TEAM TALK

After the 5-0 demolition of Bristol City in our last home game, I think many people were somewhat surprised when I said that we could still have done better. And to be fair we could have done. The scoreline could almost have been into double figures if we made the most of our chances.

Nevertheless the result put us into good stead for the long haul to play Norwich City at Carrow Road a week ago. Norwich at the time were unbeaten at home so we knew that we were in for a run for our money.

I had to change the starting line-up for the first time in many weeks after John Dreyer was ruled out with a toe injury and Lee Todd injured his hamstring in training. Jamie Lawrence and Andrew O'Brien were drafted in which is the beauty of having a strong squad.

Norwich are a good footballing

side and when we went there last season we left Norfolk with all three points after a 3-2 win, having been 3-0 up early on. How we hung on I still don't know to this day - but we did. We have improved beyond all recognition since then and despite the way the game last Saturday ended with the biggest penalty howler of all time, maybe in a few weeks time we will consider it a point gained rather than two points lost.

Norwich deserved a point and nobody would have denied them it had they scored from matchplay and not an own goal and a hotly disputed penalty.

It was a penalty which gave us the points midweek at Tranmere Rovers, however on this occasion the referee was certainly correct in his decision awarding us the spot kick after Darren Moore was fouled by John Achterberg.

The win puts us into the top six for the first time this season but we are not counting our chickens just yet!

Finally many congratulations to Gareth Whalley on his selection for the Republic of Ireland team for their International game next week against Yugoslavia in Belgrade. While we are of course delighted that Gareth has been called up to play for his country, we have been somewhat incensed by the fact that the Republic have insisted that Gareth reports today in Dublin depriving us of his services. There is a FIFA ruling that clubs have to be given 14 days notice, we received our notification last Tuesday. Talks have been going on during the week to see if all players can report after today's game. Northern Ireland have agreed, there is no reason why their counterparts in the Republic cannot do the same.

Enjoy the game today.

WELCOME

This week sees the Robins return to Valley Parade when after the visit of Bristol City two weeks ago, we welcome their West Country rivals Swindon Town for this afternoon's Nationwide Football League Division 1 encounter.

CRYSTAL PALACE

As of yet we have been unable to redate the Crystal Palace game which was abandoned last month following the torrential downpour leading up to and during the game. We hope to be able to announce a new date shortly.

Season Ticket holders will gain free admission to the game when it is played on production of Voucher 'P' from their Season Ticket book.

All other supporters who purchased match tickets or who paid cash at the Diamond Seal Kop or Ciba Stand turnstiles will be allowed entry at half the price they paid for the abandoned game provided they produce either the ticket stub or the abandoned match voucher which was given out at the turnstiles.

HUDDERSFIELD TOWN NEXT

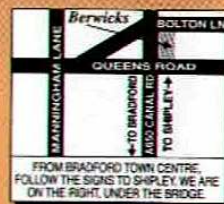

View from the BOARD

Welcome to Swindon Town.

On the 19th November our planning application for the new 2 tier stand is to be decided and whilst there have been a number of objections to the building of the stand, the Club's future is paramount.

Bradford City Football Club have been at Valley Parade for almost the whole of this century. Any resident in the area must have been aware that they were moving within the vicinity of a football ground.

We have moved a long way forward in the last few years and Premiership football is a real possibility for next season. We already generate National and International recognition for the City of Bradford. We represent the City with pride and bring enormous benefits in economic terms and give the good people of this City civic pride. Our progress

will be severely jeopardised by the rejection of planning permission.

We are building the stand because we have to comply with the Lord Justice Taylor Report. We are not building it because we want to be difficult to our neighbours. The Club prides itself upon the excellent relationship with the local community. We wish to develop this further in the future.

We recognise that the development of the Stadium does bring with it problems, and as a result have offered the residents of Rock Terrace, in writing, the following:-

- (a) An underwritten value of each house should the value be adversely affected from today's market value at any time within the next five years.
- (b) An improvement in the street lighting to be paid for by the Club.
- (c) Bateman Street to be tarmac'd (to replace the cobbles) and

maintained by us.

It is now for the elected members to make their decision. They must be under no illusions whatsoever that a rejection of planning will put this Club into crisis, with the prospect of a three sided ground from the start of next season with a capacity of 10,800.

Many decisions that have been taken in recent years in this City by elected members have resulted in mediocrity for the City. It is impossible for the Committee to please both the 11 residents of Rock Terrace and the 15,000 Bradford City supporters.

My plea to them is to say yes to our planning application on the 19th.

