

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen and a very warm welcome to Loftus Road for this afternoon's Nationwide League game against Swindon Town.

Our 1-0 home defeat here against Wolves a fortnight ago was very hard to take for a number of reasons. Firstly, we had just beaten Oxford United a few days earlier and it was very important to keep picking up points. Secondly, the referee on the day made some decisions I found difficult to accept. Thirdly,

the spirited performance of the side in the second half, when down to ten men, meant we did not deserve to come out of the game with nothing after Wolves scored a few minutes from the end.

This meant we had to travel to Bolton - after our midweek game against Grimsby Town was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch - looking to bounce back from the setback against Wolves. Unfortunately, we had Gavin Peacock and George Kulcsar suspended, as well as Steve Morrow, Danny Maddix and Antti Heinola missing due to injury and Chris Plummer with a groin problem. With Richard Langley making his first appearance since his injury and Leon Jeanne and Chris Plummer playing we had a fairly young side out but really should have had the game won in the first 25 minutes with three or four great chances.

I know I have said this before but we really haven't taken a good enough percentage of the chances we have created and it has cost us dearly from a points situation. When I arrived in late October we were the lowest scoring team in the League and, although we have improved that slightly, we must be more clinical in front of goal. After missing those chances we found ourselves a goal down at halftime. We also lost Chris Plummer during the interval with

a groin problem. We went 2-0 down before Chris Kiwomya was fouled in the box and Keith Rowland scored from the spot. We then had a couple of chances at the end but, again, came away with nothing.

Today we welcome Swindon Town, their directors, manager, players and supporters to Loftus Road. They are a team in a similar position to us and will be looking for three points today.

The remaining ten games are vital for this football club. It is not a question of whether we play well or badly, or who plays or who doesn't, but just to be able to pick up enough points to enable us to be a First Division side next season so that we can plan the long-term future of the club during the summer. The last two seasons in particular have not been good for the club, both on the field and off it. Major changes will be needed to put us back on the right road again but it can be done with your help. Get right behind the team in these last ten games like you did when we went down to ten men against Wolves, they really do respond to you.

Like the Oxford match, this is a massive game for us and it will be a major lift for all of us if we can get three points today.

IN BRIEF

RICHARD LANGLEY returned to the first team at Bolton on Saturday after four months on the sidelines following a knee operation.

Richard said: "The result at Bolton was disappointing and we will look to improve on the performance. I was pleased to be back in the side. I started off OK., but then I got fairly tired. I just need a few more matches under my belt to get the match fitness back. But I can't wait to play in the forthcoming fixtures and we are determined to pick up the points we need to consolidate our position in Division One."

TWO former Rangers men have been making the headlines in the Nationwide Conference.

LEE CHARLES scored on his England semi-professional international debut versus Italy. The Hayes striker went on as a 62nd minute substitute on his home ground and headed the fourth goal in England's 4-1 win. Charles has subsequently been named in the England squad for an international in Holland on March 30. He's scored 14 goals for Hayes this season.

Meanwhile, DEAN CONEY, 35, is the new manager of Conference strugglers Farnborough Town. And Dennis Bailey has scored in his last five matches for Farnborough, taking him to 21 goals for the season.

GERRY RALLIES THE TROOPS

DIRECTOR of football Gerry Francis had a stirring rallying cry after the defeat at Bolton Wanderers.

Gerry said: "It's a war zone at the moment. I knew it would be when I came back to the club. At that point, we were bottom of the table with nine points from 15 games – six points adrift of safety. We then had a very good run and we've given ourselves a chance. However, to be perfectly honest, we're going to have to really battle away to make sure we stay up.

"I'll be looking for a lot of spirit in the next ten games. The loyal Rangers fans have played their part by coming along and supporting us. It's a good club that has found itself in bad times. The most important thing is the future and hopefully our immediate future is going to be in the First Division.

"The results that this club have had for the last two years are nowhere near good enough for Queens Park Rangers and it has got to change. Without money, It's not that easy to do it but one way or the other we'll get there."

In the meantime Gerry has revealed that he is looking to make a loan signing in the near future.

Gerry says: "It's a priority that we need to get a defender in before the transfer deadline.

"We've had Steve Morrow, Danny Maddix, Antti Heinola, Steve Yates and Richard Ord injured. Chris Plummer has been playing with a groin problem and Karl Ready is suspended for today's game. And we have no cover in that area at the moment.

