cup tie with the Essex Third

Division side they could not hold it and returned home with a 3-1 beating ringing in their ears. The recovery, to earn a Second Round tilt at Newcastle United, perhaps the one really invigorating chapter of the season thus far.

Alas, Kevin Keegan's boys showed no mercy, taking them apart 5-0 at Ashton Gate, and leaving City with only pride to play for in this week's return leg at St James Park. But Cup issues aside the most crucial aspects for manager Joe Jordan and his assistant John Gorman our former boss, are to avert a second relegation battle in two years.

Bristol City came down from Division One with us last May. finishing second from bottom and three points behind Swindon Town. They then sold Wayne Allison their leading scorer with 13 goals to us for £475.000 and recruited Paul Agostino from Young Boys Berne for a fee that will rise to £100,000. Clive Allen, the former England striker, came and went and Phil Barber, a left sided midfielder, was signed from Millwall on a free transfer. Another free signing being Alan McLeary

centre-half who also has seen service with the Lions.

Agostino and McCleary were in the starting line on the opening day City lining thus: Welch, Hansen, Munro, McCleary, Dryden, Kuhl, Bent, Partridge, Seal, Agostino and Barker.

The team that took on Wycombe Wanderers last Saturday and was held 0-0 at Ashton Gate showed seven changes to that original selection, a sure sign that things are not going well. The team was: Dykstra. Hansen. Edwards, Dryden, Bryant, Kuhl, Bent, Owers (Seal 79), Nugent, Patterson, Starback. Subs: not called upon Hewlett and Munro.

There might be a significant gap in our respective League placings this afternoon but Town fans will be only too aware that such statistics are normally irrelevant when it comes to derby games. None the less it was our double failure against them last season (we lost 3-0 here at home remember, Ouch!). That cost us dearly in the relegation battle so perhaps this is a good time to redress that situation.

Paul Agostino

- FORWARD. Signed from Swiss giants Young Boys Berne in the summer of 1995 for £50,000, Paul made his debut in English football on the opening day of this season in the 1-1 draw with Blackpool and recorded his first goal in a 1-4 defeat at Shrewsbury Town. An Australian who moved to Switzerland in order to develop his game he has found the Endsleigh League Division Two a tough stage to come to terms with.



Phil Barber

- MIDFIELD. Left-footed player who used to play on the wing for Crystal Palace and deliver superb crosses. Came into football with Aylesbury and in February 1984. made his League debut for Palace vs Grimsby Town. Netted 35 goals in 234 League outings before a £100 000 move to Millwall in the summer of 1991. Scored twice in a 4-1 win over Sunderland on his home debut for the Lions but never totally established himself at the Den and joined Bristol on a free in the summer of 1995. Born: Tring 10-6-65.

Junior Bent

 FORWARD. Quicksilver winger who can, on his day, be a real match winner. First played the League stage in the colours of home town club Huddersfield
Town, his debut in October 1987
being against Middlesbrough.
Arrived at Ashton Gate in March
1990 in a £30.000 deal. Stands
only five-five. Scored 6 goals in 41
League outings in 94-95.
Born: Huddersfield 1-3-70.

Matt Bryant

- CENTRAL DEFENDER. City's Player of the Year in 1994-95, Matt is a local lad who has been with the club since his school days. Played three League games for Walsall, while on loan to gain experience, but a succession of injuries in 1993-94 restricted his progress. A resilient reliable stopper he came into his own last season with 3 goals in 37 First Division games. Born: Bristol 21-9-70.

Richard Dryden

- DEFENDER. Signed from
Birmingham City for £175.000 in
December 1994. Richard had come
into League football with Bristol
Rovers as a left-back, making his
debut for them at Brentford in
December 1986, but he had played
only 13 games when Exeter City
signed him. Produced 13 goals in
92 League games for the Grecians,
claiming a 4th Division
Championship medal and had a
non-playing loan spell with
Manchester City before signing for
Notts County in a £250,000 deal in
1991. It was while with the Blues
that he was moved from left-back
to central defence with great
success. Born: Stroud 14-6-69.