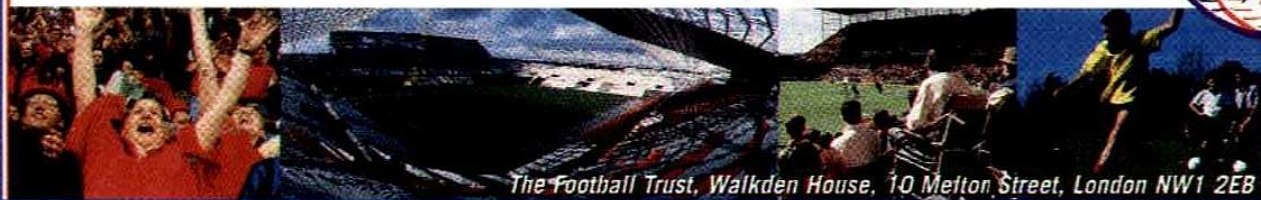
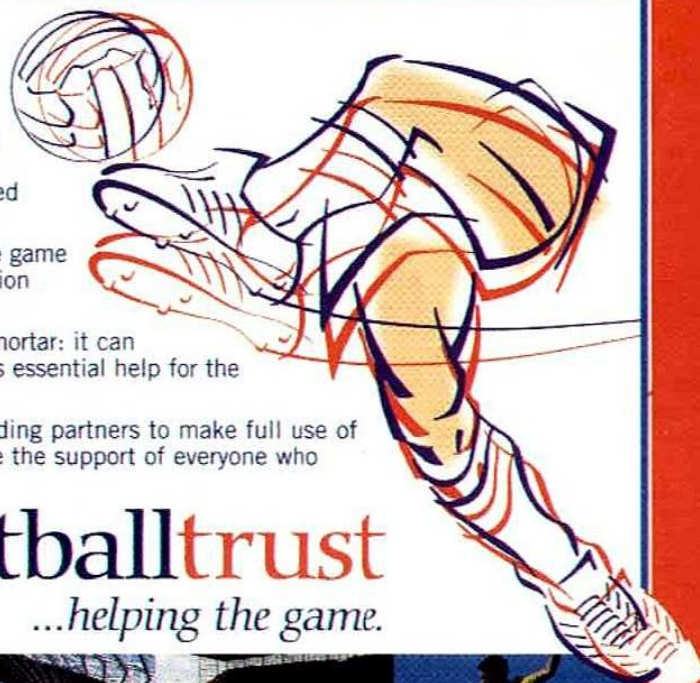

