





Stevens' wealth of experience at the very highest level saw him turn out in both full-back positions and as the 'spare' central defender for the Prenton Park club, although he did miss 14 games through injury.

The most decorated player in Rovers' history, Stevens has won everything the game in England and Scotland has to offer, and also represented his country in the 1988 European Championships and the 1986 and 1990 World Cups.

As an example of what can be achieved, boss John Aldridge could hardly hope for a better character to hold up to the likes of Alan Rogers, Ged Brannan and Tony Thomas.

Stevens' secret throughout his career has been his ability to do the simple things well. He concentrates totally, tackles superbly and distributes the ball with confidence and style.

If he can teach the young aspirants to his throne some of those hard-earned traits, then his £350,000 transfer fee - still a club record - will prove a genuine bargain.

This inspirational captain, goalscorer and now manager was appointed to the Prenton Park hot-seat following the departure of the long-serving John King in mid-April of this year, following a 6-2 defeat away at Derby that left the club in a perilously low position in the First Division table.


But Aldridge's famous talismanic properties soon shone through, and the former Newport County, Oxford, Liverpool and Real Sociedad (Spain) striker carefully guided his troops to safety as they saw out the season without losing another game, and also thrashed high-flying lpswich Town 5-2 at Prenton Park for good measure.

The undisputed king around the sixyard box, there is no-one better at sniffing out the half-chance as he has

proved time and time again for both club and country. With 67 International caps to his credit prior to the

beginning of 1996/97, 'Aldo' needed just two more goals to become Ireland's all-time record

scorer - and it would take a brave man to bet against him doing it. A fortnight ago, Rovers lost

First choice keeper at Prenton Park is the highly-rated. Welsh International DIANIVY COYNIE, who is a product of the Club's fruitful YTS policy and was voted Rovers' 'Player of the Year' for 1995/96. Coyne displaced the veteran ERIC NIXON as Tranmere's number one.

Nixon, who has also had spells at Wolves, Bradford, Southampton, Carlisle and Man City, became Tranmere's record buy when he joined from Maine Road for £60,000 in July 1988 and he was captain when the Club won promotion to the old Second Division in 1990/91. He is now the club's goalkeeping coach.

The experienced SHAUN TEALE
became Rovers' record signing when
John King splashed out £450,000 to
tempt him north from Aston Villa in
August 1995 and this tough,
uncompromising central defender has
often proved a class apart in the
First Division.

Having previously played with Manchester United and Newcastle, midfielder

• LIAM O'BRIEN signed for Tranmere in January 1994 for a fee of £250,000. He is a Republic of Ireland international and was considered unlucky not to be in the 22-man squad for USA '94.

Another young player to have come up through the ranks at Prenton Park is versatile 25-year-old **TONY THOMAS**, who can play anywhere in defence or midfield. The powerful Thomas likes to get forward, and he holds the record for Rovers' quickest ever goal, timed at 7.7 seconds after kick-off against Southend in 1991. He was reported to be on his way to Tottenham during the summer, but the clubs failed to agree a fee.

Liverpool-born 24-year-old **GED BRANNAN** is an all-action full-back or midfielder who is always likely to cause problems going forward, while **DAVE HIGGINS** is a speedy man-marker who is currently in his second spell at Prenton Park, having returned after a five year spell in non-League football.

An England U19 star, DAVE CHALLINOR was snapped up from local non-Leaguers Bromborough Pool in the summer of 1994, while JOHN MCGREAL and ALAN ROGERS are two more highly-promising young defenders to have migrated up from the junior ranks at Prenton Park to earn regular first-team slots.

who signed from Irish side Cork City for £40,000 in July 1995 and is regarded as a very bright prospect by the Prenton Park coaching staff. With Coventry as an apprentice, Woods' record of two goals every three games in Ireland speaks for itself.

The 25-year-old **KENNY IRONS** is a hard-working and energetic midfielder who can pass the ball well with both feet and plays a vital role in 'holding' the Tranmere midfield. Under new boss John Aldridge, Irons is operating 'in the hole' behind the main strikers and is clearly relishing his new position.

Another player thankful for the change in management at Prenton Park is full-back or wide midfielder **ALAN MORGAN**, who waited four years as a professional before making his senior debut, in a League match at home to Ipswich at the tail end of last season - and he made it a day to remember by scoring his first goal for the club. Despite his lack of action at club level, Alan is a Welsh U21 International.

The much-travelled **IVANO BONETTI** was the darling of Grimsby last season, but a much-publicised bust-up with manager Brian







a brief look Dack

Dick Mattick looks back ...

It seems incredible that although today's featured match happened less than four years ago, since that time Swindon have twice been promoted and twice relegated.

During this time Tranmere have continued to knock on the Premiership door without quite managing to find a way through.

Although the play-off semi final was over two legs, Tranmere probably felt they lost it in two minutes during the match at Swindon.

Town manager Glenn Hoddle described it as "like the Alamo" as tempers flared and Swindon battled to hold on.

Substitute Craig Maskell seemed to have made it safe in the 81st minute when he scored at the second attempt but Hoddle tripped John Morrissey and Irons scored from the spot two minutes later to leave Swindon fans sweating until the final whistle.


The sessions are planned to educate the boys at an early age with the correct procedures of warming up and how to carry out the proper stretches for respective muscle groups.

