
This summer has seen two of Alexandra's highly-rated midfield triumvirate move on to Premiership pastures new: Danny Murphy to Liverpool and Welsh international Robbie Savage to Leicester City.

The third player, club captain Gareth Whalley, looks unlikely to be far behind, having spent a large chunk of the pre-season on trial at Tottenham, and attracting envious glances from other corners of the top table.

The problem is nothing new for Gradi, who each year sees a string of his proteges leave Gresty Road to seek fame and fortune. From England stars like David Platt, Rob Jones and Geoff Thomas to Northern Ireland's Neil Lennon to current player coach John Pemberton who has recently returned to the club following spells with Crystal Palace, Sheffield United and Leeds United.

As a hotbed for producing top quality gems from the roughest of diamonds, there are few clubs around that can match Crewe, a fact borne out by Alexandra's historic 'deal' with Liverpool made towards the tail-end of last season.

In an Italian-style set-up Crewe and their Anfield compatriots have reached an understanding whereby the clubs will forge close links. The general feeling is that Liverpool will get first refusal when a player is to move on from Gresty Road.

Dario Gradithe manager

Arguably the most famous coach outside the top flight, and certainly one of the most respected, Dario Gradi has consistently worked miracles at Crewe.

In addition to his widely-recognised abilities as a coach there is the small matter of both his, and the club's loyalty. Gradi was appointed manager at Gresty Road in the summer of 1983 and, despite little in the way of material success before last season's promotion, he has recently signed a new contract designed to keep him at the club until the year 2006.

It's a salutary lesson in patience. The famous saying could be altered to read: 'if at first you don't succeed, stick to your principles and keep playing good football. The results will come'.

Gradi's playing career peaked with Sutton United, where he gained England honours at amateur level before joining the coaching staff at Chelsea. He later moved to Derby County but his first managerial appointment was at Wimbledon, whom he took to promotion from the old Division

Three in 1978/79, his first season in charge. When Dons chairman Ron Noades

took over at Crystal Palace he quickly appointed the promising Gradi as the Eagles' new manager. But it was a turbulent time for the south London club, and after Palace were relegated in 1981 Gradi lost his job.


He had a spell with Leyton Orient before moving north to Gresty Road... and the rest, as they say, is history.

5 YEARS AGO

Five Years Ago the opening day of the season saw Glenn Hoddle score his first goal for Swindon with a left foot shot from thirty yards.

It was enough to give the Town a 1-0 victory over Sunderland in front of a crowd of 11,094. Town paraded their new signing Craig Maskell who they had bought from Reading for £250,000 during the close season. Hignett and Clarkson

10 YEARS AGO

Ten Years Ago Swindon returned to the old Second Division after an absence of 13 years.

Swindon went down 2-0 in a carnival atmosphere after comedian Jimmy Cricket had opened the new stand at Valley Parade Bradford. It had been built to replace the one destroyed in the fire which saw over fifty people lose their lives, Swindon fail to score but former Robins; Ray KcHale (Scarborough), Gary Nelson (Brighton), Jimmy Gilligan (Cardiff City) and Dave Cole (Torquay) all get on the score sheet. On loan Alan Mcloughlin goes one better and gets two for Torquay. A second half goal by David Platt earns Dario Gradi's men a point against Bolton at Burnden Park in a Fourth Division clash. The following February, Platt is sold to Aston Villa for £200,000, a record fee for the Railwaymen.

15 YEARS AGO

Tuesday


August 5th. Our sights were now firmly set on the big one -Saturday's first Division Fixture at home to Crewe.

August 6th. As this programme went to print we were focusing all our attentions on the Crewe game with just one thing on our minds - three points come 4.45pm this afternoon.










MATCH REPORT

A goal early in the second half by Southampton's ace marksman Egil Ostenstad was all that separated the two sides last Saturday.

Ostenstad raced clear to slot the ball past Frank Talia five minutes after the re-start to leave Swindon on the end of their first pre-season defeat.

Trialist Philip Cuervo caught the eye with a fine display and was unfortunate not to get on the scoresheet as three times he was denied by goal-line clearances.