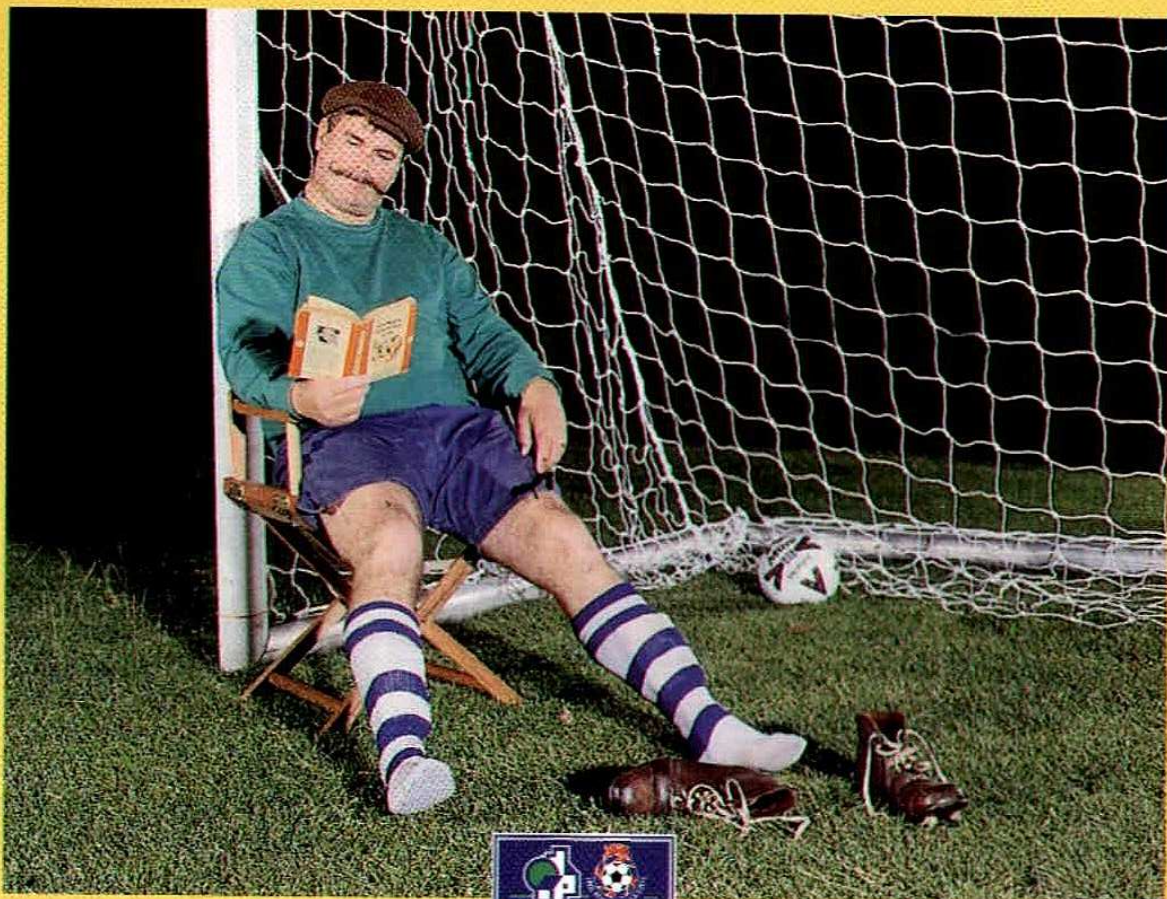

With this weekend seeing the 1st Round of the F.A. Cup - sponsored by AXA ties being played, there is no live Nationwide Football League action on SKY Sports. Last night the tie between Manchester City and Halifax Town was shown live from Maine Road while tomorrow afternoon sees Luton Town's game at Boreham Wood going out on SKY Sports kicking off at 1.00pm.

This afternoon in the Nationwide Football League Barnsley entertain Ipswich Town at Oakwell. Both teams saw out draws in their games a week ago, Barnsley drawing 1-1 at home to Bury, Ashley Ward giving the Tykes a 16th minute lead and Ipswich Town 2-2 away at Huddersfield Town. Ipswich supporters vented their disappointment at popular full-back Mauricio Taricco's reported move to Spurs by waving placards with the message 'Don't Go Mauricio' prior to kick off. The protest was in vain as the volatile Argentinian didn't even travel to the Alfred McAlpine Stadium. Out with an ankle injury, he stayed behind in Suffolk and chose to watch the Ipswich Town U19's beat their East Anglian rivals Norwich City 3-0 in an academy match.

Birmingham City moved into third place last week after their 3-1 away win over West Bromwich Albion, Peter Ndlovu (2) and Dele Adebola on target for Trevor Francis' side. Oxford United, who are at St. Andrew's today threatened not to play their game at Watford after the players wages were not paid on time following a worsening financial crisis at the Manor Ground. Despite this Oxford avoided the administrator going in to take charge of things but the players obviously had other things on their minds as they went down 2-0 to Graham Taylor's outfit.

Bolton Wanderers have Tranmere Rovers at the Reebok Stadium this afternoon and will be looking for a marked improvement in their performance after their 2-0 defeat by QPR at Loftus Road a week

ago. This was Bolton's fourth defeat of the season which saw them slip down to 12th in the table and left Manager Colin Todd admitting that they had a tough job on their hands.

Crewe Alexandra remain rooted at the foot of the table after their 2-0 home defeat by our visitors today, Swindon Town who celebrated their first away win of the season. Iffy Onuora did the damage scoring both goals, one in each half at Gresty Road. Queens Park Rangers continued their recent run of good form under new boss Gerry Francis with a 2-0 home win over Bolton Wanderers.

Crystal Palace have Bristol City at Selhurst Park today and come up against a side who have leaked in eleven goals in two games following the departure of popular John Ward from the managerial hot-seat. Last week City saw Wolves blast six goals past them in a pathetic performance against a side who themselves had won just two games in twelve and had their Manager sacked forty-eight hours earlier. Palace were fired up for their game against Portsmouth following an outburst by Pompey striker Alan McLoughlin who heavily criticised Terry Venables and Terry Fenwick. It rebounded on Portsmouth who returned to the South Coast on the wrong end of a 4-1 scoreline.

Grimsby Town made Sunderland fight for their unbeaten record at the Stadium of Light last Saturday but couldn't stop them registering a 3-1 win to keep them well clear at the top of the table. Portsmouth are at Blundell Park today having met Norwich City at Fratton Park in a re-arranged fixture on Tuesday night.

Norwich City return to Carrow Road this afternoon after their midweek trip to Portsmouth to face Wolverhampton Wanderers who have Colin Lee in temporary charge following the dismissal of Mark McGhee two weeks ago. Even the most ardent of City fans were amazed when they were awarded their 90th minute penalty against us last Saturday, this after Lee Mills looked to have secured all three points with his 88th minute goal. Despite their 6-1 thumping at Bristol City last week, Lee wasn't letting the win go to his head, even though it was the first time that Wolves had scored six goals in 22 years. The last time they visited Ashton Gate they scored five against the Robins, a defeat which cost Russell Osman his job.