"We've got one loan possibility left and that's what we're putting all our efforts into. The problem is that people don't want to let their good defenders go on loan, so It's not easy."


drain on the resources of QPR. Vinnie wants to follow a career in the media and in Hollywood and we wish him the very best."

MADDIX OUT FOR FORTNIGHT



DANNY MADDIX suffered an horrific injury to his hand in the home game against Oxford. It happened in a three-way collision.

Boss Gerry Francis explains: "You wouldn't want to have seen the cut on Danny's hand. He has a stud mark that has ripped right through the tendons in his palm, probably about two to three inches across. I haven't seen such a bad cut for a long time. He was kept in hospital and needed a major operation."

Danny has put a brave face on the whole affair. He says: "The injury happened as I went in for a tackle with Windass. I slid in for the ball and Ludo was racing out. As he came out, he caught me with his studs. I got up and my arm felt numb, but I didn't think anything of

"I carried on playing for a couple of minutes before I noticed a lot of blood on my shorts. I looked down and there was a gaping hole in my hand, with a lot of the tendons and muscle hanging out. It was a horrible sight and I went into a bit of shock, so I ran over to the touchline to stem the flow of blood. (I wish hadn't just eaten - Ed)

"They took me straight to hospital in an ambulance and I stayed in there overnight before having the operation the following afternoon. I had 19 stitches on the outside and some internally as well. I was in plaster for a couple of days, before the specialist cleaned up the wound and put a new dressing and a splint on it.

"It's the worst injury I've ever had in terms of cuts and gashes. And the physio reckons It's one of the ugliest he's ever seen. It will be another week or two before I can start playing competitive football again."

Meanwhile, Danny's testimonial year continues at full throttle with a Night of Nostalgia planned for next month. A testimonial match could also be arranged for the popular defender.






Ash Saturday



Swindon Town

By Swindon Town standards, this season has been a relatively quiet one with only the departure of Steve McMahon causing a ripple in a decade of drama at the County Ground.



Jimmy Quinn is now in charge of a club with an identity crisis. The Robins are trying to establish themselves in the First Division whilst still harbouring memories of recent seasons in both the Premiership and the Second Division.

Their one season in the sun came six years ago following one of Wembley's most astonishing games - a 4-3 play-off defeat of Leicester City under then playermanager Glenn Hoddle remember him?

When Hoddle left for Chelsea, John Gorman oversaw their Premiership odyssey and, though it was a campaign they would sooner rather forget, their adherence to a positive brand of football won them a lot of respect. Nevertheless, the team broke up and couldn't arrest a further slide into the Second Division where ignominy beckoned.

A bold championship campaign

righted the ship though and took them back to the relatively calm waters of Division One.

Even last season, Town endured a choppy ride once more, having been on the crest of a wave in November - topping the table only for an appalling run of three wins in their last 25 games to drag them into dangerous waters.

More struggles at the start of this campaign rang the death knell for Steve McMahon's tenure and it was former Town favourite Jimmy Quinn who stepped into the breach and who has steered Swindon away from the bottom of the table, without as yet being able to fashion a total march away from danger.

In this toughest of divisions though, Quinn has an army of experienced campaigners at his disposal - all with the ability to ensure that this season could, and should, finish without too many


At the back are the likes of former Chelsea defender Gareth Hall, ex-Wimbledon man Alan Reeves and old favourite David Kerslake - back at the County Ground following his sojourn to the Premiership with Leeds and Tottenham. Up front Quinn has the power and pace of Iffy Onuora the Glasgow-born poacher who, having caught the eye of Steve McMahon at Gillingham, scored on his Swindon debut here at Loftus Road last March.

Whilst Town have the look of a

side that shouldn't be too troubled by relegation worries, a poor run could start the alarm bells ringing and, after slipping and sliding around the the top three divisions in recent years, nothing will be taken for granted at the County Ground until the season is at an

Former Town favourite JIMMY QUINN (below) has gathered a wealth of experience playing for sides such as Blackburn, Leicester and West Ham before managing Reading. He has also picked up 48 caps for Northern Ireland and scored 43 goals in 86 games for Swindon as a player at the County Ground.

In Defence


Experienced defender GARETH HALL signed from Sunderland last season having spent three seasons with the Wearside club. Formerly with Chelsea, he has also been capped nine times by Wales and

can play anywhere along the back four.

