Good afternoon and welcome to today's League Division One fixture against Manchester City.





The blue half of Manchester are emerging, blinking from the darkest of shadows and dreaming once more of taking their place amongst the nation's elite.

Three and a half seasons ago, City departed the Premiership in their own inimitable style - playing out time by the corner flag in their final game, believing the draw they had carned was enough to survive. It wasn't and one of the most widely documented descents in British football was underway.

However, their renaissance got underway and despite remaining hard to beat throughout last season, too many draws scuppered their chances of automatic promotion. Nevertheless they made the play-offs and looked dead and buried when Gillingham led 2-0 in to the last minute. The rest as they say is history - possibly the most remarkable history in the club's existence - with two late. late goals taking the game to extra time and then penalties. Nicky Weaver's saves broke Kentish hearts and crystallised a turning point in City's fortunes from where they have yet to look back.


Not to put too fine a point on it, City have taken the First Division by storm, thumping Sheffield United 6-0 and disposing of Birmingham, Ipswich and Blackburn on their way to top spot, a third of the way through the season. Joe Royle has swept away the dead wood, trimming a

professional rota of 54 players and introducing influential and committed professionals such as Andy Morrison, Mark Kennedy, Robert Taylor, Lee Mills and young Terry Cooke to the City cause. At the moment, things could hardly be going better as City jostle for position with Ipswich and Barnsley for, what looks like,

Kevin Horlock became Frank Clark's first buy for the club when he signed from Swindon Town for £1.5m in January 1997.

A versatile player who usually plays at left-back or left-midfield, Kevin started his career as an apprentice at West Ham before making the move to the County Ground in the 1992/93 season. He was a virtual everpresent in the Swindon side during his time at the club, and his 16 goals during the 1995/96 alerted the attention of Frank Clark. A month after taking the hot seat at Maine Road Clark finally got his man,



and Kevin made his debut for City in a 4-1 rout of Oxford in February, scoring his first goal for the club against Swindon Town later that month.



When people remember the moment that City won promotion, they will think of the penalty shoot out at Wembley and the saves and celebration of Nicky Weaver.

He kept 26 clean sheets last season to break Alex Williams City record and so far has only conceded a handful of goals in Division One helping City to become one of the most defensively sound teams in England. Snapped up from Mansfield Town for only £100,000 in April 1997 he has been tipped for greater things including, ultimately, England caps. The future of goalkeeping in this country appears to be in safe hands.

Talented left sided defender, snapped up from Leeds United having failed to establish himself at Elland Road. Having begun his career at Cambridge United, he was snapped up Chelsea for £300,000, before moving to Leeds in 1997.

Previously with Blackburn, Plymouth and Blackpool, he was snapped up by City from Huddersfield in October 1998 for a paltry £80,000 — brought in to perform a never say die role in the heart of a depressed team. He made an instant impression, making 28 appearances last season.



Tiatto signed for £300,000 from Swiss club, FC Baden in July 1998. He is viewed as the solution to the club's troublesome left back position. He is a natural attacking wing back with great pace, though he admits that he has to keep reminding himself that his first duty is to defend.




A product of City's youth development programme, he made his league debut against Wimbledon in 1993 and since then has played for England at Under 21 and B levels. He made 47 appearances for City last season celebrating a new four and a half year deal.



Veteran defender who previously played under Joe Royle at Oldham during their most successful period. Following the Latics' relegation, he moved to Leeds but played only 26 games in two seasons due to injury and signed for Manchester City in early 1998.



Irish international winger who emerged at Millwall and secured a dream move to Liverpool in 1995. Restricted to substitute appearances he then signed for Wimbledon in April 1998. A year later he was signed by Joe Royle.


Bermudan born forward who stepped up a division to join City in March 1998 from Bristol City, only to see the two sides swap divisions two months later. Initially made over 200 appearances for Rotherham and was City's top scorer last season with 21 goals.