Port Vale have top of the table Sunderland at Vale Park today. Last Saturday Martin Smith was the two goal hero as Peter Reid's side stayed five points clear, Smith playing only his third game of the season, in as a replacement for the injured Nicky Summerbee. Sunderland's boast as the only unbeaten side in the country was being put to the test by Grimsby. However in addition to Smith's brace, Niall Quinn was also on target for the Wearsiders to take their goals tally to 40 for the season. Vale went down 4-2 at Stockport County in front of the SKY cameras.

Sheffield United, who were at Wolverhampton Wanderers during the week have Bury at Bramall Lane this afternoon. Laurent D'Jaffo saw the Shakers leave Oakwell with a share of the points last Saturday while the Blades also drew, 2-2 at home to Tranmere Rovers. This took Steve Bruce's team to seven games unbeaten and was even more pleasing in view of the fact that they went almost all of the second half with just ten men after having had Roger Nilsen sent off for hauling down striker Scott Taylor.

Stockport County moved further away from the foot of the table last Sunday after their 4-2 victory over Port Vale at Edgeley Park where today they face Watford who added to Oxford United's troubles when they beat them 2-0 at Vicarage Road, Steve Palmer and Gifton Noel-Williams the Horner's marksmen.

At the Hawthorns West Bromwich Albion entertain Huddersfield Town this afternoon. The Baggies lost 3-1 in their derby clash with Birmingham City a week ago while Huddersfield thought that they were on course for all three points against Ipswich Town but saw David Johnson score his 10th goal of the season to level the scores after Wayne Allison had looked to have sealed the promotion points for the Terriers with a dramatic 73rd minute header. Ipswich Manager George Burley maintained that Huddersfield's second goal should not have been allowed as the ball did not fully cross the line.

Referees. The very mention of the men in black (or green as is very often the case these days) is guaranteed to get a reaction from every football fan. None more so than at Carrow Road at 4.47pm last Saturday!

Whether it be a fan reminiscing about characters such as Clive Thomas and how they used common sense to control the game or maybe someone who believes the current officials are much more consistent because the laws are much more strict. One thing is for sure, you cannot ignore referees.

Already this season, I have touched on the distasteful way players tend to harangue officials these days - the consequences of which were seen in the Paulo Di Canio incident at Hillsborough last month.

Every week we see calls from exasperated Managers or players for professional referees, but I just do not see what this will change.

The officials will undoubtedly be fitter and it may make the job more attractive for former players to enter when they retire.

However no matter how much stamina training they do to keep up with play, mistakes will happen. Despite what many fans say, referees are human.

Instead, rather than clouding the issue with the question of professional referees, I believe that the debate should centre around the possible introduction of video referees.

Rugby League has tried it and as somebody who watches the sport, I believe that it has been an unqualified success.

Admittedly, the video referee is only available in games which are shown live

on SKY Television, but when it has been in use, it means that all borderline decisions regarding tries can be judged with the benefit of replays.

I must admit that when the idea was first mooted, I was not in favour. The time delay while the video referee is consulted was my major bone of contention. I thought that the gap in the action would make the game as stop-start as American Football.

However nothing could be further from the truth. OK, so the game does stop. But the anticipation inside the ground over a decision is tremendous as we wait to see either 'Try' or 'No Try' posted up on the screen.

It would be better if every game could have a video referee but the game's finances do not allow it. However that would not necessarily have to be the case in football.

Not every decision has to go to the video referee. Only ones which involve goals, whether it be something earlier in the move leading up to the strike or a direct act which causes the goal.

As we approach the Millennium, it is clear that football is a massive business. It is wrong if a club can be relegated because of one decision during a season in a similar manner to the way in which Bolton Wanderers suffered last season. In their clash with Everton, Bolton had a legitimate goal ruled out which cost them two points. And ultimately this meant that Colin Todd's side were relegated while the Merseyside outfit survived on goal difference.

I believe that a video referee would have prevented such an injustice and that is why it should represent the future for English football.

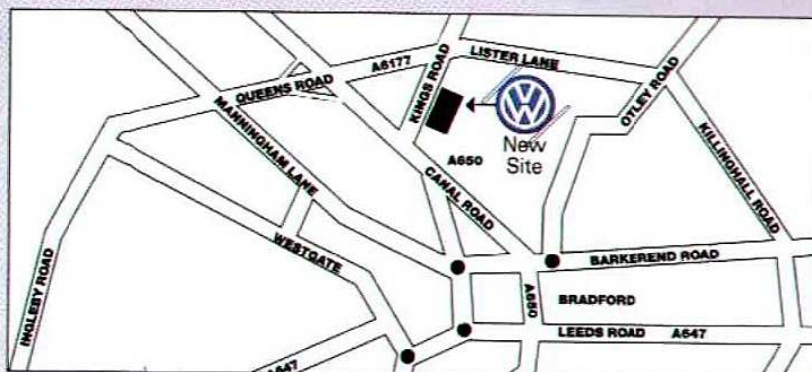

THE MAN IN CHARGE

JIMMY QUINN

When fan-power caused Steve McMahon to quit the County Ground hot-seat in September, the Board had to look no further than former Town favourite Jimmy Quinn who at the time was playing for Barry Fry at Peterborough United,

