TWO successive home wins have placed our League side in a comfortable position in the table, but whilst most club followers were well satisfied after last Wednesday's 6-2 victory over *Aldershot* the team's display in Saturday's 2-1 win against *Walsall* was disappointing to say the least. It is hard to criticise a winning team but there it is . . . the brand of play provided by Gillingham and Walsall in that one game is hardly of the type that will bring back some of soccer's missing millions. It is to be hoped that this evening's visit of *Swindon Town* will provide better entertainment. Incidentally, the victory over *Aldershot* was the biggest since *Exeter City* were defeated 9-4 in January 1951 and *Gordon Brasted's* hat-trick was the first for the club since *Ernie Morgan* performed the feat in December 1954 when we won at *Bristol City*, in their promotion season, 4-1.

MEANWHILE our *Reserves* remain undefeated in the Kent League and Cup. Last Wednesday, they drew 1-1 at *Ashford* in the First Round of the Kent League Cup (first leg), *Irvine Gray* scoring the equaliser near the end. The second leg of this tie will be played on this ground on Monday next, kick-off 5.30 p.m. had extra time will be played if necessary. Last Saturday, the *Reserves* drew 1-1 at *Betteshanger Colliery Welfare*, the equaliser this time coming from *Paul Lucas*.

At home to *Snowdown Colliery Welfare Reserves* our 'A' team went down by 4 goals to 2. *Snowdown's*

strong side included several very experienced players, among them *Billy Collins*, and our youngsters were far from disgraced. *Mike Ackland* and *Johnny Warsap* were the scorers. Our *Junior "B"* team (formerly the *Minors*) began their *Rochester* and *District League* (Div. IV) programme in grand style by a resounding away win over *United Services (Rainham) Reserves*. *David Taylor* 4, *Brian Godfrey* 2, *Keith Leigh* 1 and *Brian Grundy* 1 were the scorers in an 8-2 victory. This team included six former members of the *Medway Schools* side. Our *New Brompton* and *District League* side—the *Juniors*—were without a game on Saturday.

THE wonderful start to the season made by our Kent League side can, if it is continued in such a successful vein, do a power of good in more directions than one. Attendances for Kent League games at the Stadium should certainly improve on the miserable three figure gates of last season. In fact after the last home game—against *Margate*—many were of the opinion that if the *Reserves* continued the form shown in that game they would soon be attracting as many, if not more to the Stadium as the first team. Shades of the past in fact. Remember our *Eastern Counties League Championship* winning side? They often drew gates upwards of 6,000!

The *Reserves* too should draw larger crowds to the grounds of their opponents—an event that would give considerable pleasure to worried Kent League club committees and managements. Their standard of football should and probably will go a long way towards raising the standard of other clubs and, in fact, all in all they can do a wonderful job for soccer in the County generally.

A SWINDON SALUTATORY

FROM the great railway centre in Wiltshire this evening come old, old friends and rivals, Swindon Town and to the officials, players and supporters of this famous old club we extend our usual warm Kentish welcome.

LAST season was one of the poorest in Swindon's long history. They finished last in the League table and their resultant application for re-election was only the second time that they had had to do so. Their average home gate was only 7,378 but away from home they attracted an average of 9,274. In 46 League games, Swindon only managed to find the net 34 times and as Maurice Owen (13) and Edwards (11) scored 24 of these between them it is obvious where their biggest weakness existed. They called upon 24 players during the season and only six of them found the net — two of them once each only. Six players appeared in forty games or more last season, viz: Edwards and Hudson each 46, Burton 45, Hunt and Owen each 44 and Gibson 42. Burton's only non-appearance was when Swindon visited the Stadium — Gill deputising on that one occasion.

IN the corresponding game last season, played on 12th November, Gillingham had their best win of the season (4-0) and the teams were:
GILLINGHAM: Kingshott; Parry, Crombie; Boswell, Niblett, Riggs; Crossan, Baxter, Sowden, Morgan, Millar.
SWINDON: Gill; Hunt, Fox; Cross, Hudson, McShane; Gibson, Micklewright, Owen Edwards, Williams.

WITH the first team (at Ipswich) and reserves (at Faversham) away from home on Saturday, the opportunity has arisen for our 'A' team to show themselves to Stadium fans. Folkestone Reserves, always an attractive side, provide the opposition in a Kent League (Div. II) game, so be sure to make this a *must* for Saturday at 3.15 p.m.

ERROL had, in the first three games of this season, failed to find the form that delighted the fans throughout last season. He is too good a player to be off form for long, however, and will no doubt be back on first team duty before many matches are passed.

WHEN *Johnny (Taffy) Evans* said "Cheerio" to his "A" team colleagues after last Saturday's game, he didn't know how long it might be before he would see them again. Johnny had to report back to his Army unit on Sunday morning and was expecting an overseas posting but didn't know where or when. This quiet, shy but likeable lad from the Rhondda Valley has taken over the centre-half position in the "A" team and has turned in some great performances.