Alan Ball's last signing, he moved from Arsenal to Main Road in August 1998. A Highbury trainee in the late 1980's, he made his full debut in 1993 before joining City three seasons later. Scored 14 goals last season, the last of which took the play-off final in to extra time.

Known as. "The Man who emptied Wembley" when he scored Gillingham's second goal in the Division 2 Wembley play off final in 1999 against Manchester City. Robert signed from Gillingham earlier this season for a £1.5m fee. He scored on his third appearance in a Blue shirt against Swindon.



Having retired from playing in 1982 following an illustrious career with Everton, Manchester City, Bristol City and Norwich, Royle took the manager's job at Oldham, whom he transformed from Second Division makeweights into Premiership stars and Cup heroes.

Two FA Cup semi finals and a League Cup final bore testament to his successful 10 year spell at Boundary Park and it was no surprise when his former club, Everton came in for him in 1994. In his first season he oversaw an FA Cup triumph, before guiding them to sixth the following season.

His departure the following season said more about Everton than it did about Royle and when Manchester City came in for him 11 months later, they made possibly their best decision for many a year. He wasn't able to keep them up, but then it never was going to be a quick fix at Maine Road. He stripped and rebuilt the club and guided them back in to the First Division — admittedly thanks to some fair winds as well as fine scamanship — and now presides over the club's finest spell in donkey's years, sitting near the summit of the Nationwide League.

It isn't necessarily 'the impossible job' but managing Manchester City has been beyond many of the game's bigger names in recent years. Only now are the smiles back on the faces of City's blue half and it is thanks in no small measure to the impact and influence of this man.

I started my professional career as a youngster at Queens Park Rangers where I played for


four years.

I was then signed in an exchange deal with Simon Osborn and went to Reading for around £500,000 in the summer of 1995.

I couldn't agree terms for a new contract at Reading and left on a free transfer to join Bristol Rovers. I've been in and out of a successful side at Bristol Rovers this season, my problem is that Jon Holloway is not using wingers in his line up so that makes it harder for me to get a regular slot. At the moment I need to be playing full, competitive matches and when I heard that Jim Quinn was interested in signing me on loan I jumped at the chance. It was Jim that signed me at Reading so I know what he expects, how he likes to play, and I know he has a great desire to win.

I'm settling in very well because they are a great bunch of lads here at Swindon, plus I already knew a few of them before arriving which has helped. It is a difficult situation here at Swindon at the moment but I've found that everybody is determined to do their very best and we've all got to continue that until the end of the season and see what we can come up with.

This season I've been part of a successful side that could win the Second Division and in coming here, to a club that is threatened with relegation, I've haven't noticed any difference in the preparation or desire to win. It doesn't matter whether you are at the top or bottom because as a professional footballer you still have to do the job to the best of your ability and the boys here at Swindon are still as committed as ever.





We played last Friday against Northampton where we travelled to a magnificent venue for the fixture, a private school, but unfortunately the pitch that we played on was very poor.

It wouldn't have been so bad but the rugby and hockey pitches around us were in immaculate condition.


The standard of the pitch made it very difficult to control the ball and then pass it accurately. Adding to that it was a very small pitch, probably only big enough for Under13s, but we got through it and won 3-2 in the end. Kevin Halliday scored the first and then, at 2-1 down, Alan Young scored twice to win the match.

We went behind on two occasions and I believe that it was one of those games that we would have lost earlier in the season. So it's very pleasing to see the progression of the boys' attitude and ability. Earlier this

season on that sort of pitch, if we'd lost a goal early in the match a few heads might have dropped and the game may have got away from us. I think we're beyond that stage now and the lads know that at times they can't play attractive football so they have to roll up their sleeves, be able to compete and that's what they're doing at the moment.


We're on a good run at the moment in this section of the league. The lads have put together some good performances and deserved the victories they've had and we now find ourselves at the top of the league rather that the bottom where we finished in the South West section.