having earned his managerial spurs prior to that at Reading. 39 years old next Wednesday, Jimmy joined Swindon Town for a fee of £10,000 from Oswestry on 31 December 1981. He went on to make 41 appearances for the Robins in his first stint at the County Ground before joining Blackburn Rovers for £32,000 in August 1984. At Ewood Park he made 70 appearances for Rovers but just over two years later returned to Swindon for £50,000 in December 1986.

His second period in Wiltshire saw him turn out for Swindon on 83 occasions, scoring 43 goals in his eighteen months there.

Leicester City was his next port of call when he transferred for £210,000 in June 1988 but having made just 13 appearances at Filbert Street he was on the move again, this time to join us here at Bradford City. He was only at Valley Parade for nine months but in his 37 games for us he managed to net on 15 occasions

prior to joining West Ham United on 30 December 1989. 42 appearances and 22 goals later for the Hammers he was on the move again joining AFC Bournemouth for £40,000 in August 1991.

A move to Reading followed in July 1992 and during his time at the old Elm Park he was appointed joint player/manager along with Mick Gooding. He left Reading shortly before the 1996/97 season came to a halt and at the age of 37 he linked up with Barry Fry at London Road.

In addition to his 562 starts in first team football where he has scored 270 goals, Jimmy has accumulated 48 full International caps for Northern Ireland and one at 'B' level. Born: Belfast 18/11/59