ALAN REEVES is another with Premiership experience having spent four seasons Wimbledon. A tall centre half, he was spotted at Rochdale and can be an asset at set pieces as well as in defence.

MARK ROBINSON began his career at West Brom before moving on to Barnsley and then Newcastle in 1993. A year later Swindon paid a then club record £600,000 for his services and he has been a consistent performer since then.


CRAIG TAYLOR is the younger



brother of former Town favourite Shaun and signed a three-year contract in April 1997, having impressed during a trial period. He cost Swindon £25,000 from nonleague Dorchester Town.

BRIAN BORROWS built up a wealth of experience at Coventry where he made over 400 appearances. He has also enjoyed spells with Everton and Bolton and is another experienced pro' who can settle into any position.

DAVID KERSLAKE is now in his third spell at Swindon, having sandwiched stints with QPR, Tottenham and Leeds in between. He re-signed for Town in March 1998 from Ipswich and is most effective in a right wing-back role.

In Midfield

TY GOODEN was signed by John Gorman in 1993, having been released by Wycombe, and starred in Swindon's Second Division championship-winning season. After a spell out through injury, he is back once more and has settled back into the Swindon midfield with aplomb.

SCOTT LEITCH was formerly with Hearts, Motherwell and Dunfermline and was signed by Swindon in 1996 for the bargain price of £15,000 having enjoyed a successful loan spell at the County Ground.

Former England international MARK WALTERS signed for Town in 1996, having been released by Southampton, and immediately showed the silky skills that made him such a hit at Aston Villa, Glasgow Rangers and Liverpool. He is back in the first team squad after a serious knee injury last season.

LEE COLLINS missed the majority of the 1996/97 campaign through injury but signed a contract extension during the summer. He is a ball-winning midfielder who joined from Albion Rovers for £15,000 in 1995.


BOBBY HOWE is an attacking midfielder who signed from Nottingham Forest in January 1998 having spent loan spells at Ipswich and Kettering Town. He made 17 appearances for Forest before his move to the County Ground last season.

In Attack


CHRIS HAY is a pacy young striker who cost only £330,000 from Scottish giants Celtic at the start of last season. He scored 13 goals in 20 games last season and after a barren spell has been bang on form again this season.

GEORGE NDAH was picked up by Steve McMahon in November 1997 following the departure of Wayne Allison to Huddersfield. He cost £500,000 from Crystal Palace where he made over 100 appearances.

IFFY ONUORA has played at Mansfield and Huddersfield but caught the eye at Gillingham. He was picked up by Steve McMahon in a £100,000 deal a year ago. He scored the winning goal here at Loftus Road on his debut before a freak collision with the referee at Charlton ruled him out for the rest of the season. He is back with a bang though this season, scoring 17 goals so far, and has attracted the attention of Scotland manager Craig Brown as he prepares a squad for forthcoming Euro 2000 qualifiers.


Nevertheless, Leon is making his mark in the Rangers team. He's determined to build on the good start he has made to his R's career.

The Cups runneth over

At the top of the Premiership there are sides battling it out for places in the two European competitions next season.

With no Cup Winners Cup there will be a bumper UEFA Cup and a much enlarged Champions League - all to keep the voracious giants of football happy and, as far as UEFA are concerned, to keep alternative financiers away from their teams. Nevertheless that doesn't necessarily mean that the structure has been properly organised yet oh no, that would be far too sensible.

At the moment, sides like Villa, Leeds and Derby have no idea whether coming sixth, or even fifth, will be good enough to qualify whereas (without winning a cup either) the side currently in 15th place may get in - and not via the Intertoto Cup either. Confused? Then read on!

The thought that Wednesday, with nothing to play for in the league, could play their last two games without putting in one tackle should surely not be encouraged -but could you blame them?

Now, if Tottenham win both cups, for example, or Manchester United beat Spurs in the FA Cup Final (for example) what would happen?

It has yet to be decided who would take the spare UEFA Cup place. Would it be the FA Cup runners-up? The League Cup runners-up? Or the team that comes fifth in the Premiership? It hasn't been decided yet so Leeds and friends had just better get their heads down and keep their fingers crossed. Maybe at some stage before next season gets under way, UEFA will tell everyone what their plans are.

MICK McGOVERN

Versatile midfielder Mick McGovern was the youngest member of QPR's 1967/68 promotion squad.

