#### ATTENDANCE FACTS & FIGURES

The average league attendance at The Hawthorns this season (15 games played) is: 15,106 (aggregate 225,240). This figure is down by 60 on last season's average. Albion's away support at Ipswich Town was almost 1,000, at Port Vale it was 1,988 and at St. Andrew's last Tuesday evening it was 3128.

#### **HEAD TO HEAD V SWINDON TOWN**

- Albion first played Swindon (away) in a friendly match in March 1897 and ran out winners 1-0.
- The first league game between the clubs took place at The County Ground on 8 September 1973 (Division Two). Albion lost 1-0 and had Willie Johnston sent-off!
- ◆ A crowd of 16,254 saw holders Albion beat Swindon 2-0 at The County Ground in a League Cup-tie on 25 October 1966 — on their way to the Wembley Final.
- Albion were awarded three penalties in six second half minutes of their home league game against Swindon Town on 17 December 1989. Bernard McNally and Graham Harbey both missed from the spot before Don Goodman scored. Albion lost 2-1.
- Albion lost 5-2 to Swindon in a bottom-ofthe-table clash at The Hawthorns on 19 March 1995. Peter Thorne scored a second half hattrick for Swindon who were relegated to the Second Division while Albion stayed up!
- Paul Holmes, with a curling centre, scored his first goal for Albion against Swindon earlier this season when the Baggies registered their first league win at The County Ground (3-2).
- Albion League debutants versus Swindon: David Powell (1988), Stacey North (1988) and Tony Ford (1989).

# warm welcome to Ray Harford who is the new manager of West Bromwich Albion. The announcement was made at a press conference on Thursday morning, ending a period of intense speculation since the departure of Alan Buckley on Wednesday 22nd January.

Ray Harford started his managerial career at Fulham before a successful spell at Luton Town where he won the League Cup and Simod Cup. He then had a brief spell at Wimbledon before becoming coach and later manager at Blackburn Rovers, where he was involved in their Premiership Title. Ray becomes only the second Albion manager in post-war history to have previously managed a First Division/Premier League Championship winning side — the other being Ron Saunders.


A Sponsor's Lounge teeming with the local press was the venue for Ray's introduction, as Chairman Tony Hale outlined the reasons for his appointment on a three year contract:

"Ray was a prime-mover in Blackburn's recent success and we saw many good qualities in him as both a manager and a man."

Tony Hale confirmed that there would be funds for Ray to use if he felt it necessary to strengthen the squad. Adding, in an effort to play down recent speculation about the coaching staff at The Hawthorns:

"Ray is the new boss and what goes on with staff —on and off the field — is his affair."

Ray Harford was quick to emphasise what a good job he thought John Trewick had done in recent




"I'm impressed by the financial budgeting at the club and as far as players are concerned I'll have to assess what we've got on the staff then possibly go out and spend."

On his decision to return to football Ray admitted that:

"After two weeks out of the game I was already itching to get back, I feel like I've had my sabbatical and I now want to get back on the job, with Albion."

With the full management structure of the club to be decided in the near future — and Tony Hale inferred that this structure could be quite different to what we are used to at The Hawthorns — these are exciting times at West Bromwich Albion.

The appointment of Ray Harford is an outstanding one for Albion. Indeed, it must be considered something of a coup to attract to The Hawthorns a man who has so recently been basking in the glory of a Premiership Title. If Ray Harford can bring a measure of the success he achieved at Ewood Park to The Hawthorns there will be few grumbles from Baggies' fans in the forthcoming years.


Last season Swindon were far and away the best team in Division Two so it was no surprise to anyone that they bounced back into Division One as Champions after their relegation the year before. The Robins, under player-manager Steve McMahon, finished nine points ahead of runners-up Oxford United and their impressive record of only four defeats in 46 games gave notice that they would

not just be making up the numbers in Division One.

