On the subject of James Scowcroft, I'd just like to take this opportunity to congratulate him, and our other two members of the England Under-21 squad, on his call-up for next week's international against Moldova.

Monday 18th August The treatment room at Portman Road is full to bursting, with five first-teamers having treatment: Mathie, Stockwell, Petta, Gregory and Naylor. Meanwhile George Burley flies to Helsinki to watch Finland U21s play Norway. The Youth team put up a brave fight, but lose out 1-0 to a last minute goal v Luton in the

Southern Junior Floodlit Cup. Tuesday 19th August Mathie and Stockwell train, having shaken off their injuries. Alex is due for a

Reserve run-out v Wimbledon tomorrow. First year pro Mark Burgess turns 19.

Wednesday 20th August

The Club deny rumours in the press that Fulham are about to sign Neil Gregory. The Reserves lose 3-0 to Wimbledon but worse is the news that Alex Mathie has aggravated his groin strain. George Burley returns from Finland with "nothing concrete" to report. Defender Wayne Brown celebrates his 20th birthday.

Thursday 21st August More injury worries, as it is revealed that Paul Mason has broken his hand and must have an operation to place a

pin in it. He will be out for at least a month. Town sign Mark Stein on a two-month loan from Chelsea to provide cover up front - he will go straight into the side for Saturday's match at Bradford. New signing David Kerslake is also in the squad for the first time.

Friday 22nd August After morning training the players begin the long haul up to Yorkshire at lunchtime for tomorrow's game.

Saturday 23rd August Town taste their first defeat since March, losing 2-1 at the hands of Bradford City, although one consolation is that Kieron Dyer scores his first senior goal for the Club. In the South East Counties League the Youth team hold a powerful Portsmouth side to a 0-0 draw. Simon Milton, in his testimonial year, is sub on his 34th birthday. Tuesday 26th August Charlton visit Portman Road in the Coca-Cola Cup, and go home on the end of a 3-1 beating, with Mark Stein marking his home debut with a goal. James Scowcroft and a Steve Brown own goal complete the scoring.

Wednesday 27th August The Reserves play their first away fixture of the season, and battle out a 0-0 draw at Watford. Thursday 28th August Gus Uhlenbeek, out for at least three months following his foot operation, celebrates his 27th birthday Friday 29th August James Scowcroft, Richard Wright and Kieron Dyer are named in the England U21 squad to face Moldova. Saturday 30th August Mark Stein scores again as Town draw 1-1 with West Brom.

Matt Holland was on the brink of losing his job as a professional footballer with Bournemouth last season, now he is set to play a leading role in helping The Blues back to the Premiership. The Matchday Programme caught up with our new £800,000 arrival to ask him...

MP: HOW ARE YOU SETTLING IN AT IPSWICH TOWN, MATT?

Matt: Fine, the lads have made me very welcome and I'm really enjoying it. I know the area quite well, my mum lives in Bishop's Stortford, and I'll be moving in to a new house in Colchester within the next few weeks. So that all helps the settling-in process as well.

TELL US HOW YOUR TRANSFER CAME ABOUT?

Well, I'd read speculation in the local press in Bournemouth that I might be moving on. I was injured

during the pre-season but George Burley came down to watch Bournemouth play QPR and had a chat with me after the game. He basically sold the Club to me there and then. I didn't need to come to Portman Road and have a look around. George did such a good job telling me about the Club that what he said persuaded me that Ipswich was the Club for me. After I had agreed to the move, it was about 10 days before things got sorted out and I was getting a little bit anxious. I wasn't sure whether I'd be at Bournemouth or Ipswich for the start of the season.

DID THE £800,000 TRANSFER FEE SURPRISE YOU?

Yeah, it was a bit of a shock but I've taken it as a big compliment that Ipswich are prepared to pay that sort of money for me. As a player you never know how much you are worth on the transfer market, now it's up to me to prove to both the manager and the fans here at Ipswich that it was money well spent.

TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOUR FOOTBALLING BACKGROUND

I started as an apprentice at West Ham and I was there for three seasons. The manager, Harry Redknapp, offered me another year's contract after that period finished but I wanted first-team football. He told me that there were a few players in front of me at the time so I decided to move on. Bournemouth and Peterborough came in for me. There seems to be a good relationship between West Ham and Bournemouth, Harry was there as manager as well, so I decided to head for the South Coast. I'd been on loan there already and enjoyed it so I felt that was the right move for me at that stage in my career.

IT MUST HAVE BEEN A VERY DIFFICULT TIME FOR YOU AT BOURNEMOUTH LAST SEASON, WHAT WITH ALL THE CLUB'S HIGH PROFILE FINANCIAL PROBLEMS?

It was a bit of a nightmare some days. The Club was in a financial mess, basically, and the receivers were called in to find out what was going on. It looked pretty grim at one stage. We were getting paid but often it was three or four weeks late and I'm sure there were other people at the Club who were also in a similar, if not worse, situation. I can remember turning up on the Friday before a match against Bristol City and the receivers were in. We were asked if we actually wanted to play the match. That's how bad it was -

that's how close it came to the Club being wound up. We knew that our jobs were on the line and that at any moment the Club could go under. If we hadn't played that game against City, that could have been the beginning of the end. But as professionals we wanted to carry on.

AS BOURNEMOUTH SKIPPER, AND THE CLUB'S PFA REPRESENTATIVE, HOW INVOLVED IN THE PROBLEMS DID YOU GET?

Being both captain and the rep for the Professional Footballers' Association, I became a kind of official spokesman for the players. I would get involved in meetings with the other players and staff at the club and also attend get-togethers with the fans as well. On one occasion, I had to make a speech at the Winter Gardens in the centre of the town, with 3,000 fans there desperate to find out what was going on at their club. It was the most nerve-wracking thing

I've ever done. I was absolutely petrified! Give me playing in front of 30,000 screaming fans at a football match anytime, I can handle that!

FOUND THE STEP UP IN STANDARD FROM THE THIRD DIVISION TO THE FIRST?

On the pitch, the players in the First Division think much quicker and the

game is also played a bit faster. There are bigger crowds and the opposition are much better.
Generally, they are a class apart.
Ipswich is a better set-up
altogether. The Club has a more
professional outlook and I've been
very impressed with just about
everything I have seen at the Club.




SHORT-TERM AMBITIONS AT TOWN?

Basically to win a regular first-team place. There are a number of good players at this Club and anyone who gets in the first-team knows they have to play well every week to keep their place. I'm generally playing at sweeper at the moment but midfield is probably my favourite position. But as I've said, the standard here is very high and I'm happy to settle for a place in any position in the first-team.

WHAT ABOUT TOWN'S PROMOTION CHANCES THIS SEASON?

I reckon there are about eight teams in with a realistic shout of going up and we are definitely one of them after coming so close last year. We've had a mixed start to the season and it was a shame the wins over Charlton were in the Coca-Cola Cup and not in the League. But the confidence amongst the lads is good and I'm sure we will be in the promotion chasing pack at the end of the season.

Away With The Blues

Throughout the season we will be receiving input from our roving reporters on Ipswich's away games - not just the match itself, but the whole 'Blues Away' experience.

Our first report comes from Wendy Parish and Terry Lewis, who ventured into The Valley...

Dateline: 13th August 1997
Fixture: Charlton Ath
Competition: Coca-Cola Cup
Round trip: 160 miles

"We travelled on the Clacton Branch coach, which we boarded at Witham and enjoyed a smooth journey with no hold ups.

While it was great - indeed amazing - that we encountered no queues on the way, it did mean that we reached the ground at

5.oopm. Only two and three guarter hours to kick-off then!

Never mind...perhaps we could kill some time looking round the Club Shop.

No such luck! The 'Club Shop' turned out, because of building work at the ground, to be a Portakabin in the North Stand car park...and you had to have a ticket for the North Stand to get in there. Usefully, we were told that on a non-match day we could go straight in with no problems. It's a good job we bought our souvenir badges last season!

The coach parked on the main road about ten minutes walk from the ground: however, we had to cross the busy main road - so let's make that 15 minutes from the ground. On the way home, though, it picked us up right outside and we were given a police escort away from the area. Charlton is midway between Woolwich and Greenwich and is a typical London suburb.

