



Those of you who were here for the last 1st team match, versus Sheffield United, might feel a little short changed if today's game is anything less than a stupendous 90 minutes of football.

The individual efforts of the players were widely admired, whilst the commitment to the cause shown by the whole team was probably the best all season, particularly when we went down to 10 men. Put together it was one of those rousing performances which warms up the crowd on a Saturday afternoon, the like of which has in all truthfulness been in short supply over past seasons. I only hope that the added spark we saw then will attract the lost supporters missed by us all.

Nothing will tempt them back more than the kind of goals we witnessed from the boot of George Ndah against Sheffield. George hit the back of the net and the headlines with that goal, which he described as the best in his career. It seems to me that George has maybe ran into his purple patch, especially after he bagged the winning goal against Port Vale a week later. I can only imagine what a dream ticket he would make with Iffy

Onuora if they can maintain their partnership and stay clear of the treatment table for any length of time. Of the 39 goals scored by the Town this campaign 25 of them have been bagged by this pair, with a further 8 by Mark Walters. All three of these players have missed matches through injury, suspension or because they have been dropped, making these figures all the more impressive.

While the first team haven't moved forward in the cup our youth team have been progressing nicely in their version of the competition called The Times FA Youth Cup. After beating Premiership giants Leeds United at Elland Road they held Everton to a draw at Goodison Park in the next round. This means the game will be replayed on Tuesday 2nd February 1999

at the County Ground. Kick-off is 7.00pm and entrance costs £3 for adults £1 for children. It promises to be a great night of football, why not come down and support "Quinn's Babes".

With the FA Cup out of our minds it is back to the First Division today for our clash with Bury. Our opponents are currently in 19th position and must fear relegation. You only have to glance at the League table to see the reason for their current position, they have the lowest number of goals scored in Division One, with 26 scored.

But being so close to relegation can concentrate the mind so Town will have to be on top of their game come 3.00pm. We can do our bit and continue the terrific support that has brought the County Ground to life of late.

Jim Quinn gives his view...

Hello and welcome back to the County Ground for today's match against Bury.

It seems like ages ago that we last played at the County Ground against Sheffield United, and who could forget George Ndah's wonder goal that gave us the lead in the first half.

Since then it has been a period of ups and downs for Swindon Town. After a draw with the Blades we travelled to Port Vale and picked up three valuable points, thanks to another well taken goal by George.

It wasn't our best performance of the season, but we worked very hard and frustrated the home side. You must not forget that conditions were blizzard like and this often means that flowing football just isn't possible.

When you get conditions like these it is just a case of rolling your sleeves up and battling away. I couldn't see what was going on at some points, the snow was falling so thick, but the players equipped themselves well and defended terrific.

The week before we gave away some sloppy goals against Sheffield United, we have been working hard in training this week, there were no free headers in our box, and we got the reward for our efforts in three points.

It is all down to concentration for me. The lads need to concentrate for 90 minutes of the game and if they can do that they will get the rewards they deserve.

Frank Talia has pulled off a number of good saves and done his job well, the defence was brilliant and the midfield worked very hard with Bobby Howe once again putting in a brilliant display.

Unfortunately we couldn't repeat this against Barnsley. Looking back at the game I felt Craig Hignett was the difference between the two sides. They played very well as a team and sometimes you have to hold your hands up and give other teams a bit of credit.

We were all disappointed, because it was a great opportunity for some of our lads to progress to the later rounds of the FA Cup but that was not to be.

I know some of the players' felt they let the side down, but the whole team has been terrific for me over the last few weeks. We mustn't mope about it, these things happen, and we are going to have the odd game where we don't perform.

Now we have to look back to the League as we face Bury today. They are a side at the wrong end of Division One, but there is no such thing as an easy game and I've emphasised to the players that I want to see the same level of concentration that we showed against Port Vale.

We have been working hard over the last week to boost fitness and strength for the run into the end of the season. We will need this extra strength today because Bury are a physical side with a number of big six footers. But if we can match this and play our game we'll do all right.

