

### Pool Memorabilia

"If Oxford United lose at Bristol City and Notts County slip up against Burnley and if we beat Swindon..." Once again 'Pool's amateur statisticians are out in force anxiously working out endless permutations as the season unfolds and reaches its climax. In fact, the similarities

between today's vital top of the table clash at Bloomfield Road and our 1969/70 encounter with Swindon Town contested at the County Ground twenty six years ago this month are so striking that there can only be one item of memorabilia really suitable for featuring on this important day. The conclusion of the old Division 2 season was rapidly approaching by Tuesday 7 April 1970 with both Swindon and the Seasiders still very much 'in the frame' for promotion to the top division. On that day Blackpool, lying in second position in the league and together with a veritable army of fans, travelled south to Wiltshire to contest what turned out to be a momentous occasion. Swindon, meanwhile, in sixth spot but only three points adrift of the Seasiders had promotion aspirations of their own. A near capacity crowd of 28,520 witnessed a third minute goal by the home team's Arthur


Horsfield, his twenty fourth strike of the season but Mickey Burns' headed equaliser shortly before half time secured a priceless promotion point for Blackpool. In terms of quality the match wasn't a classic by any standards but for all the 'Pool fans present, myself included, it probably remains eminently etched in the memory as one of those unforgettable nights. Blackpool, of course, then went onto secure promotion by defeating Preston 3-0 in their next match finishing runners up to Huddersfield Town whilst Swindon missed out and occupied fifth position. A

few weeks after the season's end the Wiltshire side at least had the consolation of winning the Anglo-Italian trophy, a competition in which 'Pool themselves were to prove triumphant twelve months later.

The high drama of the April 1970 meeting shouldn't really have taken place at all because the fixture was originally scheduled for Saturday 20 December 1969 but was postponed due to bad weather. Postponed matches have been known to spell many problems for collectors in the past because it is often unclear as to whether the match programmes were made widely available for sale prior to games being called off or whether the whole issue was completely withdrawn and destroyed. Once or twice a small number of postponed match programmes have managed to survive destruction and 'leaked' into circulation and the originally scheduled Swindon v Blackpool fixture of December 1969 provides a perfect example of this.

The two standard issue Swindon programmes, each consisting of twenty four pages, are pages identical in terms of content although the pages illustrated here clearly show the key differences in dates and variations in the team line ups. The identical

aspects of each programme ends with the actual printed material the April programme would cost you only about 50p to purchase these days but the December rarity may be worth a small fortune. Notwithstanding this I'd willingly sacrifice both of my copies for a 'Pool victory today!

## In Opposition

### SWINDON TOWN COME TO BLOOMFIELD ROAD FOR THE MATCH OF THE SEASON - TOP AGAINST SECOND.

Swindon Town who were relegated from the 1st Division last season have had an outstanding season. Out of the 40 League games played to date they have only lost 4. Only one at home 1-0 to Shrewsbury and at Wrexham. (4-3), York City (2-0) and Oxford United (3-0). On their travels they have won 11 games which is only matched by Stockport County in our Division. Top scorer is Wayne Allison with Steve Finney (now injured), Kevin

Horlock and Peter Thorne all among the goals. They have two players on loan at the moment, David Preece from Swinton Town, who Blackpool nearly signed, and Donald Sutch from Hearts.

At the County Ground earlier in the season the game ended 1-1 with James Quinn equalising from the penalty spot after Steve Finney had opened the scoring.

### The Players

#### FRASER DIGBY -Goalkeeper

Born: Sheffield 23/04/67

Joined Manchester United from school as an apprentice twelve years ago, Fraser did not make the first team at Old Trafford and had loan spells at Oldham Athletic and Swindon Town before joining us on a permanent basis in September 1986. Has now made over 400 first team appearances for the Club although he did return to Manchester United for a loan spell during season 1992/93. Signed a new contract in November 1995 to take him through to 1998 which will include a testimonial

PAUL BODIN - Defender Born: Cardiff 13/09/64

Welsh International now in his second spell at The County Ground, Paul was initially signed from the now defunct Newport County for £25,000 in March 1988. Three years later he was transferred to Crystal Palace for a fee of £550,000 but was unable to command a place at Selhurst Park and just ten months later he returned to Swindon. Spent the end of last season out with a back injury. Transfer listed December 1995.

