It seems an age since we travelled back from Carrow Road having gone down 2-0 on the opening day of the season.

But today we renew acquaintances with Norwich City in the Nationwide First Division looking for three points that will keep us on the fringe of the promotion race.

After looking good bets for a move up for most of the season, Norwich have struggled to find their form of late and this afternoon we hope to further dent their chances of a play-off place by continuing our impressive home record which has seen us unbeaten at the County Ground since last October.

Newarrivals

It has been a busy week in the build up to transfer deadline day and at the time of writing a number of new faces have arrived here at the County Ground.

The most famous face to come on board is former Jockey Willie Carson who became an Associate Director of Swindon Town on Tuesday.

The 54 year old, who lives near Cirencester rode nearly 4000 winners during a career spanning 37 years and he hopes to help the Club in their race for Premiership status.

"Willie is a winner in every sense of the word and I'm sure he will be an asset to the Club." said Chairman Mike Spearman.

On the playing side, Steve McMahon had made three additions to the squad as this programme went to print.

Phil King, the former Aston Villa defender signed a two year contract, young midfielder Graham Anthony had signed until the end of the season from Sheffield United while Graham Coughlan, a 22 year central defender from Blackburn Rovers, had agreed a loan deal until the end of the season.

Nothing to show for efforts

Despite producing one of their better away performances of the season, Swindon lost 1-0 at Port Vale last Saturday.

The only goal was scored by Lee Mills but we were denied a penalty late on when a foul on Peter Thorne in the box went unpunished.

Even Vale boss John Rudge admitted. "The breaks went for us in a tight game. Sometimes you need a little good fortune and decisions that go for you." he said.

the manager Steve McMahon says



Last Saturday we gave one of our better displays away from home without getting our just rewards.

We looked solid at the back and created a number of chances and when Port Vale scored it was totally against the run of play, although it was an unstoppable shot.

Then the game turned on yet another poor refereeing decision. I've said more than enough about some of the decisions which have gone against us this season and on Saturday the referee failed to give what in my opinion was a blatant penalty after a foul on Peter Thorne. It wasn't even 50-50, there was no doubt it was a foul.

I just wish the officials would be more consistent. Even if they were consistently bad it would be ok, however I'd prefer it if they were consistently good.

I'd like to think that these things even themselves out over the course of a season but I don't think that will be the case this year. It seems to have been one thing after another.

After that defeat we want to bounce back over Easter, starting today against Norwich and then at Oldham on Monday.

They are both big games as Norwich are chasing a play-off place while Oldham are fighting for survival.

We didn't do ourselves justice at Norwich on the opening day of the season mainly because some of our players were a bit new to it. I'd like to think we've learnt a lot since then and have taken the positives from the defeat up there.

As far as the Oldham game is concerned it is bound to be a real battle as they are in a dog-fight at the bottom. They are fighting for their lives and Neil Warnock has got quite a job ahead of him.

Away from the action we have added a few more players to our squad this week with defender Phil King signing from Aston Villa, Graham Coughlan joining us on loan from Blackburn and Graham Anthony coming in from Sheffield United.

As I write these notes I'm still hoping to add another new face or two before transfer deadline day.

On the outgoing front, at the time of writing there have been a couple of enquiries about players on the transfer list.

A Premier League Club made an offer for Peter Thorne but it wasn't as much as we'd like so there is nothing concrete to tell you about. Finally we had no joy in our appeal over the sending off of Wayne Allison so the Chief starts a three match ban today.

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and staff of Norwich City to the County Ground. We hope that everybody enjoys the game and has a safe journey home after the match.

It has been a topsy-turvey season for the Canaries so far. At the time of writing they are sitting in eight place in the First Division table, just three points behind deadly rivals Ipswich Town and looking

good for a Play-Off place at the very least.

But much of their good attacking play - with the likes of Darren Eadie and Neil Adams in dangerous form - is let down by a sometimes shaky defence which has

definitely suffered since the loss of the highly-rated Spencer Prior to Leicester in August.