# SWINDON

### Town

That Swindon are a footballing side which played its way to promotion is testimony to the 'pass and move' style Steve McMahon learnt in his time at Anfield, where he was Kenny Dalglish's first signing, after the Scot became player-manager of Liverpool, in September 1985. A spell of six years at Anfield was undoubtedly the most successful of his career and he won both FA Cup and League Championships under Dalglish, as well as the first of 17 England caps. He is still adding to his total of well-over 600 senior appearances at club level,



Mark Seagraves — The Rock At The Back For The Robins though his current dual-role at Swindon, not to mention recent injuries, has curtailed the playing side of his duties, although he has figured in the last few games.

Liverpool-born McMahon began his career with Everton as an apprentice in 1977, but his impatience for success drove him to leave Goodison just before Howard Kendall began the most successful spell in Everton's history. That was in 1983 when, despite Liverpool being favourites for his signature, he opted for Aston Villa. Two years later he finally arrived at Anfield and brought with him the aggressive midfield ball winning skills that made him an instant hit at Liverpool. It was while at Anfield that Steve made his last England appearance in the third place World Cup play-off against Italy in 1990, when he was coming to the end of his Liverpool career.

After Graeme Souness became manager there were often clashes of personality between the two and in 1991 Steve took his boots down the East Lancs Road to Manchester City. Though he gave 100%, as always, Macca will probably be the first to admit that Maine Road never worked out so, three years ago, he took the plunge and became player-manager at Swindon. Though he was unable to prevent relegation for the second successive season the style with which he brought Swindon up last year augers well for one of the brightest young managers in the game.

In winning the Second Division title last year Swindon scored 71 goals and Steve McMahon said, at the time, that he felt a significant factor in that triumph was the fact that so many of his players got on the score-sheet. But no one player made a more significant contribution than burly striker Wayne Allison who weighed in with 20 goals. Signed from Bristol City in 1995 for nearly

£500,000, Wayne had been leading scorer at Ashton Gate for three of his first five seasons at the club. Huddersfield born Wayne had started his career in his native Yorkshire with Halifax Town, before a 1989 move to Watford where he spent twelve barren months before moving to Bristol City.

Wayne, at 6' 2" and weighing in at around 14 stone, is more than a handful for most defenders and is very strong on the ball. He is particularly dangerous in the air and at set-pieces and the Albion defence will have to be especially wary of these qualities this afternoon.


Though Swindon were founded in 1881 they had to wait until 1969 for the club's first trophy, but it was well worth the wait as Swindon, still a Third Division club, stunned the football world by beating mighty Arsenal 3-1 in the League Cup Final at Wembley inspired by club legend Don Rogers who scored two of Town's goals on that muddy March afternoon. Swindon also finished runners-up to Watford in that same season. Both clubs finished on 74 points but Watford had the better goal average.

Original members of Division Three in 1920, Swindon had to wait until 1963 to get into the Second Division, but it was a short stay of just two seasons and down they went until that glorious season of 1968-69. This time the stay was two years longer before 1974 saw them once again relegated after

Eight years later they hit rock-bottom and went down into Division Four but Lou Macari took them up in 1986 as Champions with a record 102 points. The following season the club were in Division Two where they remained until 1992. Despite winning the Play-off Final that year the club were found guilty of financial irregularities and were not allowed to go up




into The Premiership, but they did gain promotion in 1993 and although they illuminated the top flight with their stylish football they were relegated in 1994. The following season saw the club relegated again, but Steve McMahon inspired them to the Championship to return them to Division One.

Swindon made a bright enough start to the current campaign giving Steve McMahon plenty of optimism for the season ahead though he himself admitted: "Having got back into Division One it would be nice to achieve consolidation and that has to be our main aim." They will have to consolidate without midfield star, Kevin Horlock who has joined First Division rivals, Manchester City in a deal worth just over £1 million. The loss of Horlock is sure to hit the Robins hard and


they will need to muster all of McMahon's battling qualities to overcome it.


