





Fans deserve better

The disappointment of last week's late postponement of our game at Colchester hit everyone at the club - as well as some of our most loyal Supporters.

Many fans and the team bus had already arrived at Layer Road when theReferee decided to call the game off at 6.15pm. Both Colchester and ourselves wanted to play the game and I found it hard to believe that the referee didn't even wait until the bus had arrived at the ground to seek our opinion before calling the game off.

Over the past week I have spoken many times to my opposite number at Colchester and I have to say I feel for them because the decision was taken out of their hands by someone who wanted to play God on the night. As many of you know I have written to the Football league to request an explanation of why this game was called off so late and, at the time of writing, I have only received a rather terse response from the referee - a statement neither we nor Colchester are happy about, as we believe it does not convey the real facts. Referees would appear to hold the upper hand in matters like this and most will always work with the clubs to see if a game can be played - or not.

When our game against Port Vale was in doubt the referee made an effort to arrive at the ground early, test the pitch and wait for both managers to arrive before looking at it again. He then made a decision with all parties in attendance and fully aware.

My question is: Why did the referee at Colchester not seek to follow a similar path? I believe I know the answer but libel laws prevent me from publishing mythoughts. I have since gone back to the League and requested that the bigger picture regarding the method of

postponements is looked into and that referees are made aware that we, as football clubs, have a duty to our customers - the fans. Without them we have no game - yet referees seem to consistently disregard this. There now needs to be an effort to get match officials to understand the commercial needs of a club and its supporters as well as the requirements for players' safety whilst out on the field.

I am indebted to Colchester for offering all supporters who travelled on the official Supporters' Club coaches vouchers entitling them to free entry forthe re-arranged game. This madness was not of their making, no, on this occasion the blame has to be laid at the door of the referees department.

Enough of that and on to tonight's LDV Vans Trophy match against Wycombe. LDV have replaced Autowindscreens as the sponsor of this tournament this year and we welcome their involvement. The chance of a cup final at the Millennium Stadium in Cardiff is the prize and I am sure we will be doing our utmost to ensure we get that chance. The magnificent victory against Millwall in the last round has seen us progress this far and I am delighted to extend a warm Wiltshire welcome to the directors. players, staff and supporters of Wycombe tonight but, as I always say - and I am ever the optimist there is only one winner. Come on You Reds!

Dryden Returns To Saints




Southampton defender Richard Dryden has returned to the Premier League after completing a two-month loan spell at the County ground.

Town Take Black Cats' Young Striker Reddy on Loan

Swindon Town have swooped to take promising Sunderland striker Michael Reddy on a month's loan.

Reddy, 20, joined Sunderland from Kilkenny City in August 1999 for £50,000 and made six Premier League appearances for the Black Cats last season. The pacy 6ft sins Irish forward has been capped three times for the Republic of Ireland Under-21 side and may figure in tonight's game. Town Youth Coach Shaun Reid helped seal the move with his brother Peter, boss at Sunderland, and says: "Peter has high expectations for him and this loan both helps us and him in his football education. He is a lad expected to go on to become a full Irish international."



Sporting Club Dinner


Swindon Town's spring Sporting Club Dinner will see a nostalgic return to 1969 on March 29.



The Chairboys...

Wycombe Wanderers enter tonight's game on the back of five games unbeaten and with another cup tie to look forward to, a lucrative fifth round FA Cup tie against Middlesborough or Wimbledon.

The Chairboys solitary league game this year came at Kenilworth Road in front of the Sky cameras and was celebrated by a 2-1 win courtesy of an Andy Rammell brace. Wycombe's first three points of the New Year were welcomed by a side who have struggled to maintain their blistering start to the season. A run of six games without defeat including a win over Millwall, sparked off a run that saw them rise towards the top of the table. However, two defeats to Rotherham and Bristol Rovers followed and the

inconsistency

that has plagued them all season began, as a result Sanchez's men are in eleventh place rather than challenging for promotion.

Nevertheless you won't hear any of the Adams' Park faithful complaining, Sanchez has transformed the club on a small budget. He now has a collection of players who share his passion and desire for the club. The Wycombe boss could be boosted by Gerard Lavin, a loan signing from Bristol City who is looking to slot into the right back void left behind by Matt Lawrence. Wanderers should also have loan striker Sam Parkin available for selection. Parkin, on-loan from Chelsea, has extended his loan deal for another month.