A positive start to the campaign, which included successive morale-boosting victories over Grimsby (4-1) and neighbours Ipswich (3-1), was let down by a disastrous period between late October and turn of the year.

Just two victories in 12 matches - a run that saw seven defeats and successive thrashings from West Brom (5-1) and Port Vale (6-1) over Christmas - saw the Canaries drop off their lofty perch.

But manager Mike Walker has steadied the ship since then to ease his side back into contention at the top of the table.

There is an element of class in the Norwich squad, with players such as Andy Johnson, Darren Eadie and Keith O'Neill coveted by many of the country's top sides. But where in the past City were forever selling to survive - much to the chagrin of their supporters - the Club seems more inclined to hang on to their precious young talent...for the time-being at least.

al Closer lookat Darren Eadie

Perhaps the most sought-after player outside the Premiership, Darren Eadie has had the critics purring over the past couple of seasons, with several offers for his services dropping onto the Carrow Road doormat.

Despite a couple of niggling injuries, this fleet-footed youngster enjoyed his best season to date in 1995/96, scoring six League goals, and the current campaign has shown that he was no 'one season wonder'.

Among the most dangerous

forwards in the First Division, Darren's biggest weapon is his tremendous pace, and the fact that he can operate down either flank or as a central striker can unsettle even the best defences.

He is at his best running at defenders from deep, and his willingness to shoot from distance has resulted in some spectacular strikes among the 13 he has scored in the League this term at the time of writing.

Already a regular in the England U21 set-up, he is widely tipped to make the transition to the Full national side in the not too distant future.

Meet the Manager...Mike Walker
One of the most popular managers in
Norwich's history, Mike Walker returned
to the Club for a second spell in the hotseat in June 1996, following the
departure of previous boss Gary Megson.

City fans will be hoping that Walker can bring back some of the glory days they tasted in his first spell as manager, which began in April 1992 when he was promoted from Reserve team boss to succeed Dave Stringer.

The following campaign he led the Canaries to their highest ever League finish - third - after a lengthy spell

topping the table, and qualified for the UEFA Cup into the bargain.

And 1993/94 saw the Carrow Road Club continue to compete at the top end of the Premiership, as well as putting up a tremendous showing in Europe, where an historic victory away at Bayern Munich meant a night to remember for City fans everywhere.

A clash with then City Chairman Robert Chase over the Club's financial policy led to Walker's resignation in January 1994, and the highly-rated and likeable manager walked straight into a job with Everton. Following a poor start at Goodison Park Walker was sacked - ironically after a 0-0 draw at Carrow Road - in November 1994 and he subsequently spent 18 months out of the game before making his triumphant return to Carrow Road last summer. One of the game's true gentlemen, Walker has quickly got his Norwich side back playing the



Very much the first choice 'keeper for the Canaries is Scottish international **BRYAN GUNN**, who has twice won the Club's 'Player of the Year' award since his £100,000 transfer from Aberdeen in October 1986. Bryan captained City for much of last season and was often to be seen making an appearance in the opposition penalty box late on in games if Norwich were pressing for goals. With more than 430 senior games under his belt for the Canaries, Bryan is currently enjoying his testimonial season at Carrow Road.

His understudy is England Under-21 star **ANDY MARSHALL**, who at the time of writing has played three League games so far this season. An outstanding young goalkeeper who has come up through the ranks at Carrow Road, Andy has returned from loan spells at Gillingham and Bournemouth this season to pressurise Gunn for his first-team place.

The third 'keeper on the professional staff at Norwich is 19-year-old **PAUL BARBER**, the son of former Luton Town number one Keith Barber. Paul signed professional with the Club in July 1996 but has yet to make his senior debut.

Hard-tackling **CARL BRADSHAW** is a 'take no prisoners' full-back who moved to Carrow Road from Sheffield United for £450,000 in July 1994. Having begun life as a striker with Sheffield Wednesday, he has also enjoyed spells with Barnsley (loan) and Manchester City. Loves to get forward at every opportunity and is never afraid to shoot from distance.