The support of the fans has been exceptional over recent weeks.

We need this to continue until the end of the season as we try to push our way up the table.



The manager NEIL WARNOCK

A renowned lower League achiever, Neil Warnock was on a short-list of one when Bury Chairman Terry Robinson went looking for Stan Ternent's Gigg Lane replacement.

Ternent was the man who had guided Bury from the Third Division to the First in successive seasons, building a great team spirit and a 29-match unbeaten home run

in the process - so Warnock knew that he had a job on his hands. But if anyone could be said to relish a challenge, then Warnock is certainly the man.

The 49-year-old,
Sheffield-born
Warnock enjoyed
an 11-year playing
career as a winger
with Chesterfield,
Rotherham,
Hartlepool,
Scunthorpe,
Aldershot, Barnsley,
York and Crewe before
getting his first taste of
management with Northern
Premier League club Burton

Albion in 1981. While playing he also qualified as a chiropodist and ran his own practice in Sheffield.

After a quietly impressive start with Burton, who he took on a fairytale trip to the FA Cup
Third Round in 1985, Warnock was appointed manager of
Scarborough and in his first season he lead the club to the
GMVC Championship - and into the Football League.

Two seasons later he joined Notts
County, guiding them from the old
Third Division to the First in
successive seasons, before they
were relegated in 1992 and
Warnock was
unceremoniously sacked.

He was appointed as a management consultant by Torquay before successful spells with Huddersfield (promoted to Division One in 1995) and Plymouth (promoted to Division Two in 1996) were followed by appointment at Oldham Athletic in March 1997.





weekly diary...January

Monday 4th

Football can be a cruel mistress and after Saturday's game we have another example of how exasperating this game can be.

We played against Barnsley who showed real grit and determination to frustrate us, and that is what they did. We created a couple of openings but never really tested them enough. Now we have to travel up to Oakwell for a tough replay. After a game like this it is up to the Coaching Staff to get the lads buzzing again. All the squad were in today for a good work out. Despite a muddy pitch we did some sprints and team games and split into two teams for a full size match. To keep the lads concentrating we varied the rules, e.g. two touch, no over head height. A long warm down swiftly followed, with plenty of stretching to ease some tired muscles.

There was only a limited set of players in because of today's reserve match.

However, after the trip to Crawley Town's ground to play Crystal Palace the game was abandoned. The players were in their kit and warming-up when the ref called it off because of a waterlogged pitch.

So it was back on the coach and another game of cards to pass the time on the way home. It was particularly disappointing to have this game called off because we had a number of recently injured players back in the squad.

Phil King, David Kerslake, Alan Reeves were all set for their first run out in a while, but they'll have to wait another week.

Friday 8th

There is no doubt about it, tomorrow's opponents, Sheffield United are a team who are under performing.

They've got some real quality in their side but haven't reached their potential as yet. This means we have a good chance of getting something from this game.

We had a lively morning session with the players working on set pieces and a few particular incidents we needed to run through. After this it was back to the County Ground for chicken and pasta and then the players were sent home to put their feet up.

First Team Latest

Between the lotteries of weather, injuries and refereeing decisions its been a period of chop and change for the 1st team.

Poor conditions have threatened to call off several matches at the County Ground this season but it was at Oakwell that they finally put pay to a game. For both trips to Barnsley the squad had travelled up on the Monday and been given a fierce workout by Jim Quinn, mainly involving sprints, one-touch and, of course, penalty practice. Of course when the Barnsley game was replayed we all know what happened and we must now focus on the League and a hard earned away win against Port Vale.

At least last Saturday's lay-off offered some rest to the players, who often play under fatigue this time in the season, half way through a campaign and slogging away in mud-patch pitches. This break gave us all a chance to reflect on recent games, especially George Ndah's spectacular scissor kick goal that was almost out-done by an audacious 40-yard effort from Scott Leitch. Despite hitting the bar, Scott's shot was a signal that he had returned with avengeance after serving his 3

match suspension. Those who know him in the Club had seen the frustration he'd been working through in training, fit but unable to play in the 1st team. His form since then has been a massive boost to Jim Quinn's plans for the rest of the season.