For refreshment there was a pub on the way to the ground and quite close to the stadium there was a fish and chip shop, which had a VERY long queue outside - either the fare was good or they were offering free admission to the game! Aren't Charlton known as 'The Addicks'? That explains it then..."Addick and chips twice, please!"

Inside the ground the away supporters were well catered for, with stalls selling hot and cold drinks and hot snacks, but they were expensive. A nice touch was that Charlton gave out details of the location of those stands over the tannoy. The toilets were good, clean and very acceptable and they even had more than two ladies loos!

The Stewards, who appeared to be provided by a company other than the club itself, were fairly efficient and some were quite helpful. There was no evidence of any Official Supporters' Club buildings or social club, but this could be as a consequence of the building work.

A specially reduced issue of "Valley Review" was available, with a price of £1.00. It proved to be a good read, with reasonable coverage of Ipswich and didn't have too many adverts.

The price reductions which both clubs had agreed to instigate meant that it was a relatively cheap trip and the view of the game was very good wherever you chose to sit."







60 years of League football at Ipswich Town

HISTOLY in the making

Football historian Leigh Edwards picks out the headline stories from this month over the 60 years of League football at Portman Road.

1946 - Canaries Caned

Albert Day's hat-trick and two goals by Tommy Parker gave the following Ipswich Town team a thrilling 5-0 Third Division (South) win over Norwich City in the first post-war League 'derby' clash watched by 20,120 at Portman Road on 7th September 1946: Mick Burns, George Rumbold, Ossie Parry, Dave Bell, Matt O'Mahony, George Perrett, Jack Connor, Harry Baird, Albert Day, Tommy Parker, Jack Roy. It remained Ipswich's biggest League victory over their East Anglian rivals until equalled in February 1977, and Scott Duncan's team completed the 'double' over Norwich with a 1-0 win at Carrow Road four months later. Both Albert Day and Tommy Parker were making their League debut, with the latter going on to play a then record 428 League games for Ipswich before a recurring backinjury ended his career.

1954 - Reed is First International

Three weeks after scoring in Ipswich Town's 6-1 Second Division trouncing of Middlesbrough, outside-right Billy Reed became the club's first international when

he made his debut for Wales as the following team lost 3-1 to Yugoslavia at Ninian Park on 22nd September 1954: Jack Kelsey, Walley Barnes, Alf Sherwood, Roy Paul, John Charles, Dave Bowen, Billy Reed, Derek Tapscott, Trevor Ford, Ivor Allchurch, Roy Clarke. Retaining his place as Wales lost 1-o to Scotland a month later, Reed had joined Ipswich from Brighton for £1,750 in July 1953 and starred in the 1953/54 and 1956/57 Third Division (South) title successes. He netted 43 goals in 155 League games for Ipswich prior to joining Swansea Town for £3,000 in February 1958.

1962 - Record Euro Triumph

A week after League Champions
Ipswich Town celebrated their
debut in European competition
with a 4-1 European Cup
preliminary round first-leg win over
Floriana in Malta, goals by Ray
Crawford (5), Doug Moran (2), Ted
Phillips (2) and John Elsworthy
gave the following team a record
10-0 second leg victory over the
Maltese Champions in front of
25,287 at Portman Road on 25th
September 1962: Roy Bailey, Ken

Malcolm, John Compton, Bill Baxter, John Laural, John Elsworthy, Roy Stephenson, Doug Moran, Ray Crawford, Ted Phillips, Bobby Blackwood. England centre-forward Crawford's five goal haul remained a post-war club record until equalled by Alan Brazil in February 1982, while inside-left Phillips subsequently had a spell as Floriana's player-coach.

1967 - Wigg's Debut Double

Teenage striker Ron Wigg scored twice on his League debut as the following Ipswich Town team gained a 3-1 Second Division win over Carlisle United watched by 14,183 at Portman Road on 30th September 1967: Ken Hancock, Tommy Carroll, Billy Houghton, Colin Viljoen, Bill Baxter, Mick McNeil, Charlie Woods, Danny Hegan, Ron Wigg, Eddie Spearritt. A former Orient apprentice, Wigg had signed professional for Ipswich five months earlier and was destined to repeat his two goal feat at home to Birmingham City in January 1968, helping Ipswich to win the Second Division title in 1967/68 and netting 14 goals in 37 League games before joining Watford with Charlie Woods in June 1970.