Yet to make a senior League appearance at the time of writing, **ANDREW BROWNRIGG** is a former Hereford player who was earmarked as 'one for the future' when he was signed by Norwich for an initial fee of £100,000 in March 1995. He is a calm and composed central defender who loves to close opponents down at speed.

Continuing Norwich's long-standing record of breeding quality home grown talent is 19-year-old **DANNY MILLS**. Norwich born and bred, Danny is a former England Youth international who has progressed through the ranks at Carrow Road and is now a regular in the Canaries first-team. A versatile and powerful defender, Danny is strong in the air and happy anywhere across the back four.

The hugely experienced **ROB NEWMAN** is still going strong for Norwich, and is fast approaching 200 senior games for the Club having previously played almost 500 for his only

other Club, Bristol City. Still a vital member of the Canaries squad, Rob has been almost ever-present this season and his versatility makes him a valuable commodity. He has played in nearly ever outfield position for Norwich - and even spent 45 minutes in goal after Bryan Gunn was sent-off against Sheffield United last season.

One of several former Tottenham players to have made the move to Carrow Road is central defender **JOHN POLSTON**, who won England Youth honours at White Hart Lane before transferring to Norwich for a tribunal-set fee of £300,000 in July 1990. A reliable and well organised defender, John has already found the net on two occasions this season.

Highly-rated former Everton defender **MATT JACKSON** became Mike Walker's first signing since his return to Carrow Road when he moved from Goodison Park for a £450,000 fee in December 1996. He began with Luton Town as a right-back, but quickly switched to central defence and was soon snapped up by then Everton boss Howard Kendall. After the arrival of Joe Royle at Goodison, Matt had loan spells at Charlton, QPR and Birmingham City before moving to Norwich. A polished performer who loves to push forward, he had scored two goals in 11 League games for his new Club at the time of writing.

Former City trainee **JOHNNY WRIGHT** is a bright youngster who has overcome a couple of nasty injuries over the past two seasons and is now keen to make up for lost time in the first-team. Belfast-born Wright made two Premiership appearances as an 18-year-old for City and is a quick and intelligent full-back who has already won Northern Ireland 'B' recognition.

Giant centre-back **KEVIN SCOTT** is a former Newcastle player who signed for Norwich for £250,000 in February 1997, having spent the previous two years at Tottenham. Strong in the air, and a threat at both ends of the pitch, Kevin spent almost the whole of last season suffering with a knee injury sustained in a pre-season tour of Hong Kong.

Former Stoke, Everton and Oldham midfielder **NEIL ADAMS** cost Norwich £250,000. He won a League Championship medal as well as England U21 recognition while at Goodison Park and made his City debut against Swindon in a 3-3 draw here at the County Ground in February 1994. Happiest playing wide on the right side of midfield, Neil is the Canaries' second highest scorer this term, with 12 League goals at the time of writing, having missed just one game all season.

PLAY ERPROFILE

SHAUN CAREY is another of Norwich's home grown stars, having moved up through the junior sides at the Club to make his senior debut against Torquay United in the Coca-Cola Cup in September 1995. A ball-playing midfielder who is equally happy tackling back and helping his defence, he is often used in the 'holding role' just in front of the back four by Mike Walker. A Republic of Ireland U21 international.

One of the most sought-after talents outside the Premiership this season has been 22-year-old attacking midfielder **ANDY JOHNSON**, who has already been the target of a couple of big money bids. A former England Youth international, Andy is an aggressive and skilful player who loves to push forward, although he is equally effective operating in central defence.

The experienced **MIKE MILLIGAN** moved to Carrow Road for a tribunal-set fee of £850,000 in June 1994 and made his debut in the rarefied atmosphere of an East Anglian 'derby' match against neighbours Ipswich. Originally a schoolboy with Man City, he moved across Lancashire to Oldham and played a major role in the Boundary Park Club's rise to prominence in the late 1980s. He then had a brief spell at Everton before returning for another successful spell with Oldham.

MATTHEW RUSH, 25, was former City boss Martin O'Neill's first signing for Norwich, when he moved from West Ham in a £300,000 deal in August 1995. Sadly the player suffered a serious knee injury in training two days later which ruled him out for the whole of last season. Able to play at full-back, in midfield or on the wing he has had a spell on loan at Northampton this season and is desperate to get his Carrow Road career off the ground.

