





The Millers made their usual bright start and Kevin Watson was given offside from a fourth minute fine move before Marvin Bryan's low cross was turned out for a corner from which Paul Warne drove a shot well wide. Guy Branston headed home a tenth minute corner only for the offside flag to go up again before Bristol's Wilson had a free kick well caught by Ian Gray.

Following a quick visiting break Evans saw his shot saved by Gray before the Millers came close to taking the lead but Richie Barker headed just wide following a Watson free kick.

It needed a great Guy Branston tackle to stop Astafjevs before the Millers took the lead in the 43rd minute. Watson and Rob Scott combined to find newcomer Jeff Minton in the centre circle and he threaded a superb pass inside a defender for Barker to race through and open his Rotherham account.

Four minutes into the second half Barker's shot came back off the post while at the other end Evans drove a shot over the bar. Barker had a header well saved but on 53 minutes the Millers went further ahead.

Barker and Warne combined on the left and Minton finished off the move with a first time shot from the edge of the penalty area.

That put the home team well in control and Minton almost found the net again but his 20 yarder was saved. It was no surprise when Rotherham increased their lead in the 88th minute with Minton finishing off a brilliant six man move to crown a tremendous debut after moving from Millmoor two days earlier.

Atrocious playing conditions greeted the players with driving snow, a strongwind blowing down the pitch and it was bitterly cold. But this didn't deterthe Millers from trying to play their usual good football and they soonlooked the better side.

Jeff Minton had a 20 yarder saved before Wycombereplied with Cousins shooting just wide after an eighth minute corner.

That was to be Wycombe's last real effort of the first half as the Millers took command and Paul Warne had a shot saved.

Mark Robins was wide with a long range shot and then Warne had a shot blocked after linking well with Robins. Three minutes before the interval it looked as if the Millers would take the lead when the ball rebounded to Robins but the usual deadly finisher pulled his shot just wide.

Watson drove an early second half free kick wide before David Artell had to be replaced by Brian Wilsterman after pulling a hamstring.

But it made no difference as Rotherham continued to call the tune with Richie Barker and Guy Branston both going close with headers.

Wycombe then enjoyed a little spell of pressure with Bulman shooting wide and Simpson had a shot blocked. Bates was wide of the target with a long range shot and McCarthy glanced a header just wide following a 72nd minute corner.

Minton headed just wide after getting on the end of Marvin Bryan's high cross but the deadlock was finally broken in the 82nd

minute. Paul Hurst found warne with a throw and the striker delivered a perfect cross for Alan Lee to score with a superb header.







PROMOTION WINNER

Former Swindon Town midfielder Kevin Watson starred in Rotherham United's promotion success last season. Moving to the County Ground from Tottenham Hotspur in July 1996, his solitary goal in 63 League games came in Swindon's 3-1 win at Southend United a month later and he helped Swindon to lead the First Division early in the 1997/98 campaign. He joined Rotherham on a free transfer in July 1999 and his single goal in 44 Third Division outings last season was a memorable strike from the half-way line at home to Chester a month later.


TITLE TRIUMPH Swindon Town's loanee former midfielder Mark Dempsey featured prominently Rotherham United's 1988/89 Fourth Division title triumph. Following lou Macari



from Manchester United in January 1985. he made five consecutive Fourth Division appearances while at the County Ground. He joined Rotherham from Sheffield United for £15,000 in October 1988 and netted seven goals in 75 League outings for the Millers before moving to Macclesfield Town on a free transfer in July 1991.

EVER-PRESENT

One-time Swindon Town goalkeeper Tom McAlister was everpresent for Rotherham United in two consecutive seasons. Moving to Millmoor from Sheffield United in January 1976, he starred in Rotherham's 1976/77



MANAGING TO SUCCEED

Danny Williams managed both Rotherham United and Swindon Town during his career. Moving to Millmoor from Silverwood Colliery in October 1943, the long-serving wing-half starred in Rotherham's 1950/51 Third Division (North) title triumph and scored 22 goals in a record 459 League games before managing the Millers between July 1962 and February 1965. He joined Swindon as manager for four years in August 1965 and plotted their 1968/69 promotion and League Cup 'double' success, then had a second spell as Swindon's boss from March 1974 until May 1978.