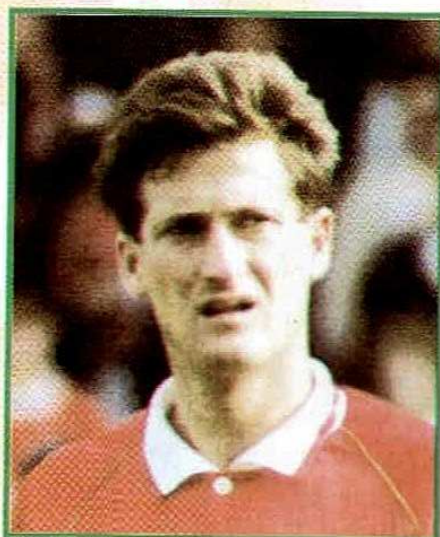

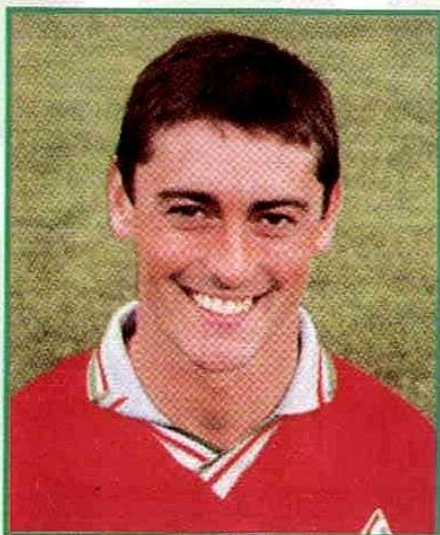
TY GOODEN

Born: Dulwich 23/12/74

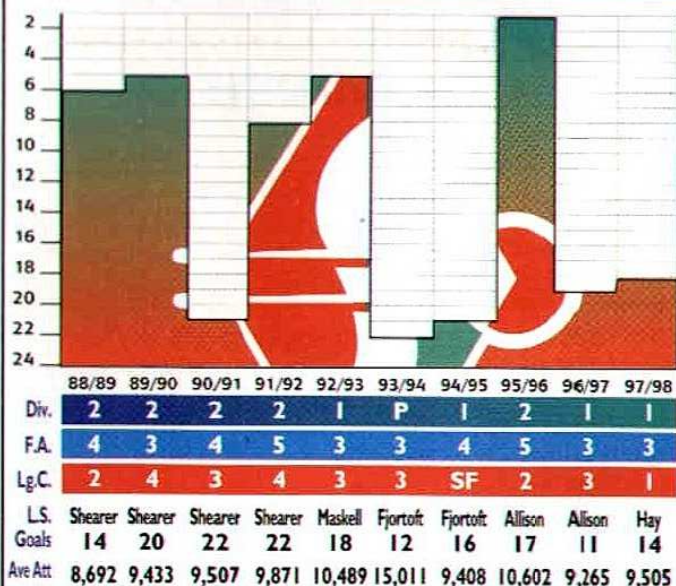
IFEM ONUORA

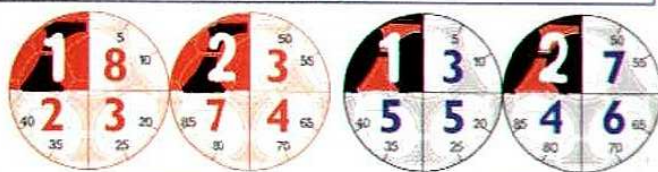

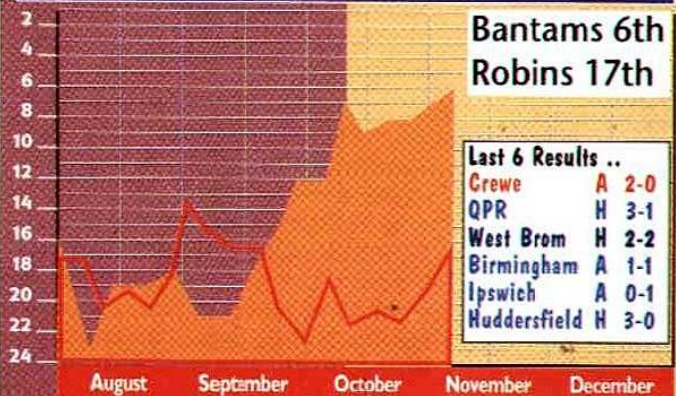

You know, it can't be all that easy being a Football Manager.

It's a job I'm sure that almost everybody would like to do, despite the pressure for results coming from all sides - the fans, the Boardroom and the media.

But quite apart from results, the actual day-to-day man management of a squad of, say 25 professionals must be difficult.

There are only 11 places in the team, and only another three on the bench. That means that players are going to be left disappointed on the sidelines because they are not playing and there seems little prospect of them getting into the side.

Of course, the players who are out of

the first team are unhappy and in one sense that is good, in that it encourages those players to train harder in order to get back into the side. But it can also have a bad effect on players with those who are missing out week in and week out becoming demotivated and unhappy.

Somewhere in the middle of all this is the Manager, trying to pick his best team, ensuring that he has a squad to call upon when injuries and suspensions occur and yet at the same time trying to keep everyone happy.

If a player is happy to play in the Reserves and appear for the first team only when injuries and suspensions permit, he is no trouble to the Manager who knows that he

has a capable reserve to use whenever he needs to.

But does that player really have the right motivation if he is content to play in the Reserves most of the time?

And a player who causes a Manager problems by trying to get away from a Club because he is not in the first team - is that necessarily a bad thing? It shows that he has the desire to play first team football and he will be constantly pressing for a place in the side.

The Manager's job must be one of the most difficult juggling acts there is and it proves that it is impossible to please everybody all the time.

It has been said by many supporters that you are currently playing the best football of your career here at Bradford City Peter. Would you agree with that?

Who are the team that you fear most and the main contenders for automatic promotion?

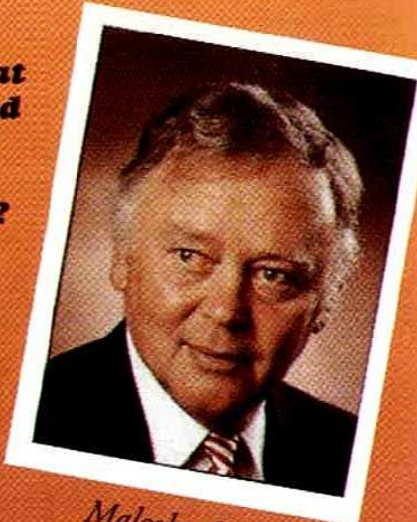
Other than ourselves, the teams I think will be in with a shout come May are Sunderland, Birmingham City and Ipswich Town.