Alec Stock gave him his Second Division debut as a 16-year old apprentice in the 1-0 win at Plymouth Argyle on Boxing Day 1967, eleven months before he signed professional at Loftus Road. He gained top-flight experience and made 12 league appearances for Rangers prior to joining Les Allen's Swindon Town for £10,000 in February 1973 after a loan spell at Watford. Scoring twice in 32 league outings for today's opponents, he was loaned to Aldershot before moving to Jim Langley's Hillingdon Borough in August 1975, then Mike Tomkys'



Harrow Borough a year later. He joined Hayes in July 1977 and starred in their 1978/79 FA Trophy run, moving to Southall in July 1985 and playing alongside Les Ferdinand in the 1986 FA Vase final at Wembley. Still living in Hayes, he has been a British Airways driver at Heathrow for the past 23 years.



DON ROGERS

Former England U-23 international winger Don Rogers helped QPR finish as London's top club for the second consecutive season in 1974/75.

One of Swindon Town's all-time greats, he signed professional at the County Ground in October 1962 and featured in that season's promotion success. He was everpresent four times and starred as Swindon won the League Cup in 1969 and Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, netting 146 goals in 400 League outings before reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace for a record £150,000 in November

1972. Joining Rangers in exchange for Terry Venables and Ian Evans in September 1974, he scored five times in 18 First Division games while at Loftus Road before returning to Swindon for £33,000 in March 1976 as Peter Eastoe moved in the opposite direction. He netted a further two goals in 12 league outings for today's visitors prior to joining Yeovil Town and featuring in the 1976/77 Southern League Cup final. Now running his own sports shop in Swindon, he was recently voted Town's 'Local Hero'.



final second-leg. Signing professional for Wolves in June 1971, gained top-flight experience prior to joining Swindon Town for a record £88,000 in November 1973. He was leading marksman in two successive seasons for today's visitors, scoring 43 times in 91 League outings before Dave Sexton paid £80,000 for him in March 1976. Rangers' top scorer in 1977/78, he netted 15 goals in 72 First Division games prior to being swapped for Everton's Mickey Walsh in March 1979. He helped to reach the FA Cup semi-finals in 1979/80 and was leading goalscorer in 1980/81, moving to West Brom in exchange for Andy King in August 1982. Subsequently loaned to Leicester City, Huddersfield Town, Walsall

and Wolves, he joined Sporting Farense in July 1985, then assisted Atherstone United, Bridgnorth Town (P/C), Alvechurch (P/M) and Nuneaton Borough (A-M) and is now a van driver in Hagley.

ALAN SPRATLEY

Young goalkeeper Alan Spratley understudied Mike Kelly and Phil Parkes while at Loftus Road.

Signing professional for QPR in May 1967, he was loaned to Guildford City before making his First Division debut at home to West Ham in January 1969 and featured in the 6-0 League Cup third round win against Tranmere Rovers the following season. He was a member of Rangers' 1972/73

promotion squad, making 29 League appearances prior to joining Les Allen's Swindon Town for £10,000 in July Contesting their goalkeeping slot with Jimmy Allan, he was unable to prevent relegation that season and played seven Second Division games before rejoining Guildford in July 1974. He moved to Molesey in December 1976, then was a plumbing and heating engineer with his father Owen and uncle Keith in Maidenhead until emigrating to the United States seven years ago.

Now running his own tile and marble business in Tampa, he also coaches Under-14 girls soccer at Pine View Middle School.

A Loity View

It was a sad day

"It was a QPR scout called Bill Smith who brought Alan to London for the first time back in 1979. 'The Doc' was the manager at that time and, though a young Alan was very homesick at first, he settled in London to become one of Rangers' favourite sons.

"Alan enjoyed a colourful career at Loftus Road – he played over 500 times for Rangers, spending large chunk of that time as captain. Jim Smith took the captaincy away from him in 1989, and I felt very sorry for him, but he soon regained the arm band and led the side right up until his departure in 1997.

"He starred at the heart of the Rangers defence week in, week out and happened to be one of the nicest footballers you could wish to meet.

"He also enjoyed a long and illustrious international career, playing 52 times for Northern Ireland, including against Brazil in the 1986 World Cup in Mexico. In actual fact he holds the record for most international caps by any QPR player — a thoroughly deserved honour.