Sieb Dykstra

- GOALKEEPER. Currently on loan from Queens Park Rangers whom he joined from Motherwell in the summer of 1994. The Londoners paid £250.000 for his transfer but he was several weeks on the bench before making his Rangers debut at Norwich in October 1994. A giant of six-foot-five inches he really made his reputation during the

1993-94 season when he was in sensational form for Motherwell helping them finish third in the Scottish Premiership. Spectacular and exceptionally agile his bent for showmanship sometimes detracts from his reliability and last season he lost out to Tony Roberts as Ray Wilkins' first choice, making 11 Premiership appearances.

Born: Kerkrade, Holland 20-10-66.

Rob Edwards

- MIDFIELD. Arrived at Ashton
Gate from Carlisle United in March
1991 for £135.000. A versatile
performer. Rob had featured at
centre-half and fullback before
making his mark in midfield where
he made 30 appearances last
season. Capped by Wales at Youth.
Under-21 and "B" levels and has
been named in the Under-21 squad
to face Germany in the European
Championships next week.
Born: Kendal, Cumbria. 01-7-73.

Vegard Hansen

FULLBACK. Right sided defender now in his second season in English football following his arrival from Norwegian club Stromsgodsel IF. Made 29 First Division appearances last season. Born: Drammen, Norway 8-8-69.

Martin Kuhl

MIDFIELD. Now with his sixth club. this most experienced competitor served his apprenticeship with Birmingham City gaining his first opportunity at West Bromwich Albion in March 1983. Midway through the 1986-87 season he joined Sheffield United where he was handed the captain's armband. His stay was short lived however for he was traded to Watford in February '88 and the following September signed for Portsmouth for £125.000. Voted Player of the Year in 1991 and scored 23 goals in the next two seasons before continuing his career with Derby County. In December 1994 Bristol invested £330.000 in his services. Born: Frimley 10-1-65.

Stuart Munro

- DEFENDER. A free transfer signing from Blackburn Rovers in 1993. Stuart had arrived at Ewood Park in June 1991 in a £350.000 deal after a highly successful career with Rangers during which he picked up Scottish League Championship medals. Injuries and the form of Alan Wright limited Stuart to just one senior game for Rovers in 1991-92 and he was subsequently released. Has played across the back line for Bristol City. Born: Falkirk 15-9-62.

Gary Owers

- MIDFIELD. Joined Sunderland as an apprentice and served the Roker Park club until December 1994 when he was transferred to Bristol City. Gary made his League bow at Brentford in August 1987 and operated in all midfield positions as well as both fullback roles for the Rokerites. Was rightback in their 1992 FA Cup Final team beaten 2-0 by Liverpool. Made 21 League appearances (2 goals) last season for City.

Scott Partridge

- STRIKER. A former trainee with Bradford City who released him after five League games in 1992-93. Had a trial at Ashton Gate and was given a contract, breaking into the team in April 1994 and netting four goals in six games. Scored twice last season in 14 (19) appearances.

Born: Leicester 13-10-74.

Mark Shail

- DEFENDER. Snatched from non-League football in March 1993, Mark has proved his worth in the City defence since his £45.000 move from Yeovil Town. It took him just six months to impress his leadership qualities on the management who installed him as Captain. Had gained representative honours with the England semi-professional side before his arrival at Ashton Gate. Born: Sandviken, Sweden 15-10-66.


Brian Tinnion

- MIDFIELD. Signed from Bradford City in March 1993, for £180.000. Had served his apprenticeship at St James Park making the first of his 32 League appearances for Newcastle United at Everton, in April 1982. Unable to command a regular place he joined Bradford City and scored 22 goals in 145 League outings for them.

Born: Stanley, Durham 23-2-68.