SHAUN TAYLOR - Defender Born: Plymouth 26/02/63

An ever present in the team again last season for the second consecutive year, Shaun was signed from Exeter City in July 1991 for £200,000. He came into professional football late signing for The Grecians from Western League Bideford Town at the age of 23. He played 233 first team games for Exeter before he joined Swindon Town. He has just signed a new contract which will keep him at The County Ground until 1997.

MARK SEAGRAVES - Defender

Born: Liverpool 22/10/66 Big strong central defender signed from Bolton Wanderers for £100,000 in June 1995, Mark forms a solid defensive partnership with Shaun Taylor. A former Liverpool apprentice, Mark had a loan spell with Norwich City before a £100,000 move to Manchester City in 1986. In 1990 he moved to Burnden Park but was unable to command a place in last seasons side who gained

promotion to the Premiership. KEVIN HORLOCK - Defender

Born: Plumstead 01/11/72

Born: Rochdale 21/11/68



STEVE McMAHON - Player/Manager Born: Liverpool 20/08/61 Appointed Player/Manager at the end of November 1994 following John Gorman's departure. An Associated Schoolboy with Everton, he was deeply hurt when they overlooked him when handing out apprenticeships - but he battled back and soon impressed enough to make his League debut at Sunderland in August 1980.


He went on to register 11 goals in 100 League games for Everton before a £300,000 transfer to Aston Villa in the summer of 1983. By then Steve was a seasoned England U21 International, having made his debut against The Republic of Ireland at Fratton Park in February 1981 and he continued in the squad to be part of England's European U21 Championship winning side in

With Villa, Steve proved to be a midfield general of the highest quality but his career in the Midlands was short lived as Kenny Dalglish splashed out. £375,000 to land him his first major deal for Liverpool in September 1985. McMahon filled the position vacated by Graeme Souness and played his first

game for Liverpool at Oxford. By the end of the season he had League and Cup medals to flaunt as Liverpool clinched the 'double'.

Further trophies were added to his collection as Steve shared in Anfield's phenomenal success, while at International level Bobby Robson drafted him into the 1990 England World Cup squad as cover for Bryan Robson. He was capped 17 times.

On Christmas Eve 1991, Manchester City paid £900,000 for his registration and until his move to Swindon, McMahon has continued to demonstrate his agility at the highest level.





### Pools Past

Looking at former Pool players currently managing Premiership

or Endsleigh League Clubs.

■ The recent appointment of Mitch Cook as the Director of Football at Scarborough doubles the number of ex-Seasiders in professional football management. Cook returns to the McCain Stadium for a third time after two previous spells for the Yorkshire Club, totalling 90 league appearances.

Mitch Cook joined Pool from Darlington in February 1993 becoming the regular left back until the end of the next season, captaining us on a number of occasions. The only game he missed during 1993/94 was the home defeat by Port Vale when traffic problems on the trip from their Yorkshire homes caused both Cook and Lee Martin to miss the game.

The departure of Billy Ayre and the arrival of Sam Allardyce heralded the replacement of Cook at left back by David Burke and although Mitch did play four games in September 1994 with Burke out injured, when the former Bolton player returned Cook

had played the last of his 80 games for Pool. He was transferred to Hartlepool until taking over as player-manager at non-league Guiseley. He will perform a similar role at Scarborough despite the fancy title. The other manager with previous experience as a Pool player is of course, Alan Ball. He holds several records at Bloomfield Road including being our youngest league player at the age of 17 years and 98 days when making his debut against Liverpool in 1962. He also has the distinction of possessing the longest time between appearances in a Tangerine shirt. Over 14 years passed from April 1966 when he played

transfer to Everton and his return in August 1980.

As player manager in that second spell, Ball added 35 games to his tally of 126 league and cup matches in the 1960's.

Since his sacking in March 1981 Ball has continued in management with Bristol Rovers, Portsmouth and Southampton prior to his current job at Manchester City.

The possibility of a reunion between Ball's first and present club next season, is an intriguing one.

At the beginning of this season, former Pool defender Mike Walsh was the only other former Seasider to be a manager, as he entered his sixth season at the helm at Bury. However, his sacking late last year and his replacement at Gigg Lane with the former Pool bosses Stan Ternent and Sam Ellis left Alan Ball as the solitary former player in the ranks of managers. Mitch Cook's new role has equalled the number.

Walsh himself is now the manager of
Unibond Premier League Club Barrow - until
at least the end of this season. He moved to
the Cumbrian Club after Tony Hesketh
stepped up to the Vauxhall Conference to
join Morecambe as assistant manager.
The examples of both Cook and Walsh made
me wonder about future managerial
candidates amongst current or very recent
Pool players. Will any of the present staff
even take over here at Bloomfield Road at
some time in the future?

managerial ambitions?