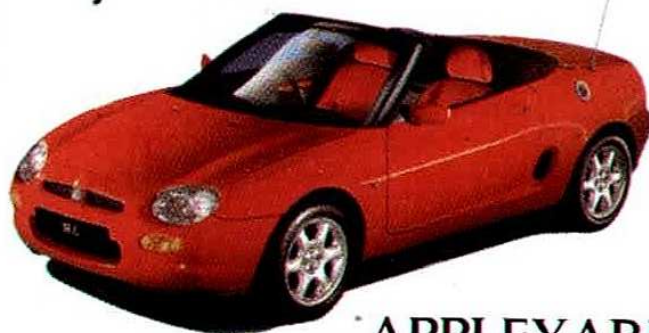

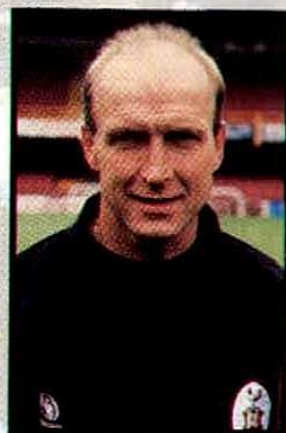

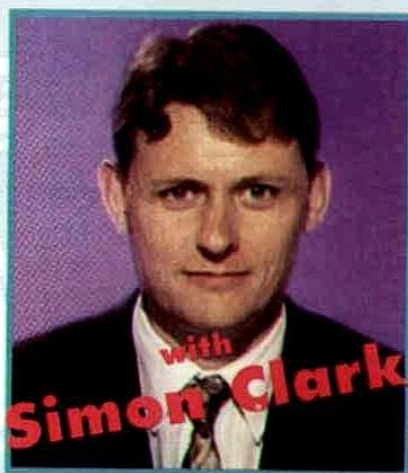

In Rugby League the yellow card is used as a means of removing a player for ten minutes into the so-called sin-bin. There is merit in that too. What there is no merit in is a dismissal of a player for two minor indiscretions. Football is getting it's disciplinary knickers in a twist.

My question for Sepp Blatter and Graham Kelly is this. "Is football really so much more violent now than it was 5, 10, or 15 years ago? From the

benefit of my own eyes spent reporting this grand game I have to tell the two seasoned administrators that it is not.

I have nothing but admiration for the referee who goes straight for the red card when a player through on goal is fouled. But one whose first line of attack is the yellow rather than the quiet word falls well below the standard I expect of an official. They may counter that they are instructed to discipline in this way, and if that is the case, then the masters of the game are wrong.

People in the game keep telling me that refereeing standards are falling. I am not so sure. There are still good referees and poor referees,

but I do believe that the behaviour of players generally is not as high as it once was. Perhaps the stakes are just too high, who knows?

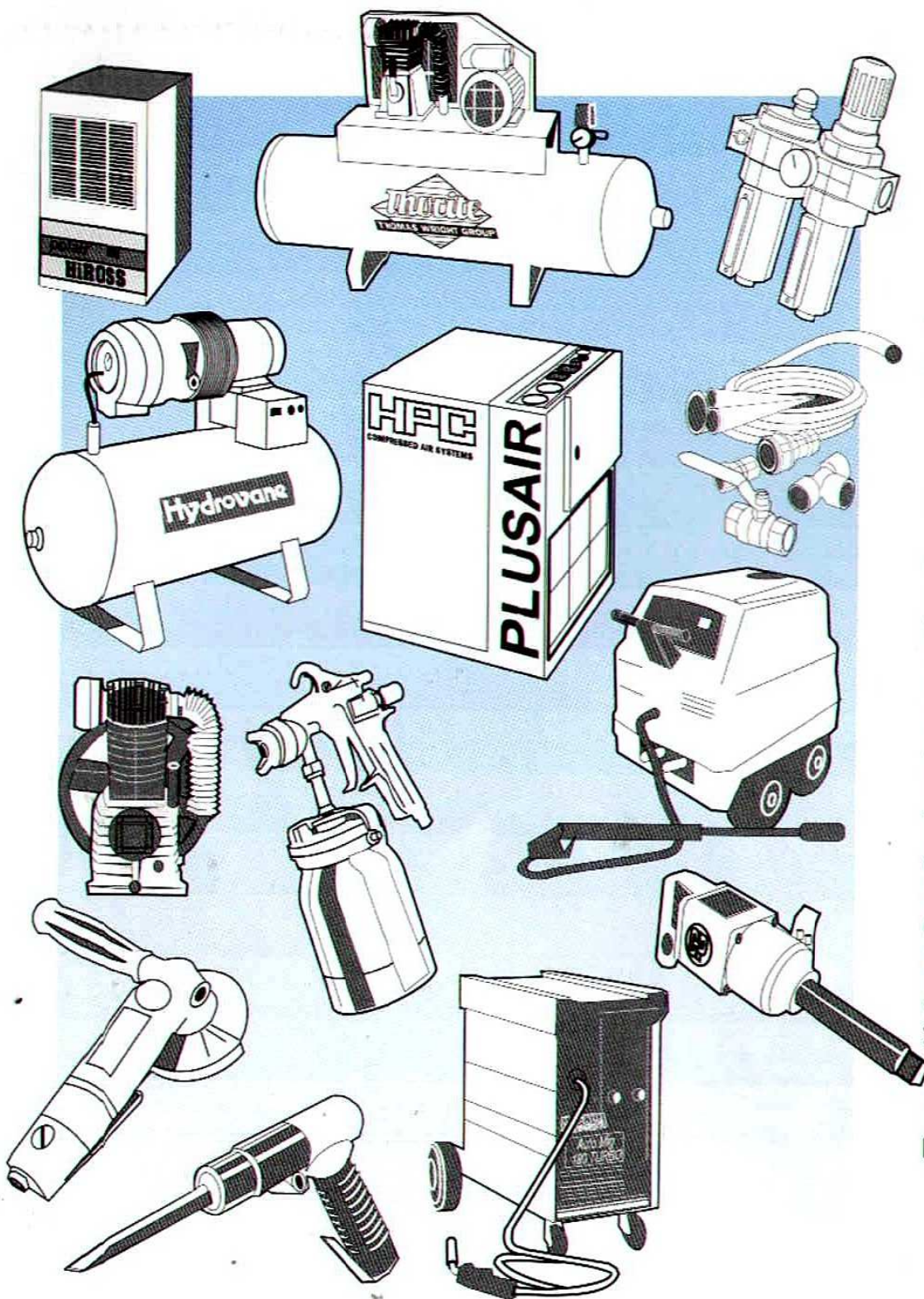
In the near future, the Premier League are to experiment with professional referees. I doubt myself if this will make a bit of difference. I do though accept that fast tracking former professional players might be helpful. That's not because they may be better than somebody who has come through the ranks, but if a player retires at 35, what chance has he then to make the top? We are probably losing some talent by not offering former players the chance to short cut their way to the top.