Local lad **KARL SIMPSON**, from Newmarket, has yet to figure in the first-team this season, but is a highly-rated youngster of whom the Norwich coaching staff are expecting big things. He turned down the chance of a two-year YTS with the Club, preferring to stay in full-time education, while **ADRIAN FORBES** is another youngster who has recently signed a professional contract with the Club.

Yet another home grown star is 25-year-old **DARYL SUTCH**, who signed professional with the Canaries in July 1990. He had struggled to hold down a regular first-team place at Carrow Road before this season, but his tremendous pace and crossing ability have come to the fore in 1996/97. He has won England U21 caps.

Midfield playmaker IAN CROOK created a storm of controversy during the summer of 1996 when he left Norwich to sign for East Anglian neighbours Ipswich - only to turn his back on the Portman Road Club and return to Carrow Road in a matter of days. Having been offered a free transfer at the end of 1995/96, Crook transferred to Ipswich on the day that Mike Walker was reappointed City manager. But after hasty negotiations with his new boss the gifted Crook returned. A tremendous passer of the ball, this former Tottenham trainee joined Norwich for a bargain £80,000 in June 1986 and has won England 'B' recognition.

One of the most popular players ever to have worn the yellow shirt of Norwich, striker **ROBERT FLECK** is currently in his second spell with the Canaries, having rejoined them from Chelsea for £750,000 in September 1995. He began with Glasgow Rangers, where he won a Premier Division title and two Skol Cup winners' medals before joining Norwich for the first time in December 1987 for a then Club record fee of £580,000. He has won four Full caps for Scotland and is Norwich's third highest scorer of all time, with more than 80 senior strikes to his credit.

Norwich-born **DAMIAN HILTON** is a 19-yearold forward who has progressed through the ranks in the best traditions of Norwich City and has yet to make his senior debut for the Club.

Winger KEITH O'NEILL has enjoyed a meteoric rise to fame after starting last season with just one senior appearance to his name and finishing it as an established Republic of Ireland international. A real crowd pleaser with his skilful dribbling and powerful shooting, he has been the subject of envious glances - and big money bids - from several Premiership Clubs this season.

Former Swindon favourite **KEITH SCOTT** joined the Canaries from Stoke in November 1995 in a deal which saw Mike Sheron move in the opposite direction. Began with Lincoln City before drifting into non-League football with Wycombe Wanders, where he first hooked up with ex-Norwich boss Martin O'Neill. After helping Wanderers to two FA Trophy successes and the GMVC title he came to the County Ground, moving on to the Potteries twelve months later. He enjoyed a great start for Norwich, scoring twice in his first two games, but has struggled for a regular place ever since.

a brief look Dack

Dick Mattick looks back ...

Saturday December 6th 1958 - Matt Busby had just resigned as manager of Scotland on Doctor's orders and Swindon Boys had fought their way to the Divisional Final of the English Schools' Shield.

It was the second round of the FA Cup and a day which saw Tooting and Mitcham defeat Northampton 2-1 and Peterborough defeat Headington United 4-2 in a clash of the cream of non - leaguers.

Swindon faced a home match with Norwich City, one of the best supported teams in Division Three with gates averaging over 22,000.

Jim Kelly, recovered from a shin injury led the Swindon forwards while Nethercott in goal and Terry Allcock at inside right returned to the Norwich team.

Swindon had much the better of the first half and took the lead after 20 minutes. Bob Edwards stabbed a pass out to Willie Corbett whose centre was headed in by John Richards.

Jimmy Hill, picked out by R.C.E. as the best forward on the pitch, equalised for City after 38 minutes.

Errol Crossan rounded Town full-back Walter Bingley and cut in along the bye-line before pulling the ball back for Hill to score.

Swindon came close to restoring their lead just before the interval but Nethercott did well to keep out an Edwards pile-driver.