Early results indicated that The Robins even surpass that conservative objective as the team beat Tranmere on September 16th and drew at QPR a week later. With a third of the season gone Swindon were among the front-runners in the division and a 3-0 success over high-flying Barnsley took the side up to eighth in the table, that win came after a 2-0 victory against Macca's former club Manchester City. Home form wasn't the


problem it was on the road that Swindon had troubles, as early as Christmas the boss was speaking of "relegation" to his embattled players. At the County Ground Swindon's record, following the 2-1 win over Sheffield United last week-end, was a pretty impressive eight wins and four draws out of 15 games played, but the away record is the worst in the division, eleven defeats in 15 outings. Despite that McMahon will be insisting his side doesn't roll over for the Albion today.



Steve McMahon — Developing Into One Of The Division's Best Young Managers










Paul has led a highprofile life, principally

marriage to Blues' managing
director Karren Brady. It was in fact Paul's
relationship with Karren which led to the first of his
transfers, when he was sold by Blues to Stoke in
August 1994.

Pesch observed wryly: "It's been an interesting first few years over here. Luckily I adapt quickly to new situations, otherwise I might have had

problems with all the changes I've seen since Terry Cooper signed me for Blues from Toronto Blizzard.

"I really enjoyed my first spell at Blues, but after Terry was sacked Barry Fry came in and he eventually decided there was a conflict between my job as a footballer and my relationship with Karren.

"That was why I was sold to Stoke, but within a month or so of me moving there Joe Jordan got the sack. I didn't have time to get to know Joe, but he seemed a very professional and well organised manager.

"Lou Macari came in and I really enjoyed working for him and his assistant, Chic Bates. They believe in fitness, organisation and 100 per cent commitment and that suits me — wherever I've played I've given everything and I'm sure supporters, as well as managers, appreciate that.

"Lou had to sell me because

of financial problems at Stoke, and it was Barry Fry who took me back to Blues — he obviously felt there was no longer a clash of interest between football and my marriage.

"But a couple of months later Barry got sacked and Trevor Francis took over. Right out of the blue one morning, I got a call from Trevor telling me I wasn't in his plans because he had signed Mike

Newell and Paul Furlong — so would I like to go along and talk to Alan Buckley?

"That's what I did, I liked what Alan had to say and from first arriving at The Hawthorns I've enjoyed being an Albion player. It's been like my first 12 months at St Andrews, when I loved the club, the supporters were fantastic to me and I felt I did a good job.

"I'm just hoping now that I get to stay here for a long time to come. I'll give the new manager the best I've got to offer and hopefully, if I also carry on scoring goals, that will keep me in the team as well as at The Hawthorns."

Unfortunately for Paul, he was not in the team at Birmingham on Tuesday night due to an injury he sustained

at Port Vale last Saturday.

His two goals in the 2-2 draw at Vale Park brought his



season's tally to 11, and he was relishing the prospect of playing against his former club in midweek.

But the knock he took to his knee proved more serious than it had first seemed. He explained: "It didn't feel too bad after the match and I drove home with no problem.

"But the knee swelled up so badly around 9.00 pm that Karren had to rush me to hospital. There was damage to the top of the fibula and at first they thought it might be broken, but when I had a scan it was diagnosed as an old injury which had taken another knock.

"The kick just below my knee had caused bleeding in the joint, so on Monday morning I had it drained and I thought I might be OK for Tuesday night.

"But I ran out of time to get match-fit and I was absolutely gutted — I had been looking forward to the match at Blues more than any other game this season.

"What makes it worse is that I won't even be able to play against them when they come to The Hawthorns next month, because I'll be on international duty with Canada that weekend.

"But you can be sure I'll be on the telephone to find out how we've done — and hopefully that Sunday night I'll be toasting a double against my old club."



ack Smith became West Brom's first teammanager in July 1948 after long-serving Fred Everiss relinquished his job as Albion's secretarymanager and the positions were divided. A former Swindon Town left-back, Smith made 114 league appearances while at the County Ground before joining Chelsea for £4,000 in March 1938 and returned to Wolves as trainer-coach when his playing career was ended by a road accident.