Because of the popularity of our courses, in the future you need to return your application forms as soon as possible to avoid disappointment.



The lads were devastated to learn that had they won they would have faced Man Utd in the last eight.


This tournament was a great eye opener for the lads who will learn from the experience.







Women's football is being reorganised over the next few years so it was essential that the Town retained their First Division status in the Southern Region League.

This season the division has been renamed the Premier Division.

At present there is a National Premier League (Arsenal and Doncaster Belles play in that League) and a Division One North and a Division One South. The rest of the country is split into ten Regional Leagues. The Town play in the Southern Region League which stretches from Bedfordshire and Buckinghamshire, the edge of London and down to the south coast. The winners of the Southern Regional League go into a play off competition with the other Regional winners in *the Southern half of the country and the winners then go into the National League Division One South. The same thing happens in the North of England. Last season Reading Royals, who won our League, were beaten in the play offs by the South West Region Champions, Barry Town in the Southern Play Offs. This season the Regional League Premier Division was increased to twelve teams but since the Annual General Meeting of the League, Newbury have withdrawn reducing the Division to eleven clubs. The old Division Two has now become Division One and

the other three Divisions have been merged and new area Divisions formed; Northern, Central and Southern. Next season four new combination Leagues will be created. One in the North, one in the Midlands and one each in the South East and South West. The top six Southern Region Premier Division teams will merger with the top six south West Region League teams to form the new Combination League - South West. This season it will be important that the Town do well so that they can be part of this new Combination League. The Regional Leagues will continue as they are at present but with promotion into the Combination League. Entry into the National League will be through the new Combination League.

It is hoped ultimately, to set up County Leagues to feed into the Wiltshire League, the Town and Swindon Spitfires who play in the Premier Division, Salisbury City, who play in the Southern Section League and Salisbury

Girls who play in the Dorset League but with the rapid growth of girls football there will soon be a need for these additional competitions.

Months of wheeling a dealing paid off earlier in the week when Town boss Steve McMahon finally got a long term transfer target - former Celtic striker Chris Hay.

The 22 year old forward was prized away from the Scottish Premier giants for £330,000 as he signed a three year deal at the County Ground and Swindon manager Steve McMahon reckons he's got a bargain.

And Chris is determined to repay the faith the Gaffer has shown in him by hitting the net at regular intervals this season.

"I've been really impressed with the place since I came down from Scotland and I've been really impressed with Steve McMahon as well and I just can't wait to get into the action." he commented.

And Chris already had some inside information on the Club he was about to join even before he came down for talks.

"I knew a little from a team mate of mine, Stuart Kerr the goalkeeper who was down here on loan a few seasons ago, so he told me a lot about the place. Obviously it was all good so I had no doubts about signing."

Although Celtic were reluctant to let their young starlet go, Chris was adamant he wanted to leave as he felt he had not been given a fair chance in the first team.

He didn't want to go anywhere else in the Scottish league and so turned his attentions towards a taste of English First Division football.

"I was flattered when I heard

that Steve McMahon was keen to sign me and I feel that Swindon is an ideal place for my career to really get going properly."

Chris has been at Celtic since he was 18 and worked his way up through the Youth team and Reserves before breaking into the first team which was a big boost for the striker.

"I think I made about 30 appearances altogether for the Celtic first team, mind you about 20 of them were as a substitute."

Last season Chris had an immaculate record of four goals in four games but still didn't feel happy with the amount of first team matches he was getting.

So after lengthy negotiations he was finally allowed to sign for Swindon and his aims are simple.

"I want to play in the first team all the time and score as many goals as possible."

Chris feels one of his main qualities is his pace and ability to get away from defenders, a sentiment echoed by Steve McMahon who is confident the young Scot will give the other First Division defenses a torrid time.

After packing his cases and travelling down from Scotland Chris is looking forward to making his debut for Swindon and showing the County Ground faithful what he is capable of and he had no doubts about up rooting and coming south of the border.

" It's going to be a wrench leaving my family but my girlfriend is moving down with me so that should help me to settle in quickly." he said.




