



Recent weeks have certainly proved to be busy for me after the Chairman asked me to act in a caretaker role until such time as a new appointment as Manager is made. So far I have been in charge for two games and it does not matter whether I have two or twenty two more games to do, I consider it to have been a great honour to have been asked by the Chairman to run things in the interim period. Make no mistake about it, like most players nearing the end of their career, I would certainly relish the opportunity of being able to take the Manager's job on a permanent basis. But at the present time I am taking every day as it comes.

After the initial shock of Chris Kamara's departure almost three weeks ago, the players were naturally somewhat taken aback but in true professional style they knew that they had to get on with things and show nothing but one hundred per cent commitment at Stockport.

Commitment is what I asked for and commitment is what I got. We were down to just thirteen senior players for the game. I changed the system

and thanks to the effort put in by the players it worked. You can try out as many systems as you like but if the players don't perform they mean nothing. I thought that we would get the best out of Peter Beagrie by playing him in a free role and I also decided to play with a sweeper.

I felt proud and privileged to be in charge of the team at Stockport. It was probably the best day of my career and to be fair I felt no pressure at all.

Last week we found ourselves playing in front of the SKY cameras against a team who had received a 7-0 thrashing the week before. We went 1-0 up early on and we were in complete control until Stoke equalised with the penalty and their second goal right on the stroke of half-time gave them a lift. Our lads kept battling on in the second half and had opportunities to score through Edinho and Shaun Murray.

Again I had 100 per cent effort from the players and could not have asked for any more. I wasn't surprised at how well Stoke did having seen them unlucky to lose in their FA Cup game at West Brom earlier in the week.

Swindon are here this afternoon on the end of a few bad results so we will have to be careful to again show nothing but commitment and not be caught on the end of another backlash.

Finally many thanks to all the supporters and back room staff here at Valley Parade who have given me so much help and encouragement over the last few weeks.

Enjoy the game.

After what seems to have been an eternity having gone a month without a home game, we now have two in quick succession with Reading here on Tuesday following today's visit by Swindon Town. Coincidentally both teams met at the County Ground last week.

One good thing about the long lay-off between these games is that we have not had to worry about the appalling weather we have been experiencing of late. The pitch has certainly taken a battering from the rain.

The excellent behaviour and loyalty shown by our travelling fans has again be borne out by reports received from Clubs we have played at since Christmas. We took 1826 fans to Sunderland's Stadium of Light where a new Nationwide Football League attendance of 40,055 was created. We were restricted to an allocation of just 1826 and could have sold three times as many but those who were lucky enough to get a ticket made so much vocal support and in Sunderland's words were 'exemplary'. At Maine Road, Manchester City have said "to describe the visiting supporters in one word - Excellent!'.

The Football Trust in conjunction with McDonald's Restaurants Ltd has published the results of a national survey of facilities for supporters with disabilities at FA Premier League, Football League and Scottish Premier Division stadiums.

The research scheme was launched in February last year with the aim of highlighting those clubs who have provided the highest standards of facilities for their disabled supporters. The report assesses the nature and extend of facilities and highlights examples of good practice at professional clubs.

In conjunction with the survey the Football Trust has launched their 'National Guide to Disabled Football Supporters Facilities', a pocket size club-by-club guide to facilities.





Welcome to Swindon Town. Firstly I would like to publicly thank Swindon Town for agreeing so readily to the change of date for today's fixture. We were of course due to play each other on Tuesday 3rd March, 1998, but in view of both Clubs being knocked out of the F.A. Cup it seemed to make so much more sense to play today.

The last few weeks have been, for me, the most difficult that I have ever experienced in my 10 years as a Football League Chairman. I cannot find words to express my thanks for the countless letters, telephone calls and faxes that I have received, particularly during the last 10 days or so, in support of the decision taken to sack Chris Kamara.

Without wishing to go over old ground, the decision was taken solely for football reasons. The Board felt (and still does) that Chris Kamara had taken the Club as far as he was able and that if we are to progress from here it has to be under another Manager.

David Mellor's extraordinary intervention into the debate has cast a huge slur on the Club and its supporters. The Supporters Club have responded magnificently and their action today in distributing red cards to the supporters as a way of sending a message to Mr. Mellor is to be applauded.

I would like to make the point that

the BBC have acted impeccably throughout this dispute and at all times have tried to defuse the situation which has arisen. Whilst I do not believe that Mr. Mellor is the voice of football, I freely acknowledge that the BBC have the absolute right to let Mr. Mellor host the programme (although I do not believe that he truly speaks for football supporters throughout the country).