Keith Welch

- GOALKEEPER. Has been with
Bristol City since summer of 1991
when the club paid Rochdale
£200.000 for his signature. Stands
six-foot-two and was an everpresent in the 1993-94 campaign,
adding another 44 First Division
games in 94-95, Started his career
in 1986 with home town club
Bolton Wanderers but was blooded
in League football by Rochdale
against Leyton Orient in February
1987. Became a fixture in the
Scotland eleven making 205
League appearance, Born: Bolton

Big Joe Jordan was appointed manager, for the second time at Ashton Gate, on the 15th November 1994. He took over from the axed Russell Osman following a dismal run.

Jordan will be best remembered as a swashbuckling centre-forward whose toothless grimace was enough to frighten the hardest defenders.

Started his playing career with Morton, scoring one goal in 10 Scottish League appearances before being snapped up by Leeds United in 1971. Led the line with vigour and registered 47 goals in 219 senior appearances including 5 goals in 21 games in Europe - before heading for Old Trafford in 1977.

Joe claimed 37 goals in 109 First Division games for Manchester United before transferring to AC Milan in June 1981. Twelve goals in 52 Italian League games was a fair return in those ultra-defensive days in Italian football and a short stop off with Verona (1 goal in 12 appearances) on his way back to the UK added to his experience.

Joined up with Southampton where he scored another 12 goals in 48 League games before switching to Bristol City in February 1987.
Exactly a year later he was elevated to player-manager in succession to another former Leeds favourite.
Terry Cooper, and he took City to the Play-Off Final only to be beaten by Walsall in a replay.

The following season Joe guided City to the semi-final of the Littlewoods Cup - they lost to Nottingham Forest in extra-time - and then in 1990 he led them to promotion from Division Three. In September 1990 he left Ashton Gate to take over Hearts and took the Scottish Premier League side into Europe.

The holder of 52 Scottish caps. Joe scored a controversial goal to knock out Wales and put Scotland through to to the 1978 World Cup Finals, it was claimed he punched the ball into the net!



A natural predator he smashed six goals in his first two Reserve team appearances in a 3-2 win over Spurs and wait for it, an 8-1 demolition of our Youngsters. Indeed, he has cause to be grateful to Swindon, for after bagging four goals against us, Russell Osman quickly finalised his transfer from Belgian club Aalst for £80.000.

That was in October 1994, but five full appearances in City's first team failed to produce a goal and David was back in the Reserves where he thumped home 25 strikes!



The departure in the close season of Wayne Allison to Swindon opened the door again and this time David has struck "Gold" with strikes against Blackpool (20 minutes into the season).

Colchester (3 in the Coca-Cola Cup). Stockport. Portsmouth and Notts County.

Down-under he played for three of the top clubs, Sydney Olympic. Sydney Croatia and Marconi. He was in the Australian Olympic team and also gained caps at Youth level.

He came to Europe to develop his talents and scored goals in 31 appearances for Belgian club Eondracht Aalst. Not surprisingly he attracted much attention and came over to London for a trial period with West Ham United. He would probably have signed for the Hammers but manager Billy Bonds quit Upton Park the day he was due to make a decision. Born: Sydney 26-1-72

A 3-0 defeat at Burnley last week was their fourth defeat of the season. However, they have lost but once on home soil and this encounter could be another draw.



Since then they have not put a boot wrong as last week's 3-0 win at Hull City confirmed. It will be interesting to see if they suffer a reaction to this week's return leg with United when they entertain Wrexham today. Hull are home again in the bottom of the table clash with Shrewsbury Town.

It was certainly disappointing to lose our unbeaten League run at Wrexham last Saturday.


After having scored three goals away from home, you would expect to get something out of the game - but it just wasn't to be.


Sometimes the games are against you maybe last Saturday's was one of those days.

We did not pick up many injuries after last weekend's game at Wrexham apart that is from Peter Thorne who badly injured his ankle and will most certainly miss this afternoon's clash with Bristol City. He was attempting to cross the ball when a Wrexham defender challenged him causing his right ankle to twist.