Sanchez Breaks Another Cup Record


Wanderer's boss Lawrie Sanchez has made FA Cup history once again.

He is already in the record books by scoring the winning goal for Wimbledon against Liverpool in the 1988 FA Cup final. Sanchez has made history again by taking Wycombe into the fifth round of the FA Cup for the first time in the club's history. A 3-1 win over Grimsby was followed by a 2-1 victory against Wolves on Saturday courtesy of a Sam Parkin winner. Sanchez could face his former club in round five if Wimbledon can beat Middlesborough.

Lawrie Sanchez started his Larger at Reading playing in the Third and Fourth Divisions. He moved to Wimbledon for £30,000 just before Christmas 1984 when Dave Bassett was Manager. In the 10 seasons at Wimbledon he played 317 games and scored 35 goals.



The Wanderer Returns



It's a return to the County Ground for both Lawrie Sanchez and his assistant Terry Gibson. They both played a part in our Premiership season, signed to add vital top-flight experience to the cause. However, they were unable to repeat their Wimbledon form and we all know what happened. Lawrie had a knack of scoring vital goals, he got the winner against Huddersfield that took the Dons into the First Division (now Premiership) and the winner against Liverpool in

the 1988 F.A.Cup Final. Lawrie left Swindon to join Sligo Rovers as manager and took them into Europe in the Cup Winners' Cup before losing to F C Bruges. Lawrie was enticed back to Wimbledon by Joe Kinnear to manage the Dons' reserve side.

He won the Football Combination in his second year in charge. He was appointed first team coach in 1997-98 and appointed manager of Wycombe Wanderers on 5th February 1999.

Has also made 9 appearances for Northern Ireland Youth and 8 appearances for the U-21's. Very promising youngster who has attracted attention from the Premiership.


16 Andy Rammell



Tonight's visit of Wycombe Wanderers see another former Robin return to the County Ground.

Terry Gibson, re-united with Lawrie Sanchez at Adams Park after their spell in "the Crazy Gang' with Wimbledon spent a short spell here with the Town. Signed in April 1992, Gibson went on to make nine appearances scoring one goal before his loan spell at the club was terminated in May.


Terry started his career with
Tottenham Hotspur, making his full
debut for the North London giants at
the tender age of 17, at the same
time representing England
schoolboys and England youth.
However Terry failed to command a
first team place at a regular basis
and subsequently moved to
Highfield Road. Whilst at Coventry,
he became on of the Sky Blues' top
goal scorers. 43 goals in 98 league
matches was his modest record and

it caught the eye of Manchester United, Gibson finally moving there in January 1986. Despite moving for a fee of £650, 000, his time at Old Trafford was marred by prolonged spells on the sidelines and he was on the move once again a year later in 1987, this time signing for the Dons for £200, 000. Gibson formed an integral part of the 'Crazy Gang' and played alongside Lawrie Sanchez in the side that beat Liverpool 1-0 in 1988. Terry spent six glorious years at Wimbledon before moving to Underhill, it was here that he would end his playing career.

Following the decision to end his playing career, Terry Gibson became involved with the running of the youth team. Under Ray Clemence, he became Youth Team Manager and eventually took over the affairs of the reserve side in the Capital League. At one stage it appeared as though he would become manager of the first team (after a successful

spell as Caretaker Manager) with the advent of Terry Bullivant's departure. Unfortunately the Board decided that Alan Mullery was the man for the job, a decision that would signal Gibson's departure for the two did not see eye to eye.

Upon leaving Underhill, Gibson spent his time setting up a bike customising business before he was found by the Chairboy's boss Sanchez. It was hoped that he would come in as Assistant manager and he was appointed this role on the 9th February two years ago. Terry has been working alongside the 6ft 4inch frame of Terry Evans, a real Little and Large duo, but his 5'5" frame will be remembered for it's pace and ability to find the back of the net. With a career spanning over 300 games and fifteen years, now one waits to see if he can enjoy as much success on the sidelines, let's hope he is not too successful tonight!

In the back row of the Nationwide Stand probably.

My hero would have to be Sebastian Coe for the way in which he came back from illness to prove his critics wrong.

Most embarassing moment on or off the field?