Middlesbrough have Ravanelli and Juninho; Chelsea are spearheaded by Vialli, Arsenal by Bergkamp, while Newcastle United parade the most expensive striker in the world in Alan Shearer.

But Tranmere Rovers couldn't care less for they have the inimitable consistency of John Aldridge to rely on.

The former Liverpool star now shoulders the considerable responsibilities of player-manager, yet he is showing no signs of faltering in his annual quest for goals as he continues to be Rovers' match-winner.

"Aldo's" strike on the hour against Birmingham City last Saturday was his fourth goal of the campaign and even though it sealed Birmingham City's first defeat of the season it did not dampen Trevor Francis's enthusiasm for the veteran striker.

The Blues' boss, a world class forward in his own playing days, was full of admiration as he admitted: "He's a master striker and you just can't afford to give him an inch of space.

Incredibly John will celebrate his 38th birthday next Wednesday and although he has been knocking in league goals for 17 years, the thrill he feels on hitting the net is still as vividly passionate as it ever was.

The truth is "Aldo" thrives on the buzz - it's like a drug - and no matter whether it is on the International stage, with the Republic of Ireland, or on the training field, the sense of achievement is equally intense and he just can't get enough. Perhaps it is because his roots were firmly entrenched in non-League football and he knows what it is like to survive at the grass roots level. John was a factory toolmaker playing part-time for South Liverpool in the Northern Premier League when Newport County gave him his chance in League football in 1979.

He finished that first season as Newport's top scorer with 14 goals and he has been a top gun ever since.

At Oxford United he broke the Club's scoring record by a massive 10 goals in season 1984-85, when he finished the season as the top shot in the old Second Division with 34 strikes; then registered another 23 the following season, his first in the top flight.

When Ian Rush announced he was to quit Liverpool to seek his fortune in Italy nobody thought they would fill his boots.
But Aldridge not only did it with his goals return but there was also an uncanny physical resemblance to the man he replaced.

The honours and the plaudits came at Anfield and such was his reputation that in February 1990 Real Sociedad, after 30 years of an all-Basque team, broke with tradition to sign him.

It was a brave move for a great many Basques were antagonistic to any foreign influences and at 31, John was taking on something many younger men would have shunned. He said many remarks, which were obviously not complimentary, were directed his way in the street; "but as I couldn't understand what they

were saying it didn't matter."

Though he quickly learned the lingo it was his goals that did the talking, top scorer was John in both his seasons in Spain and the rewards were worth it.

You might say he's been there, done that, done it all in fact, with League Championship, FA Cup winners, "Player of the Year" and "Footballer of the Year" trophies in the cabinet and two World Cup and European Championship campaigns with the Republic of Ireland stored in his memory. Oh, of course and over 400 senior goals. Surely he can retire content with his lot. Yet "Aldo's" thirst for success on the field is genuinely as enthusiastic today as it was when he pulled on the shirt for South Liverpool all those years ago.

Here is a star who has not taken his rewards for granted. Liverpool born and bred he knows that but for a break or two he could have spent his entire career on the factory floor.

He has a lot to be grateful for, including an Irish great grandmother who opened the door to his International career. But most of all John Aldridge worked for his success and the true measure of his talent has never been more obvious than it is today.




Age obviously slows one down but it hasn't dulled Aldridge's natural predatory instincts for finding the net.


He is taking them on and more than holding his own, in a young man's role at the sharp end.

Talia signed for Swindon from Premiership Blackburn Rovers after a successful loan spell here at the County Ground late last year.


Born in Melbourne the shotstopper was first spotted by a scout while playing for the Australian Under 21 team.


An invitation to England resulted in trials for several clubs but it was Blackburn who signed him in August 1992.





Hopefully it will not be necessary but you will know what to expect in the unlikely event of an emergency evacuation. It is in the public interest and your assistance is greatly appreciated and will help to maintain the safety record of Swindon Town Football Club.

Aldo's Penalty

John Aldridge entered the football folklore annuls for the wrong reasons in May 1988, when in the 61st minute of the Liverpool vs Wimbledon game he became the first and up to now only player ever to miss a penalty in an FA Cup Final at Wembley. Having successfully converted 11 penalties already that season the League's leading goalscorer hit the ball firmly to the left of Dave Beasant who dived to save and keep the Don's 1-0 lead in tack. The following season saw Liverpool return to Wembley and complete a League and Cup double with John Aldridge getting the Reds first goal in the fourth minute against arch rivals Everton. John Aldridge made his farewell appearance for Liverpool on September 12, 1989 when his side played in yet

another historic match versus Crystal Palace. Winning 9-0, a Liverpool League Division One record score. Leading 5-0 at Anfield in the 69th minute Ronnie Whelan was brought down in the penalty box and manager Kenny Dalglish summoned Aldridge from the bench to take the spot kick. Claiming afterwards he had never been so nervous he strode forward to make it 6-0. As well as being a record scoreline in Division One for Liverpool, it is the only time in League Division One that eight different players have got on the scoreline for the same team. Nichol (2), McMahon, Rush, Gillespie, Beardsley, Barnes and Hysan also scoring.

Paying the Penalty

Only two players have ever missed penalties in FA Cup Finals. John Aldridge became the first player to miss a penalty in a Wembley final when Liverpool lost to Wimbledon in 1988 but 75 years earlier Charlie Wallace playing for Aston Villa versus Sunderland became the first player ever to miss a penalty, but unlike Liverpool his team still went on to win the Cup by one goal to nil