Young, enthusiastic and modern in his approach to coaching, he was charged with the task of getting Albion back into the top-flight alongside Midlands rivals Aston Villa, Birmingham City and Wolves. He inherited a talented squad, strong in key positions with

Jim Sanders in goal, record-signing Jack Vernon at centre-half and fellow Irish international Dave Walsh leading the attack.

Other influential figures included right-back Jim Pemberton, Len Millard, Harry Kinsell, Glyn Hood, outside-right Billy Elliott and insideforwards Jack Haines and Cyril Williams. Emerging youngsters like Ray Barlow and Joe Kennedy

brought in Paddy Ryan at right-half as Dave Walsh's hat-trick and two goals by Jack Haines gave West Brom an emphatic 5-0 home win over Lincoln City in early September.

This victory launched a 12-match unbeaten run that included nine wins and established Smith's team among the early pace-setters. The run ended with a surprising 4-1 defeat at lowly Bradford PA in mid-November. Albion's goalscorer Jack Haines learned of his selection for England on Bradford station and scored twice on his international debut against Switzerland 11 days later.

West Brom immediately returned to winning ways as goals by Len Millard and Billy Elliott gave the following side a vital 2-0 victory over

Cyril Williams netted a hat-trick in Albion's 5-2 home win over Grimsby Town a fortnight later, the same week that reserve centre-forward Arthur Rowley moved to promotion rivals Fulham in exchange for outside-left Ernie Shepherd. Rowley had deputised for Dave Walsh in Albion's 2-1 win at Fulham two months earlier and was dissatisfied with second-team football.

The ideal successor to Ronnie Rooke at Craven Cottage, he spearheaded Fulham's promotion push and was destined to score an all-time record 434 league goals during his career that continued at Leicester City and Shrewsbury Town. Shepherd failed to solve Albion's left-wing problem and made just four appearances prior to joining Hull City where he helped to clinch the Third Division (North) title.

A fortnight after scoring twice in West Brom's 3-1 FA Cup fourth round victory at Gateshead, Dave Walsh netted a hat-trick as Albion gained a 3-0 fifth round win over First Division Chelsea in front of 57,843 at The Hawthorns. Two weeks later, Albion were narrowly beaten 1-0 at Wolves in the sixth round watched by 55,684 and Stan Cullis' team went on to win the FA Cup.

defeats, pressure mounted on West Brom in the promotion race when Albion reject Arthur Rowley gave rivals Fulham a shock 2-1 victory with the last shot of the match in a blizzard at The Hawthorns. Smith's team responded by winning 2-1 at Plymouth Argyle a week later, as goals by Dave Walsh and Billy Elliott enabled Albion to take their first-ever points from Home Park.

Smith had switched Ray Barlow from inside-forward to wing-half with great success and as the promotion race reached a critical stage, he risked giving a debut to inexperienced reserve centre-half Joe Kennedy in the vital game at Luton Town. The gamble paid off as Albion won 1-0 and Kennedy retained his place.

At the start of April, the championship looked an absolute certainty for Southampton as they beat Spurs at White Hart Lane to go eight points clear. But in scoring the winning goal ace marksman Charlie Wayman was injured and put out of action for the rest of the season. Saints failed to win another match and their amazing loss of

form gave West Brom and Fulham the chance to overhaul them.


Dave Walsh scored four goals in Albion's 7-1 win over Bradford PA at The Hawthorns, then came two hectic battles with Coventry City over Easter and Jack Haines' goal gave West Brom a 1-0 win at The Hawthorns on Easter Monday. The following day, Dave Walsh missed a second-half penalty at Highfield Road where struggling Coventry gained revenge with a 1-0 tri-umph.

In a thrilling match at Southampton four days later, the home forwards bombarded Albion's goal in the first-half but little outside-left Arthur Smith slipped away to score against the run of play and Saints went to pieces. Despite Eric Day managing to head an equaliser in the dying seconds, the 1-1 draw handed West Brom the advantage in the tight promotion race.