In the second half, Norwich gradually gained the ascendancy with big Barry Butler stamping out Swindon's attacks and Archie Macauley's team building some clever passing movements.

They might have snatched victory in the final minute when Allcock broke through but was unable to beat Sam Burton in the Swindon goal.

By the time the replay was staged, both sides new that a home tie rescued his side by diving at the feet of Edwards. Matt Crowe replaced him for a few minutes but soon after their keeper's return, the Canaries struck - Crossan scoring with a powerful drive which Burton could not get enough of a hand on to divert wide.

Swindon piled forward after this with Corbett and Morgan both testing the City keeper and big George Hudson coming forward to add his height to the attack.

> But it was to no avail as Norwich moved through to face United in Round Three. It was a chance they took with both hands, not only did they defeat them but also Cardiff, Tottenham and Sheffield United before their bid to become the first Third Division side at Wembley fell at the final hurdle of Luton Town.



with Manchester United was the reward for victory.

Kelly, who had appeared to tire in the first match was replaced by Maurice Owen. He played in a deep centre forward role, with the inside forwards pushed on in the fashion of the Hungarians.

A penalty appeal for Norwich was turned down when the ball struck Jack Fountain. Near the end of the half they again went close but Burton managed to snatch a fierce effort by Roy McCrohan from under the bar.

During the second half, Nethercott was forced to leave the field shortly after he had



This is one of the strangest Easter's I can remember. The holiday period that once had us playing three games in four days, on Good Friday and Easter Saturday and Monday, has been whittled down to the bare bones.

There are no Premiership fixtures at all this week-end due to international demands while the Nationwide Division One schedule has been split over two days with three games yesterday and the balance this afternoon.

Consequently this Easter might not have such a significant effect on Championship, promotion and relegation issues as it has in the past. But it is non-the-less still a very crucial time, particularly for our guests today, Norwich City, who slipped out of the play-off-zone last Saturday following their fourth home defeat - this one inflicted by **Bolton Wanderers.**

Bolton as it happens have got their feet up this weekend because of international calls on their players but then with a 19 point lead at the head of the table they shouldn't worry.

Wolverhampton Wanderers must be concerned as they and Barnsley battle it out for the second automatic promotion spot however, for their form remains erratic.

Barnsley were home to West Bromwich Albion yesterday, Wolves play hosts to struggling Grimsby Town this afternoon. Now on paper this looks no contest but such has been the home form of the Black Country team that not even their most ardent supporter will be filled with confidence.

A shock 1-0 defeat at Bradford City last week made it three successive defeats for Mark McGhee's men who hope to have Steve Froggatt back after hamstring problems.... The Mariners earned themselves a good point in a goalless draw with Tranmere, a big boost for manager Kenny Swain's survival fight.

Another game featuring promotion challengers against relegation fighters is at Selhurst Park where Crystal Palace take on Birmingham City. Palace eased themselves back into the play-off-zone with a 1-0 win at Oldham last Sunday but like Wolves have been inconsistent.

If Birmingham boss Trevor Francis gets the Blues by just looking at the league table, his depression will be even greater having lost skipper Steve Bruce, who is out for a month after sustaining a fractured eye socket.

Bryan Hughes, an £800,000 signing from Wrexham, made his debut in midfield in last week's 1-1 draw with Sheffield United at St Andrews. There is a cushion of 11 points between Birmingham and the drop it is true, but they can't allow things to slip. Palace are favourites but I fancy a draw.

Sheffield United will be anxious to get back to winning ways and maintain their position. They too have a new man on show, centre-back Carl

Tiler, whose £750,000 transfer from Aston Villa on Friday was just too late for him to make his debut at Birmingham.

Ex Town shooter Jan Aage Fjortoft had an off day but boss Howard Kendall still fancies his side's promotion chances. He said: " The importance of not losing at this stage of the season is paramount."

The Yorkshire side have not won away this year and with a derby at Huddersfield on Monday they really do need all three points against Reading this afternoon. To do so they will need to nullify the Royals' top shot Trevor Morley. The former West Ham marksman has 22 goals so far.