The next 7 days will hopefully see the appointment of a new Manager. The Board conducted interviews on Thursday for the shortlist.

These notes are written prior to the interviews so frankly I do not know how the interviews went at this moment in time.

On Tuesday we play Reading and I look forward to seeing you then.


Thanks to the Government and to the Football Association, the FA Premier League and the English Sports Council, a major new funding package to secure the future of the Trust has been put in place.



The Man In Charge

STEVE McMAHON



Born: Liverpool 20/08/61

Was appointed Manager at the County Ground following the departure of current England Number 2, John Gorman in November 1994 and following relegation led Swindon Town straight to the Division 2 Championship, making 21 appearances himself along the way. This he rates as the highlight of his career so far despite picking up almost all of the honours available for both Club and Country as a

He began his career at Everton making 100 League appearances at Goodison before a £175,000 move to join Aston Villa in May 1983.

Kenny Dalglish then took him to Liverpool for £375,000 where he emerged as a midfield general of the highest quality, bagging League and F.A. Cup winners medals during the glory years at Anfield.

He also achieved International recognition with 17 Full England caps and was a member of the 1990 World Cup squad in Italy.

In December 1991, Manchester City paid £900,000 to take him to Maine Road where he continued to perform at the highest level until taking over at Swindon Town.

Last season saw Steve McMahon's team struggle back in Division 1 but this season they have maintained a challenge for the Play-Off positions however three weeks ago they endured a shock exit from the F.A. Cup in a 2-1 home defeat by Stevenage Borough from the G.M. Vauxhall Conference followed by a 2-0 defeat at lowly Crewe Alexandra in front of the SKY Television cameras, and last Saturday a 2-0 home defeat to local rivals Reading.

GOALKEEPERS

FRASER DIGBY

Swindon Town's longest serving player by far, Fraser completed his tenth season at the County Ground last year which culminated in him being voted Player-of-the Year and having a Testimonial Match against Manchester United, the Club where he served his apprenticeship. After an initial period on loan at Swindon, Fraser was transferred from Old Trafford in a £32,500 deal in September 1986. The former England U21International in fact returned to United on loan in 1992/93. He was displaced by Australian Frank Talia for a period last season but won back his place, which apart from injuries he has retained since. Born: Sheffield 23/04/67

FRANK TALIA

Frank was spotted playing for the Australian U21 team and following trials with several British clubs, eventually signed for Blackburn Rovers in August 1992. He failed to make any First Team appearances while at Ewood Park and was brought in on loan at the County Ground before eventually signing in November 1995 for a fee of £150,000. He was first choice keeper for a spell last season but lost his place following the home defeat by West Bromwich Albion. Frank has recently signed a new three year contract with the Robins.

Born: Melbourne, Australia, 20/07/72

STEVE MILDENHALL

One of Swindon Town's home grown talents, Steve is a giant of a custodian standing at 6'5". Now in his second year as a professional at the County Ground, he was called upon to come on as an outfield substitute in the game at Tranmere Rovers last season, even though Manager Steve McMahon was himself on the bench! He made his full League debut in October 1997 in the 1-0 victory over Portsmouth at Fratton Park coming in at the last moment following injuries to Digby and Talia. Steve put on a brilliant display which was witnessed by the SKY cameras, saving everything Pompey shot at him. He too picked up a painful injury for his troubles!

Born: Swindon 13/05/78

DEFENDERS

BRIAN BORROWS

Spent 12 seasons with Coventry City, making in excess of 400 League appearances for the Sky Blues. Brian started off with Everton as an apprentice and made 27 appearances for the Goodison club before a £10,000 move to join Bolton Wanderers in March 1983. Two years later he was on the move again for the start of his lengthy period with Coventry. He had a successful two month spell on loan at Swindon earlier this season before the move was made permanent in November. Brian is

comfortable anywhere along the back line but is particularly effective as sweeper. Born: Liverpool 20/12/60

IAN CULVERHOUSE

lan began his footballing career with Tottenham Hotspur as a trainee and having made just one senior appearance at White Hart Lane was transferred to Norwich City for a fee of £50,000 in October 1985. He spent nine successful seasons at Carrow Road and was a member of the Norwich City side who hit the footballing headlines with their tremendous UEFA Cup win at Bayern Munich, A Football League Tribunal set a fee of £250,000 when he was transferred to Swindon Town in December 1994 and having been an ever present in the Robin's Division 2 Championship season, did not enjoy such a commanding year last season in their return to Division 1 with injuries and suspension disrupting his progress. Born: Bishops Stortford 22/09/64