The most embarassing moment would have to be getting heavily beaten. I have played for one or two teams that have been defeated by a large number of goals, I think we got beat 7-1 at Bolton once? They are always embarassing, especially because in most cases they could have been worse.

10 What has been your strangest encounter with a football fan?

Nothing really that strange, but once I was followed home by four Newcastle United supporters!

Q11 Any embarassing habits of any of the lads you can tell us about?

There are too many to mention. If I had to choose one it would have to be Antoine van der Linden and Bobby Howe's constant moaning! They are particularly bad before and after training, they remind me of the two old gits in Harry Enfield!

12 If you weren't a footballer, what would you be?

I would have to have an occupation outside, but I am not very practical. Maybe a P. E. teacher or something?

Q13 Your ultimate ambition as a footballer?

I am coming to the last few years of my career so my aim is just to make the most of them, to enjoy them and play to the best of my ability.

14 If Swindon could sign any player in the world, who would you most like to play alongside?

Zenadine Zidane, he is the best player in the world at the moment.

15 Do you have any other hidden talents other than football we should know about?

I love fishing and I take part in Match Fishing, I am OK at that, well better than I am at golf!

Q16 Favourite sporting moment/memory?

It has to be Seb Coe again, when he turns to the press after winning his race and showing them he was number one. Any kind of sporting excellence is good, watching Manchester United at their best etc.

Believe it or not, there are a couple of intelligent lads, Adam Willis, David Duke and Graz. If I had to choose one, it would have to be Graz because he has four A-levels and ten O-levels.

Q 20 What would your advice be to any young players hoping to pursue a football career?

Keep at it, it can take a long time to get where you want to go but it is worth it when you do. Just persist and if you want it enough, you will get there.



Matches from Memory

It is only two and a half seasons ago, but just four players who appeared for Swindon in this match remain on the books today; Gareth Hall, Mark Robinson, Alan Reeves and Fraser McHugh.

Swindon's team for the Worthington Cup first round first leg showed just one change from the previous Saturday when they had lost 2-1 at Sheffield United, Jimmy Glass replacing Frank Talia in goal.

The opening minutes saw Swindon create many chances but Onoura with a header and Ndah with a shot both fired wide of the target. As the game progressed Wycombe also had chances with Paul Read's pace causing problems for the Town defenders. On the half-hour Stallard looked to have a goal scoring opportunity but Reeves did well to block his shot. Just two minutes from half time. Swindon made a breakthrough. Moments after Taylor had produced a fine save to deny Hay, Mark Walters's low corner was met by Alan Reeves whose diving header beat the keeper to earn his first goal for Town.

The second half saw Fraser McHugh replacing the injured Gareth Hall. Swindon's defence was soon under pressure with Brown forcing a save from Glass and Comforth firing over the bar. Read was foiled by Glass when he broke through after 59 minutes, but later the Arsenal reject seized on a ball from Stallard and drove the ball into the roof of the net. Swindon must have begun the game looking for victory by a

comfortable margin but, at this stage, they were struggling for any kind of a win. Their cause was not helped when Chris Hay (rated Town's Star Man by the Advertiser) limped off to be replaced by Kevin Watson. In the 69th minute a long ball from Reeves found George Ndah whose electrifying pace took him clear to score and put Town 2-1 up. Watson might have increased the Robins lead but, after a good break by Walters, the former Tottenham player saw his shot blocked. Former Swindon striker Keith Scott joined the action but it was Town who looked more likely to score with Onuora, firstly failing to reach a cross from Gooden and then being foiled by a fine save by Martin Taylor. No fewer than six players were booked; four from Wycombe, two from the home side but it was never a dirty game.

A 2-o win for Wycombe in the Second Leg was to make this result a hollow victory for Swindon and the Wanderers went out in the following round to Middlesborough.

Neither side enjoyed a successful season in the League. Just a few weeks after their Cup exit, Swindon Town parted company with manager Steve McMahon. At the season's end Town finished 17th in Division One, whilst Wycombe finished in 19th position in Division Two - just one point above the relegation zone.



Football Programmes Down The Years:











A series of articles by the Editor of PROGRAMME MONTHLY & FOOTBALL COLLECTABLE magazine, describing how programmes have changed over a century and a quarter of Association Football.

No. 1 After the World Cup

Football enjoyed a renaissance following England's 1966 World Cup victory. Spectators flocked back to the grounds and a number of individuals began to try out some new ideas.