### Talking Football

### "When the seagulls follow the trawler....."

The seagull is of course a scavenger, and Eric Cantonas' imaginative description of the press can be more easily understood when one sees the type of journalism witnessed in a recent incident involving Blackpool's Micky Mellon.

■ The dramatic "Pool star arrested" headline on the front page of the Evening Gazette (10/4), concerned an alleged incident at the Savoy Hotel involving Blackpool footballers. The report, incidentally, made a rather tenuous link to Blackpool's recent run of three defeats and almost invited the reader to link the two events together. But surely the most significant thing about this news was that it wasn't really news at all. If the alleged incident involved you or I it would hardly warrant a small paragraph, yet it was blown up out of all proportion.

As football supporters the only time we should be concerned with what our players are doing is at 3 o'clock on a Saturday afternoon. What players get up to away from the stadium should not be up for public consumption as they have a right to live their lives as they want to away from football. What the press should be more concerned with are those whose off field activities undermine the very ethics of the sport. Those are the ones who take drugs to perform better, or those who sell the sport down the river by taking part in match rigging activities.

I am sure there was no malicious intent on the part of the Gazette, who have of course a job to do in selling newspapers. However, I would suggest that there are far worse things going on in the world to report on than high jinks in a local hotel.





## What The Papers Say With Roger Cooke

Torquay United and Hull City may be set to follow the example of Manchester United and switch strips in a desperate attempt to improve their performances. A Torquay spokesperson said their players had found it difficult to pass the ball to each other since the season began last August. And a Hull official voiced similar concerns. "The fact we have won only four out of twenty two home games may be due to our black and amber striped shirts, black shorts, and amber stockings with two black hoops. We're looking for something a little louder.

■ Not surprisingly, the press have had fa aield day following Manchester United's decision to change their strip at half time during the game against Southampton. United have lost four and drawn one of the five games played wearing their grey kit. According to manager Alex Ferguson the players found it difficult to pick each other out at a distance when they lifted their heads.

As The Independent pointed out on Tuesday, thousands of parents who bought the Umbro grey shirts for their children at prices ranging from £29.99 to £39.99 will now have to buy the new white replacement shirt. And although Umbro are reducing the price by £10 this does lend support to the old adage that you can fool some of the people all of the time.

According to The Independent United are already committed to selling a new version of their traditional red shirt next season and the blue and white third kit is to be changed at the end of the year. Tony Kershaw, secretary of the National Federation of Football Supporters Club told the paper "You can only sum it up as a rip off. Changing all three kits in the course of one season is totally unfair to the fans of all age groups, not just children. United fans are just being taken for a ride."

Meanwhile, an FA spokesman told the

Guardian that England have no plans to scrap their own gray outfit which was launched to widespread derision against Bulgaria. "Our players had no difficulty picking each other out and that was a night game."

The Evening Gazette's Anna Thompson thinks United fans are also being ripped off over the allocation of Cup Final tickets. The Old Trafford side, like their opponents from Liverpool, were given just 25,000 tickets for the big game and this won't even satisfy the demand from season ticket holders. The remaining 30,000 are given to County Football Associations, other Premier League and Football League clubs, sponsors and FA Council Members. According to Thompson these organisations and their members are given tickets as a privilege and many people use them simply because they are free.

"Wouldn't it be better then, if all those interested in going to the FA Cup final applied to the FA instead of being given way over the amount of tickets they need."

If the FA showed a bit of common sense they would have less of a black market problem. Most of us fans would go along with that, Anna.

### Gimpges inome line Post by Gerry Wolstenholme



Horace Fairhurst ... a tragic end to a promising career.