Finally let me give my view on what so many see as refereeing inconsistency. Like us all, referees are individuals. As such each may have a different interpretation of incidents. Until robots operate in the middle, inconstancy will always be part of the game. It is a human thing, see.

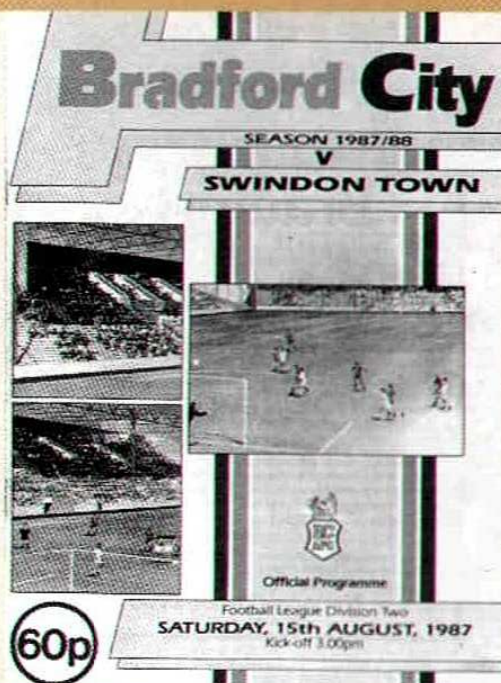
When the 1987-88 season kicked off, hopes were high as ever at Valley Parade, the first full season back home after the fire. The season began with a home fixture against today's visitors Swindon Town. Newly promoted with Lou Macari at the helm, their hopes must have been high also following two consecutive promotions.

The Swindon team had one or two players who were later to join Bradford City. Under Terry Dolan City were slowly building a team that I feel could have held their own in the old Division 1, had we managed that final leap, but that's history now.

Everyone connected with Bradford City knows that we failed in the Play-Offs against Middlesbrough when a final day victory over Ipswich Town would have secured promotion.

Making their debuts that afternoon for City were Paul Tomlinson, signed from Sheffield United and a young defender recruited from Watford, Lee Sinnott. Born in the Midlands, Lee signed for Walsall for whom he played 40 games and scored twice before being transferred to Watford where he went on to make 78 League appearances, again scoring twice.

He played in the 1984 FA Cup Final against Everton which Watford lost 2-0 and joined Bradford City in July 1987. He left Valley Parade for



the first time in 1991 when he joined Crystal Palace, a victim of the John Docherty clear-out. He was re-signed by Frank Stapleton, originally on loan in 1993.

He left for a second time in December 1994 when transferred by Lennie Lawrence to Huddersfield Town. Lee Duxbury also went with him with City getting Graham Mitchell and some cash in return. Lee Sinnott returned to Valley Parade yet again, this time for a short loan spell at the end of last season and in all he played 214 League games for us and scored seven goals.

In the Swindon Town side for this fixture were Chris Kamara - who got booked(!) and current Town Manager Jimmy Quinn. City won 2-0 to start the campaign in the right vein with Stuart McCall and Ron Futchler scoring in the second half.

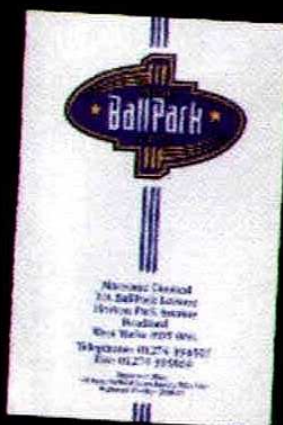