Foremost in this was Jimmy Hill who transformed Coventry City from a struggling lower-league club into a First Division outfit which, to date, has retained its place in the top flight.

The match-day programme was one of a number of areas of the club that Hill transformed and modernised. The Coventry issue was turned from a conventional Assized, rather boring, traditional programme into 'The Sky Blue', a glossy, large page size, multi-page extravaganza full of photographs and features. It was in tune with the modern era, resembling the new magazines which were appearing on the bookstalls (one of which, of course, was 'Jimmy Hill's Football Weekly').

It wasn't all for show - at oneshilling (5p) it was the most expensive in the League, reflecting high production costs, and it was the first to hit the 10p price tag post-decimalisation, so it was as much a commercial enterprise as an image-builder.

It was undoubtedly value for money however, and the pioneering Coventry City 'matchday magazine' encouraged other clubs to take a long, hard, critical look at their programmes. Midlands neighbours Wolverhampton Wanderers quickly followed suit.

Wolves had traditionally one of the better programmes of the 1950's and early 60's, but they had become jaded and predictable, and they followed the Coventry example with relish. 'Molinews' was launched as a large-page production, filled with features and photographs. Ironically, the return to large page productions set the clock back to pre-war days, when

many clubs favoured this size.
Indeed Spurs retained that
format up to and including their
double-winning season in 1960-61,
albeit only as a 4 page (folded
sheet issue.)

Still in the Midlands, West Bromwich Albion took the matter a stage further. They enlisted the help of graphic designers who produced the first designerprogramme. To emphasise this radical step, they turned the programme 'on its side', landscape rather than portrait. Page make up was unrecognisable from traditional programmes, and photographs were manipulated to create a design image.




















The flood of illegal immigrants entering the country is rising fast, but we're not talking about dispossessed Lithuanians hidden among truck-loads of cabbages being ferried across the Channel to the generous Blighty hand-outs.

No, we're talking of very wealthy young men flying into the UK, first-class, to join their new British league soccer clubs with highly dubious EU passports. The alarm bells are ringing in overdrive in the offices of football authorities throughout the land.

It is estimated that there are as many as 80 professional league players in England and Scotland, mainly South Americans, who gained entry to these shores on predominantly Greek and Italian passports. This is made possible by the 'grandparent rule' - no matter where you are born, one grandparent(or the claim of one grandparent!) means that you can obtain a passport from that ancestor's native European country. However, some countries are very restrictive on this matter. Spain, for example, insists that there must be a direct male line of descent to the

applicant, but others seemingly hand them out willy-nilly. Obviously, many of these passport holders are thoroughly genuine but, worryingly, many are thoroughly not. The problem area is double-edged, there are the passports obtained on falsified family history and there are the passports that are simply forged.

Typical examples of these, respectively, are the cases of the Peruvian Nolberto 'Nobby' Salano. now with Newcastle United and the Argentinian Estaban Fuertes, late of Derby County. Salano holds a Greek passport on the claims of a paternal grandmother but the Greek authorities have now expressed serious doubts as to the substance of his claim and the Home Office are currently investigating the matter. Fuertes on the other hand held a 101% fake Italian passport and as soon as that came to light he was promptly shown the door by immigration - on yer bike mate!

What is becoming increasingly alarming to the football authorities is the modus operandi of the Home Office, who only thoroughly check the credentials of these immigrants when a fraud becomes apparent.

Gordon Taylor, boss of the PFA, earlier this week called on the government to take a firmer line with dual passport-holding imported players. He said, "it's getting quite farcical... there is nothing to prevent clubs bringing players here who may turn out to be short of the right qualifications. It really is up to the Home Office to make the necessary checks". Sports Minister Kate Hoev joined the fray by calling for government action to put an end to these illegal practices. Surely they are both right, the clubs simply do not have the resources to check immigration details whilst the government very much do.

Clubs are beginning to get extremely jittery over the possibility of another Fuertes being exposed. The financial implications of similar incidents are horrendous and the Bald Eagle said, "It took nine months to resolve our situation. We now follow FA guidelines very closely. In the Fuertes case the people who handled it for us handled it badly". I had a half-Argentinian grandfather. Must get on to River Plate - they might need a ball-boy or a safety steward!