Leitch's suspensions have been quickly followed by Darren Bullock's, and now Mark Robinson and Brian Borrows. Both the manager and the chairman have behind the scenes made it clear to the players that the Club cannot afford the kind of avoidable bookings which have gone on to rule out players in this way.

A shock omission from the team for other reasons has been Mark Walters. Quinn called Mark in to his office a fortnight ago to talk things over, after signs of stress appeared to be creeping into his game.





This culminated in the manager offering some time off, and after a week Wally made a welcome return to the squad in the 2nd replay at Barnsley. He knows that he has no time to waste in recapturing the no. 7 shirt from Bobby Howe, who has been putting in a series of stunning displays at the heart of midfield.

Bobby had shown that kind of form when he was scouted by Steve McMahon, but it has been Jim Quinn who seems to have gotten the best out of him at Swindon.

Youth Team News

A dramatic last minute goal from Danny Jeffery has secured a 4th Round Youth Cup Replay at the County Ground against Everton.

Everton, last year's winner of the cup, scored with ten minutes to go but Town's youngsters didn't let their heads drop, and they battled back to find an equaliser in the 86th minute. It was a well-balanced game with both sides creating some good chances, but Town will be delighted with the replay. "It's an old cliche, but we're over the moon" said youth team manager Tom Jones.

"To come to a massive club like
Everton, who are ranked as one of the
top youth clubs, and get a result like this
is a testament to the lads and the hard
work they've put in. "When you face the
big clubs you can often freeze and not
play your best but I felt we matched
them for most of the game, and took the
game to them. Now we have a home
replay to look forward to, and I'm hoping
we can get plenty of support."

17 year-old goalscorer Danny Jeffery is a first year YT who Swindon signed from



West Ham. He said: "This was one of the biggest games of my life, so to score was a bit special. Fraser has swung in a corner from the right which they've headed out Donlon struck it back into the box and I was in the right place to finish of the chance from close range."

More drama has followed the game, two of Town's key players Paul McAreavey and Ricky Culbertson may have to miss the replay due to Northern Ireland international duties.





Kevin is confident that he will have sufficient support to plan a structure very shortly but additional help is always welcome and any parents wishing to have an involvement should contact Kevin.




It never rains but it pours is the phrase that can best describe

HAMMERS CLINCH DOUBLE DEAL

At the time of going to press West Ham has called a news conference at which they are expected to confirm the arrival of Cameroon international Marc-Vivien Foe and Italian Paolo Di Canio.

Defender Foe, who almost joined Manchester United last season before suffering a broken leg, is likely to cost around £3.5m. Striker Di Canio has not played a competitive game since pushing over referee Paul Alcock during Sheffield Wednesday's game with Arsenal last September. He was banned for 11 matches by the Football Association and then returned to Italy, where he has since remained for treatment for stress and depression.

It appears Wednesday are willing to cut their loses by agreeing a fee of around £1.7m with West Ham, a loss of almost £3m on a player they signed from Celtic. Hammers boss Harry Redknapp has cash to spend following the £7.5million sale of John Hartson to Wimbledon but investing in Di Canio still represents a risk.But Redknapp said: "it's important with John's money that I strengthen the team in maybe four areas to have a stronger squad. If I get the players I want, people will say it was money well spent." He is also reported to be interested in signing Liverpool full-back Rob Jones.



It's Your Call First Football Commentator Phil Duffell

Of all the questions I'm asked about covering football matches, among the most common is: Why doesn't soccer introduce new technology to help referees make the right decisions?

It's true that match officials are under the microscope like never before with an array of camera angles and the use of super-slow motion replays to highlight any errors made during the course of a game.

It's also true that because of the vast amount of money at the top end of English football, a wrong verdict towards the end of a season can cost clubs millions of pounds.

Given such a weight of responsibility, surely the referee should be afforded every possible assistance in getting the job done correctly?