JASON DRYSDALE

Jason is a former Newcastle United player who joined Swindon Town in March 1995 for a fee of £340,000. He began his career at Watford where he won an F A Youth Cup winners medal before moving to join the Magpies for £425,000 in August 1994. Last season was a disappointing one for Jason who was out through injury having been injured in a Coca-Cola Cup tie at Wolverhampton Wanderers. Born: Bristol 17/11/70

GARY ELKINS

Gary, a left sided defender made over 100 appearances for Wimbledon in the F A Carling Premiership before his £100,000 move to Swindon Town in September 1996. He was with Fulham as a youngster and had a spell on loan at Exeter City, joining the Dons for £20,000 in August 1990 where he gained a reputation as a tough tackling full back.

Born: Wallingford 04/05/66

ALAN McDONALD

A Northern Ireland International, having made 53 appearances for his country, Alan joined Queens Park Rangers as an apprentice in March 1981 and in his 17 seasons at Loftus Road made in excess of 500 appearances, scoring seventeen goals for the West London club before his move to Swindon Town last summer in a two year deal.

Born: Belfast 12/10/63

MARK ROBINSON

Mark was Swindon Town's most consistent performer last season missing only four of the Robin's 52 match programme. His only goal of the campaign came in August with a free-kick which secured an equaliser in the 1-1 draw with Port Vale. He started off at West Bromwich Albion as an apprentice before joining Barnsley on a free transfer in June 1987. Such was his form at Oakwell, Newcastle United secured his services for

£450,000 in March 1993 but having lost his place at St. James' Park though injury Swindon Town paid a then Club record fee of £600,000 for him in July 1994. 29 years old last November, Mark can play at full-back, central defence and has also been a successful sweeper.

Born: Rochdale 21/11/68

MARK SEAGRAVES

Last season was an in and out one for the Swindon central defender, Following the departure of Shaun Taylor, his twin centre back to Bristol City, he formed a useful partnership with Ian Culverhouse but suffered an injury which kept him out of the side. However following a traumatic away 7-0 away defeat at Champions elect Bolton Wanderers and another defensive debacle at Oldham Athletic on Easter Monday, Mark was rested for the remainder of the season. A former Liverpool apprentice and England Youth International, Mark made his League debut while on loan at Norwich City before signing for Manchester City in September 1987. Bolton paid £100,000 for him three years later and he went on to make 150 appearances for the Trotters before joining Swindon for £100,000 in June 1995. Born: Bootle 22/10/66

CRAIG TAYLOR

24 years old today, Craig is the younger brother of former Swindon Town favourite Shaun - now at Bristol City. Craig signed a three year contract at the County Ground in April 1997 after having impressed during a trial period. Swindon paid non-League Dorchester Town £25,000 and despite a preseason injury set-back he made a dream debut against Port Vale in October, scoring a wonder goal from 35 yards out. Strong in the air and determined when it comes to tackling, Craig has certainly carried on where brother Shaun left off.

MIDFIELDERS


DARREN BULLOCK

A late developer in the game, Darren was drafted into full-time football in November 1993 following a £55,000 step-up from non-League Nuneaton Borough when he joined Huddersfield Town. A tough tackling midfielder, Darren made 127 League appearances for our near neighbours but following a series of events off the field, the then Terriers Manager Brian Horton sold him to Swindon in a cut price deal in February 1997 and he went on to score in his debut for the Robins against Birmingham City later that month.

Born: Worcester 12/02/69

LEE COLLINS

Young Scottish midfielder joined Albion Rovers from Pollock in November 1993 and made 43 Scottish League appearances before he was snapped up by Swindon Town for £15,000 in November 1995. Lee made three appearances for Town last season deputising for Kevin Watson but he missed a great deal of the campaign through injury. It looks as though another enforced lay-off is looming after Lee collected his ninth caution of the season in the defeat at Crewe a fortnight ago.



Born: Bellshill 03/02/74

PHILIPPE CUERVO

This gifted Frenchman impressed during a trial period at the County Ground and was quickly signed from Sochaux on a free transfer on a three year deal just before the start of this season. He was a revelation during the first two months of the season but then spent several months out with a hip problem.