They're continually progressing away from 'schoolboy' football and developing towards competing on a professional level, including preparing properly, doing things correctly and cutting out the silly mistakes that cost games. They have also come to grips with competing against 3rd year youth players on professional contracts. It has a lot to do with



the fact that our lads are in their first year and the continual good diet, constant training both on the pitch and in the gym is starting to take effect. The boys are getting stronger and more competitive all the time. Like we always say to them, you can have all the ability in the world but if you can't compete you won't last long on the ball.

As an overall update on the future of the youth team, we have spoken with the administrators and they have assured us that they are pro youth so that is a good sign. We're getting on with our jobs because I'm positive that there will be a Swindon Town for the long term and we're working hard to make sure that the whole club benefits from the youth set up.



There were noticeable performances by Chris Taylor and Matty Collins and you may remember it was about this time last year that we signed Chris Taylor out on the pitch before one of the matches at the County Ground. He has had an outstanding year so far and has come on tremendously well, even in one of his bad matches he is still the best player on the pitch! There is still plenty of work to do with him because at the moment he plays in behind the front two and that's all well and good now but we need to discipline

him so that he can adapt to a variety of positions. When we do pass him onto Iom Jones and he is then asked to play a different role he can do so easily. He's definitely got the ability to develop into a fantastic player and we'll do everything in our power to achieve that.

The Under 13s travelled away to Torquay which is a long journey for them and they won 2-1.

The Under 12s travelled to Swansea and lost 5-4 in a very entertaining match.

We're still working ever so hard to encourage our lads to be comfortable on the ball in every position. If you witnessed the England versus Holland Under 15s match last week you will have noticed how confident the Dutch lads were with the ball at their feet. I thought they were moral victors over England even though they lost the match 1-0.

The evidence showed that we must develop kids that are comfortable in tight situations when they are being pressured by the opposition. They have to get used to that because it is no use, at that age, just pumping it forward because it will not serve them well when they develop as players.

It is now a prominent feature of the modern that game that the way a player receives the ball is crucial, so a lot of the time at the Centre we work on receiving the ball properly and one-on-one defending.

Too many kids in defensive positions rely too heavily on the covering player to do all the work rather than defending themselves.

the editor talks with Adam Willis...

Last time we spoke for the programme you were working hard to get in the side, what was the key to your elevation to the first team?

Over the last few months I've worked very hard in reserve games and pushed to get into the first team. I decided to do a lot more work in the gym and improve my physical presence and that seems to have worked because I feel much stronger.

Now your in the side on merit, how does it feel?

Football is always strange because you never know what's going to happen next. One minute you're in the stand watching matches and then circumstances arise through injuries etc and you have to take your chance when it does eventually come.

Now you've taken that chance, what is your impression of the matches you've played in?

There have been some tough games while I've been in the side against some big sides in this division. We continue to struggle at home but we seem to travel well to difficult opposition - especially winning away at Charlton and Norwich. Last week's defeat at Portsmouth was very disappointing for me because, as a defender, to concede four goals not good. It was hard to take because as a defence unit recently we've played very well together. In some games the three of us at the back have become quite comfortable playing alongside one another.

Do you prefer playing in a three-man defence rather than a flat back four?

Well, yeah because I'm playing!
I've been playing in the middle of
two very experienced professionals and
it's a pleasure to do so. They talk to me
constantly and keep me on my toes
which is vitally important.

What do think the future holds for you?

My contract is up at the end of the year and I'm not sure what's happening yet because of the situation the Club is in at the moment. I think I'm one of many who's contract is up, so whatever happens, happens.

How do you want to finish this season?

The games are running out and we're still quite a few points adrift from safety so it's not looking too good at the moment. We just have to keep battling away and hopefully get a few more wins, it hasn't been a good season for the fans because there have been some real lows. It would be nice to finish on a high even if we do go down and hopefully we can start doing that on Saturday in front of what should be a big crowd.




The game was played at the Charlton training complex and although they lost the game 8-2, with 5 goals coming in the last

The Prospect Hospice based at Wroughton was opened in 1985 to provide specialist palliative care to our local community.