An X-Ray at Princess Margaret Hospital on Monday morning fortunately revealed no bone damage although the ankle is very swollen.

Peter has damaged the ligaments on the lateral aspect (outside) of the joint which is a very common injury in football.

Now after a week he is able to walk unassisted and pain-free and although it is still very early on in the injury we cannot envisage Peter playing in a competitive game certainly for the next fortnight. However everybody at


the club is hoping that he proves us wrong.


As the ligaments heal, we will be working on the calf muscles to stabilise and strengthen the joint.

Let's hope that this is sooner rather than later.






















Royal Mail Seeks Public Vote on 'Football Legends' Stamp Issue

For the first time in the history of Royal Mail the British public are to help choose who will appear on a Special Stamp issue. The stamps will celebrate the biggest sporting event in Britain for thirty years - the European Football Championships.

The set of five stamps, to be issued May of next year, will depict all-time-great British footballers.

A panel of distinguished football experts have selected a short list of ten legendary British players from a master list submitted by the Football Associations of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The Public are invited to vote for one player from the following short Jist:

Danny Blanchflower

Northern Ireland captain, finishing with 56 caps. Also captained Tottenham Hotspur to League and Cup "double" in 1960-61.

"Dixie Dean"

16 caps and 18 goals for England 1927-32. Beefy centre-forward, a legend on Merseyside. His 60 goals in Division 1 in 1927-28 is still the record.

Peter Doherty

He was born in Magherafelt, Co. Londonderry on 5th June 1913. One of the most outstanding inside forwards in the history of football. Won an FA Cup Winners' medal with Derby County in 1946. He was capped 16 times for Northern Ireland, whom he managed from 1951 to 1062. He played for Glentoran, Blackpool, Manchester City, Derby County, Huddersfield Town and Doncaster Rovers.

Duncan Edwards

18 caps 5 goals for England in the 1950's. Shortest-lived England player (perished after Munich crash at 21) and youngest this century. Manchester United legend.

Alex James

8 caps for Scotland between the wars. Won the FA Cup twice with Arsenal in the 1930's and also starred for Preston. Skilful inside-forward with the famous baggy shorts.

Joe Mercer

5 England caps just before the last war, then 27 wartime England games. Joined Arsenal from Everton in 1946 and captained them to FA Cup success four years later. "Genial Joe" was England's caretaker manager for 7 games in 1974.

Billy Meredith

48 Welsh caps and 11 goals between 1895-1920. The star of British Football at the turn of the century.

A winger of great skill he played for both Manchester clubs, winning Championship and Cup honours.

Championed players rights throughout his career.

Bobby Moore

One of the greatest defenders of all time, won 108 England caps - a total bettered only by Peter Shilton. He was player of the Tournament when he captained the World Cup winners in 1966. Sixteen years at West Ham United. Cancer victim two years ago.

Frank Swift

19 caps as England's goalkeeper just after the war, including two as captain, "Big Frank" lost his best years to the war. Huge hands, long reach, larger than life personality. Lost his life in Munich crash as a journalist.

Billy Wright

One of the most respected English footballers of the century, passing away in 1994. Against Scotland in 1959 he became the first player, from any country to win 100 caps. The last 70 were consecutive (all as captain). Glittering 12-year career at Wolves.

As no living people, other than members of the Royal Family can appear on British stamps, the choice has been limited to footballers who are deceased.

At the same time, the public are also being asked to choose the greatest British Footballer of all time (living or deceased) and the greatest British Club side. The results of these votes will appear inside Royal Mail's official First Day Cover, issued simultaneously with the 'Football Legends' stamps.

Votes, on a sealed envelope, or postcard, to include voter's name and address, should be mailed to 'Football Legends', PO Box 442, Liverpool, L65 3EF by October 13th 1995. All votes submitted will be entered into a prize draw and the winner will receive a pair of tickets for the European Football Championship Final at Wembley.