Another Hammer helping Reading is goalkeeper Steve Mautone, currently on loan from Upton Park, the 26-yearold Aussie is the 11th goalkeeper Reading have used in two seasons.

Oldham's desperate plight might be helped by their new striker Soren Anderson. The Dane is on trial at Boundary Park and has impressed with the Reserves and Neil Warnock could give him a go at Stoke today.

The Potters' star striker Mike Sheron was hoping to break his goal-scoring drought against his former club Manchester City but they lost 2-0. Sheron, formerly with Norwich City, last week linked with Everton, has not scored since January 18th.

Mike Newell made his Bradford City debut after answering an SOS from Chris Kamara and helped his side to a 2-1 victory over Wolves - it was Nigel Pepper who proved too hot for the visitors while another debutant, goalkeeper Aidan Davison was man of the match.

The youngsters slumped to their worst defeat of the season as they were punished for some horrendous defending.


For the first 44 minutes the lads worked hard in the Spring sunshine and looked confident until Alex Finlayson lost possession which resulted in Palace taking a half time lead.



To see these boys develop over the years makes me feel very proud so it is time for them to show us what they are made of.



Poor Glenn Hoddle. Our former manager is under fire again even before a ball is kicked in this evening's friendly international against Mexico at Wembley. The bullets this time fired by Graeme Souness over the selection of Matthew Le Tissier for the England Squad.

Souness claims Matt is not fit and needs to rest. Matt on the other hand declares he is fit and it doesn't take a degree in philosophy to interpret the body language of the player when interviewed on TV about his relegation to the Southampton bench. The hesitation in reply; the thoughtful uncontroversial response, tells us Matt is fed up with the way he is being

The thing is there is contradiction in Mr Souness's argument. On the one hand he is saying Le Tissier is not fit and has put on weight. On the other he says he should rest. Surely training and exercise is the remedy for an overweight, out of sorts, midfield player.

treated at the Dell.

This, however, is not the point, whether the Saints' idol is fit or not makes no difference, the fact is Glenn has made it clear that Matt Le Tissier is part of his World Cup plans and consequently he wants him involved as much as possible.

When Terry Venables included an unfit Paul Gascoigne in his squad to keep him in the spirit it was hailed as a master stroke. As it is injuries have deprived the England boss of so many of his regular players it is going to be difficult anyway for him to retain the outlines of a recognisable team tonight.

It must be remembered that there was no Seaman, Adams, Gascoigne, Shearer or Sheringham available for the Italy game six weeks ago. Adams and Sheringham have made this squad but Hoddle's genuine options still remain very limited.

The one surprise selection was that of Martin Keown, who played his part in England's European Finals in Sweden in 1992. With Gary Pallister uncertain of his fitness, the Arsenal man could win his 12th full cap, so well has he been performing for Arsenal since Arsene Wenger instilled more self belief into the 30-year-old, who now looks much more comfortable on the ball.

The inclusion of goalkeeper Nigel Martyn is well received too. The Leeds United custodian is probably the in-form goalkeeper in the Premiership at the moment and many thought he should have deputised for the injured Seaman and Flowers against Italy.

I doubt whether he will play against Mexico however for after the stick, much of it undeserved, Ian Walker received following that Italian victory, Hoddle might conclude he has to show faith in the Tottenham man by selecting him, for the first half anyway.

If he does make a change at the break it could be to give Liverpool giant David James his

first cap though given the strength we have in this position, James's

international debut could be delayed until the summer.

I think he will almost certainly use this game to give Robbie Fowler his chance up front but as to who will partner him is a lottery.

Sheringham is not fully over his ankle injury and lan Wright 33, will probably be involved at some time during the game.

This will be the seventh time we have played Mexico and the third meeting at Wembley where England won 8-0 in 1961 and 2-0 in the World Cup Finals of 1966 - Bobby Charlton scoring a hat-trick in the first and a thunderous winner in the second.

After missing Swindon's opening game of the season at Carrow Road through injury, defender lan Culverhouse is hoping he's selected this afternoon when his former club come to town.






A few months later, manager Mike Walker left the club and it was when John Deehan took charge