"He was also pretty nifty between the sticks too. I remember a reserve game against Charlton. Alan had just scored for the R's and, with Tony Roberts off the pitch, the big man went in goal to the immense pleasure of the sprinkling of fans who then saw him keep the Charlton strikers at bay for the remainder of the game.

"He was up to his old tricks last season when he played his first game back here at Loftus Road with Swindon. Fraser Digby was sent off and, naturally, Macca stepped in to the breach. He kept a clean sheet that afternoon too.

"The story has it that Alan turned up for training the day after the Charlton game with a pair of goal keeping gloves hoping to get some training with Phil Parkes – who trained our goalkeepers at the time – and perhaps put a bit of pressure on the regular custodians! Knowing Macca's determination, I wouldn't be surprised if he did just that.

"He also possessed infamously wicked sense of humour and often battled with prank nemesis David Bardsley - both with a manic desire to outdo each other. It was always a close run thing, although Alan's crowning glory was when he had a ball-andchain made and left David chained up in the showers after the last match of the season for an hour. Even David Bardslev had to pay his respects to a master that day!

The attendance was 493 and the replay date is this coming Wednesday, March 24, at the City Ground (7pm).

Youth team boss Warren Neill said: "Obviously when a team scores against you that late, you feel as if you've lost the game.

"Our lads were a bit down in the dressing room after the final whistle, especially the younger players who came straight from school to play for us. Although it is a painful experience, it is invaluable in their learning curve towards becoming a professional footballer.

"We set out our stall to keep it nice and solid. We knew Forest were a good side. We'd had them watched and they are very powerful and very good at passing it around. So we had to play a bit like an away side, especially with the young team that we had available, and we tried to hit them on the counter-attack. It worked for 92 minutes!

"We opened the scoring early on with a very well taken goal. Richard Pacquette showed a good appreciation of where Alvin Bubb was in the middle, and Alvin tucked away the cross very nicely.





"We were under a bit of pressure from Forest in the first half. They kept changing the play very quickly and keeper Nikki Bull made some good saves for us.

"I thought we played a lot better in the second half, but Forest came back with a goal that was a comedy of errors. We had a free-kick on the halfway line and we took it quickly when we had no need to. So we lost the ball, then our keeper miskicked it, and it went out for a corner from which they scored. So the goal was down to our own bad play rather than good play from Forest.

"But we came back with a second goal from a set play with ten minutes to go. Terry McFlynn, who had an excellent game, was very quick on the ball. He flicked it over the defender for Alvin, who hit it and the 'keeper pushed the ball on to the bar. Richard Pacquette was there to turn it in. We thought that was going to be the winning goal.

"It was very hard for the lads to take the injury time equaliser by Forest. A lot of the younger boys were tired, and when you get tired you switch off mentally. Unfortunately the goal was just a basic long throw and a flick on, which we had dealt with all night. But we just switched off and allowed them to equalise.

"Now we've got a tough replay up at the City Ground. But the lads have got nothing to worry about after their performance in Tuesday's game. They did admirably for the club and we are looking forward to the replay.

"It will be a good experience for my boys to go up to Nottingham and if we can perform as sternly as we did in the first match, then who knows what will happen."


There's a definite sea change in the top half of the First Division, with some of the bigger guns moving into position for the kill. Bryan Robson was there to run the rule over two players - Bantams forward Robbie Blake, who may be starting to feel the heat following the arrival of Dean Windass, and Keith O'Neill, the Canaries want-away Irish international front man. Both had poor games and were substituted ,although at the time of writing a deal for O'Neill is all but completed.

Birmingham blew their West Midlands rivals **West Brom** away at St Andrews, winning 4-0 to make it

13 points out of 15 for Trevor Francis' men. Meanwhile Wolves eased into sixth place with a 3-0 stroll over doom-laden Bristol City. It's no fun at the bottom and, whilst it seems everyone else is picking up wins here and there, Benny Lennartson's boys are finding it hard to live with the rest. Crewe picked up another massive away win - hot on the heels of their success at Bolton - and moved off the bottom on Tuesday night after a home draw with Grimsby. Oxford, Port Vale and Bury all picked up points.

So who will be the winners and losers come May? It's a tricky one but here are my wild stabs in the dark anyway. Bolton with a late surge move up into second place with Birmingham to beat Ipswich at Wembley. At the bottom Crewe and Bristol City are doomed I'm afraid, whilst on a happier note – for Swindon fans I mean – Oxford are going to join them. But hey, what do I know?