LEADING MARKSMAN

Former Rotherham United centre-forward Bronco Layne was Swindon Town's leading marksman in 1959/60. Signing as a part time professional at Millmoor in July 1957, he scored on his League debut in Rotherham's 4-1 defeat at Stake City two months later and netted four goals in 11 Second Division games before moving to Swindon on a free transfer in June 1959. He partnered Jimmy Gauld in their attack and scored 28 times in 41 League outings for today's visitors prior to joining Bradford City in December 1960.

PROMOTION PUSH

One-time Swindon Town left-back Alf Radford made a significant contribution as Rotherham United finished Third Division (North) runners-up for the third successive season in 1948/49. Born locally, he moved to Millmoor on a free transfer from Huddersfield Town in May 1947 and partnered Jack Selkirk in Rotherham's defence. He made 44 League appearances prior to joining Rochdole in June 1951 and joined Swindon in August 1952, playing 16 Third Division (South) games for today's opponents.

IN SAFE KEEPING

Goalkeeper Chris Ogden played for both Swindon Town and Rotherham United during his career. Moving to the County Ground from Oldham Athletic in August 1978, he featured in Swindon's 1978/79 promotion challenge and contested a firstteam slot with Jimmy Allan. He made 24 Third Division appearances for today's visitors prior to joining Rotherham in November 1979, playing three League games while at Millmoor before moving to Bath City in July 1980. Fellow keeper Paul Crichton had a loan spell at both clubs during the 1987/88 campaign.

SWINDON SWITCH

Ex-Rotherham United wing-half Ken Keyworth briefly played for Swindon Town during the 1965/66 campaign. Born locally, he moved to Millmoor from Wolverhampton Wanderers in January 1952 and netted six goals in 85 Second Division games for Rotherham before being sold to Leicester City for £9,000 in May 1958. He joined Swindon from Coventry City in August 1965 and made six League appearances for today's opponents. The likes of Ted Dransfield, Bernard Harris, George Hicks and Leslie Roberts played for both clubs during the inter-war era.



welcome to swindon town



After coming down from Division One last season when they finished bottom of the table, Swindon Town were hoping for much better things this time round particularly after signing quite a number of new players during the summer.

But it hasn't quite worked out as planned and they have had to spend most of the time

struggling to get away from the wrong end of the table.

The season got under way with a goalless home draw against Colchester United before three defeats on the trot left them in 23rd spot. Their first victory came with a 1-0 win at Bristol City before a defeat at Bournemouth was followed by victory at Luton Town.

That was the start of a run of four matches without defeat in the league as Town climbed up to 18th spot but three successive defeats saw them drop down four places.

After beating Ilkeston Town in the first round of the FA Cup, further progress was made by easing past Gateshead in round two before Swindon recorded one of the best performances of the season, a 2-1 home win against the Millers.

However, since then inconsistent form has kept them at the wrong end of the table but their form in March has been much better with a very creditable draw at Wigan Athletic, wins against Oldham Athletic and Oxford United, a home draw against Swansea City, a win at Colchester United and last Saturday they took a point from a goalless draw at Bristol Rovers.

Made two first team appearances in 1995/96. came off the bench to play as an outfield player in 1996/97 and made his full league debut between the posts for Swindon in October 1997, 'Mildy' made 6 (2 as substitute) appearances for Town last season. He spent most of the season in the reserves earning praise for his resolute performances, however, he was rarely relied upon to make the step up to the first team. Has recently come into the first team and has impressed, despite being pelted with missiles against Oxford!

After only making 44 league appearances for The Posh he decided it was time for a new challenge when his contract expired during the summer. Bart spent a two-month loan period with Town last season and impressed in difficult circumstances.

Defenders MARK ROBINSON

Started his career at West Bromwich Albion, joined Barnsley on a free in June 1986 and such was his form there that Newcastle snapped him up for £450,000 in March 1993. After losing his place in the first team through injury, Mark is now the Town's longest serving player since Swindon paid a Club record £600,000 for his services in July 1994. He has been a consistent and versatile performer ever since, however, he could face competition from new signing Juan Cobian for the right-back slot this season. Town's captain up until a October last year.