Talks to Colin Benson

CB: Your first game against your old team-mates - exciting prospects for you?

WA: Yeah. It will be interesting won't it. Yes I'm looking forward to it.

CB: What are your thoughts on Bristol City at the moment?

WA: I don't have any thoughts on Bristol City. It is all about us really isn't it. I can't really comment on their team.

CB: You had a great deal of personal success with Bristol City top scorer for two or three seasons - so why did you leave?

WA: Well it was at the end of my contract and had been there five years so it was a case of wanting a little change really. So I just moved up the road.

The training here is different. I think it is different from club to club everywhere - each manager has his own ideas how he wants to play and of course as in any job a change in routine can be stimulating. I enjoy training.

CB: Defeat at Wrexham puts extra emphasis on this game today doesn't it?

WA: All games are important. There aren't any easy games as Wrexham

proved last week and we have to try and win as many games as we possibly can no matter who they are against.

CB: It is assumed in football journalistic circles that players tend to lift their game when they come up against former clubs. Is this fact or myth do you think?

WA: You have to try and raise your standard for any and every game, you know what I mean. At this level nothing but your best will do every week. It is all about wanting to do well whether it is Bristol City or Shrewsbury Town, and if it is a derby game then it is a derby game. As long as the goals go in that is all that

CB: Well they are starting to go in for you now Wayne.

WA: Yeah, yeah, I am having quite a good little run at the moment so I hope things can continue this way. I had one or two little injury niggles when I first came here but hopefully that is all behind me.

CB: It obviously takes time to adjust when you join a new club. do you feel comfortable yet? have you reached your peak yet or are you still finding your way?

A closer look at Wayne Allison

Wayne started his career with Halifax
Town as a midfielder but soon
established himself as a consistent
scorer with 23 goals in 84 League
appearances after making his debut in
a 3-4 defeat by Wolves in Division Four
on March 17, 1987.

It looked a good career move when he signed for Watford but just six starts and one substitute appearances in the season of 1989-90 was scant reward for his efforts at Vicarage Road and he welcomed the move to Bristol City at the start of the 1990-91 season.

A strong able striker Wayne has topped the Ashton Gate score sheet for the past two seasons registering 13 goals in the First Division last season. Born: Huddersfield 16-10-68.



WA: I'm still finding my feet, I won't say I have reached my peak yet. Your choice of words are amazing (he chuckles). No I'm still finding my feet, it will take a bit of time, but hopefully I will get there.

CB: What is the most difficult aspect of settling in?

WA: The most difficult thing is forging partnerships with people. Knowing and trying to anticipate when they are going to pass the ball.

Like this you make a run you hope that the man on the ball is reading the situation the same way are and will slot it in to you. You don't always get it but it is a matter of working to try and get on the same wavelength with the boys. This is the most difficult thing.

CB: A lot of folk who have not played the game would think this is something you can achieve on the training field, but of course training can not recreate exactly a match environment - it is a totally different situation isn't it?

WA: Oh yes, it takes time - it does take time and you do try and perfect that on the training pitch obviously, but in a game everything happens so quickly you have to be really sharp with your thinking and you really need to make your reactions towards each other and situations instinctive.

CB: You scored a good couple of goals at Wrexham but unfortunately they did not win us any points which I suppose takes the shine off your achievement?

WA: That's right. Hopefully we can bounce back from that. It was a game we should never have lost.

CB: Which of your goals has given you most pleasure?

WA: All my goals give me a lot of pleasure. If I see the ball go over the goal-line that is enough pleasure for me.

CB: You're a Yorkshireman Wayne yet you have played most of your career in this part of the country. You must like it down here?

WA: That's right. It is a nice place

to live. It is always nice to go back up North for away games but I have settled down here. I had to for my job like, and I am happy.

CB: Is life getting
any easier for
strikers do you think
since the alteration in the offside

WA: Unfortunately not all linesmen seem to be operating this way and it is the inconsistency factor that is so annoying. Some linesmen do. some linesmen don't. It is the letter of the law as well - like some linesmen may flag but the referee won't give it because there is a difference of interpretation. It is a little bit difficult but from a striker's point of view, we have to remain very, very positive.