The New Year of 1921 heralded tragedy for Blackpool Football Club and in particular, for two of its players. They were the full backs Horace Fairhurst and Bert Tulloch who had formed an impressive partnership since being paired together on a regular basis in the 3-0 win over Clapton Orient on 24 January 1920. There were universally regarded as two of the most accomplished full backs in League football but their last appearance together was fated to be at Barnsley on 27 December 1920. Tulloch was the senior of the pair, having first appeared for Blackpool in the 1914/15 season, but it was Fairhurst was generally deemed to have the most potential. He came from the Bolton and District League and after a season or so with Darwen found himself posted

to Blackpool with the Royal Army Medical Corp on the outbreak of World War 1. He played for the Army in matches at Bloomfield Road and was one of the 'D' Company team that won the Service Medals Competition before he was posted to Egypt. He later returned to Blackpool and made a number of oppearances for the club in the war-time competition in 1917/18 and 1918/10

Blackpool saw lots of promise in the young right back and stepped in to sign him ahead of Manchester United and Bolton Wanderers where Fairhurst had been for trials "We liked his style and as he looked like making a fine back, we kept him" was the official comment from Bloomfield Road. He graduated with the Reserve side and by the middle of the 1919/20 season he had established himself at left back as partner to Tulloch. He very quickly won the admiration of the fans because of "his cool and sure attitude, even during the hottest of attacks." Over the Christmas period of 1920, Blackpool played Barnsley twice. Both games resulted in a 1-0 win for Blackpool with Barnsley lucky to escape defeat by the single goal in the Bloomfield Road encounter on Christmas Day. The second game was more fiercely fought; "some of the Seasiders got battered and bruised a bit but their injuries were not so serious as to take them off the field" which made them more fortunate than Cooper, the Barnsley goalkeeper, who was stretchered off and taken to reported that "Tulloch and Fairhurst were always too strong for the Barnsley forwards", this despite the fact that Fairhurst received a nasty knock on the head during the course of the game.

What was thought to be a touch of gastritis forced Fairhurst not to travel to the following game at Notts County and Tulloch was partnered by Gavin who had stood in twice for Fairhurst earlier in the season. But in training at the Balmoral Private Hotel, South Shore the following week for a Cup tie at Darlington, all the players were reported as "fit and well". However, Fairhurst was eventually deemed not to have recovered sufficiently for Blackpool to run the risk of playing him. And so he stayed at home, unhappy to be missing a second game, whilst the team travelled to the north east to play their non-league opponents. Blackpool were apparently caught napping and the headline the following day read "Darlington Delight at Drawn Game" as, with a 2-2 scoreline, they forced a replay.

But all the Cup tie excitement dissipated when the team arrived back at North Station as Bert Tulloch was met with the sad news that his wife, who had been feeling sick when he left on Friday, had passed away at eight o'clock that evening. And then, on the Sunday night the second tragedy struck. Horace Fairhurst, having been taken to hospital, asked to see "the boys" in order to get an update on the Darlington Cup tie. Manager Bill Norman and the players rushed to his bedside only to find him unconscious when they got there. The players were obliged to leave but Mr Norman stayed behind and was with Fairhurst when he died after 11 o'clock.

The replay with Darlington took place on the following Wednesday, where a collection was made for the bereaved families, and although the players, not surprisingly, had no real heart for the contest, Blackpool won 2-1. Bert Tulloch bravely missed only two games and continued playing first team football until he stepped down in 1923/34, having made 186 appearances. Sadly, Horace Fairhurst's career had lasted only 50 games but during that time he gained a considerable reputation as a full back, was known as a gentleman on and off the field and was strongly tipped for greater honours in the game. Blackpool football had never before witnessed such a tragic weekend as that of 8/9 January 1921.

### Gazette Gossip

HERE we go at last. This really is the big one for which Blackpool's fans have been waiting for practically the whole season. Swindon have been setting the pace at the top of Division Two for much of the term, apart from a recent spell when Pool made the most of a dazzling run of eight wins and two draws from 10 games to move above them.

Three successive defeats saw the Seasiders tumble from pole position but even that did not mean too much damage to their hopes of automatic promotion and the chances appear to be that the two teams on show today will both be in Division One next

Pool have already taken a point off Swindon with a 1-1 draw from an impressive show at the County Ground back in November. They have gone five games without a win but a hard-earned draw at Bristol Rovers lifted spirits after those three setbacks in a row and Sam Allardyce's men are raring to go today.

Swindon have lived up to their pre-season billing as leading promotion contenders after coming down from the First Division at the end of last season.

But it says much for the great strides Pool have made over the last 18 months or so that they have been able all term to keep right on the heels of a club which was in the Premier League two years ago. The Seasiders will be eager to produce a much better show than when they were last at home against Rotherham on Easter Monday. Despite Andy Preece giving them an early lead, they fell to a 2-1 defeat which was their first home setback in 12 League games dating back to November and only their third at Bloomfield Road all season.

And finally there is no truth in the rumour that there's a contract out on the Bristol Rovers PA announcer.