The aim of palliative care is to help individuals and those close to them to reach their optimum quality of life throughout many stages of their illness.

The care we provide both within and from Prospect Hospice is free of charge to a community stretching from Swindon, north to Highworth, south to Ludgersahll, east to Ramsbury and west to Lyneham. Contracts with the Wiltshire Health Authority and Social Services provide approximately 20% of our annual income; the remaining 80% has to be found from voluntary sources. Without generous support from local community we could not function at the necessary level.

What we provide from Prospect Hospice

- Medical Team
- The In Patient Unit with 10 beds caring for over 300 patients a year.
- Day Hospice open 3 days a week caring for 15 patients each day.
- The Prospect Macmillan Nurse Team making over 4000 home based visits
- Senior Social Worker supporting the work of the care.
- Physiotherapy giving advice and support to patients and carers.
- Spiritual Care provided by the volunteer Chaplincy Team.
- Education providing a variety of courses and workshops aimed at helping health care workers develop specialists' palliative skills.
- Over 300 volunteers who take on a variety of essential roles throughout the organisation.
- Costs approx. £5000 a day (over £1.8 million a year)

been able to get forward as much but has one goal assist to his name and has a minor lead on Pollock when it comes to passing accuracy.

Pollock has not been a regular this season, and as a result he has often been forced into playing out of position on the flank rather than in the engine room. He has taken this role change in his stride as his 30 per cent crossing accuracy from 30 crosses suggests. His dribbling statistics suggest that he likes to run with the ball but could do with passing it sooner as his completion rate is only 72 percent which indicates that he tries to do it all himself to often and runs into trouble.








a process more convoluted than a Nassem Hamed boxing ring entry, the knock-out phase of the Champion's League has finally been reached.

There are very few who will be sorry to see the conclusion of the league section, a section which apart from a select number of games, has failed to inspire supporters across Europe. Many games have been played out in half empty stadiums as the supporters of many of the top European sides have let UEFA know what they think of the new format by voting with their feet.

The last set of qualifying games seemed to sum up the situation very aptly indeed. One only had to witness the second half stroll between Valencia and Manchester United to realise that Europe's premier competition was not designed for such dull fare. There have of course been exceptions. Manchester United's game against Fiorentina at Old Trafford will live long in the memory but games such as this have been few and far between.

Surely if 'The Champion's League' (already an extremely blurred definition given that the last two winners had not even been the champions of their own league the previous year) is to thrive it's format must be modified. Fewer games, more teams in a group with just one group phase would immediately relieve some of the strain on the players and would place greater emphasis on quality rather than quantity. The likelihood of this happening is however remote given that UEFA seem far more interested in finance than football. One can only hope that the final stages will be as rewarding and thrilling as the group stages have been tedious and long-winded.

Hoult, 27, currently the subject of a proposed transfer deal from Derby County to Portsmouth, was stopped last month with several other men in a red light district of Derby.


He was questioned, released on police bail, and is expected to appear in court next month.

Rosenborg Trondheim striker John Carew confirmed last week that he would move to Spanish first division club Valencia in the summer for a record Norwegian fee of at least £5.3 million.

"Several clubs have been in the picture, but Valencia have always been my first choice," he said in a statement.

"I've seen them on television and I was impressed. They're among the best in Spain, and I have a good chance of a fixed team place."

Carew, 20, impressed in Rosenbourg's unlikely success in the Champion's League this season and it is not the first time he has been linked with Europe's top clubs. Several Premiership clubs nearly stepped in for Carew before he joined Rosenbourg from Oslo club Valerenga where his tally of 38 goals in 58 matches alerted Europe's elite; Borussia Dortmand, PSV Eindhoven and Strasbourg were ready to sign the Norwegian international before talks broke down.

Valencia need a replacement for Claudio Lopez, tipped to be joining Lazio at the end of the season.

Carew will move from the Norwegian champions after the first part of Norway's league season, starting on April 8 and ending before the European Championship finals in June.