Needing four points from their last three games to secure promotion, Albion won 2-0 at home to Barnsley and on 5th May 1949, the following team travelled to lowly Leicester City who had been FA Cup finalists five days earlier: Jim Sanders, Jim Pemberton, Len Millard, Paddy Ryan, Jack Vernon, Glyn Hood, Billy Elliott, Joe Kennedy, Dave Walsh, Ray Barlow, Arthur Smith.

Watched by 34,585, West Brom took a 12th minute lead when Paddy Ryan's free-kick was headed down by Joe Kennedy for Dave Walsh to score. Kennedy netted from Arthur Smith's corner in the 26th minute and Ray Barlow added a third in the 64th minute with a narrow-angled shot as Albion's 3-0 victory clinched a First Division return.

West Brom had to settle for the runners-up slot behind champions. Fulham after a 1-0 defeat at Grims-by Town on the last day, with Southampton a further point behind Albion in third place. Achieving promotion success at the first attempt, Jack Smith had guided the club back to the top-flight after an absence of 11 years.







### A late revival was not enough to prevent the reserves from going down 2-0 at Notts County on Wednesday evening.

Albion had the better of the closing stages and had chances to save the match, but they were unable to pull back the two goals County had scored in the first half.

Before the home side took the lead Albion had made a bright start, Lee Knight forcing goalkeeper Michael Pollitt into a third minute save then Kevin Donovan hooking a shot wide of the near post from Simon Buckley's eighth minute cross.

The Magpies went ahead after 14 minutes, when Sean Farrell volleyed home Peter Kennedy's left wing cross from beyond the far post.

Michael Rodosthenous almost equalised within a minute, lobbing a shot over Pollitt but also just over the bar after Paul Groves had headed on a Shaun Murphy

free-kick.

Just before the half hour Buckley had a 20 yard chip deflected for a corner with Pollitt stranded off his line; but five minutes later Tony Agana headed narrowly over the Albion bar then Farrell shot wide from a good position.

When the penalty decider came it was due to Martin Graingers's foul on McGinlay and the Scot settled the game with his 23rd goal of the season after the Blue's defender was sent-off. Bolton's lead increased to twelve points over Wolves who won 2-0 at home to Stoke thanks to a brace of goals from Steve Bull.
- Bolton minds were obviously on promotion because they surprisingly went out of the FA Cup in a mid-week replay at home to Chesterfield 3-2. It was 19-year-old Kevin Davies who did the damage with a hat-trick. Bolton's goals came from Scott Taylor and a late strike from Scott Green.
- Bradford City continued their resurgence with

Jack Lester made it 2-0 just after the break to take Grimsby to within a point of Oldham who lost 1-0 at Portsmouth to a Paul Hall goal in the seventh minute. Craig Fleming's sending-off for a foul on Hall, his second yellow card, didn't help the Latics' cause.

They'd be happier still in the top flight but very few clubs with their goal difference are likely to ever reach that promised land.

Listen out for the chimes in a fortnight as Pompey come to The Hawthorns, no doubt bringing the man with the bell with them. He hasn't had much to ring about this season as they float in mid-table waters but recent weeks have shown improved form that will have the Fratton Park optimists delaying booking their holidays. Their form at home and away is pretty unremarkable but they have picked up four away victories (at Crystal Palace, Grimsby, Port Vale and Swindon). They have drawn at Ipswich, Oldham and Reading and lost at Barnsley, Bolton, Bradford, Norwich, Oxford, Sheffield Utd, Stoke and Tranmere.

The side assembled by Terry Fenwick contains plenty of experience with Alan Knight in goal, Alan McLoughlin in midfield and one-time loan Baggie John Durnin up front. Throw in the names of Fitzroy Simpson, Paul Hall, Andy Awford and the former Arsenal midfielder David Hillier (who joined before Christmas) and you have a squad that should be higher in the rankings. Pompey are one of several south-coast clubs looking for a new home but if they want to inaugurate a new stadium with Premiership football they need to be more consistent. The highlight of their season could well come in the form of Southampton being relegated to provide a spicy local derby next term. This is a game we must look to win.