CB: Have you changed your approach in any way?

WA: No. I still get off-side every time.



WA: You try and keep onside by staying behind the last man as much as you can because if you are close you will invariable be blown up more often than not and you won't be happy about that of course.

CB: From what you have experienced so this far this season do you feel we are one of the best teams in this Division?

WA: We have got one of the most experienced squads in the Division with many players who have played at the higher level so in that respect we are a decent team. But you can never take anything for granted. It is all down to the players who play on a Saturday - we need to get results.







Palace are currently League leaders with maximum points from games played.


In the last two to three seasons Palace have become one of the teams you can judge the strengths and weaknesses of your players on, as they seem to be a good all round team with three or four outstanding players.





Blackburn Rovers have been very much on our minds this week, the second leg of our Coca-Cola Cup tie at Ewood Park the highlight for the players and fans alike. It was a mountain to climb of course after we conceded three goals to them at home. but the experience of playing the Premiership Champions in their own back yard will have provided an excellent insight for our younger players.

The week before English football had been handed another severe lesson when first Manchester United crashed out of the UEFA Cup at the First Round stage then Blackburn found themselves outplayed by Rosenborg, the Norwegian Champions. It was, according to the broadsheets, a case of Blackburn's tactics being exposed by clever continental opponents.

Well the Rovers have been found wanting for some time. Remember the way relegation haunted Manchester City took them to the cleaners at Ewood Park during the final run-in last season? Sherwood and company couldn't live with the movement and creativity of the likes of Garry Flitcroft and Nicky Summerbee that night and City, as we have seen, are not the greatest of teams.

Tactics are important of course but in the end it really is all down to players. It doesn't matter what tactical geniuses you would have behind the scenes, what fancy title you give your formation. If you haven't got players of quality who can operate the system and adapt to conditions on the park you are dead.

Let's face it the passing of the Blackburn side in Frondheim was woeful. Midfielders Batty and Sherwood continually gave away possession through sloppiness, both on and off the ball, when they weren't passing back and I can't recall anyone playing a telling ball into the last third of the field. Where was the craft? Where was the vision? Where was the

precision? Oh for the days of Clayton, Douglas and Dougan.

The tragedy is that Blackburn have in Alan Shearer one of the most lethal strikers in the business possibly the best ever to wear the famous blue and white halves - but are unable to make the most of him through the forward's inadequacies in other departments. It was the England centre forward's brilliant leap and headed lay-off that set up the chance for Newell to scramble in a surprise equaliser but the rare opportunities that come his way he had to fashion himself.

Manchester United too were short on skill. Ryan Giggs - however was he compared to George Best? He's not in the same class and failed to deliver a quality cross all night. You had to go to the City Ground, Nottingham, to enjoy such "old fashioned" virtues. Oh yes the pace and cunning of Dutchman Bryan Roy earned the headlines but the contribution of Steve Stone was the highlight for me. Here is a player who can beat a man and cross a ball with the accuracy of a laser guided missile; on the run or from a standing situation...An ideal partner for the likes of Shearer you might say.

It was interesting to hear Roy say after Forest's victory over Malmo that he felt the English tended to run down their own while in his opinion there was so much talent around the domestic game. Heartening words from the talented Dutchman but the lessons surely from the first two weeks of European club competition indicate that we still need to develop and better our basic skills.


It was Blackburn on Wednesday, an exciting tie to be involved in, but everybody knows our priority this season is to go up into the



The flank-men, now known in the modern game as 'wing-backs', didn't get to grips with the system and were very poor in going forward.



The U14's and U16's both travelled to AFC Bournemouth and came away with mixed fortunes.


The younger group lost 5-1 with the goal coming from Antonio Falvobut. The U16's fared better winning 3-2 after coming back from being two goals down.