'Today's interview'

Swindon Town Manager Andy King

Millers: Have you any particular memory or recollection Rotherham United?

Andy: 'Although I have been Millmoor may times, scouting, I never actually played there. My nearest connection locally was during my time as manager of Mansfield Town."



Millers: Which player or manager do you always associate with the Millers?

Andy: Ronnie Moore. I think the way he has turned the club round has been tremendous. In the lower divisions he and Ray Graydon have done an unbelievable job on limited resources. After we take the three points from you on Saturday, I hope you go on to win promotion!

Millers: What has been the happiest time in

your career?

Andy: 'My seven/eight seasons at Everton. As well as being able to play at the top level then, we were also a successful team.' Millers: What is your biggest frustration as the manager of a football club?

Andy: 1 have no frustrations as a manager. The frustration has been when I couldn't get the opportunity to coach or manage. There are many good coaches out there who could be doing a good job, given the chance."

Millers: Who are your biggest friends and mentors in football?

Andy: 1 played for some big name managers, Tommy Docherty and Howard Kendall to name a couple. However I have learned the biggest lessons working with Peter Reid. Peter is very honest with himself and with the players and likewise commands total respect. If I had a big football problem tomorrow morning, Peter is the first person I would ring. As regards friends, my family have always sup-ported me very well. My wife still attends our games as does my mum. However if we have a bad run then someone has to take responsibility, so I usually ban her for a few games!" Our thanks to Andy for sparing time from his busy schedule, to talk to us.

Close encounters of a previous kind

Call me old fashioned but I prefer the traditional A5 glossy programme, Today's 'retro file' revisits a Millers v Swindon game in September 1979. I am all for innovation but the publication accompanying this game was a newspaper. Being tabloid size even a reduced photograph makes it difficult to get any text on this page. So I can either write less or ask the editor if I can borrow a bit of page 34. To make matters worse it had many newspaper style gimmicks. For example if you cut out the coupon,

you could buy the popular fixture key ring' for 30p instead of 35p. Only available from the Red and White shop.

Although it was very early on in the season only 4 games gone, Rotherham were top of the league with six points. With 2 points for a win in those days that meant 3 wins and one defeat. Swindon had 5 points from the same number of games. All relatively meaningless so early on!

The Swindon manager was Bob Smith and his side featured several well known names. Former Shrewsbury forward Chic Bates was a key striker. Irish international and now much travelled manager, Bryan Hamilton, looked after the midfield. Celebrated defender Chris Kamara bolstered the back line. As if all that wasn't enough they also had nippy striker, Alan Mayes, who had signed for Town the previous season; an unhappy memory for Millers fans. Mayes had made his debut at Millmoor and scored a hat trick.

However this was a new season and United were in good form. As well as the good league start, they had also beaten 1st division Leicester in both leas of the League cup. The team included John Breckin, Rod Fern, Richard Finney and Dave 'nothing is a lost cause' Gwyther. This was manager Jim McGuigan's team and was the nucleus of the championship winning side of 1980/81. There recollections prompt one or two questions that we will not be able to answer, Ian Porterfield (McGuigan's successor) made three brave but ultimately shrewd signings, which enhanced the McGuigan squad. However would he have been able to build the rest of that successful side in the way his predecessor did? Likewise, had he carried on, would Jim McGuigan have ever had the nerve to make the bold, risky signings that his team needed?

Perhaps the last word ought to be about the newspaper, sorry programme. Devout programme collectors had a couple of difficult decisions. If very keen, they would have to find a way of storing this 'outsize' publication alongside their many seasons of the standard issue. Alternatively they could abandon that season and dispose of the journal via the local chip shop. This type of establishment would then recycle them as sophisticated fish and chip insulators. Who knows this could have opened up a whole new fast food market. For example 'could I have fish and chips in an Arsenal' or 'pie and chips in a Scunthorpe United please'.









One or two people might accuse us of being complacent because of who we were playing but I can assure you there was none of that at all as we had so much to play for.




We will be looking for a bit of revenge today for when we played at Swindon Town earlier in the season, they played