The solution seems simple...cameras around the ground capture any controversial incident, play is then suspended while an official in the stand studies the replay before delivering his decision via an intercom to the man taking charge in the middle.

Sounds good in theory, but would it work in practice?

Alas, I think not - at least not as well as most

The best example to illustrate my misgivings is the "goal" which is disallowed for offside.

people would hope.

As offsides can occur anywhere in the opponents' half, it is unlikely that a camera would be perfectly positioned - dead level with the last defender - to ensure a correct decision.

A further complication is the fact that the all-important pass may have travelled some 50 yards or so - and it's the moment the ball is played that matters - so the pictures may not tell the whole story.

As a commentator, I have the additional benefit of a monitor in front of me - and yet there are many times when the pictures are inconclusive...exactly the problem that would face a fourth official.

Worse still, there's the human factor - even with a selection of camera angles and a clearly defined white line to aid him, the third umpire in the Fifth Ashes Test somehow contrived to give Michael Slater not out, when everyone else could see he was just short of his ground!

The bottom line is that there is no guarantee of getting the right decision 100 per cent of the time.

So I say let the game continue with the man in the middle - rightly or wrongly - acting as the sole arbiter.

I don't believe referees are making more mistakes than they used to - it's just that errors are more likely to be picked up now with the intense scrutiny of the game.

It sounds like hearsay I know, but supporters up and down the land would do well to remember that England effectively won the 1966 World Cup with one of the dodgiest decisions in the history of the game.

I'm sorry Geoff, but that shot of yours never crossed the





SWILDON IN Ladies




The Town Ladies have not had a league fixture since the end of November and have dropped to fourth place.



Steve Bruce admits that his Sheffield United managerial career is still in its infancy after just six months.



But the Blades player-boss insists that he does not need to dangle any kind of carrot before his players with FA Cup games. Bruce had to bite his nails in the third round replay at Notts County where goals from David Holdsworth and Marcelo in the last five minutes saved the day for the Blades before the Brazilian struck in extra time to seal the game 4-3. Now Bruce is happy that his side despatched the Bluebirds in the first game to prevent any repeat of the Meadow Lane experience over a week ago and save his players a fixture backleg which could seriously affect their First Division play-off hopes. "Ideally, we could have done with a few more days, but that's part and parcel of football. We are used to playing three games in the space of a week. We just have to focus on our jobs and go for victory."

This is my 1st year of management and I've loved every minute of it so far.

To be fair it's a lot more demanding than I'd have imagined. There's a hell of a lot of work involved, especially at youth level.. As manager you're in early to finalise preparations, looking after all the players, and I have two different sessions a day for all the YTs. On top of that there's the admin side of it which I've learned so much about, like monitoring the progress of the individual players. This has to be done for all 3 youth teams.

I've got nothing to prove - my day as a player has gone, but if I can still have that attitude where I train hard and work on my fitness, hopefully that might spur a few of the young lads on, the fact that I'm still pushing myself as manager.

I've been fortunate to play under a lot of good managers. One very important one for me has got to be Glenn Hoddle. I think he was a shining example, and trained really hard, although some people might not think that. He always had players working very hard in training. He was fortunate enough to have a very good coach in John Gorman, and I picked up a lot of the sessions I do off him. I've been influence by John and the likes of Colin Lee and they all started off as youth

team managers. You just hope you can bring all that to bear on a game like the FA Youth Cup against Everton. I see where they have a few weaknesses and if we go with our game plan there's no reason why we shouldn't beat them in the replay at the County on Tuesday.



Q. It's been a bit of bumpy ride for the youths this season, hasn't it?



Q. How have the youths been mixing in with the 1st team this season?

A. Yeah, this is it, the final year. We have another 5 months on our contract. unless they get rid of me before then! It's a bit nerve-racking 'cause I don't know what to do after. If I was released I'd have to look at finding somewhere at some other Club, which I've never done, so I don't know how to go about it. But I'd love to stay here, so we'll just have to wait and see what happens.




Q. Have you been told when the decision will be made?