1971 - Irish International signed

Ipswich Town manager Bobby Robson signed Blackburn Rovers'

Northern Ireland international central defender Allan Hunter for £60,000 plus Bobby Bell in September 1971. Starting with his goalkeeping brother Vic at Coleraine, 'Big Al' had joined Oldham Athletic for £5,000 in January 1967 and moved to Blackburn for £30,000 in June 1969 where he was ever-present in 1970/71. Unable to prevent Ipswich's 2-1 First Division defeat at home to Leicester City on his debut, he subsequently formed an outstanding defensive partnership with Kevin Beattie as Ipswich mounted successive title challenges and won the FA Cup in 1978. Capped 47 times while at Portman Road, he scored eight goals in 280 First Division outings before joining Colchester United as player-manager in April 1982.

1979 - Geddis sold to Villa

Ipswich Town's England 'B' international striker David Geddis moved to First Division rivals Aston Villa for £300,000 in September 1979. He had scored in Ipswich's second FA Youth Cup Final triumph in three years shortly before signing professional from apprentice under Bobby Robson in August 1975. Making his League debut in February 1977, while on loan to Luton Town, he set up Ipswich's FA Cup-winning goal at Wembley in 1978 and netted five times in 43 First Division outings before his move to Villa Park. He was destined to help Villa pip

Ipswich to the League Championship in 1980/81 and was a member of their European Cup-winning squad the following season, later reuniting with Ron Saunders at Birmingham City.

1982 - County hit for Six

Bottom of the table Ipswich Town gained their first League win of the 1982/83 campaign as goals by Paul Mariner (2), Alan Brazil, John Wark, Frans Thijssen and Steve McCall gave the following team a thrilling 6-o First Division victory at Notts County on 25th September 1982: Laurie Sivell, George Burley, Mick Mills, Frans Thijssen, Russell Osman, Terry Butcher, John Wark, Steve McCall, Paul Mariner, Alan Brazil, Eric Gates. It remains Ipswich's biggest away win in the League and the First Division programme that day produced 50 goals with Watford registering an amazing 8-o victory over Sunderland. The Ipswich revival continued as they defeated leaders Liverpool 1-0 at Portman Road in their next match a week later.

1988 - Milton tames Shrews

Simon Milton's first League hat-trick plus goals from Jason Dozzell and Frank Yallop gave the following Ipswich Town team an emphatic 5-1 Second Division win at Shrewsbury Town on 20th September 1988: Craig Forrest, Frank Yallop, David Hill, Mick Stockwell, Tony Humes, David Linighan, David Lowe, Jason

Dozzell, Simon Milton, Dalian Atkinson, John Wark. Popular midfielder Milton had joined Ipswich from Bury Town for £5,000 in July 1987 after impressing in the Eastern Counties League and spent Ioan spells at Exeter City and Torquay United during the 1987/88 campaign. Rejecting a chance to join rivals Norwich City in the summer of 1989, he was destined to be an influential figure in Ipswich's 1991/92 Second Division title success and was voted 'Player of the Year' in 1995/96.

1993 - Slater follows Lyall

Former England U21 and 'B' international midfielder Stuart Slater was reunited with John Lyall at Portman Road after Ipswich Town paid £750,000 to Celtic for him in 1993. An ex-West Ham apprentice, Slater had signed professional under John Lyall in March 1987 and starred in the Hammers' 1990/91 promotion triumph and FA Cup run. Following Liam Brady to Celtic for a record £1.5 million in August 1992, he played alongside Tony Mowbray as they defeated Cologne in that season's UEFA Cup. He netted four goals in 72 League outings for Ipswich, an experienced figure as Town tried to regain Premiership status at the first attempt in 1995/96. But persistent injury problems led to his release at the start of the 1996/97 campaign and he followed a trial spell at Leicester with a permanent move to Watford.