Born: Ris-Orangis, France 13/08/69

TY GOODEN

Signed on a free transfer by former boss John Gorman from Wycombe Wanderers in September 1993, Ty had a mixed campaign last season playing in a variety of positions and being hampered by injury. His first appearance was in November when he displaced Gary Elkins and it was from this position that he scored his only goal of the season. However this season fortunes have changed and having regained full fitness he has been an ever present playing as either a wing-back or attacking midfielder. Born: Canvey Island 23/10/72

SCOTT LEITCH

Following a successful loan period from Heart of Midlothian at the end of the 1995/96 season, Scott signed a two year contract with the Robins in July 1996 being transferred for a bargain fee of £15,000. He played in all but ten of the club's games last season only being missing through injury or suspension. His only goal of the campaign came early on in the 2-0 Coca-Cola Cup victory over Wolverhampton Wanderers. Born: Motherwell 06/10/69

MARK WALTERS

Released by Southampton in the summer of 1996, Mark was reunited with former Liverpool colleague Steve McMahon when he was signed on a free transfer at the County Ground. It was as an apprentice at Aston Villa that Mark won his first silverware, an F A Youth Cup winners medal. Having made 168 League appearances for Villa he transferred north of the border to join Rangers for £500,000 in December 1987 and went on to win Scottish Premier League Championships in 1989,90 and 91 and well as Scottish League Cup winners medals in 1989 and 1991. In August 1991 a £1.25m move to Liverpool came his way and having made 82 appearances at Anfield, plus loan spells with Stoke City and Wolverhampton Wanderers he joined Southampton on a free in January 1996.



Born: Birmingham 02/06/64

KEVIN WATSON

After four years without a First Team game at White Hart Lane, Kevin was signed on a free transfer by Swindon Town in the summer of 1996. He scored his first ever goal in the Football League in a 3-1 victory at Southend United from 25 yards out. Kevin came through the Youth ranks at Spurs under Terry Venables before being loaned out to Bristol City and Barnet.

Born: Hackney 03/01/74

FORWARDS

STEVE FINNEY

Swindon Town signed Steve from Manchester City on a free transfer in June 1995 and despite a brilliant start to his career at the County Ground, Steve has been unable to recapture his goalscoring form since suffering a broken leg in March 1996. He started last season as a striking partner for Wayne Allison, now at Huddersfield Town. However he soon lost his place and made only occasional appearances in the starting line-up behind Steve Cowe and Peter Thorne, A loan spell in November 1997 at Cambridge United seems to have worked as he has returned refreshed and hungry for goals and promptly scored three in as many games when he took over from Wayne Allison.

Born: Hexham 31/10/73


CHRIS HAY

Young pacy striker, Chris was drafted in from Scottish giants Celtic for £330,00 a week before the start of this season and soon paid off a chunk of his fee scoring 13 goals in 20 appearances prior to Christmas. Manager Steve McMahon had been watching the goalscoring ace for a year in Scotland as he was finding it hard to break into the Buoy's First Team on a regular basis. Unfortunately he soon fell foul of the English disciplinary system and has just returned from a spell out following suspension having collected five cautions.

STEVE COWE

An energetic striker, Steve competed with Steve Finney and Peter Thorne for the second forward slot in partnership with Wayne Allison last season and participated in 38 of Swindon Town's League games during the season. Gloucester born, Steve was signed from Aston Villa for £100,000 in March 1996 and what he lacks in height, he more than makes up for with his pace and skill on the ball.

BOBBY HOWE



The decision to sign for Bradford City earlier this season was an easy one for Peter knowing that changes at Maine Road could have meant him playing Reserve Team football.

Now nicely settled in here at the Pulse Stadium at Valley Parade, recently moving to Harrogate, is making life so much easier for the Beagrie family, Peter, wife Lynn and children Charlotte (6), Rebecca (5) and Sam (2).

The move to Bradford was made possible when Frank Clark was appointed Manager at Manchester City. Clark's system was to play with wing backs and Peter Beagrie did not fit in with this style of play. The plea to Clark to let him go for a minimal fee was much appreciated and has allowed Peter to rebuild his career and help Bradford City get off to a good start to the season and help retain a place towards the top of was is a very difficult division.

Peter's skills have made him a popular player with the fans at his previous clubs and have resulted in him being involved in two one million pound transfer deals.

Peter started his footballing career in Middlesbrough playing in senior League football on Teesside and working during the day in the carpet trade. 
Beags also enjoys watching television and names Only Fools and Horses as his favourite and like most of us was pleased at being able to watch a bumper edition at Christmas.






All this nonsense together with negative letters in the local press led Mr. Richmond to seriously consider quitting the Club.