Carew, a tall, speedy striker, would be able to move to Valencia earlier if Rosenborg find a replacement - Rosenborg are in talks with striker Rune Lange of Tromso, who was top scorer in the Norwegian elite division last year.

Carew, born on September 5, 1979, said that only formalities remained of his transfer deal to Valencia. "I've not signed my personal conditions yet, but we have agreed.

"I'll have to speak English at first, and then gradually go over to a bit of Spanish. The only thing I can say so far is 'senoritas'," he said.

the clock John Trollope.

Welcome to our A to Z of former Swindon Town players. This week we take a look back at John Trollope.

On the opening day of the 1960/61 season in a match at home to Halifax Town, Swindon Town fielded the youngest ever pair of full backs to appear together in the Football League. Sadly, the career of one of them, Terry Woollen, was to be cut short by a broken leg but the other was to go on to not only make a record number of appearances for Swindon Town, but to make a record number of appearances for one club in Football League history. During his first season in League football Trollope missed two matches but he was ever-present from the start of the 1961/62 season until 24th August 1968 when a broken arm at Hartlepool ended a magnificent run of 368 appearances. The run had included being part of the first ever Swindon squad to win promotion in 1963 and by the end of the season in which he sustained his broken arm Trollope was to add another promotion triumph not to mention a League Cup winners medal to his honours list.

In his early days John had most often attracted notice with last ditch clearances off the line but as his career progressed his overlaps with Don Rogers became a striking feature of Town's play and was to produce many goals. Managers came and went but John seemed to go on forever. After making a record 832nd appearance against Preston on 7th March 1978 he was intending

to retire but less than a month later an injury crisis saw him pressed back into service. He took over the role of Youth team manager and did not play at all in the 1979/80 season. The following campaign saw him called into the colours for the final time until after a 770th League appearance at Colchester on the 8th November 1980 he decided to concentrate his efforts on his managerial role. Although he was successful in helping Town avoid the drop that season, the following year saw Swindon slump into Division Four for the first time in their history. The familiar story of players signed on wages based on gate expectations in a higher division meant there was little money to spend. The ball did not run kindly and John found himself axed as manager. His huge magnanimity was shown in a letter he wrote to me after I had commiserated with him over his fate, "I still hope I can be useful to the Club in another role and that we will return to success for Swindon



which is what we all want."

His wish came true and he was to be an able Lieutenant as Assistant Manager to Lou Macari before returning to look after the Youth team which always seemed his great passion and the job in which he was happiest. John Trollope had given 37 years of service to Swindon before he was sacked as Youth team manager as Steve McMahon wanted to bring in his own people. It was sad that the Club did not see fit to mention his departure in the Club programme or wait and allow him to retire at the end of the season with the dignity he himself had always shown both on and off the pitch.





It is also just a matter of time before a 'pay as you go' telephone line will patch you into your favourite club's dressing room to hear players discussing their contractual obligations. Interactive T.V. coverage will enable you to not only follow a player through the game but follow him home to see him on his sofa watching Blind Date and picking new wallpaper for the spare room.

> If you have something to say it should be about yourself, not the people around you and I'm not that sure I'm in favour of that kind of soul bearing. There's a time and place for people to reveal their innermost feelings in public and that's not in the Winners Bar at Swindon Town, it's on the Jerry Springer show. The trouble is that by the time a soccer celeb' is ready to tell

the world their problems we already know them. As with reading the book and then watching the film the first version of events tends to be the one you enjoy most, which must be very galling when you reveal your lifelong secret only to have people say they preferred the version published by the Daily Star.

With football agents came the mobile phone ear accessory, beloved by Premier League players which enables them to conduct an interview in conference with their agent live on T.V. As mobile phones will shortly include a T.V. screen they will be able to see themselves doing it, at the same time as the nation sees it. I have a strange feeling that we are about to use this sort of technology to achieve time travel and then we will not only know everything, but be able to travel back and actually see it happen. 