ENCOURAGING YOUTH

Bradford was one of the nineteen Cities that took part in the first National Shield Competition (now the English Schools FA Trophy) in the 1904/05 season. The other Yorkshire representatives were Leeds, Hull, Sheffield and York. Sheffield reached the Final where they lost to London in Llandudno.

The first recorded Inter-City fixture played by Bradford Boys took place at Valley Parade (then the home of Manningham RFC) on 8 March 1897. The opponents were Leeds Boys and the score ended in a 2-2 draw.

On 27 May 1916, Bradford Boys won the Schools Trophy for the first and only time in the history of the City, beating West Ham Boys 3-0 before a crowd of 7000 in the Final at Valley Parade. MAURICE WELLOCK, later a professional with Bradford City scored in every tie - including the Final.

Bradford Boys best post-war performance came in the 1960/61 season when they reached the quarter-final before losing 2-0 to Barnsley Boys after a 1-1 draw at Valley Parade.

Over the years the Bradford schoolboys side has provided the springboard for many aspiring youngsters to attract the attention of the City's two professional Clubs. Those who have made the grade with Bradford City include such memorable names as BRUCE STOWELL, BRUCE BANNISTER, IAN COOPER, JOE COOKE and GARRY WATSON, each of whom recorded over 200 appearances for the Club.

The first Schoolboy International match to be held in the West Riding was staged at Valley Parade on 5 May 1917. An England side including two local boys (C Haig and G Hollis) defeated Scotland 1-0.

PACKING THEM IN

City's record attendance of 39,146 for an FA Cup 4th round tie against Burnley on 11 March 1911 is the longest standing record at any League ground.

City's first visit to The Shay for a Division 3 (North) game against Halifax Town on 27 September 1927 attracted a crowd of 20,000. This remains a record for a League

match on that ground. Halifax, including ex-City man DONALD DUCKETT were 2-1 winners.

Much more recently, City's game with Sunderland at their new Stadium of Light on Boxing Day 1997 attracted a new record for a Nationwide Football League fixture when 40,055 fans saw the Wearsiders record a 2-0 victory over us.

ON THIS DAY

Bournemouth 8-1 at Valley Parade. This result stands as the record post-war League victory and also set a new Club record of 23 consecutive home League games without defeat. BOBBY HAM scored a hat trick whilst Bournemouth lost 17 year old goalkeeper RON TILSTED after he was injured making a first half save and centre half DAVID STOCKS took over in goal.

.....24 January 1974. A crowd of 9041 saw City defeat Exeter City 1-0 in only the second League game ever to be staged on a Sunday at Valley Parade.



Two home matches in four days gives Bradford City a great chance to climb the table and renew their Play-Off challenge.

City have struggled away from home with only one win in thirteen League and Cup matches but at home they have looked solid with only two defeats against Sunderland and Tranmere Rovers.

The top four teams, Nottingham Forest, Middlesbrough, Charlton Athletic and Sunderland have been so consistent that they look to be favourites to be occupying either the automatic promotion or Play-Off places. But who else will be in contention is anybody's guess.

However the job of guiding City through the next two home matches will be that of Paul Jewell. He made a tremendous start as his tactical changes worked like a dream in City's 2-1 win at Stockport County two weeks ago.

The side were also doing well at Stoke last Friday with John McGinlay giving them a 1-0 lead before Andrew O'Brien had the misfortune to handle the ball in his own penalty area and enable Stoke to equalise.

The goal put new confidence into a previously jittery Stoke side. They scored again shortly afterwards and always looked likely winners after that.

The Club said that it felt that Chris Kamara had done all he could for Bradford City and that it was time for a change.


Chris is a good Manager and I am sure that he will have little difficulty in finding another Club but Geoffrey Richmond has set out his stall for Bradford City nowand I think that this should send out a positive message to the fans.

By sacking Chris when City stood in 11th place, the Chairman has demonstrated that in his opinion a midtable position in Division 1 is not good enough and he is prepared to bring in a new boss to make a sustained push for Premier League status.

Whoever the new Manager might be he will have quite a hard act to follow. Chris achieved promotion in his first season in charge at Valley Parade after taking over when City were in 13th place in Division 2.

I don't think anyone can seriously expect the new man to have quite such a dramatic impact, although of course it would be wonderful if he did, but the brave decision to dismiss a Manager who had achieved so much in a relatively short space of time shows that the Club is not prepared to tread water.



Perhaps FIFA should introduce a ruling that the ball must be out of play before the whistle is blown.






Unfortunately John Dreyer is taking some time to recover from a
